#### **Academic Achievement**

This school outperforms 36% of schools statewide as noted by its statewide percentile and 35% of schools educating students with similar demographic characteristics as noted in its peer school percentile in the performance area of Academic Achievement. Additionally, this school is meeting 100% of its performance targets in the area of Academic Achievement.



Academic Achievement measures the content knowledge students have in language arts literacy and math. For elementary and middle schools, this includes measures of the school's proficiency rate on both the Language Arts Literacy and Math sections of the New Jersey Assessment of Skills and Knowledge (NJASK). A proficiency rate is calculated by summing the count of students who scored either proficient or advanced proficient on the assessment and dividing by the count of valid test scores.

#### **College and Career Readiness**

This school outperforms 82% of schools statewide as noted by its statewide percentile and 87% of schools educating students with similar demographic characteristics as noted in its peer school percentile in the performance area of College and Career Readiness. Additionally, this school is meeting 100% of its performance targets in the area of College and Career Readiness.



#### **Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent**






#### **Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup**









Students in both elementary and middles schools begin to demonstrate college readiness behaviors long before they even enter high school. Among the behaviors that research has shown to be indicative of success and college and career readiness are regularly attending school and challenging themselves with rigorous course work. The table presents the percentage of students who were chronically absent during the prior school year. A chronically absent student is a student who was not present for any reason for more than 10% of the total days possible for that individual student.

The first column - Schoolwide Performance - represents the outcomes for these particular indicators in this school. 








#### **Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup**








#### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -**Grade Level - 04**




#### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 04







#### Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent






#### **Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup**








#### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 06




### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 06









### **Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent**












### **Proficiency Trends - Math**










### **Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent**




### **Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup**
