Vietnam Veterans honored at two Medal Ceremonies this week.

BG Thomas J. Sullivan presented the NJ Vietnam Service Medal to 133 Atlantic, Cape May, and Cumberland County veterans as part of the "Welcome Home Vietnam Veterans" ceremony held at the Naval Air Station Wildwood in Lower Township, New Jersey. The ceremony was hosted by Naval Air Station Wildwood Museum and was attended by 450 people on Saturday, 3 May 2003.

On Wednesday, 7 May 2003, the annual "NJ Vietnam Veterans Remembrance Day" ceremony at the NJ Vietnam Memorial was preceded by the presentation of 232 NJ Vietnam Service Medals to Monmouth and Ocean County veterans by COL Emil Philibosian. 500 people attended this ceremony.

House Passes Legislation Providing Comprehensive Civil Relief to Military Personnel and their Family Members while on Active Duty.

Active duty military personnel and their families would have strengthened and expanded civil and economic protections available to them under legislation approved by the House of Representatives

this week. H.R. 100, the Service members Civil Relief Act, sponsored by Veterans' Affairs Committee Chairman, Chris Smith (NJ), which rewrites existing law, passed the House by a vote of 425 to 0 and is now headed to the Senate for further action. H.R. 100 blocks attempts by states to double tax military personnel, provides automatic 90-day stays for civil court proceedings, protects families of service members from being evicted due to non-payment of rent while the service member is on active duty, and limits interest to 6 percent on any outstanding loan balances while they remain on active duty. H.R. 100, cosponsored by Congressman Lane Evans (IL) and backed by veterans groups, military associations, and the American Bar Association, will now be referred to the Senate for their consideration and approval.

Defensive Drivers Course (DDC) Now Available Online for Army National Guard Soldiers (ARNG).

National Guard Bureau is sponsoring a new online DDC training program. Accident Avoidance/Defensive Drivers Training is a requirement for all soldiers with a military drivers license and must be updated every four years. The new online course consists of five sessions with a post test and takes 2-4 hours to complete. There is no cost for this training; however, soldiers need to obtain an access code from their unit Training Officer/ NCO to enroll.
