



Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent







A proficiency rate is calculated by summing the count of students who scored either proficient or advanced proficient on the assessment and dividing by the count of valid test scores.

College and Career Readiness

This school outperforms 27% of schools statewide as noted by its statewide percentile and 24% of schools educating students with similar demographic characteristics as noted in its peer school percentile in the performance area of College and Career Readiness. Additionally, this school is meeting 20% of its performance targets in the area of College and Career Readiness.



College and Career Readiness measures the degree to which students are demonstrating behaviors that are indicative of future attendance and/or success in college and careers. 

Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent










Scholastic Assessment Test (SAT) Results





Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent






Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup




































Proficiency Trends - Math









This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.




Total School Enrollment Trends

Enrollment Trends by Program Participation




Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup








NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 03






NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 03








Chronic Absenteeism Trend
















NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 03






NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 03








Chronic Absenteeism Trend



Enrollment by Grade














NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -**Grade Level - 03**




NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 03





Students in both elementary and middles schools begin to demonstrate college readiness behaviors long before they even enter high school. Among the behaviors that research has shown to be indicative of success and college and career readiness are regularly attending school and challenging themselves with rigorous course work. A chronically absent student is a student who was not present for any reason for 10% or more of the total days possible for that individual student.




Chronic Absenteeism Trend



Enrollment by Grade






Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup
