Nonfarm wage and salary employment in New Jersey dropped sharply on a seasonally adjusted basis by 21,200 from March to an April level of 3,062,100. Less than seasonally expected hiring in restaurants and service-related businesses such as hotels and amusements and an overall weakening in most manufacturing industries accounted for the over-the-month decline.

Jobholdings in nonmanufacturing declined on a seasonally adjusted basis by 13,000 to 2,330,000 in April. Construction, down by 6,300 to a seasonally adjusted level of 112,100, contributed to this loss as hiring in the residential building and the special trades segments was less than seasonally expected. Wholesale and retail trade employment dropped by 5,600 after seasonal adjustment, primarily due to losses in food stores and apparel shops. All other nonfactory industries, except mining, recorded over-the-month decreases of from 100 to 600 jobs.

Factory division employment declined for the ninth consecutive month to a seasonally adjusted 732,100 jobs, which was the lowest manufacturing employment level since April 1950. The loss of 8,200 jobs over the month was primarily due to a number of layoffs and plant closings throughout the sector. Particularly affected were the apparel, food, and electrical equipment industries, which lost 1,500; 1,400; and 1,100 jobs, respectively.

After seasonal adjustment, the average workweek of factory production workers dipped slightly by 0.1 hours to 40.4 hours in April. Reflecting the marginal decline in the workweek, the weekly earnings of manufacturing production workers were off by 96 cents from March to an average of \$337.24 in April.

LABOR AREA COMMENTS (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

Total nonagricultural wage and salary employment declined from March to April in five of the state's ten major labor areas, and generally increased less than seasonally expected in the remaining five areas. Newark, Atlantic City and Long Branch-Asbury Park experienced the greatest over-the-month gains, increasing 2200, 1900, and 1400, respectively on the strength of the nonmanufacturing sector.

The manufacturing sector continued to show the effects of the national recession as nine areas recorded decreases. Only the Jersey City Labor Area remained stable over the month. The Newark Labor Area registered the largest decrease in manufacturing, declining by 2100. Plant closings and layoffs were the main reasons for this decline. Particularly affected were the apparel, food, and electrical equipment industries.

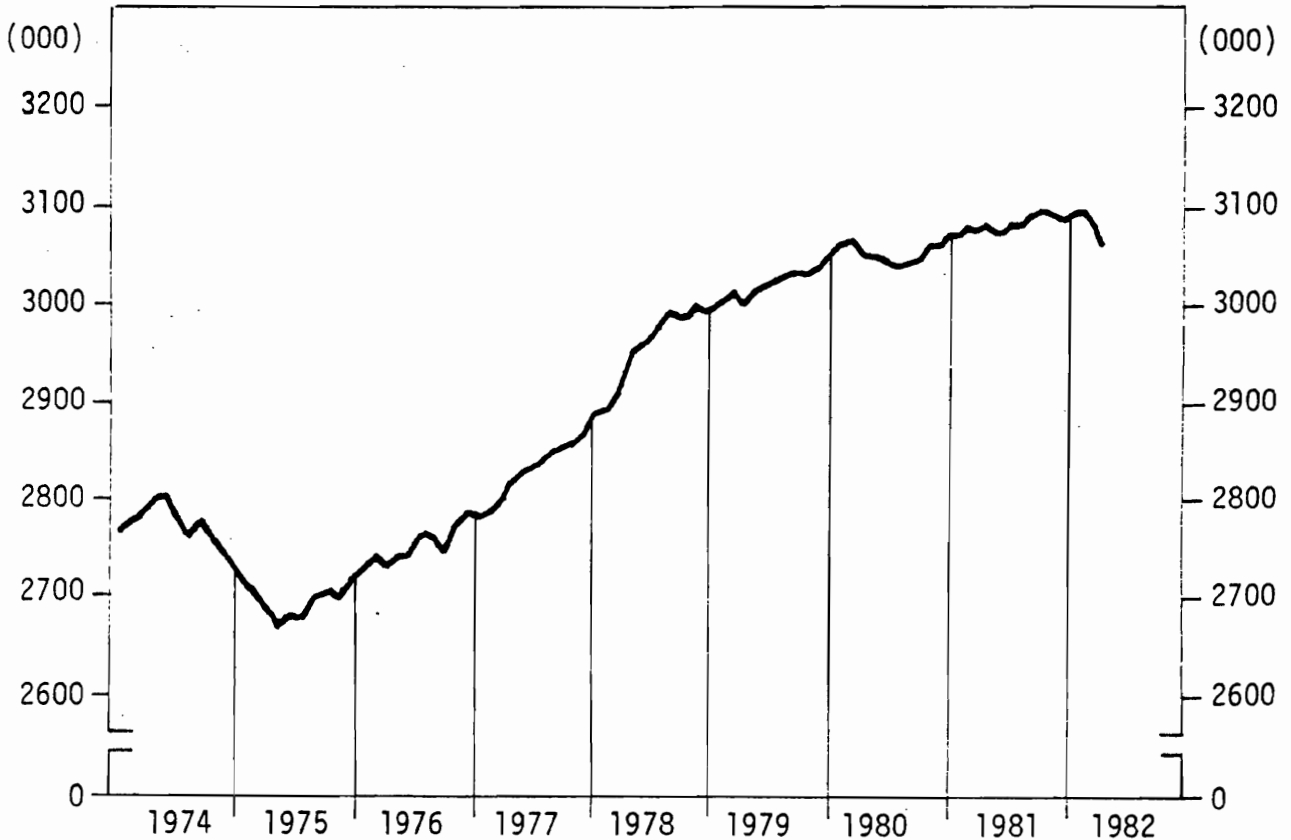

TECHNICAL NOTES

Nonfarm Wage and Salary Employment

Employment data refer to persons on establishment payrolls who received pay for any part of the pay period which includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude proprietors, the self-employed, unpaid family workers, farm workers, and domestic workers in households. Salaried officers of corporations are included. Government employment covers only civilian employees; federal military personnel are excluded.

Persons on an establishment payroll who are on paid sick leave (when pay is received directly from the firm), on paid holiday or paid vacation, or who work during any part of the pay period but are unemployed or on strike during the rest of the period, are counted as employed. Not counted as employed are persons who, during the pay period which includes the 12th, are laid off, on leave without pay or on strike for the entire period, or who are hired but do not work during the period.

Average Hours and Earnings

Hours and earnings data are derived from reports of payroll and man-hours for production and related workers in manufacturing. When the reported pay period exceeds one week, the payroll and man-hour figures are reduced to a weekly basis.

Average hourly earnings for manufacturing are on a "gross" basis, reflecting not only changes in basic hourly rates, but also such variable factors as premium pay for overtime and shift work, and changes in output of workers paid on an incentive plan. Excluded from average earnings are irregular bonuses, retroactive items, payments of various welfare benefits, and payroll taxes paid by employers.
