


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Enrollment by Grade This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.

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


Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup






Proficiency Trends - Math



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

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


Enrollment by Grade




Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup







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

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


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












# **Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup**














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This graph presents the grade level outcomes in the categories of Advanced Proficient, Proficient, and Partially Proficient over the last four years.












# **Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup**
























# **Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup**
















