



Enrollment by Grade














NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 03










Chronic Absenteeism Trend



Enrollment by Grade






















Chronic Absenteeism Trend



Enrollment by Grade














NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 03








Chronic Absenteeism Trend








Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup






NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 07




NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 07






Chronic Absenteeism Trend



Enrollment by Grade

























Enrollment by Grade













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

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





Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup


This graph presents the percentages of enrollment for each subgroup defined by the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001




Enrollment by Gender



Enrollment by Grade


















Chronic Absenteeism Trend


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

Enrollment by Grade






Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup








Chronic Absenteeism Trend



Enrollment by Grade






Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup








NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 03



Students in both elementary and middles schools begin to demonstrate college readiness behaviors long before they even enter high school. A chronically absent student is a student who was not present for any reason for 10% or more of the total days possible for that individual student.

The first column - Schoolwide Performance - represents the outcomes for these particular indicators in this school. For example, a school whose peer school percentile is 65 in Chronic Absenteeism has a lower Chronic Absenteeism than 65% of its peer group. 


Chronic Absenteeism Trend
