## Transcript:

**Nick Hilton:** I have never heard a public official or anybody in anything like the position that you hold have such a kind of articulate such an enlightened view of all this. It's rare and positively enlightening. I think that you have a bully pulpit, I had no idea that you felt that way. I know just have a platform and forum to continue to talk about it in a way that I think is really important and so I appreciate you noticing. And it

won't change and it won't change after I leave office. You know, I'm looking forward to hopefully invited back onto the board at Daytop and working for them and working for other facilities as well after I leave office because you know that work- one of the disappointments of being US Attorney and Governor was I couldn't be on those boards anymore so it will be good I'm going back to Daytop on I think Tuesday of next week for a holiday event which I haven't been to in a few years so I need to go back and see the kids and see the folks who are helping them and it's a really important
