



Enrollment by Grade








Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup

Academic Achievement measures the content knowledge students have in language arts literacy and math. A proficiency rate is calculated by summing the count of students who scored either proficient or advanced proficient on the assessment and dividing by the count of valid test scores.

indicative of future attendance and/or success in college
and careers. For all elementary and middle schools, this
includes a measurement of how many students are
chronically absent. For schools with middle school
grades, it also includes a measurement of how many
students take Algebra I in eighth grade.



Student Growth measures the performance of students from one year to the next on the New Jersey Assessment of Skills and Knowledge (NJ ASK) in Language Arts Literacy and Math when compared to students with a similar history of performance on NJASK.








Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup




















This graph presents the grade level outcomes in the categories of Advanced Proficient, Proficient, and Partially Proficient over the last four years.




Chronic Absenteeism Trend
