Lt. Governor Kim Guadagno Presents the Governor's Jefferson Awards to New Jersey's Outstanding Volunteers

Trenton, NJ – Recognizing New Jersey's outstanding volunteers, Lt. Governor Kim Guadagno presented the prestigious Governor's Jefferson Awards to 20 citizens, organizations and companies at a ceremony at the Newark Museum. More than 1,400 nominations were submitted for this year's awards.

"Volunteerism is truly compassion in action, and these citizens have not only identified priority needs, but have found unique ways to address those needs," said Lt. Governor Guadagno. "Some of the honorees have given decades of service to their communities. Corporate volunteers have directly served thousands of victims of the Haitian earthquake. One dedicated and selfless individual gave his life responding to the needs of others during Hurricane Irene."

These honorees represent a small fraction of the approximately 1.5 million New Jersey volunteers who provide more than 170 million hours of service each year.

The Governor's Jefferson Awards is a partnership of the New Jersey Office of Volunteerism, PNC Bank, the Community Foundation of New Jersey, BD, PSEG, Verizon, and State Farm Insurance. The Governor's Volunteer Awards began under Governor Kean in the 1980's and the National Jefferson Awards were initiated in 1972 by Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis, U. S. Senator Robert Taft, Jr. and Sam Beard to establish a Nobel Prize for public and community service. New Jersey consolidated the two awards programs in 2010.

This year's award feature several categories, including a one-time-only category for those who volunteered during the response to Hurricane Irene.

Edward J. O'Malley, Chair of the Governor's Advisory Council on Volunteerism, praised the members of the Council for their dedicated work as judges for the awards.

"Our Council members set the pace for volunteerism in New Jersey, serving as judges for the awards and reading as many as 70 nominations in individual categories," said O'Malley. "The Governor's Jefferson Awards are truly a highlight and inspiration for all of us each year."
