The foregoing 219 cases involved 281 separate violations, as set forth below, comparing with a total of 34 cases involving 48 violations for the fiscal year 1937-38. Of the total number, 78 were Fair Trade cases in municipalities scattered throughout the State; 94 involved other charges against Newark licensees; 19 other charges against West New York licensees, and the balance against licensees scattered throughout the State but conducted at the Department because the complaint had been made by a coordinate law enforcement agency (e.g., the Federal Alcohol Tax Unit); or the license had been issued directly by the Commissioner because a member of the municipal issuing authority was interested therein; or the municipal authority had requested that the particular case be conducted by the Department. Penalties preceded by an asterisk were imposed in cases where one or more additional charges were involved, and no separate penalty was imposed on the separate charges.

3. MINIMUM OR COVER CHARGES - IMPROPER TO LEVY SUCH CHARGES WITHOUT FAIR NOTICE TO THE PARTY SOUGHT TO BE SUBJECTED THERETO.

Being that we were told after the drinks were served and said charge was not advertised anywhere on the premises, we objected to paying same.

There is nothing in the alcoholic beverage law or the State Regulations requiring the advertising of minimum or cover charges.

Neither is there anything authorizing a licensee to exact minimum or cover charges without bringing the matter to the attention of the customer. If what you say is the truth and the whole of it your objection was justified.

Enclosed is copy of Re Shingler, Bulletin 272, Item 1, in which a similar practice against good business ethics was condemned and in which I pointed out that while there is no formal rule there are remedies to effect a cure for such an unfair practice.

If you will give me the name of the licensee who imposed the minimum charge without properly advertising it, I will see that he is warned to discontinue the practice.

4. NEW LEGISLATION - ALCOHOL - SALES TO CONSUMERS - RETAIL LICENSEES SHALL NOT SELL OR POSSESS ALCOHOL AND NO PERSON SHALL SELL ALCOHOL AT RETAIL TO CONSUMERS EXCEPT PURSUANT TO SPECIAL PERMIT ISSUED BY STATE COMMISSIONER.

Assembly Bill No. 217 was approved by Governor Moore on July 11, 1939 and thereupon became Chapter 173, P. L. 1939.

This supplement is therefore effective immediately. It reads:

"AN ACT concerning alcoholic beverages, and supplementing chapter one of Title 35 of the Revised Statutes.

"BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

"1. No retail licensee shall sell, offer for sale or possess in or upon the licensed premises nor shall any person sell or offer for sale at retail to consumers any alcohol for any purpose, except pursuant to and within the limitations of a special permit issued by the State Commissioner of Alcoholic Beverage Control.

"2. Any person who sells or offers for sale, or any retail licensee who sells, offers for sale or possesses alcohol in violation of this act shall be punished by a fine of not less than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) and not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00), or by imprisonment of not less than thirty (30) days and not more than three (3) years, or by both fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the court.

"3. Nothing herein contained shall apply to the sale or possession of alcohol which is not intended for beverage purposes and has been denatured or otherwise rendered unfit in fact for beverage purposes, nor with the possession of alcohol for the actual manufacture of United States Pharmacopoeia and National Formulary preparations and for the compounding of physicians' original prescriptions by pharmacists registered by the Board of Pharmacy of the State of New Jersey under the laws of the State of New Jersey, who are owners or managers of pharmacies registered with the Board of Pharmacy and operated under unlimited permits issued by the Board of Pharmacy of the State of New Jersey.

"4. This act shall take effect July first, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine."

5. ALCOHOL - SALES TO CONSUMERS - SPECIAL PERMITS - TO WHOM ISSUABLE - OBJECTIVES OF THE NEW LEGISLATION.

July 11, 1939

Dear Sir:

Up until this week we have referred patients of physicians requiring pure grain alcohol for external use to the licensed liquor firm of Frankel & Nelson, 372 Main Street, East Orange. This firm now advises us that they have been informed they can no longer supply this article.

Kindly let us know where we can refer a patient to get pure alcohol when the so-called rubbing alcohol will not answer the purpose.

Gentlemen:

I have yours of the 11th.

Bill 217 has become Chapter 173, P.L. 1939, effective July 11, 1939. Enclosed is copy.

You will note that the statute exempts alcohol unfit in fact for beverage purposes and alcohol used by registered pharmacists in the manufacture of U.S.P. and N.F. preparations and the compounding of physicians! original prescriptions.

You will observe that the licensed liquor firm has been misinformed when it says that it can no longer supply pure grain alcohol. It may providing it applies for and receives a special permit to do so.

The same privilege is likewise open to you as a <u>pharmacist</u> even though you have no liquor license, provided that you too obtain such a special permit.

Forms of application and of such special permits are being devised and will be ready shortly.

The objective of the legislation is to wipe out, as far as possible, illicit activity in the home manufacture and rectification of alcoholic beverages. Interference with the legitimate use of grain alcohol for family and therapeutic purposes will be reduced to the minimum necessary to the exercise of a proper control over a commodity inherently susceptible to misuse.

6. UNLAWFUL PROPERTY - COMPOUNDS DESIGNED FOR HOME MANUFACTURE OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES - WARNING.

July 11, 1939

Ace High Products Co., W. Brooklyn, IN. Y.

Gentlemen:

On or about June 8, 1939, a messenger left two full one-ounce bottles, one labeled "Ace High Imitation Rye Extract", the other labeled "Ace High Imitation Anisette Extract", at this Department, with the request that their contents be analyzed. With them was left your card bearing the address used above.

Copy of the analysis is enclosed.\*

Your attention is called to, and you are hereby warned of, R. S. 33:1-66 (Control Act, Section 64(d)), which declares certain substances unlawful property and subject to seizure and inflicts heavy penalties.

You are further warned that under State Regulations 20, Rule 18, no licensee may lawfully sell or permit any such extracts as yours upon licensed premises.

\*The analysis showed that the rye extract had an alcoholic proof of 60.40; the anisette a proof of 120.80.

Menoth G. Battista, the Department's Graduate Chemist, reported:

"Sample A-6126 is a flavoring extract artificially colored. As is, it is unfit as an alcoholic beverage. It is soluble in alcohol and water, making a palatable alcoholic beverage having the taste and aroma similar to rye whiskey, making it fit for beverage purposes.

"Sample A-6127 is a flavoring extract having anise flavoring. As is, it is unfit as an alcoholic beverage. It is soluble in alcohol and water, making a palatable alcoholic beverage having the flavor, taste and aroma similar to anisette, making it fit for beverage purposes."
