Directions from North Jersey via Route 1:

Take Route 1 South to the last New Jersey exit ("Capitol Complex"). Turn right onto Warren Street and go to the light where you will make a left onto Market Street. Pass through the next light at William Trent Place and bear right following signs for the Capitol Complex. The Division of Elections is located at 225 West State Street and is a half a block from the State House.

Directions from South Jersey:

Take I-295 North to Rte. 29 toward Trenton, Exit 60. Continue onto Rte. 29 North and take the Calhoun Street exit. Turn right onto West State Street. 225 West State Street is the first building on your right.

Public Transportation:

Direct rail service to Trenton is provided by both NJ Transit (including the River Line)(1-800-582-5946) and Amtrak (1-800-872-7245). NJ Transit also provides bus service to and within the Trenton area.

From the Train Station:

Cabs:

Cabs are available at the rear of the station.

Buses:

Buses stop in front of the train station at the corner of South Clinton Avenue. Most service West State Street.

Electoral Responsibilitie

Outline of Primary Electoral Responsibilities for the Election Offices in New Jersey

A. Secretary of State (through the Division of Elections):

- 1. Chief Election Official in the State to assure compliance with both the federal National Voter Registration Act (NVRA), and the Help America Vote Act of 2002 (HAVA) which includes reporting requirements to the Election Assistance Commission, respectively.
- 2. Certifies voting machines for use in all elections.
- 3. Filing Officer for all federal and state public elective offices.
- 4. Oversees compliance with polling place accessibility for elderly and voters with disabilities.
- 5. Regulatory authority for voter registration, political party declarations, mail-in ballot voting, and election district requirements.
- 6. Clerk of the Board of State Canvassers, which certifies federal elections and state office and public question elections. The Board consists of four members of the Legislature.

B. County Superintendent of Elections

(in eleven counties of New Jersey):

- 1. County's Commissioner of Registration, responsible for review and maintenance of the County's voter registration records.
- 2. Custodian of the County's voting machines.
- 3. Police Powers to enforce election laws pursuant to Title 19, Election Laws of New Jersey.

C. County Board of Election*

(in all 21 counties):

- 1. Recruits, appoints, trains and supervises district board workers.
- 2. Certifies the polling places, which require inspection to insure compliance with accessibility requirements.
- 3. Canvasses and counts mail-in and provisional ballots.
- 4. Issues challenger permits and badges.
- 5. Conducts election recounts, under court order.
- 6. Establishes and maintains election districts.
- * In those eleven counties without the Office of County Superintendent of Elections, the County Board of Election acts as the County Commissioner of Registration and custodian of the voting machines, but does not have police powers.

D. County Clerk

- 1. Filing Officer for nomination petitions for county offices and petitions for independent municipal candidates.
- 2. Designs and prints ballot materials (i.e., mail-in ballot, emergency, machine strips, provisional and sample ballots).

Outline of Primary Electoral Responsibilities for the Election Offices in New Jersey (cont'd)

- 3. Publishes the notice of mail-in ballot availability for any statewide, countywide or school election in a regional or other school district comprimising more than one municipality.
- 4. Reviews mail-in ballot applications; if approved, sends out ballot materials; if rejected, notifies voter.
- 5. Clerk of the County Board of Canvassers (which is the four member County Board of Election), which certifies election results for county, partisan municipal and school elections.
- 6. Filing Officer for Election Law Enforcement Commission reports by county and municipal candidates.
- 7. Issues Certificates of Election to county and municipal candidates duly elected at general elections.

E. Municipal Clerk

- 1. Voter registration office for the receipt of voter registration and party declaration forms.
- 2. Recommends polling places to the County Board of Election.
- 3. Assists County Superintendents and Boards of Election in assuring the proper conduct of an election.
- 4. Publishes the notice for mail-in ballot availability in any municipal election or in school election for a school district within a single municipality.
- For non-partisan elections, the municipal clerk is the filing officer for nomination petitions, designs and prints the ballot and certifies the election results.

F. School Board Secretary*

- 1. Filing officer for nomination petitions for school board candidates.
- 2. Draws ballot position for school board elections.
- * It is the school board that sets the hours for a school election and the hourly wages for the district board workers.

G. Fire District Commission*

- 1. Clerk of Fire District publishes mail-in ballot notice.
- 2. Fire District Commissioners conduct election.
- * County Clerk provides mail-in ballot applications and ballots; County Commissioner of Registration provides registry list, and County Board of Election counts mail-in ballots.

NJ Voting Informatio

You Can Vote in the Voting Machine if:

- vour complete voter registration information is in the poll book;
- you currently live in the election district or moved out of the County after the close of registration for this election (thereafter you must be registered in your new County); and
- there are no successful challenges to your right to vote.

You Have the Right to-

- vote in private in the voting machine;
- bring voting materials (such as the sample ballot, but no campaign material) into the voting booth to help you vote;
- a "reasonable" amount of time to cast your vote.

Instructions on use of the voting machine are available in the polling place. If you do not see them, ask any board worker.

Assistance in the Voting Machine

If you are blind, disabled or cannot read the ballot on the machine, you can have someone of your choice assist you in the voting machine.

If you are alone and are entitled to assistance, two board workers of opposite political parties may help you.

You have the right to have both workers assist you or one worker - It is your choice.

The district board workers must first fill out a disability certificate for you before you go into the voting machine.

Standing in Line to Vote

If you are in line to vote after the polls have closed - You MUST be allowed to vote. Board workers CANNOT turn you away.

Emergency Ballots

If the voting machine is **not working**, **DO NOT LEAVE** the Polling Place. A board worker will give you a Paper Emergency Ballot. If you spoil your ballot, you have the right to ask the board worker for another ballot.

ID Requirements - Certain "Active Need ID" Voters

The following voters have to show ID at the polling place:

- 1. If you registered to vote by mail in this County after January 1, 2003, and never voted in a federal election in the County, you were required to provide identification. If you did not provide identification before voting for the first time at the polling place, you must show the board workers identification today
- before voting for the first time at the polling place, you must show the board workers identification today.

 2. If you did not complete section 5 of the New Jersey voter registration form (section 5 requires a Driver's License #, or last 4 digits ofthe social security number, or an affirmation you do not have either set of numbers), and you did not respond to a request for such information, you must show the board workers identification today.
- 3. If you were a mail-in registrant and did provide your driver's license number or the last four digits of your social security number, but the numbers could not be verified, you must show the board workers identification today.

If you DO NOT show the board workers any identification you CANNOT vote in the voting machine. You MUST vote with a provisional paper ballot.

An identifying document may include, but is not limited to: Any Valid and Current Photo ID: NJ driver's license; Military or other Government ID; Student or Job ID; Store Membership Card, or,

Any current document with your name and address on it, including but not limited to: Bank statement; Pay check; Car registration; Rent receipt; Sample ballot; Government check or document; Utility bill; Non-photo NJ driver's license

Provisional Ballot Voting - You MUST Vote by Provisional Ballot if:

- you are a registered voter in the County who moved within the County and did not notify the County Commissioner of Registration before election day of your current address; or
- 2. your registration information is not complete in the poll book, for example your signature or address is missing; or
- 3. you are an "Active need ID" voter who has not provided identification information (see above section); or
- 4. there is a marking in the poll book that you applied for a mail-in ballot, but you didn't tell the board worker: a. you did not apply for one; or b. you applied for a mail-in ballot, but did not receive it; or c. you received it but did not return it.

How to Vote by Provisional Ballot:

- 1. The board worker will give you a paper ballot and an envelope.
- 2. The board worker must provide you with a place to vote the ballot in secret.
- 3. Put the voted ballot in the envelope and seal it.
- 4. Sign and complete the "Affirmation Statement" that is attached to the envelope. DO NOT DETACH the Affirmation Statement. *If you do not sign the Affirmation Statement, your ballot will not be counted.
- 5. Give the envelope to the board worker.
- 6. Watch the board worker put the envelope into the provisional ballot bag, or you may put your ballot into the bag yourself.
- 7. If you spoil your ballot, you have the right to ask the board worker for another ballot.

No provisional ballot is counted at the polling place. All provisional ballots are taken to the County Commissioner of Registration's office after the close of the polls for verification and counting by the County the County Board of Election.

After the election, you can call 1-877-NJ-VOTER (1-877-658-6837) to find out if your ballot was counted. If your ballot was not counted, you can find out why it was rejected.

Complaints

Complaint Forms are available if you have a complaint regarding the conduct of the election at this polling place. Ask any board worker for a form.

Challenger Do's & Don'ts

Challengers Can:

Challenge a voter if the challenger believes the voter is not qualified to vote. In order to vote a person must be: ■ a United States citizen ■ registered to vote ■ 18 years of age or older ■ a resident of the County for at least 30 days before the election

A person on probation or parole for a felony conviction cannot vote. A challenger must sign an affidavit stating the reason for the challenge.

Challengers Cannot:

- 1. Challenge a voter for any of these reasons:
 - a. they think they know how the voter is going to vote.
 - b. the race or ethnic origin of the voter.
 - c. the voter resides in a particular ward, housing complex, or section of municipality or county.

It is a criminal offense for a challenger to challenge a voter for any of the above 3 reasons.

- 2. Sit with the district board workers or touch the election materials.
- 3. Go to the voting machine during the voting hours.
- 4. Challenge the voter directly. Only the district board can ask the voter questions.
- 5. Wear any campaign buttons, signs or campaign clothing.
- 6. Harass or intimidate any voters; or cause any disturbances in the polling place.
- Challenge a voter because the district board asks the voter to affirm his or her residence, or asks a first-time registrant by mail to show identification.

Challenge Process in Polling Place

- If your right to vote is challenged, the board workers may ask you for identification and you must sign an affidavit.
- The challenger must also sign an affidavit.
- If the board workers vote to reject the challenge or there is a tie vote on the challenge, you have the right to vote in the voting machine.
- If the board votes to uphold the challenge, you cannot vote but you have the right to go to a Superior Court Judge to request a court order to vote. The board workers must tell you where to go to see the Judge.

Election Offenses

- Electioneering It is a crime under State law to electioneer within 100 feet of the outside entrance of the polling place up to and including the polling room. There can be no campaign signs or material in this area and no one can campaign on behalf of any candidate or public question.
- Fraudulent Voting It is a crime under federal and State law to attempt to vote or vote knowing you are not entitled to vote, or to provide false information when registering to vote or voting. You are not permitted to vote more than once in an election.
- Conspiracy It is a federal crime to conspire to deprive voters of a fair election. If anyone is harassing you or improperly interfering with your right to vote, ask the board worker for assistance.

Mail-In Voting in New Jersey

It is now the law that any voter can vote by mail-in ballot in any election.

Mail-In Ballot Application Process

To get a Mail-In ballot, you must fill out an application. You can get an mail-in ballot application from the County Clerk's office. You can also visit www.NJElections.org to download an application.

Make sure you properly fill out the Application:

- Print your name and address. You must Sign and Date the Application. A Power of Attorney signature on behalf of a voter is not acceptable. If you do not sign the application, it will be rejected.
- If you receive assistance in completing the application, the name,address, and signature of the assistor must be provided.

The Mail-In Ballot Application must go to your County Clerk's Office. If you mail it to your County Clerk, it needs to get there at least 7days before the election. After that day, you must deliver the application to the County Clerk's Office. Ballots can be issued by the Clerk until 3:00 p.m. of the day before the election.

Authorized Messenger Application Process

Any voter may ask someone to be their Authorized Messenger to go to the County Clerk's office to get the ballot


- At the bottom of the application, you must write the name of the person you choose as your Authorized Messenger.
- No one can be your Authorized Messenger without your permission.
- The Authorized Messenger must be a family member of the voter or a registered voter of the county.
- No candidate in the election for which you are requesting an mail in ballot can be an Authorized Messenger. Now, you can ask for a mail-in ballot for all the elections in a calendar year with one application. Also, any voter who wishes to vote only by mail-in ballot for all general elections can request to automatically receive a ballot for such elections.

Exit Polling

Exit Polling is not allowed within 100 feet of the entrance of the polling place. It is Legal You may be asked by a member of the press or non partisan interest group about your voting when you are leaving the polling place. You do not have to answer any questions - it is your choice.

The duties of the FEC, which is an independent regulatory agency, are to disclose campaign finance information, to enforce the provisions of the law such as the limits and prohibitions on contributions, and to oversee the public funding of Presidential elections.

Automatic Tabulating Equipment -

includes apparatus which automatically examines and counts votes recorded on ballot cards, and tabulates the results.

Ballot -

except when reference is made to irregular ballots, means that portion of the ballot containing the name of the candidate and the designation of the party by which he was nominated, or a statement of a proposed constitutional amendment, or other question or proposition with the word "yes" for voting for any question or proposition, and the word "no" for voting against any question.

Ballot Card -

a tabulating card on which votes may be recorded.

N.J.S.A. 19:53A-1b

Ballot Labels -

the pages, cards, or other material containing the names of offices and candidates and the statement of measures to be voted on, which are placed on the voting device.

Circulator -

an individual, whether paid or unpaid, who solicits signatures for a petition.

Commissioner -

the commissioner of registration in counties.

County Boards of Elections -

Election District -

Elected Official -

 - (a) was registered to vote, or had all the qualifications to register and vote, in New Jersey; or
 - (b) had all the qualifications to register and vote in New Jersey other than having attained 18 years of age but has since attained that age; or
 - (c) would, but for residence, have the qualifications to register and vote in New Jersey;
- (2) does not maintain a Residence in the United States and is not registered or qualified to vote elsewhere in the United States; and
- (3) holds a valid passport or card of identity and registration issued under authority of the Secretary of State of the United States.

Public Question -
