







# REPORT.

*To His Excellency, Theodore F. Randolph, Governor of New Jersey :*

SIR:—I have the honor to lay before your Excellency my report agreeably to the provisions of the act entitled “An Act for the Organization of the National Guard of the State of New Jersey.”

In the statements hereto annexed will be found a full return of the clothing, camp and garrison equipage, and quartermaster's stores, baggage train, hospital supplies, ordnance and ordnance stores in the State Arsenal, October 31, 1870; the number of arms cleaned and repaired; camp and garrison equipage, ordnance and ordnance stores turned into the Arsenal by disbanded and other military companies; clothing, camp and garrison equipage, ordnance and ordnance stores issued from the State Arsenal, and the amount of ammunition expended in firing salutes during the year. The tabular statements will show the ordnance and ordnance stores in possession of the National Guard, the former Rifle Corps and the Military Schools of the State.

Five newly organized Companies of Infantry and one Battery of Artillery have been supplied with arms, upon the officers giving the proper bonds, with sufficient surety as provided for in the Act approved March 9, 1869. The arms in the possession of the National Guard, are in good order, and are kept under the proper responsibility.

We have filed with the Third Auditor of the United States Treasury, since my last report, three new instalments of the claims of this State against the United States for expenses incurred in aiding to suppress the late rebellion, amounting in the aggregate to forty-five thousand, three hundred and sixty-one dollars and sixty-seven cents (\$45,361 67).

The State has received from the United States, during the year, on account of the expenses incurred as above, the sum of twenty-five

thousand and thirty dollars and forty-two cents (\$25,030.42), which has been paid into the Treasury as follows :

We are in receipt of a communication stating that another allowance of over twenty-seven thousand dollars (\$27,000) has been made, and that the draft for that amount will be forwarded in a few days. The settlement of the balance of these claims is being prosecuted with vigor, and I can confidently assert that nearly the entire amount of our claims will be allowed and paid on the new examination, which is now being done.

In the appendix will be found the following statements :

Statement "E," ordnance and ordnance stores issued to the uniformed companies of this State, upon their giving bond, according to law, during the year ending October 31, 1870.

Statement "F," the ammunition expended during the year ending October 31, 1870.

Tabular statement "A" shows the ordnance and ordnance stores in possession of the National Guard October 31, 1870.

Tabular statement "B," ordnance and ordnance stores in possession of former New Jersey Rifle Corps, October 31, 1870.

Tabular statement "C," ordnance and ordnance stores in possession of military schools at Newark, New Brunswick, and Cranbury, October 31, 1870.
