The public meeting was called to order by Chairman O'Toole at 12:29 p.m. and ended at 1:32 p.m. The Board also met in executive session prior to the public session.

## **Report on Prior Meeting's Minutes**

Copies of the Minutes of the meeting of December 13, 2018 were delivered to the Governors of New York (in electronic form) and New Jersey (in paper form) on December 14, 2018. The time for action by the Governors of New York and New Jersey had expired at midnight on December 31, 2018.

# PATH – JOURNAL SQUARE TRANSPORTATION CENTER – HONEYBEE FOODS CORPORATION D/B/A JOLLIBEE – LRR-385 – NEW LEASE

It was recommended that the Board authorize the President of Port Authority Trans-Hudson Corporation (PATH) to enter into a lease agreement (Lease) with Honeybee Foods Corporation d/b/a Jollibee (Jollibee), to provide for the letting of an estimated 3,623 square feet of retail space on the plaza level of the Journal Square Transportation Center (Journal Square) for the operation of a restaurant.

The Lease would commence on or about April 15, 2019, and run for a term of ten years. PATH would have the right to terminate the Lease, without cause, upon 30 days' notice. It is expected that Jollibee would invest approximately \$2.8 million for the build-out of the retail space and would receive an approximately four-month free rent period during the build-out phase. The build-out would include certain utility work to be performed by Jollibee on behalf of PATH, which would be subject to reimbursement by PATH, in an amount of up to \$500,000, to be provided in the form of an additional rent credit. Should PATH exercise its early termination right, PATH would reimburse the unamortized portion of Jollibee's capital investment, in an amount of up to \$2.8 million. Over the term of the lease, PATH would receive a total aggregate rental of approximately \$3 million. Jollibee also would pay percentage rental on the portion of its gross receipts that exceeds an annual threshold amount.

The proposed lease would be subject to a brokerage commission payable to Cushman & Wakefield (C&W), in accordance with the terms of the Retail Management Agreement between PATH and C&W. In addition, PATH also would pay a commission fee to Jollibee's broker, Colliers International.

Pursuant to the foregoing report, the following resolution was adopted, with Directors Bagger, Eve, Horwitz, LaBarbera, Lynford, McCabe, McDonald, O'Toole, Pocino and Rosado in favor. Counsel confirmed that sufficient affirmative votes were cast for the action to be taken, a quorum of the Board being present.

**RESOLVED**, that the President be and he hereby is authorized, for and on behalf of Port Authority Trans-Hudson Corporation (PATH), to enter into a lease agreement with Honeybee Foods Corporation d/b/a Jollibee (Jollibee) to provide for the letting of an estimated 3,623 square feet of retail space on the plaza level of the Journal Square Transportation Center for a ten-year term, substantially in accordance with the terms outlined to the Board; and it is further

**RESOLVED**, that the President be and he hereby is authorized, for and on behalf of PATH, to enter into any other contracts and agreements necessary or appropriate in connection with the foregoing lease; and it is further

**RESOLVED**, that the form of all contracts, agreements and other documents in connection with the foregoing shall be subject to the approval of Counsel or his authorized representative, and the terms of such contracts, agreements and other documents shall be subject to review by Counsel or his authorized representative.
