Summary of Grant Awards: August 1995 to September 1996

Electronic Resources for Public Library Grants

Phase one of the *Libraries 2000* technology plan for New Jersey will make \$970,000 available to provide state-of-the-art electronic information access to all state residents through their local public libraries. Using existing state, federal and memorial funding, the New Jersey State Library has created three noncompetitive grant programs to purchase necessary hardware and software or to pay telecommunications costs for 287 public libraries in the state. Key to the grant programs is flexibility which allows libraries to tailor their use of funds to meet local needs. One grant targets libraries which meet the criteria of being "small and needy." A second grant targets county and municipal libraries with branches, and the third program targets nearly all remaining public libraries. The State Library mailed RFPs and applications to all eligible libraries. All grants will be awarded by late 1996 or early 1997, with full implementation of the initial phase expected by spring 1997. The plan will eventually encompass all libraries in the state, providing an electronic link among them and access to the World Wide Web.

Passage of the Library Services and Technology Act (LSTA)

On September 30, 1996, President Clinton signed the omnibus appropriation bill (H.R. 4278) containing a six-year renewal and updating of the Library Services and Construction Act (LSCA) which provides federal funding for many of the grant programs offered by the State Library. The Library Services and Construction Act expired on September 30, 1996 and is being replaced with the Library Services and Technology Act (LSTA). LSTA is expected to fund library technology and services to special populations. The new law takes effect immediately. For FY 1997, federal funds will be appropriated under the Library Services and Construction Act according to the

regulations in effect in FY 1996. FY 1997 will be a transition year in which regulations will be developed for LSTA.

FY 1997 Elementary/Secondary Education Federal Funding Increases

The ALA Washington Office electronic newsletter *ALAWON*, vol.5, #71, reports that Congress funded education programs at or near the levels requested in President Clinton's FY 1997 budget. This will result in increases in funding for various elementary and secondary education programs. These increases present many opportunities for school libraries to benefit from technology programs this year. For example, Improving America's Schools Act, Title VI received a \$35 million increase. Approximately 40 percent of these funds are currently spent on school library resources and instructional materials. Also, included in this Act, the School Technology Resources program specifies providing training to school library media personnel and including them in the technology planning process. Elizabeth Free Public Library Wins Grant from Microsoft

Microsoft Corporation is giving \$10.5 million in cash, training and software to 41 disadvantaged library systems across the United States and Canada. Elizabeth is the only New Jersey library on the list. The \$112,500 award will result in a total of 20 multimedia computers being placed at three public library branches and five high school libraries in Elizabeth. The new computers at the public library will be connected to the Internet and will also be made available for patrons wishing to use word processing and spread sheets programs.

Summary of Grant Awards: August 1995 through September 1996

Through September 1996, the State Library has awarded \$1.5 million to local libraries through the grant programs it administers. Seventy-one contracts were issued for state aid funds totaling \$796,228, and 35 contracts were issued for federal Library Services and Construction Act (LSCA) funds totaling \$773,591.

Collection Evaluation and Development April 1996

The purpose of this program is to increase access to a variety of materials in public libraries by developing or strengthening specific subject collections in public libraries. Thirteen grants totaling \$149,995 were awarded.

Expanding Internet Access for Library Computer ConsortiaSeptember 1996

The intent of this grant is to expand access to the resource databases on the Internet by providing funding to library computer consortia to provide Internet services for the first time or to expand existing Internet services provided to their member libraries. The RFP required that, if possible, one grant be awarded in both the northern and southern portions of the state. Two grants totaling \$100,000 were awarded.

Major Urban Resource Library (MURL) November 1995

Newark Public Library was awarded \$87,406 for this targeted grant program. One of the goals of the Library Services and Construction Act is supporting and expanding library services of major urban resource libraries which, because of the value of the collections of such libraries to individual users and other libraries, need special assistance to furnish services at a level required to meet the demands made for such services.

Multimedia Audiovisual Services for Public Libraries July 1996

The purpose of this grant is to assist public libraries in the provision of new or expanded reference and information services to their patrons through the use of interactive multimedia audiovisual materials and equipment. Twenty-four libraries received grants totaling \$165,197.

Municipal Branch Library Services (Program B--Assistance for Operations and Improvements) March 1996

The purpose of this grant is to expand or enhance library services in established branches of municipal libraries or to add new services. This year's focus was on providing new, expanded or enhanced reference, information and children's services to patrons at branch libraries through the use of computers and/or telecommunications to access library materials and information. Eight libraries received grants totaling \$89,311.

New Jersey Nightline: After-Hours Toll-Free Reference Service FY 1996

East Brunswick Public Library was awarded \$175,000 to continue the *New Jersey Nightline* service which was funded through federal Library Services and Constructon Act and state Network Aid funds and contributions from the four Regional Library Cooperatives. *New Jersey Nightline* provides ready-reference services directly to callers by operating a toll-free information service seven nights a week after most public libraries are closed.

Non-English Language Materials Acquisitions Center April 1996

The Newark Public Library received \$150,000 to continue for a fifth year the operations of *MultiMAC*, the Non-English Language Materials Acquisitions Center, which acquires materials in 11 foreign languages. The Center provides the following services: quarterly booklists available to all requesting libraries, bulk loans, on-site review of materials, current vendor data, full cataloging information, continuing education workshops, translation and interpreting services, and a toll-free consultation hotline.

Public Library Literacy Programs August 1995

The purpose of this grant program is to strengthen local library services, resources and programs to meet the literacy needs of adults, young adults and families. In FY 1996 the grant program provided funds for three types of activities: literacy instruction, collection development and family literacy programs. Seven libraries received grants totaling \$100,000.
