I wish that people would be above acting in such a manner, yet I know from past experience as a prosecutor that greed all too often trumps integrity and common sense. That is why the work of our insurance investigators, prosecutors, law enforcement officers, and claims representatives is so important.”

The organization monitors trends affecting the industry and shares technical information with the insurance industry and with law enforcement and regulatory agencies. The Association also acts as an industry liaison with related organizations.
