#### **Academic Achievement**

#### **College and Career Readiness**

This school outperforms 5% of schools statewide as noted by its statewide percentile and 3% of schools educating students with similar demographic characteristics as noted in its peer school percentile in the performance area of College and Career Readiness. Additionally, this school is meeting 0% of its performance targets in the area of College and Career Readiness.



College and Career readiness measures the degree to which students are demonstrating behaviors that are indicative of future attendance and/or success in college and careers. For all elementary and middle schools, this includes a measurement of how many students are chronically absent. For schools with middle school grades, it also includes a measurement of how many students take Algebra I in eighth grade.

#### **Student Growth**

This school outperforms 43% of schools statewide as noted by its statewide percentile and 55% of schools educating students with similar demographic characteristics as noted in its peer school percentile in the performance area of Student Growth. Additionally, this school is meeting 50% percentage of its performance targets in the area of Student Growth.



This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.






### Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup


























#### **Chronic Absenteeism Trend**
