Regional Focus: North Jersey

Data and analysis for the Bergen-Hudson-Passaic and Newark labor areas (Bergen, Hudson, Passaic, Essex, Hunterdon, Morris, Somerset, Sussex and Union counties)

Regional Employment is Steady Over the Year

Total nonfarm employment in the Northern Region stood at a not seasonally adjusted level of 2,142,300 in December 2017, up by just 600 jobs from the same month a year ago. In comparison, unadjusted statewide nonfarm employment inched up by 0.6 percent during the period. Leisure and hospitality (+7,500 or +4.5%), manufacturing (+5,200 or +3.9%), and education and health services (+3,800 or +1.1%) were the regional job growth leaders over the year.

Employment contractions in trade, transportation and utilities (TTU, -4,100 or -0.9%), professional and business services (-3,900 or -1.1%), financial activities (-2,700 or -1.8%), and construction (-2,000 or -2.6%) were factors that dampened regional job growth. A decline of 1,100 jobs or 0.5 percent in retail trade contributed to the decline in TTU.

At the statewide level, sectors that experienced significant not seasonally adjusted employment gains since December 2016 included leisure and hospitality (+12,900 or +3.6%), education and health services (+11,600 or +1.7%), manufacturing (+7,900 or +3.3%), and construction (+3,100 or +2.0%). Much of the gain in leisure and hospitality occurred in restaurants which added 5,100 jobs (+2.4%). Within education and health services, ambulatory health care services added 7,300 jobs.

Sectors in decline over the year included government (-2,700 or -0.4%), financial activities (-2,300 or -0.9%), TTU (-1,800 or -0.2%), professional and business services (-1,700 or -0.3%) and information (-1,500 or -2.1%).

BHP Advances to Boost Regional Jobholding

Unadjusted total nonfarm employment in the Bergen-Hudson-Passaic Labor Area (BHP) advanced to 948,500 in December 2017, up by 9,900 or 1.1 percent from the same month a year ago. The labor area's gain accounts for all of the employment growth within the region.

BHP's employment levels were up due primarily to gains in the leisure and hospitality (+6,100 or +8.2%), education and health services (+2,400 or +1.5%), and professional and business services (+2,300 or +1.6%) sectors. Health care

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
was the main contributor to the gain in education and health services with hiring occurring in ambulatory health care (+2,300 or +3.6%) and hospitals (+300 or +0.9%). In Professional and business services, increases in management of companies and enterprises (+1,900 or +8.3%) and administration and support and waste management and remediation services (+2,300 or -3.9%) offset a decrease in professional, scientific and technical services (-1,900 or -3.0%). Manufacturing (+700 or -1.2%0, government (+400 or +0.3%) and TTU (+300 or +0.1%). were also up slightly over the year. In TTU, retail trade advanced by 1,500 jobs or 1.3 percent while wholesale trade (-600 or -1.0%) and transportation, warehousing and utilities (-600 or -1.4%) were down over the year. Jobholding in construction (-1,100 or -3.5%), financial activities (-500 or -0.7%), and other services (-700 or -1.9%) was down from the same month a year ago.


Unadjusted total nonfarm employment in the Newark Labor Area dipped to 1,193,800 in December 2017, down by 9,300 jobs or 0.8 percent from the same month a year ago. Despite overall job loss, the manufacturing (+4,500 or +6.1%), education and health services (+1,400 or +0.8%) and leisure and hospitality (+1,400 or +1.5%) sectors posted significant gains over the period. Within the manufacturing sector, durable goods increased by 3,500 jobs or 10.4 percent. Much of the increase in education and health care occurred in health care and offices of physicians (+1,600 or +7.5%) experienced the fastest growth in the sector. Other services (+800 or +1.5%) posted a modest gain over the past year.

Professional and business services (-6,200 or -2.8%) and TTU (-4,400 or -1.7%) experienced the most job losses over the last year. Within professional and business services, administrative and support services (-6,000 or -7.8%) accounted for the majority of the jobs lost in the sector. Retail trade (-2,600 or -2.1%) experienced the most job losses in TTU. Despite the loss in retail trade, grocery stores gained 1,400 jobs or 5.5 percent thanks in part to the continued expansion of ALDI's which now has 37 stores in New Jersey. Its newest grocery store opened in Bloomfield in June. The new store is at the site of a former Hartz pet food manufacturing facility which closed in 2011. Whole Foods has also been expanding in the state and added a store in downtown Newark in March 2017. The store is located along Broad Street and part of a redevelopment project at a long shuttered Hahne and Company department store.

Government (-3,200 or -1.8%), financial activities (-2,200 or -2.8%), construction (-900 or -2.0%), and information (-500 or -2.1%) also experienced losses over the year.



LABOR FORCE DATA

- In December 2017, the not seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for the Northern Region was 3.9 percent, a rate just 0.2 percentage point below the statewide rate of 4.1 percent and just below the December 2016 regional rate of 4.0 percent.
- In the Newark Labor Area the unadjusted unemployment rate during December 2017 was 4.0 percent. Among the counties in the labor area, unemployment rates ranged from a high of 5.1 percent in Essex County to a low of 3.1 percent in Hunterdon and Morris counties. The Bergen-Hudson-Passaic Labor Area's December 2017 unadjusted unemployment rate was 3.8 percent.




By county, the area's unemployment rates for December 2017 were: Passaic County at 4.9 percent, Hudson County at 3.8 percent, and Bergen County at 3.2 percent.

During the fourth quarter of 2017, there were 71,595 residents claiming unemployment insurance benefits in the Northern Region. This represented 45.5 percent of claimants statewide. Regional claims activity was down by 2,129 claims or 2.9 percent from the same quarter a year ago. Statewide, claims activity declined by 3,850 or 2.4 percent since the fourth quarter of 2016.



REGIONAL JOB OUTLOOK OCTOBER 2017 - DECEMBER 2017


The New Jersey Department of Labor and Workforce Development through its agreement with Burning Glass Technologies is able to provide the following labor market information aggregated from online employer job listings during the quarter. This data provides valuable insight regarding current employer demand for characteristics such as skills and educational requirements. Note that this data is not meant to represent all available employment opportunities but rather should be viewed in terms of analysis of labor market demand.

During the fourth quarter of 2017, Northern Region employers in the professional, scientific and technical services, credit intermediation, chemical manufacturing, food service and drinking places, insurance carriers, ambulatory health care services, and hospitals industries exhibited the most labor demand based on online job listing activity.

Concentrated in Bergen, Hudson, and Morris counties, employers indicated that they were most interested in filling positions for software developers, registered nurses, retail salespersons, and wholesale sales representatives. Skills that were actively sought by regional employers included customer service, project management, sales, budgeting, scheduling, and proficiency in Microsoft Office programs.

Of those job listings for which educational requirements were advertised, the majority required an Associate's degree or higher.
