

# MEMORANDUM TO: THE HONORABLE RICHARD J. CODEY AND THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY

The New Jersey Wiretapping and Electronic Surveillance Control Act (N.J.S.A. 2A:156A-1 to - 34) requires the Chief Justice to submit an annual report to the Governor and the Legislature (N.J.S.A. 2A:156A-23E). In accordance with that section, I am submitting this report to inform you of the operation of the Act during 2004.

N.J.S.A. 2A:156A-2(i) provides that only Superior Court judges designated by the Chief Justice are authorized to hear wiretap applications. For the year 2004, the following judges were authorized wiretap judges: by order dated April 26, 1994, Judges Kevin G. Callahan, Arthur N. D'Italia, and Robert A. Longhi; by order dated March 19, 1997, Judge Joseph A. Falcone; by order dated July 22, 1997, Judge Linda R. Feinberg; by order dated December 3, 1997, Judge Samuel D. Natal; by order dated June 11, 1999, Judge Albert J. Garofolo; by order dated July 22, 1999, Judge Marilyn C. Clark; by order dated June 15, 2004, Judge B. Theodore Bozonelis; and by order dated September 1, 2004, Judge Ronald B. Sokalski.

The data for the year 2004 include reports of all orders granting permission to intercept wire, electronic and/or oral communications, or to perform electronic surveillance, for any period that ended in 2004. It is the actual termination date of the surveillance that governs which reports are included within the reporting year. During 2004, the reports to the Administrative Office of the Courts reflected 171 applications¹ seeking permission to intercept wire, electronic or oral communications. No applications were denied. Thus, in 2004 the authorized judges entered 171 orders granting permission to intercept wire, electronic and/or oral communications.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> Note that the Office of the Attorney General reports 177 applications. The numbers differ because of differences in reporting methods for the two reports. The Judiciary reports a wiretap in the year that it terminated. The Attorney General does not report a wiretap until the investigation in the case is complete.

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Of the 171 orders entered, 166 permitted interception of wire communications, 3 permitted interception of electronic communication, and 2 permitted interception of oral communication. There were 66 orders authorized for 30 days each, 98 were specified for 20 days each, and 7 others were authorized for less than 20 days each. Additionally, 83 extensions of previously entered orders were granted during the reporting year. Of these, 40 extensions were for 30 days and 2 extensions were for 20 days. There were another 41 extensions for 10 days or less.

Please note that because some orders involved the investigation of more than one offense, the total number of offenses listed (194) is greater than the number of orders issued (171).

N.J.S.A. 2A:156A-11 provides that in certain instances a showing of special need is required before an order for interception of wire, electronic and/or oral communication is to be granted. The reports made by the authorized judges indicate that in reporting year 2004, a showing of special need was required in 0 of the orders, a showing was not required in 28 orders, and the special need information was not available in 143 orders.

Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 2A:156A-23(b), attached please find the annual report on the operation of the New Jersey Wiretapping and Electronic Surveillance Control Act for the year 2004.

As required, the information reported herein concerns the number of applications made for electronic surveillance and orders issued; the effective periods of such orders and any renewals; the crimes in connection with electronic surveillance orders; the name of the applicants; the number of indictments resulting from each application; and indictment charges and dispositions.

After your review, the Attorney General's report should be combined with the report prepared by the New Jersey Administrative Office of the Courts and forwarded to the Governor and Legislature along with the attached transmittal memorandum signed by both the Attorney General and Chief Justice.

#### COURT-AUTHORIZED ELECTRONIC SURVEILLANCE 2004

Following is a summary of the attached 2004 electronic surveillance report.

- . In 2004, 177 applications were made statewide for electronic surveillance orders. As a result of these applications, 177 orders were granted authorizing the use of electronic surveillance.
- Extensions were requested and granted for 64 intercept orders. In addition to the first extension granted in 64 instances, second extensions were granted in 29 instances, third extensions were granted in 9 instances, and fourth extensions were granted in 3 instances.
- . Of the total 177 orders granted, 171 authorized wire (telephone) intercepts, 4 orders authorized electronic communications intercepts, and 2 orders authorized oral intercepts (microphone eavesdrops).
- . Of the 177 orders granting electronic surveillance, 170 were installed and utilized. Seven intercepts were never installed or utilized.
- . Considering the most serious offense being investigated, the largest number, 112 (63%) involved controlled dangerous substance violations.
- . In addition, 42 (24%) of the orders involved racketeering, 11 (6%) involved murder offenses, 7 (4%) involved theft offenses, 3 (2%) involved gambling, and 2 (1%) involved forgery or fraud.
- . At the close of the report year, 238 defendants were indicted statewide as a result of 2004 electronic surveillance orders.
- . In addition, 356 defendants were arrested and awaiting grand jury, 32 had charges no billed, and 1 entered a pre-indictment diversionary program.
- . At the close of the report year, 99 of the 238 defendants indicted reached final disposition. Of those reaching final disposition, 65 were convicted through guilty pleas (three of which pled guilty to charges downgraded to disorderly persons offenses), 33 were admitted into pretrial intervention programs, and 1 had indictment charges dismissed.

Data reported pursuant to *N.J.S.A.* 2A:156A-23 were compiled to report on the operation of the New Jersey Wiretapping and Electronic Surveillance Control Act. As required by statute, this report contains data concerning:

- (1) The number of applications made.
- (2) The number of orders issued.
- (3) The effective periods of such orders.
- (4) The number and duration of any renewals.
- (5) The crime in connection with electronic surveillance orders.
- (6) The name of the applicants.
- (7) Indictments resulting from each application.
- (8) The crime which each indictment charges.
- (9) The disposition of each indictment.

In addition to the detailed information provided for 2004 applications and orders, supplemental follow-up data is provided for electronic surveillance orders reported in previous calendar years.

### **APPLICATIONS**

In 2004, 177 applications for electronic surveillance orders were reported statewide pursuant to the Wiretap Act. The applications made were authorized by prosecution officials as follows.

In all, the 177 applications for electronic surveillance resulted in 177 orders granting the use of electronic surveillance.

#### ORDERS FOR ELECTRONIC SURVEILLANCE

In all, 177 court orders were entered granting court authorization for electronic surveillance in 2004.<sup>1</sup>

Additional inconsistencies between the federal AOC report and the state report include:

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> The United States Administrative Office of the Courts 2004 wiretap report (Table B-1) lists 186 electronic surveillance orders for New Jersey. The state report lists 177 electronic surveillance orders for New Jersey. Discrepancies between federal and state reports are described below.

**Bergen County.** Five of the 23 electronic surveillance orders listed in the federal AOC report incorrectly list "Stefanacci" as the Prosecutor who authorized the application. The authorizing prosecutor should be listed as Molinelli.

Essex County. The six orders reported by the federal AOC (application dates 1/6/03, 1/29/03, 1/29/03, 7/28/03, and 8/11/03) were previously reported in the New Jersey Attorney General's 2003 report. New Jersey, however, reports one Essex County electronic surveillance order (BTBESS2704, application date 12/10/04) which is not reported by the federal AOC.

Gloucester County. The federal AOC report lists three court authorized electronic surveillance orders; New Jersey lists four. The fourth order, AJGGLO1504 (application date 8/17/04) was for fraud (counterfeiting).

**Passaic County.** The federal AOC report lists 42 court authorized electronic surveillance orders; New Jersey lists 43 orders. The additional order listed in the state report, RBSPAS6204 (application date 12/15/04), while terminated in 2005, was part of a 2004 investigation.

<sup>(1)</sup> AO#17 (MCCPAS1804, application date 6/1/04). The federal report lists one extension. The Passaic County, New Jersey report lists no extensions.

<sup>(2)</sup> AO#22 (MCCPAS2304, application date 7/21/04). The federal report lists the original order was for 30 days. Passaic County reports that the original order was for 20 days. Also, the federal report indicates the wire was in operation 26 days. Passaic County reports the wire was in operation only 9 days.

Extensions were requested and granted for 64 intercept orders. In addition to the first extension granted in 64 instances, second extensions were granted in 29 instances, third extensions were granted in 9 instances, and fourth extensions were granted in three instances.

*Union County.* The federal AOC report lists 21 electronic surveillance orders. The New Jersey report lists 24 orders. In addition, the federal report includes a 2003 application/order (application date 10/3/03) which was previously reported in the New Jersey report.

Federal report AO#'s 19 and 20 are duplicates. The same order, BTBUNI2404, is listed twice.

The state report includes five wires not reported by the federal AOC: BTBUNI2504, application date 12/2/04; BTBUNI2804, application date 12/17/04; BTBUNI2904, application date 12/21/04; BTBUNI3004, application date 12/21/04; BTBUNI3104, application date 12/28/04. These wires, while authorized and reported in 2004, were terminated in 2005.

State Attorney General. New Jersey reports 49 electronic surveillance orders. The federal AOC reports 66 electronic surveillance orders. (One entry, AO#15, is repeated.) The discrepancies between state and federal reporting are generally the result of differences in reporting procedures. For example, the federal report will include orders terminated in the current report year, but used in conjunction with ongoing investigations. Orders terminated in a report year, but used in conjunction with an ongoing investigation, are not reported by the New Jersey Attorney General's Office until the investigation has concluded. This often results in orders being reported in years following the year the order was terminated.

Of the 66 orders reported by the federal AOC, 46 are reported by the Office of the Attorney General. Nineteen of the 66 orders reported by the federal AOC involve ongoing investigations and will be reported in a future report year upon conclusion of the investigation. One order (JAFESS1402, application date 7/11/02) listed in the federal AOC report was previously reported in the New Jersey report.

Three orders listed in the state report were previously reported by the federal AOC: KGCHUD2102, application date 5/30/02; KGCHUD2202, application date 6/12/02; and SDNGLO1103, application date 11/13/03.

- Of the 177 orders granting electronic surveillance, 171 authorized wire (telephone) intercepts.
- . For the remaining six orders, four authorized an electronic communication intercept (microphone eavesdrop) and two authorized an oral communication intercept.
- . Of the 177 orders granted for electronic surveillance, 170 were installed and utilized. Seven intercepts were never installed or utilized.
- Of the total 177 original orders, 99 authorized use of intercepts for 20 days, 70 authorized use of intercepts for 30 days, and 4 orders authorized an intercept for 1 day, 3 orders authorized an intercept for 10 days, and 1 order authorized an intercept for 15 days.

Section 8 of the Wiretap Act specifies the crime for which electronic surveillance may be granted. Offense data collected and analyzed for court-authorized electronic surveillance consider the most serious offense investigated. Offense data consider only substantive offenses and not conspiracy to commit the offense.

Overall, electronic surveillance orders were granted in connection with investigations involving the following offense categories: controlled dangerous substance offenses, racketeering, murder offenses, theft, gambling, and forgery or fraud.

- Of the 177 orders authorizing electronic surveillance, considering the most serious offense, the majority, 112 (63%), involved controlled dangerous substance offenses.
- In addition, 42 (24%) of the orders involved racketeering offenses, 11 (6%) involved murder offenses, 7 (4%) involved theft, 3 (2%) involved gambling, and 2 (1%) involved forgery or fraud.

#### DEFENDANT INDICTMENTS AND DISPOSITIONS

Summary information concerning defendant indictments resulting from electronic surveillance applications is provided below with detailed information on the following pages.<sup>2</sup> The information provided concerns defendant indictments resulting from each application, the offenses charged, and indictment dispositions.

- At the close of the report year (December 31, 2004, a total of 238 defendants were indicted statewide as a result of 2004 electronic surveillance applications and orders.
- Of those 238 defendants indicted, 229 (96%) were indicted for controlled dangerous substance offenses.
- . In addition, 8 defendants were indicted for gambling offenses and 1 was indicted for official misconduct.
- In addition to those defendants arrested and indicted, 356 defendants were arrested and awaiting grand jury action, 32 had charges no billed, and 1 entered a pre-indictment diversionary program.
- At the close of the report year, 99 of the 238 defendants indicted reached final disposition.
- Of those defendants reaching final disposition, 62 were convicted through guilty pleas, 33 were admitted into a pre-trial intervention program, 3 pled guilty to disorderly persons offenses (post-indictment), 1 had indictment charges dismissed.
