To the Joint Committee on Treasurer's Accounts of the Legislature of the State of New Jersey:

We have examined the report of the Treasurer of the State of New Jersey for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1933, compared the same with the books and records in the office of the State Treasurer.

Inquiry was made into the system of internal check and independent verification of the various statements was made with either the State Comptroller's Office, State Accountant, State Board of Education, or State Auditor. All securities listed in the various funds were proved with the total required by the records and either physically examined or the sale of or payment since June 30, 1933, verified.

Bank balances were confirmed by certificates received direct from the various depositories and the balances confirmed were reconciled with the balances shown by the banks.

No securities were examined or bank balances verified for either the Employees' Retirement System or Teachers' Annuity and Pension Fund, as we were informed that these were not to be examined by us and had been examined by the Department of Banking and Insurance. They are not included in this report.

Securities are valued at par value and no provision is made for any losses on the sale of or default in the payment of these securities. Nor is any provision made for losses on balances on deposit in closed or restricted banks.

Based on our examination of the books, records and securities presented to us, supplemented by personal inquiry and investigation, we certify that in our opinion the accompanying report of the Treasurer of the State of New Jersey for the year ended June 30, 1933, is a true statement of the transactions for the period and that the balances of cash and securities shown in the report for the various funds agrees with the books and the balances as verified by us.
