



This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.




Total School Enrollment Trends




Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup








NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 06






NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 06





Students in both elementary and middles schools begin to demonstrate college readiness behaviors long before they even enter high school. Among the behaviors that research has shown to be indicative of success and college and career readiness are regularly attending school and challenging themselves with rigorous course work. First, the table presents the percentage of students, as measured against the school's enrollment in eighth grade, who were reported via NJSMART as being enrolled in Algebra I. 


Chronic Absenteeism Trend



This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.




Total School Enrollment Trends




Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup












Chronic Absenteeism Trend








Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup










NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 04






Chronic Absenteeism Trend



This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.




Total School Enrollment Trends




Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup










Chronic Absenteeism Trend



This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.




Total School Enrollment Trends




Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup






Proficiency Trends - Math









This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.




Total School Enrollment Trends




Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup








NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 06






NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 06








Chronic Absenteeism Trend
