The New Jersey Army National Guard has won the National Guard Bureau's First Term Retention Award and the Training Pipeline Retention Award for FY03. This is all brought about in response to the abuses, which have occurred in the past. This is directed to all federal employees of this organization, Technicians, AGR, and Competitive. No one intentionally uses the government card for personal use, however, sometimes when you see that special gift for someone and your credit card has reached its limit, don't do it.just keep on walking.in fact.when you get home tonight reach into your wallet and take out the government card and put it in a safe place.don't carry it around unless you are on Official Business. The NJNG has excellent tracking systems already in place to guard against illegal uses.don't be embarrassed.
