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


Enrollment by Gender

This graph displays the percentage of students by gender for the past three school years.




Enrollment by Ethnic/ Racial Subgroup





This graph presents the percentage of students who met or exceeded expectations for the past two years.






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PARCC Math Performance Trends




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

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


Enrollment by Gender

This graph displays the percentage of students by gender for the past three school years.




Enrollment Trends by Special Population




Enrollment by Gender

This graph displays the percentage of students by gender for the past three school years.




Enrollment Trends by Special Population

While the School Performance Reports bring attention to important student outcomes, the NJDOE does not collect data about other essential elements of a school, such as the provision of opportunities to participate and excel in extracurricular activities; the development of non-cognitive skills; the pervasiveness of a positive school culture or climate; or the attainment of other employability and technical skills, as many of these data are beyond both the capacity and resources of schools to measure.




Enrollment by Gender

This graph displays the percentage of students by gender for the past three school years.




This graph displays the percentages of students by ethnic/racial subgroup defined by the ESEA Waiver.





This graph presents the percentage of students who met or exceeded expectations for the past two years.












Absenteeism
