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

# REPORT.

OFFICE OF THE STATE LIBRARY, TRENTON, N. J., Nov. 1st, 1888.

To His Excellency Robert S. Green, Governor of New Jersey:

SIR—Permit me to submit the following report of the condition of the State Library for the fiscal year ending October 31st, 1888:

At the time of my last annual report the whole number of books, papers, magazines and pamphlets in the Library was 33,308. During the past year the following additions have been made by exchange, donation and purchase:

The 269 law books in the purchase account include 122 volumes of pamphlet laws of the various States, obtained to complete the sets in the Library, as shown in the Appendix. A few more of them will make our collection as perfect as possible, and arrangements have been made for obtaining them.

During the year 237 books and 10 newspaper files have been bound, and 43 books have been repaired, many others being in the hands of the binder.

"The Ornamental Arts of Japan," by Audsley, (which was added to the Library last year,) having proved acceptable to pottery decorators and others, a companion work, "The Pictorial Arts of Japan,"

by William Anderson, has been obtained, and has elicited much commendation from appreciative artists and amateurs.

Among the art additions to the Library, I desire to call special attention to the fact that the skillful artist, Albert Rozenthal, of Philadelphia, has liberally presented to the State, proof sketches, or rather, etchings of Chief Justices Oliver Ellsworth, John Rutledge and M. R. Waite; Judges Bushrod Washington, John Blair, Brockholst Livingston, James Iredell and William Paterson; and also of Gov. William Franklin, Gov. William Livingston and Hon. Jona. Dayton. These fine works I have had appropriately framed, although I have reserved their hanging until the Library shall occupy its proposed new quarters in the third story of the new front of the State House.

Apropos of the "removal," it was supposed last year, as stated in my last report, that the Library would have been moved during the last fall, but it is now evident that it cannot be transferred from its present locality until after the adjournment of the Legislature, even if the new rooms were ready for occupancy, as the removal would require the temporary closing of the Library, which would materially inconvenience the Legislature. Permit me to say, however, that the new rooms, aside from the important fact that they are fireproof, will afford splendid accommodation, not only for the Library as it is, but for its prospective growth, for at least thirty years. There is also the great advantage of having the law and miscellaneous works in different rooms, which, while conveniently adjacent, avoid annoying interference between incongruous workers; for, be it understood, that the State Library, which some seem to consider only a pleasant rendezvous, is really the workshop of lawyers, artisans, inventors and students of all kinds. With skylights, windows upon three sides of each room and heaters at every window, the rooms ought to be as comfortable as possible to be designed.

It is hoped there will be no delay, after the adjournment of the Legislature, in occupying the new quarters, as the Library has outgrown its present location, and the constant change of its books, in an effort to find place for them, has rendered its catalogues dilapidated and almost useless. These cannot properly be renewed until the books are permanently located upon the new shelves, which will not at all correspond with those in present use, on account of the different formation of the rooms.

The proposed conference of State Librarians at Washington, in May last, suggested by the State Librarian and the State Legislature of California, to which I devoted a large portion of my last annual report, failed to take place, by reason of some mismanagement on the part of the projectors, or, possibly, by the manipulation of the "American Library Association," representing town and city libraries and having but slight affiliation with State Libraries. This latter assumption is based upon the fact that another conference is called by the same parties, to meet at St. Louis in May, 1889, "with the American Library Association." This, of course, nullifies the main object of the proposed conference of State Librarians, which was to obtain a uniformity in regard to State exchanges of State publications, which is not at all applicable to circulating libraries, which issue no publications of use to State Libraries. It is presumed, therefore, however beneficent a conference might have been as originally projected, the proposed conference will fail to accomplish the result desired. Consequently, I feel that my attendance at the St. Louis convention would be of no benefit to the State, and therefore shall not renew my proposition to that effect, made to the Commission last year. It is not intended in these remarks to underrate "The American Library Association," which is undoubtedly an institution of great benefit "in its way," but its interests and methods, while not antagonistic, are not congenial with those of State Libraries, and therefore any conference with it, on the part of State Librarians, must prove abortive.

I can only regret, therefore, that the original design of holding a conference of State Librarians failed, as I feel assured it might have been of great benefit in establishing a much-needed reform in the system of State exchanges. It is hoped the proposition will be renewed at an early day—after the attempt at amalgamation with city circulating libraries has been ascertained to be impracticable, which I feel confident will be determined by the St. Louis meeting in May next.

What is chiefly needed is that all the laws, court reports, legislative journals, official reports, archives and other documents of each State and Territory should be sent regularly to the library of every other State and Territory, whereas now several of the States and Territories make irregular and but partial exchanges through other officials than Librarians, and consequently books are forwarded to

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Executives or Secretaries of State, and only by accident find their way into the State Libraries, where they properly belong.

During the past year there were 1,590 registered visitors at the Library, exclusive of members of the legal profession, State officials and other regular attendants.

The accompanying Appendix presents an itemized statement of the additions made to the Library.
