In view of present and prospective prices for all supplies, it is estimated that as large an amount of current income will be required for 1866, as for 1865, when special appropriation of \$10,000 was made from State treasury.

In place of such an appropriation I would suggest that the charge for county patients be increased from \$2.35 to \$3.00 per week. Such change of price would, with 277 county patients, produce the sum of \$9,662.60, which would probably carry the institution through the year without debt.

The large expenditures for building purposes required during next

two years is sufficient reason for increasing charge to counties rather than State for this purpose.

NEW BUILDINGS.

The work of extending the buildings as authorized by the legislature near the close of the last session was commenced as early in the season as plans could be prepared and other preliminary arrangements made. Since then it has been prepared as vigorously as was consistent with the ability of the State treasurer to furnish the necessarv funds.

Two sections of the building commenced have been enclosed and the foundation walls of the third raised to the ground level and

securely covered for the winter.

The work of finishing the former will go forward as rapidly as is

practicable.

It should be stated in explanation of the course pursued by the commissioners for building (and the Board of Managers of the Asylum, who approved their action), that at the time the appropriation was made no plan of building had been adopted, the act simply requiring that accommodation for 120 additional patients be made for the sum of \$60,000.

After much careful reflection and inquiry, however, as to the best method of extending, and perhaps completing the present structure, it was decided to arrange the extension for either extremity in three sections and to locate them on three sides of a square, closing the remaining side by an open paling. This method of building secured an enclosed plot of ground 80 by 100 feet in extent, for the free use

of patients from all parts of the new structure.

To carry out this plan properly, so as to secure the size of ground necessary, as well as the required internal arrangement of parts for convenience, a greater extent of building than was at first contemp'ated became necessary, and a corresponding increase in the appropriation will be needed. The extension as designed and commenced will afford easy accemdation for 200 patients instead of 120; tomeet the expense of which the appropriation should be increased from \$60,000 to \$100,000.

About \$20,000 has been expended this year, and it is hoped that the whole extension may be completed and put in use within the next

two years.

When this is done the building will accommodate 500 instead of

360 patients, the present capacity.

This extent of building it may be hoped will meet the requirements of the State for several years to come, and will accommodate asmany patients as it will be advisable to assemble in one institution.
