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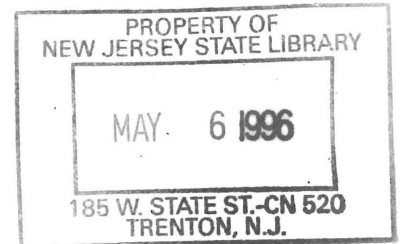

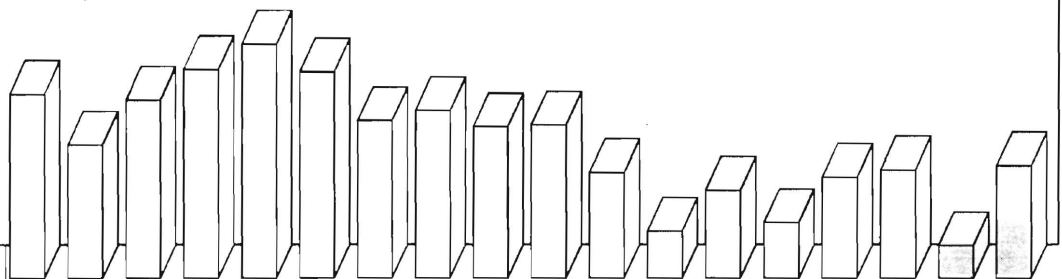

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## Highlights of Current Program Statistics

### AFDC (Tables 1 and 5, Graphs 1 and 4)

**116,000 eligible families in New Jersey were receiving AFDC as of the end of January 1996:**

- Less than **104,500** single head of household families (Regular AFDC, C segment).
- Among two-parent families, about the same number, under **3200**, of Unemployed Parent families (F Segment) and State AFDC families (N Segment).
- About **5100** Medicaid Only families.
- The largest numbers of families by county: Essex with **29,500**, Hudson with **18,200**, and Camden County with **13,300**. (53 percent of all AFDC families)
- Other counties ranged from under **200** families in Hunterdon to **7,500** in Passaic County.

**There were about 1000 fewer eligible families in January 1996 than in December 1995, with a total decline of nearly 9000 since the May/June 1994 peak of 124,600.**

- There were **850** fewer C segment families in January 1996 than in December 1995, and **7400** less than the peak of **111,800** in June 1994
- F segment families declined from over **4500** in May 1994 to less than **3200** by November 1995, with a slight drop since then
- State AFDC (N segment) grew from about **3000** families in December 1993 to almost **3500** by June 1994, but slowly declined by about **300** since then
- Medicaid Only families remained at or below **5000** in 1994, but averaged nearly **5200** for 1995. In January 1996 they were down to about **5100**

### FOOD STAMP PROGRAM (Tables 2 and 6, Graphs 2, 5, and 6)

**At the end of January 1996, about 221,000 households were participating in the Food Stamp Program:**

- **109,500** AFDC households with **343,000** persons
- **111,200** Other Low Income households with **169,400** persons.
- **48 percent** were in Essex (**55,300**), Hudson (**29,600**) and Camden (**21,500**) Counties.
- Food Stamp households included about **512,000** persons, **244,800** adults and **267,400** children.
- In seven counties (Bergen, Hunterdon, Monmouth, Morris, Somerset, Sussex, and Warren) the number of adults exceeded the number of children in Food Stamp households.

Food Stamp households in New Jersey remained close to 215,000 families between August 1993 and February 1994, and jumped to about 222,000 families in March 1994. The number has remained between 220,000 and 222,000 since then, except for a peak in March 1995 of almost 225,000.

- The number of Other Low Income households now exceeds the number of AFDC(FS) households by about 1500, after first surpassing the latter in November 1995. There were less than 103,000 Other Low Income households in January 1994, and more than 111,000 two years later. AFDC(FS) households declined from nearly 116,000 in May 1994 to less than 110,000 by December 1995.
- Total Recipients peaked at almost 531,000 in March 1994, and then again at 529,500 in March 1995. The level was around 512,000 in December 1995 and January 1996.
- The number of Recipient Adults averaged about 246,000 in both 1994 and 1995. The number has hovered around 245,000 since June 1995.
- The number of Recipient Children which peaked at almost 283,000 in March 1994 and almost 280,000 in March 1995, declined to less than 268,000 by December 1995.

## EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (Tables 3 and 7, Graphs 3 and 7)

In January 1996 4,639 eligible AFDC families received Emergency Assistance (EA) payments in New Jersey:

- 1761 families with Temporary Rental Assistance (TRA)
- 374 motel placements
- 325 emergency shelter placements
- All other AFDC-EA accounted for 2,179 families, including back rent, back utilities, security deposits, furnishings, clothing and food allowance, or transitional housing.
- 1311 families in Essex County received EA, with 723 in Middlesex, and 428 in Ocean. All other counties had between 3 and 347, with nine counties under 100.

In the past two years the highest numbers of families receiving EA were in March and May of 1994, each with close to 8000. The number has declined since, and dropped below 5000 in January 1996.

- The number of families provided TRA each month has declined steadily from about 3600 in early 1994, and has been below 2000 since September 1995.
- Emergency Shelter and Motel Housing have each been provided to under 500 families each month, except for three months in 1994 and one in 1995 when Motel Housing exceeded 500.
- An average of 3300 families received Other EA in 1994 and 2800 in 1995. The number dropped to 2200 in January 1996.

## **JOBS/FDP PARTICIPATION RATES** (Table 8, Graph 8)

The Statewide JOBS/FDP participation rate of 23.7 percent in January 1996 was the third month of decline since a high of almost 28 percent in October 1995, and was nearly three percent below December 1995. Nevertheless, January 1996 was more than three percent higher than the January 1995 rate of 20.4 a year earlier. A clear upward shift was evident in 1995, as had occurred in 1994.

- Since July 1995, many counties have shown upward movement in participation rates. Most counties tend to show small fluctuations, with Cape May, Essex, Hudson, Middlesex, Ocean, and Passaic having clear upward movement. Bergen, Burlington, Camden, Gloucester, Mercer, Monmouth and Union have had minimal upward movement. Cumberland has had some fluctuations, but maintained very high participation rates overall. Atlantic, Salem, Somerset, Sussex, and Warren also exhibited high rates, but have had wide fluctuations; Warren has trended downward since the summer of 1994. Hunterdon jumped to higher levels early 1995, but moved down in recent months. Morris increased markedly in 1995 and remains at record levels.
- For January 1996, Camden, Cape May, Essex and Gloucester remained between 10 and 20 percent. Middlesex, Passaic, Salem and Sussex were between 30 and 40 percent, while Atlantic, and Warren exceeded 40 percent. Cumberland and Somerset exceeded 50 percent, while Morris exceeded 70 percent for five of the last seven months. Eight counties were between 20 and 30 percent. Seventeen counties showed lower rates in January 1996 than in December 1995.

## **GENERAL ASSISTANCE** (Table 9, Graph 9)

For the period July 1993 through July 1995 (the latest available information), the number of GA recipients peaked at 38,100 in March 1994. The level stayed around 35,000 from September through December 1994, and remained below 36,000 from January through April 1995. There was a decline of over 3,000 from May through July 1995 to a two year low of 32,400.

- The number of employable recipients peaked in March 1994 (26,400) and has been declining since then. The level remained slightly over 23,000 from September through December 1994. After increasing to over 24,000 in January 1995, the level resumed declining to 21,000 by July.
- Unemployable GA recipients have remained within a relatively narrow range. The level remained between 11,000 and 11,700 through April 1994, and hovered around 12,000 through November 1994. From December 1994 through July 1995, there were between 11,300 and 12,100 Unemployable recipients.

## **CHILD SUPPORT AND PATERNITY COLLECTIONS** (Table 10)

Total collections of the Child Support and Paternity Program grew from about \$534 million to more than \$586 million from FFY1994 to FFY1995, an increase of almost 10 percent.

- Total AFDC/Foster Care collections increased from almost \$92 million to about \$97 million, or 5.3 percent.
- Non-AFDC collections grew from \$442 million to almost \$490 million, or 10.7 percent.

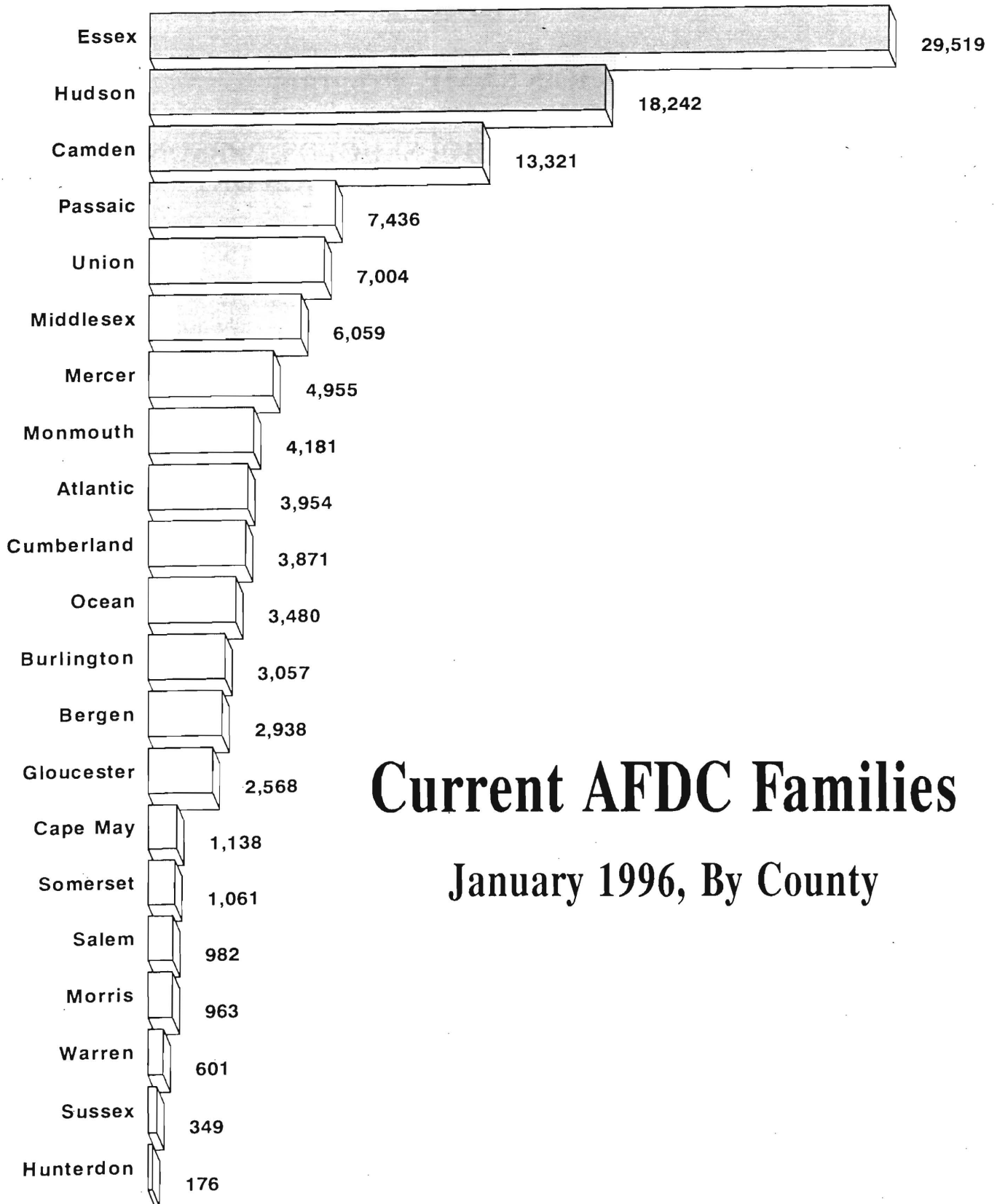

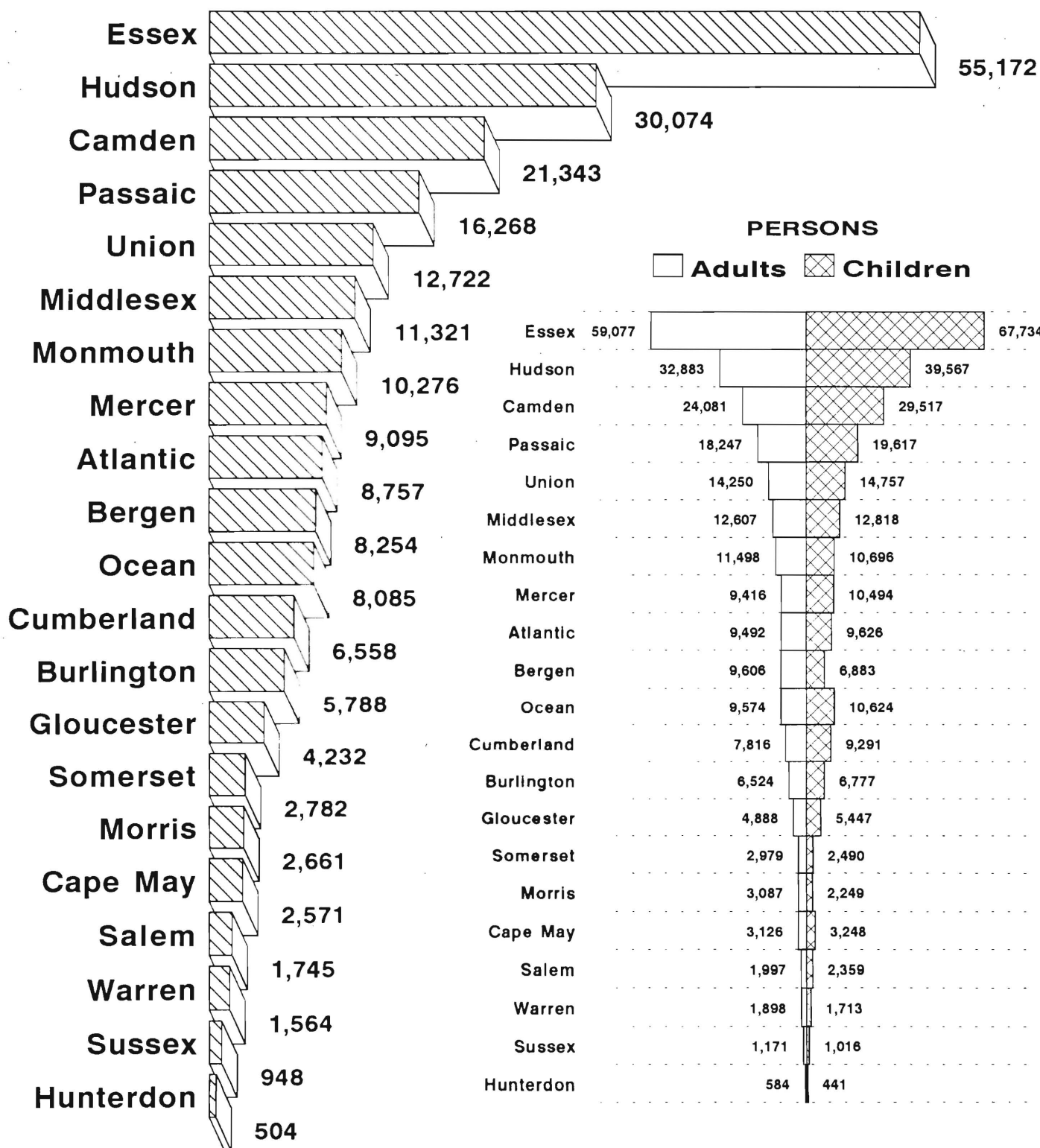

## Food Stamp Households

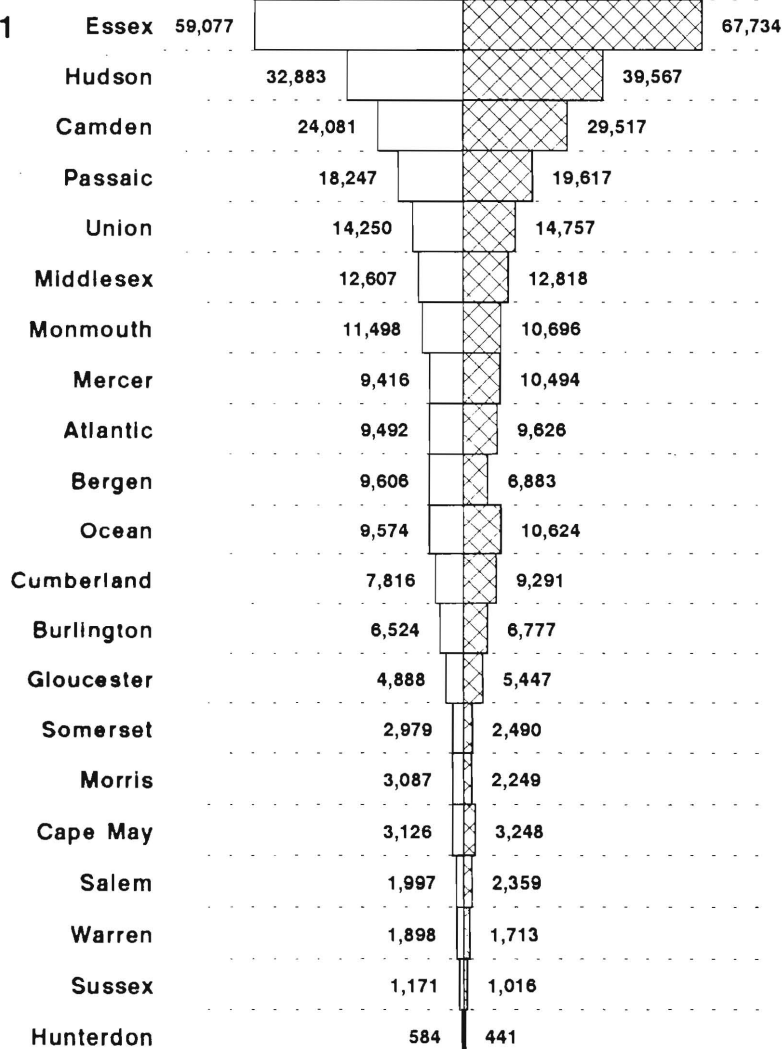
### January 1996, By County

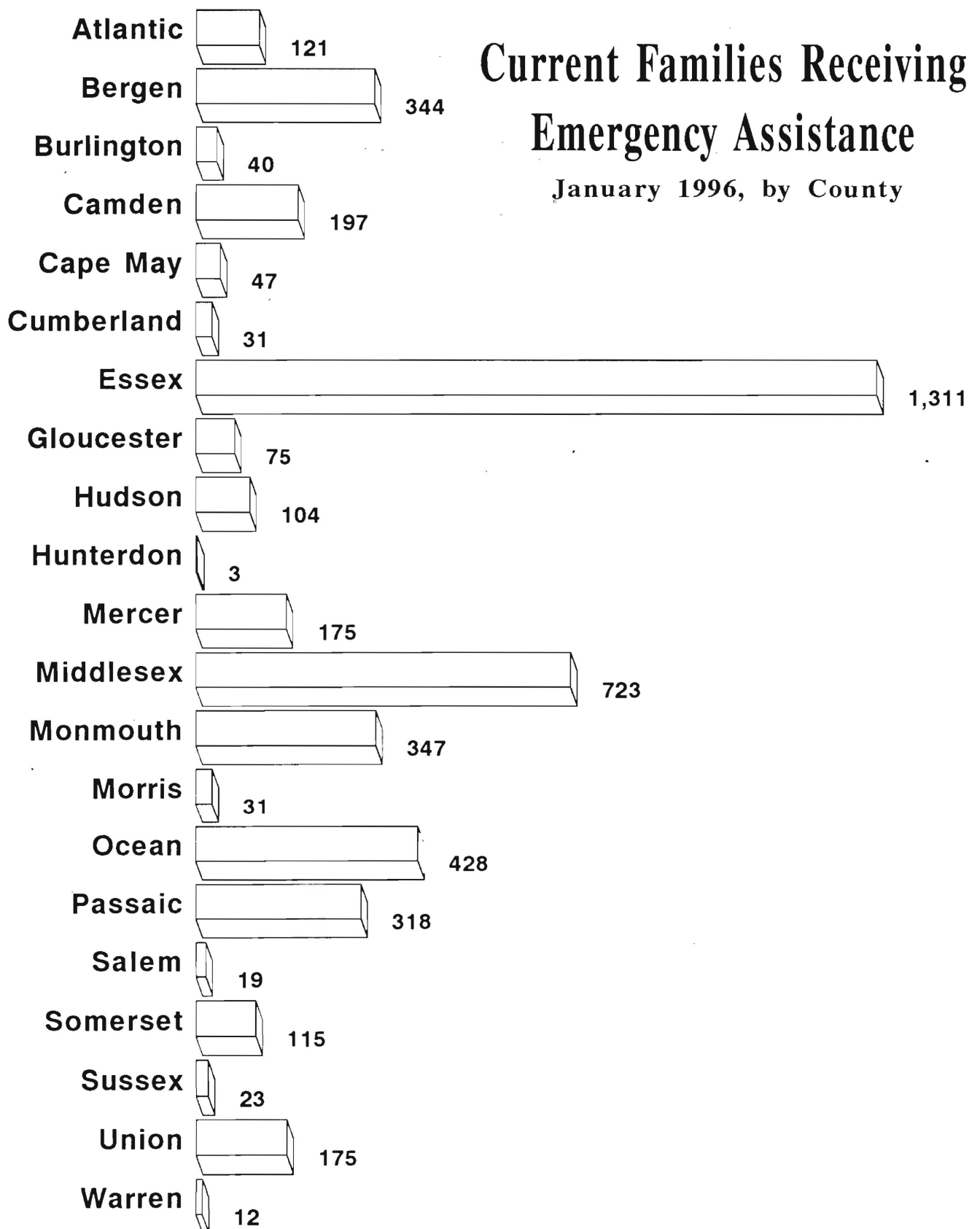

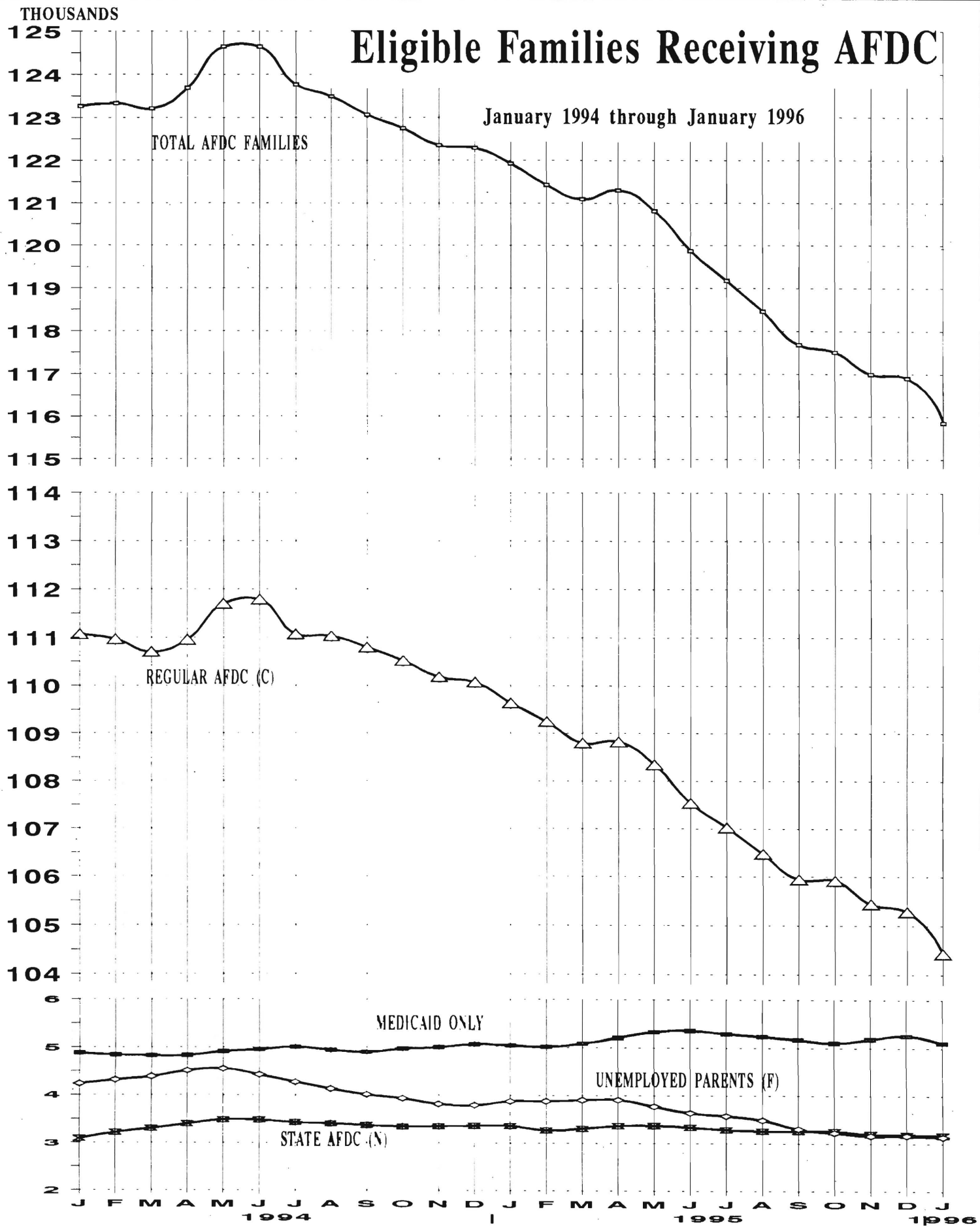

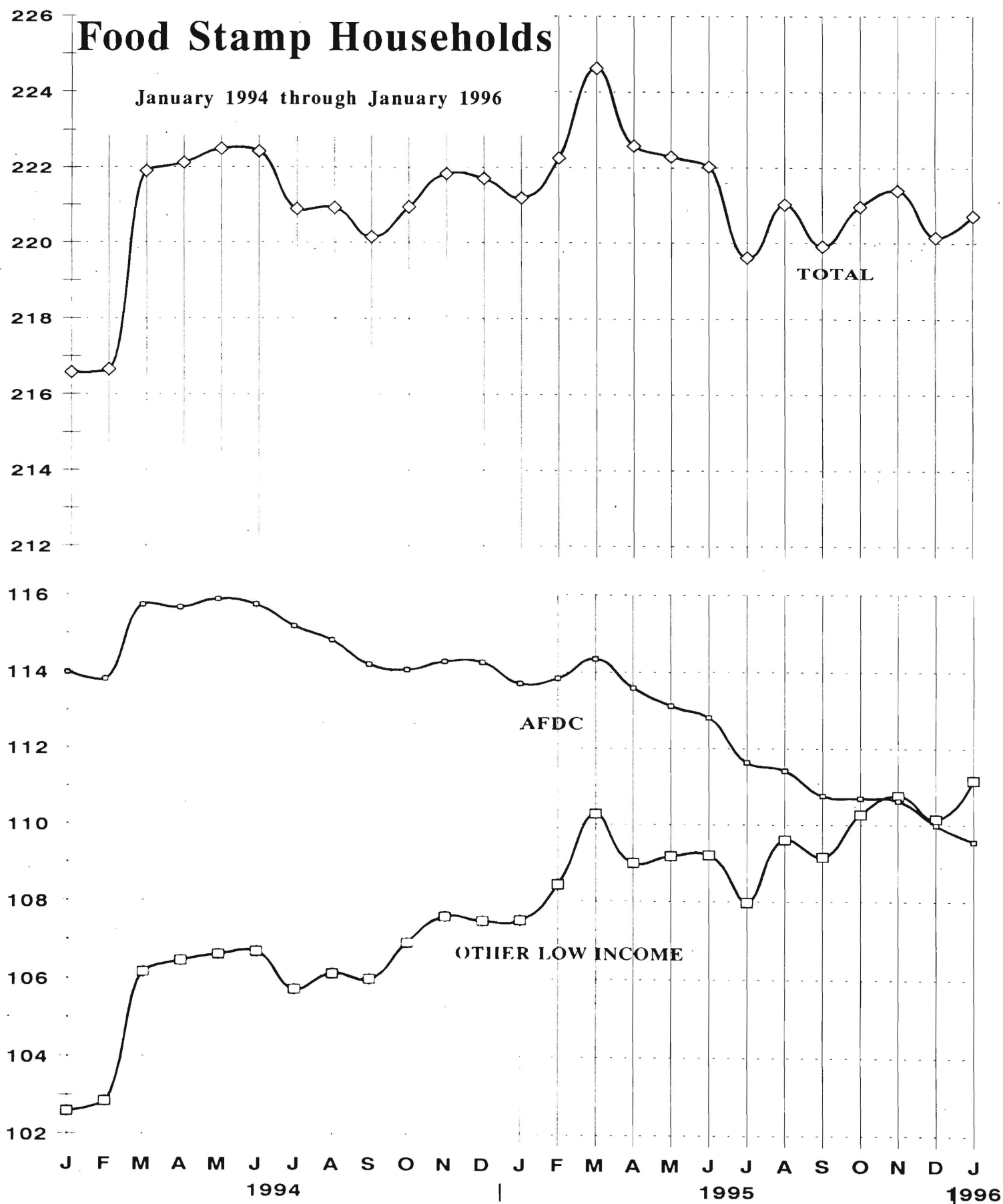

Thousands

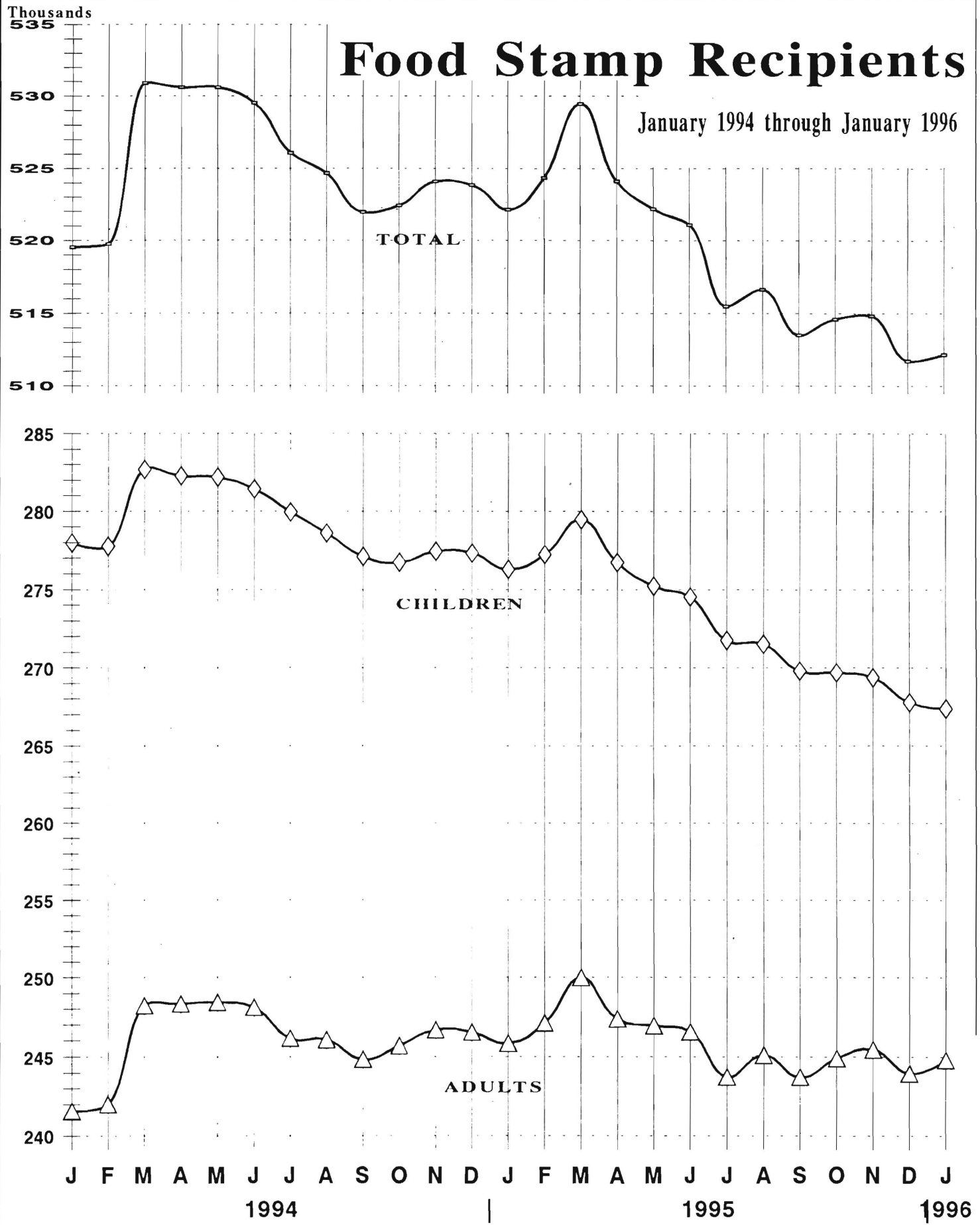
## Food Stamp Households

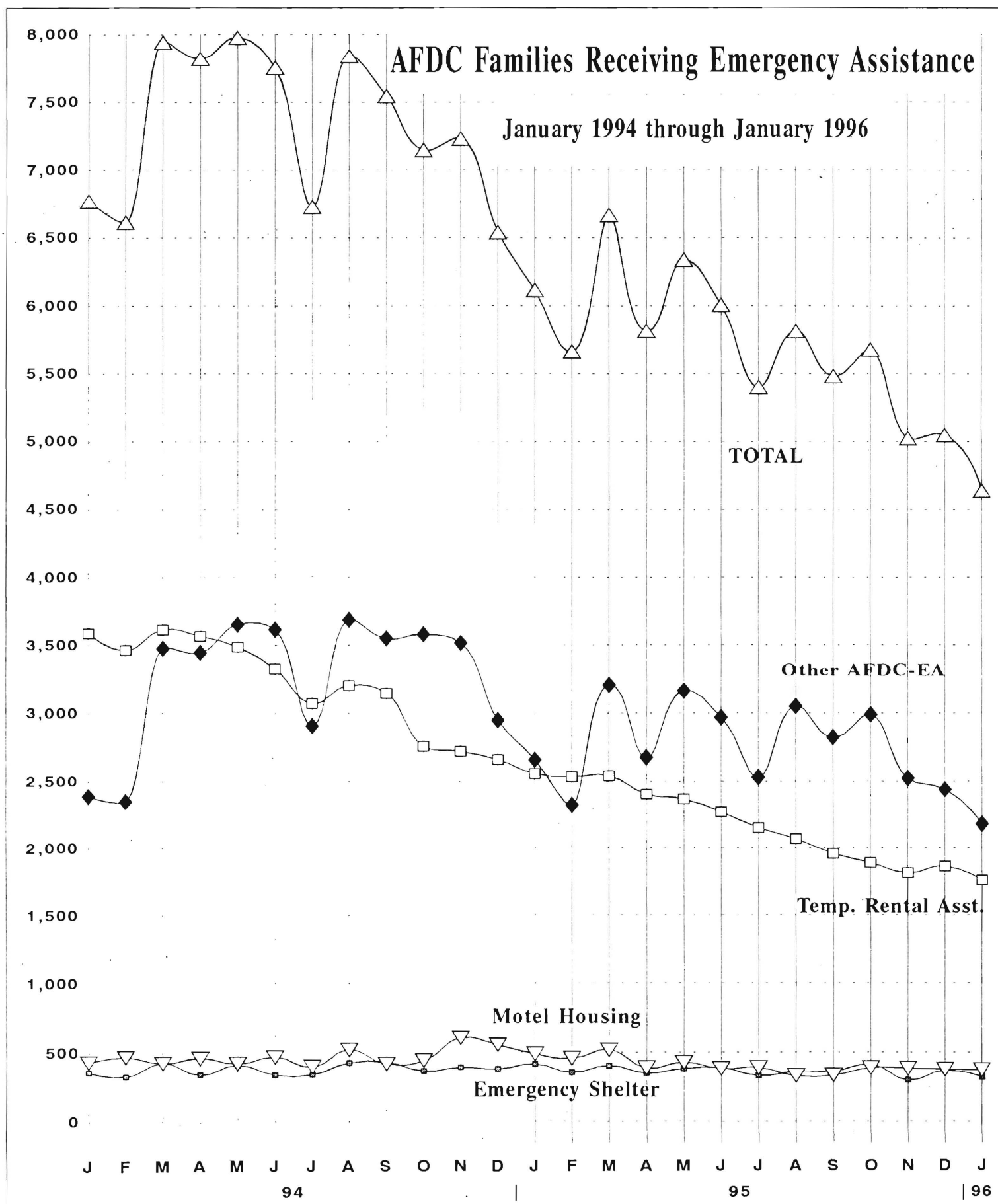

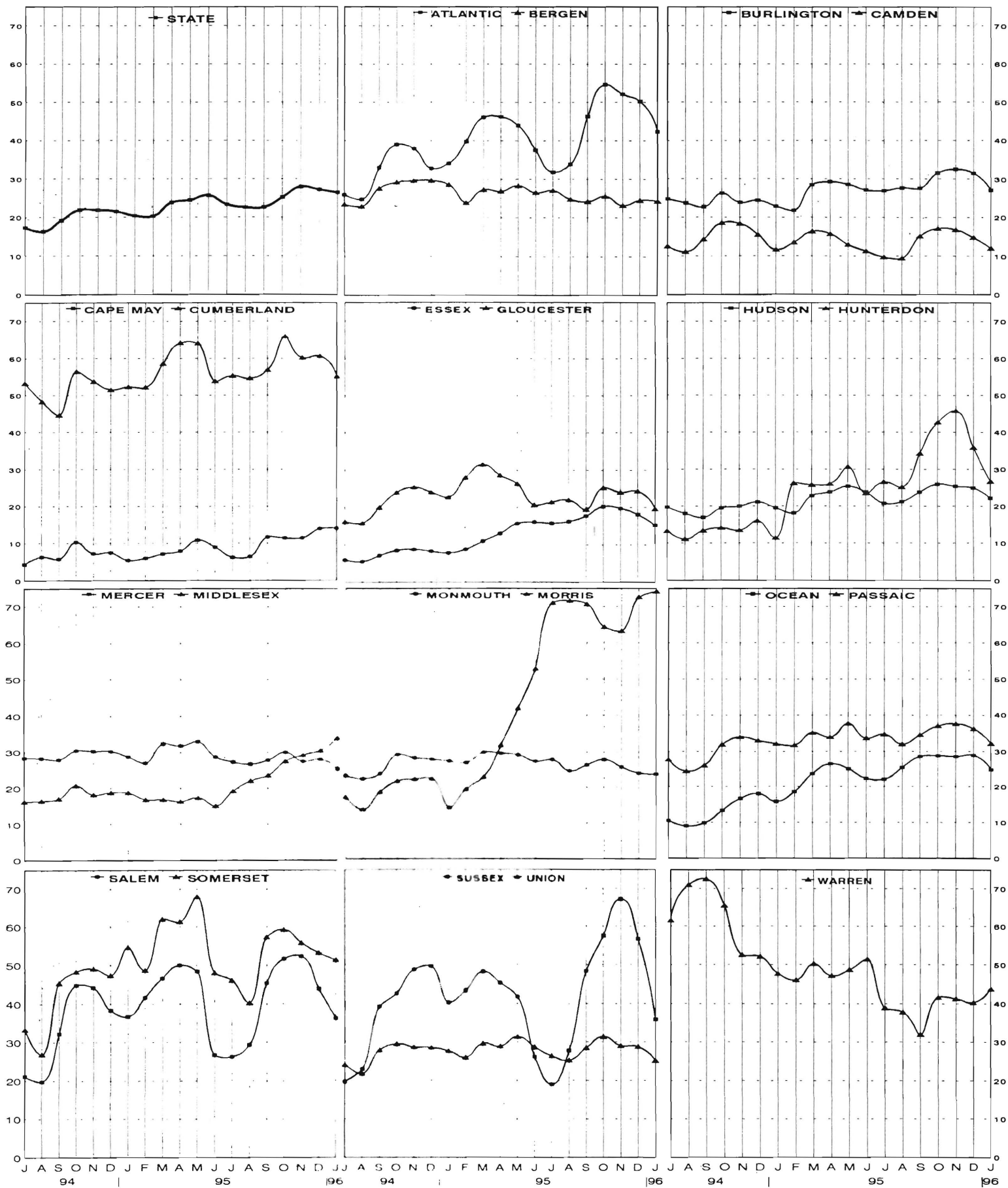

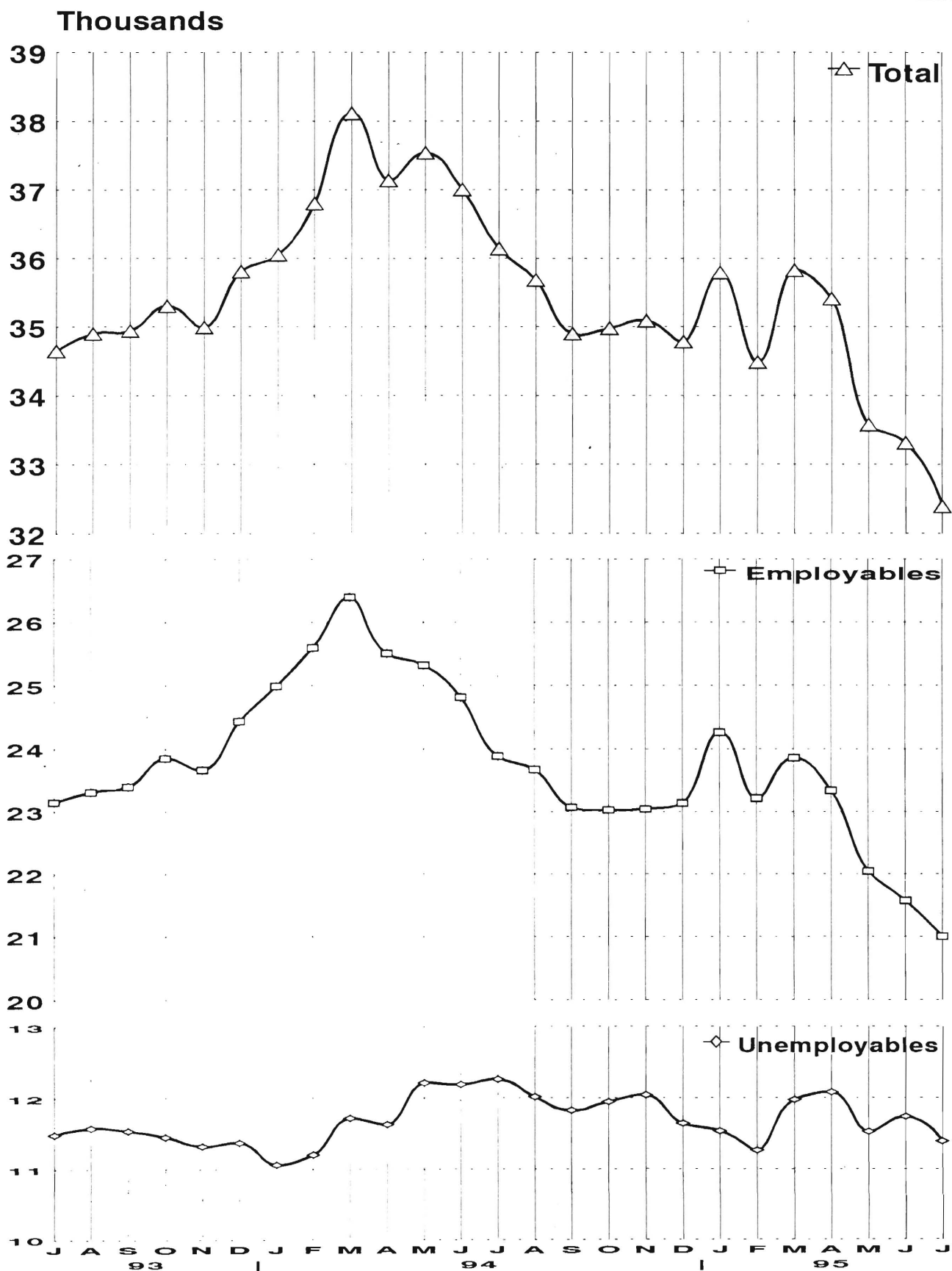

### **Explanatory Notes**

The Department of Human Services Division of Family Development provides basic income and an opportunity to achieve self-sufficiency for individuals and families served by the Division's programs. The Division provides leadership, direction and supervision to those public agencies responsible for administering those programs and plans for and develops policies to promote self-sufficiency.

**AID TO FAMILIES WITH DEPENDENT CHILDREN (AFDC)** - Financial assistance for dependent children and their natural or adoptive parents, or certain other relatives recognized as taking the place of a parent.

**Regular AFDC (C Segment)** - assistance when only one parent is in the home due to death or absence, or both parents are in the home but at least one is incapacitated.

**Unemployed Parents (F Segment)** - assistance when both parents are in the home, neither is incapacitated and the primary wage earner meets the federally defined criteria for unemployment.

**State AFDC (N Segment)** - assistance when both parents are in the home, neither is incapacitated, and the primary wage earner does not meet the federal definition of unemployment.

**Medicaid Only** - families no longer receiving AFDC financial assistance but remaining eligible for Medicaid under applicable provisions which extend coverage beyond period of AFDC assistance.

**FOOD STAMP PROGRAM (FS)** - Authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refer certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

**EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA)** - Payments to those eligible for AFDC (also for General Assistance or Supplemental Security Income, not included here), authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if the eligible individual or family is in an imminent or actual state of homelessness.



## **JOBS/FDP**

**JOB OPPORTUNITY AND BASIC SKILLS PROGRAM (JOBS)** - Federally mandated work/training program for recipients of AFDC established by the Family Support Act of 1988 under Part F of Title IV of the Social Security Act.

**FAMILY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM (FDP)** - Reform legislation enacted by the State Legislature in January 1992 to: build, strengthen, and support the family unit; encourage family formation; reduce the long-term aspects of welfare dependency; look to the needs of the family unit as a whole; emphasize education and training for all family members; maximize use of educational, training and employment resources; and develop genuine private sector job opportunities.

**Total Non-Exempt JOBS/FDP Recipients** - Calculation of the number of mandatory IV-F individuals (FAMIS report # FB304)

**Participation Rate (JOBS/FDP)** - Federally mandated calculation method, dividing the number of participants whose combined and averaged weekly hours of participation in qualifying activities equals or exceeds 20 hours per week by the total number of non-exempt IV-F recipients. As of the end of the month

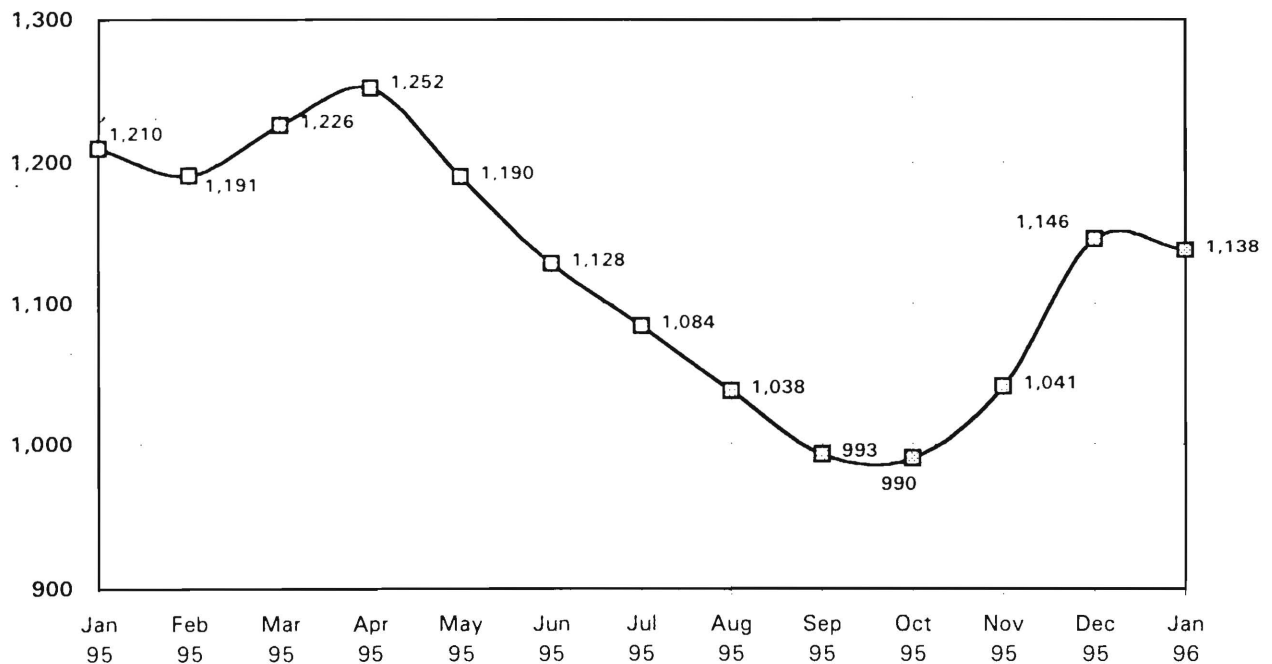

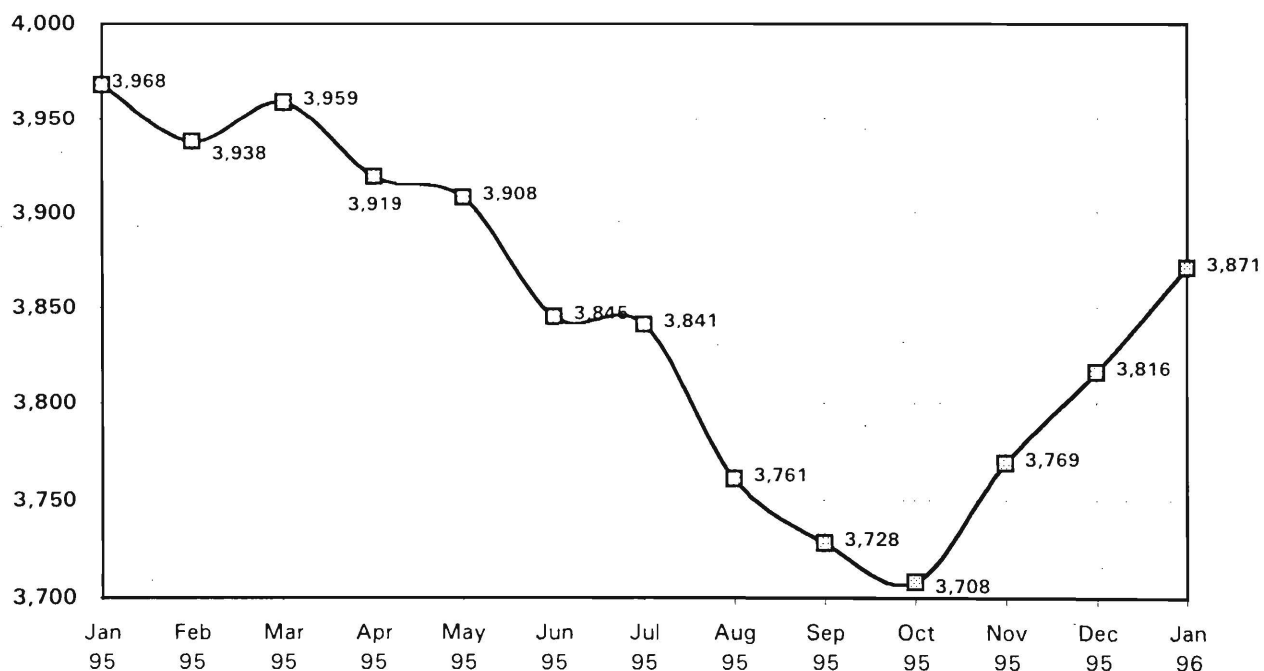
