The State School Tax, amounting to two million one hundred and fifty-one thousand seven hundred dollars (\$2,151,700), has been received and disbursed to the several counties of the State, in accordance with the apportionment of the State Board of Education.

The Agricultural College Fund amounts to one hundred and sixteen thousand dollars (\$116,000). One hundred and fifteen thousand four hundred dollars (\$115,400) is invested in New Jersey bonds, and six hundred dollars (\$600) in New Jersey bonds, which became due and payable January 1, 1893, is held by the State Treasurer for re-investment by the Commissioners of the Agricultural College Fund. The interest on the same, six thousand nine hundred and forty-two

dollars (\$6,942), has been received and disbursed for the maintenance of Rutgers Scientific School.
