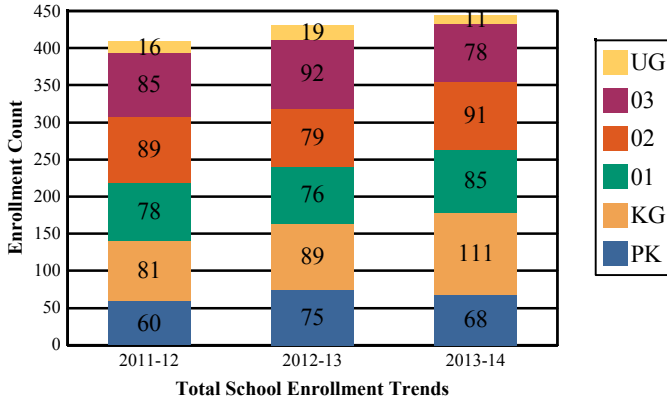

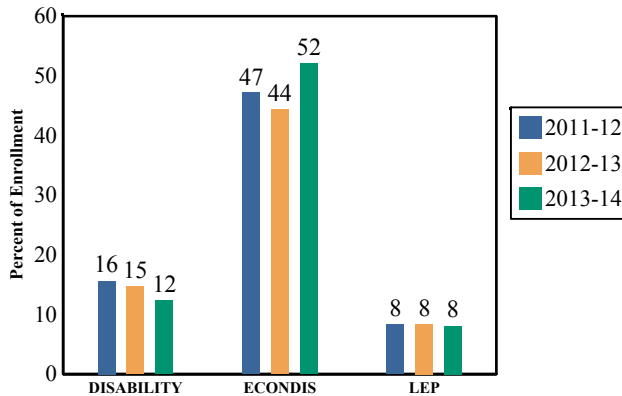

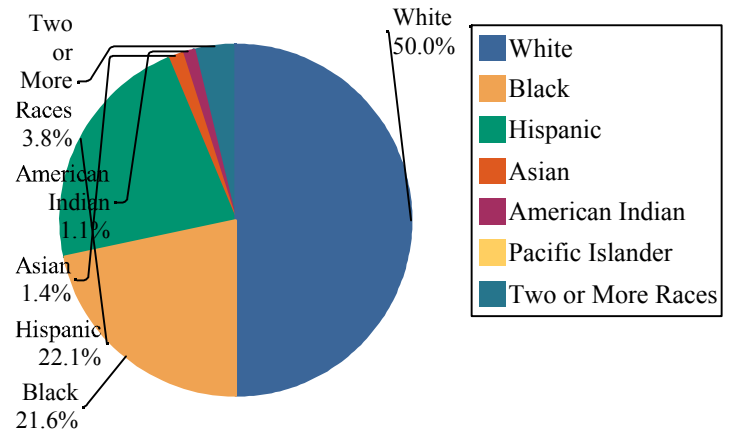

Enrollment Trends by Program Participation



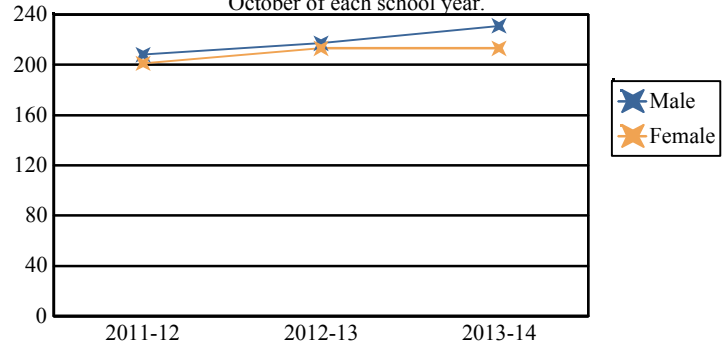
Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup

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ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT

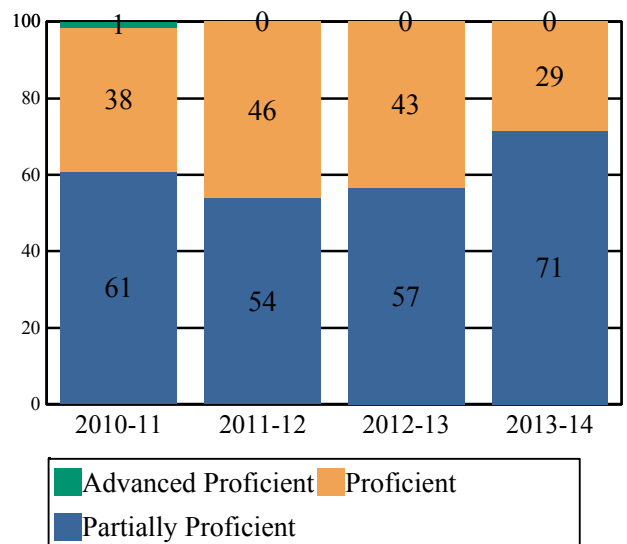

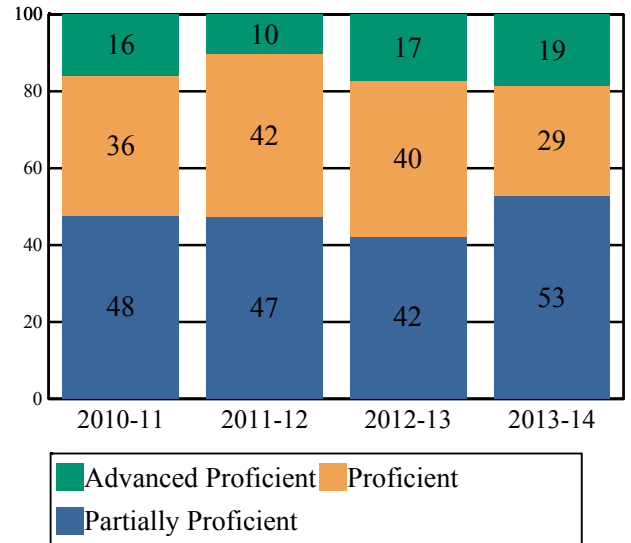

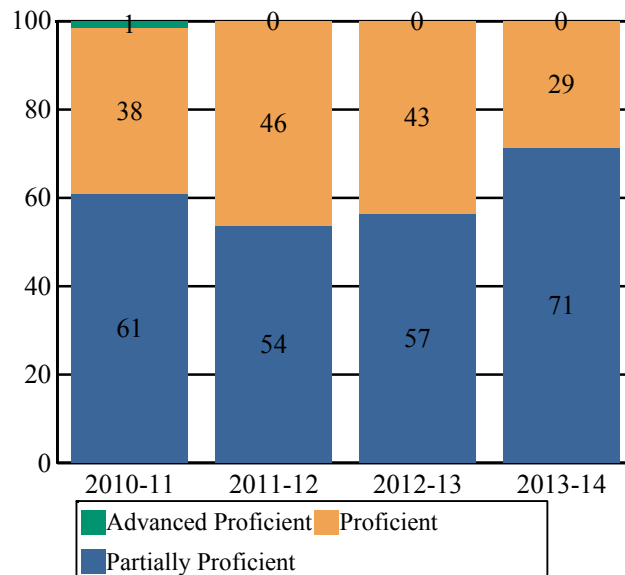

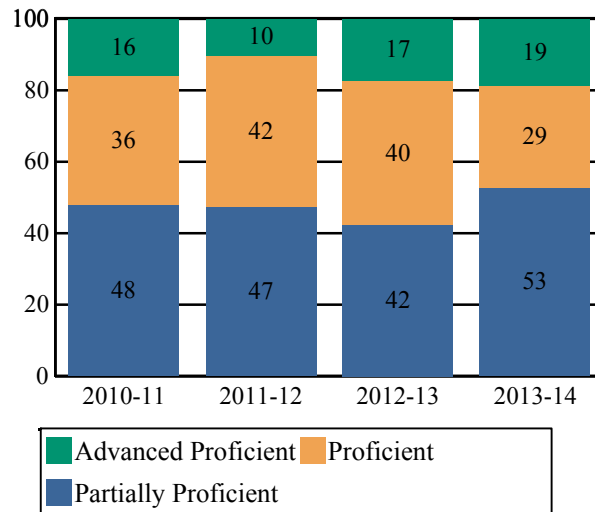

Students in both elementary and middle schools begin to demonstrate college readiness behaviors long before they even enter high school. 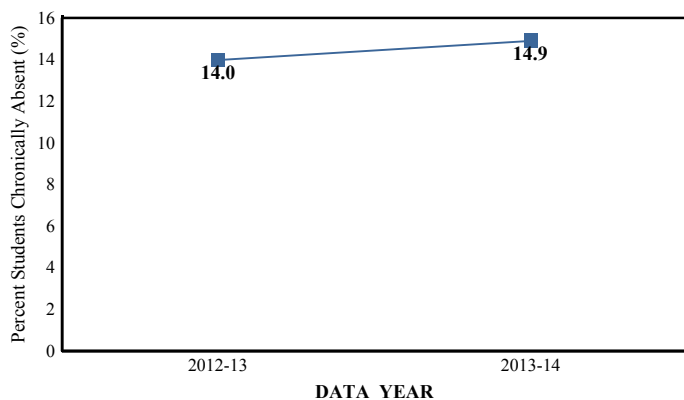

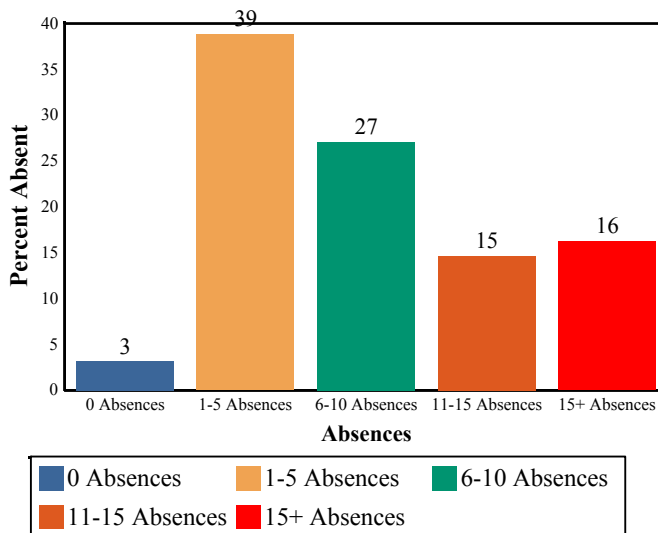
Chronic Absenteeism Trend

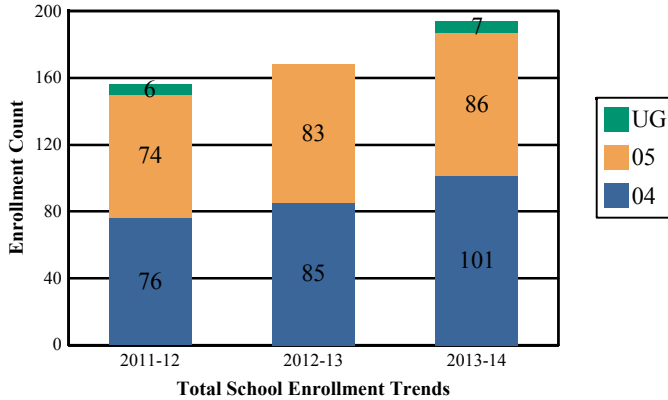

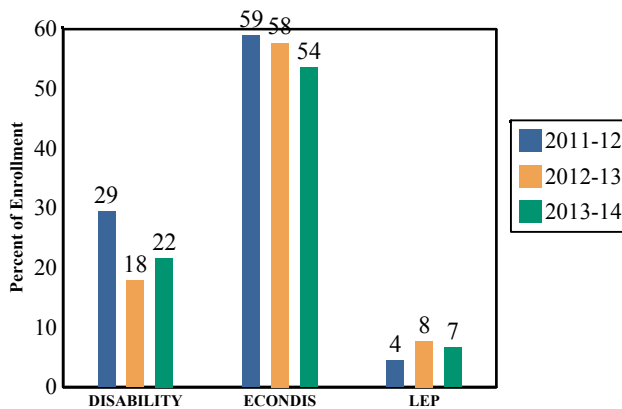

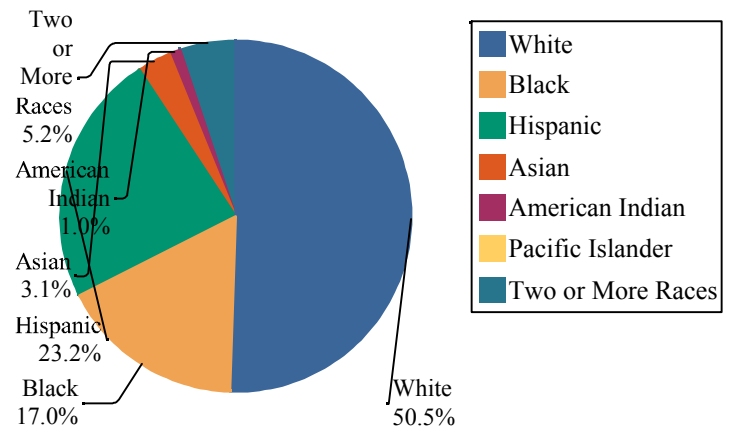

Enrollment Trends by Program Participation



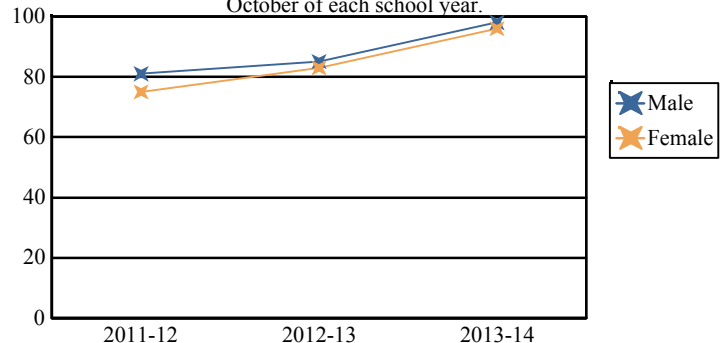
Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup

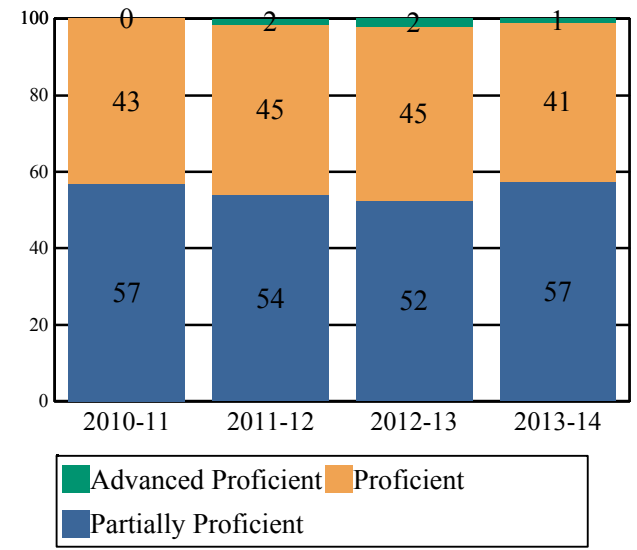

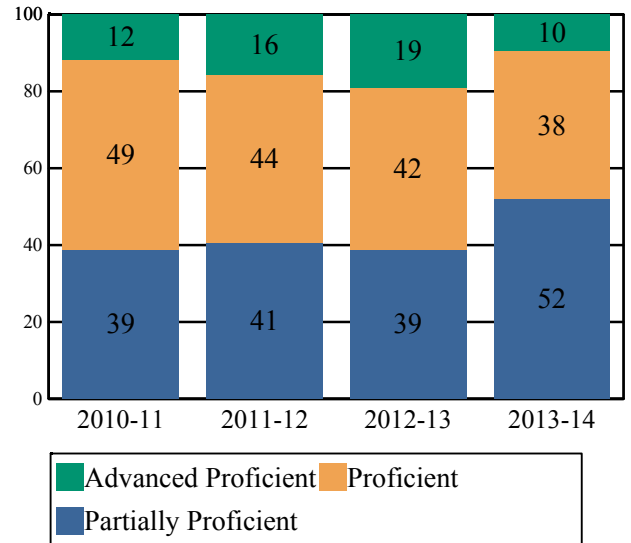

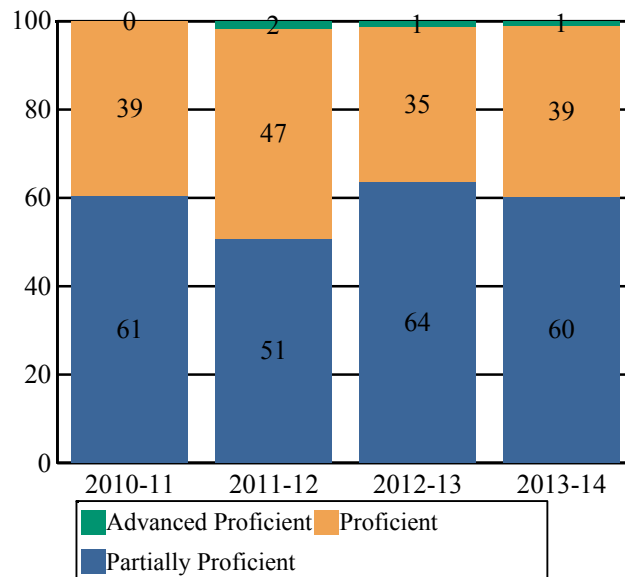

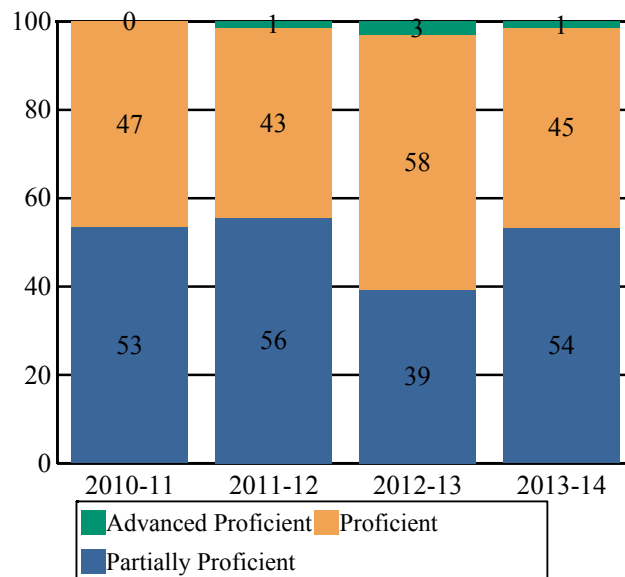

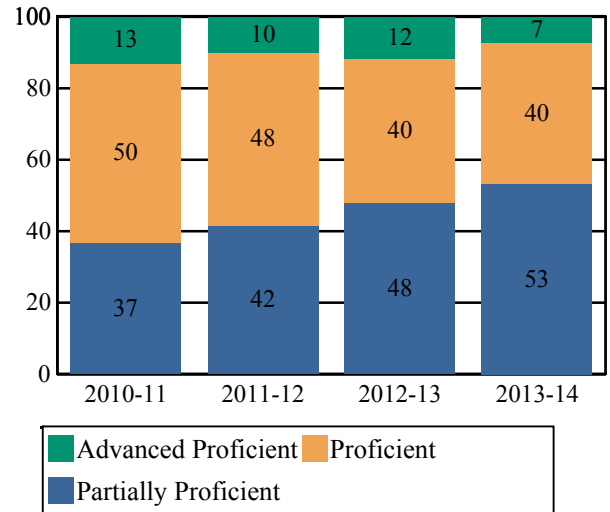

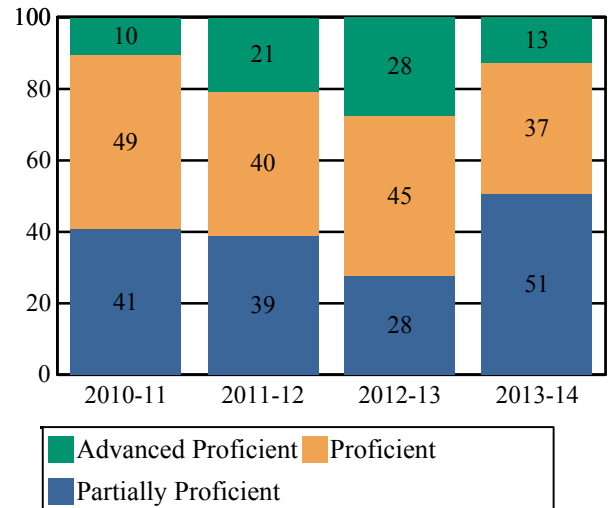
NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 04

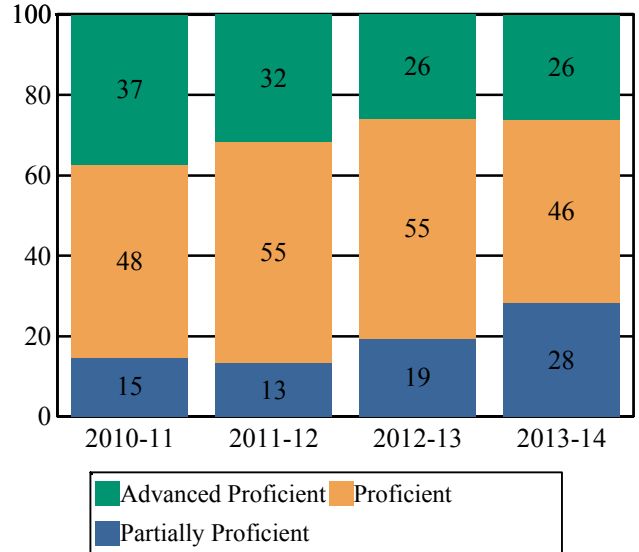

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COLLEGE AND CAREER READINESS

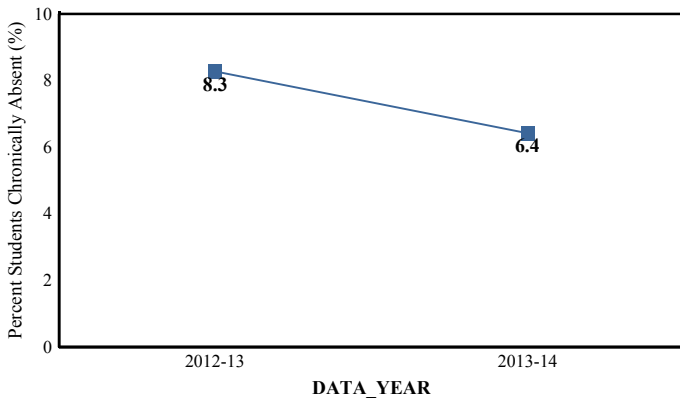

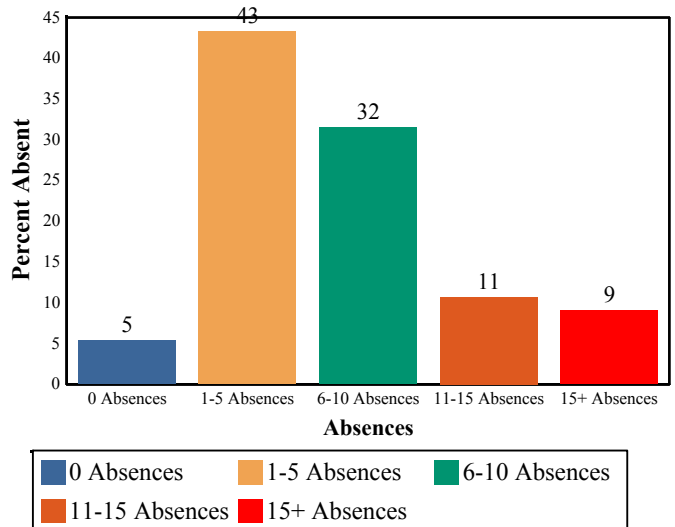
Chronic Absenteeism Trend

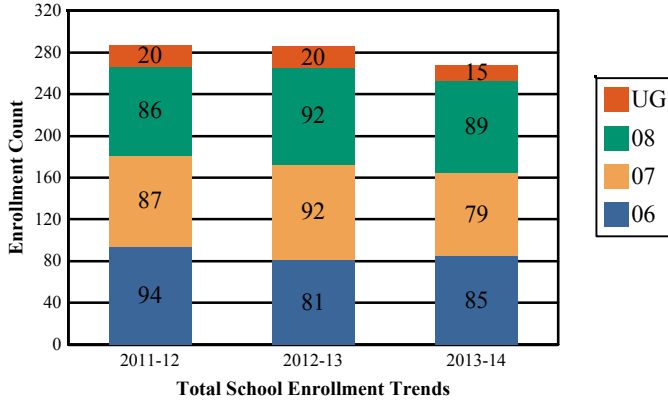

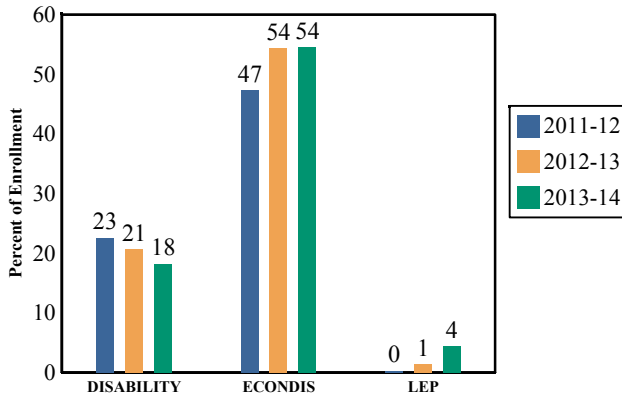

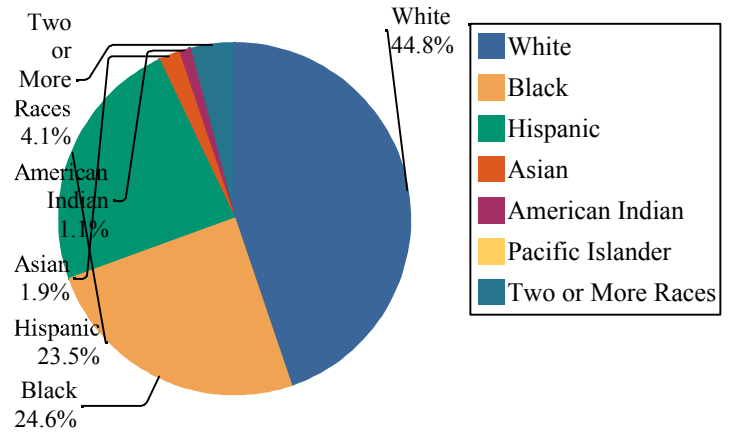

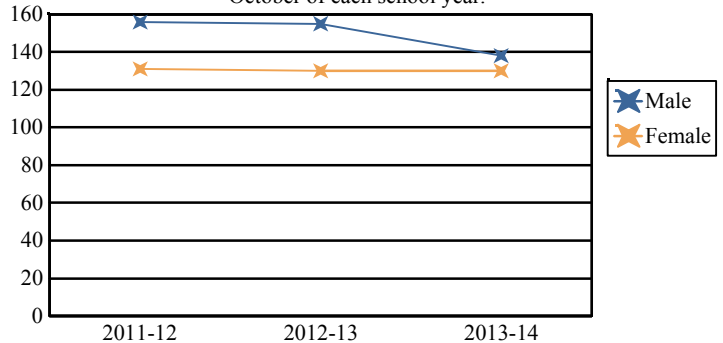
Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup

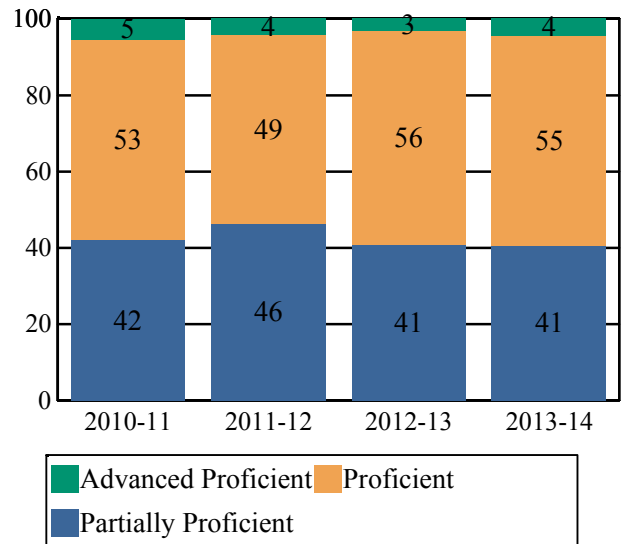

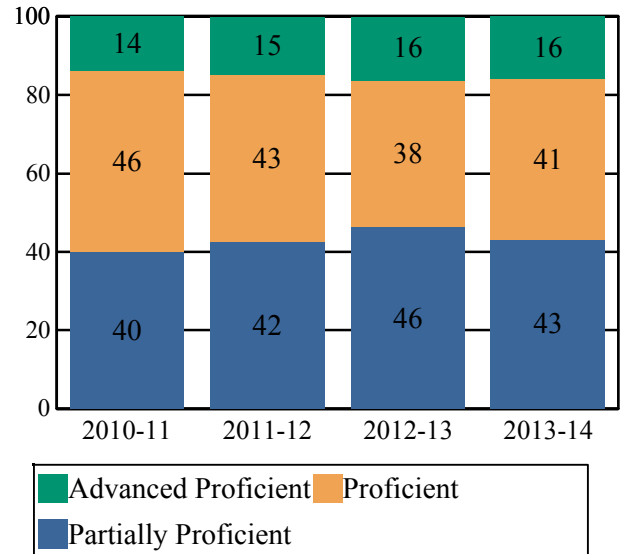

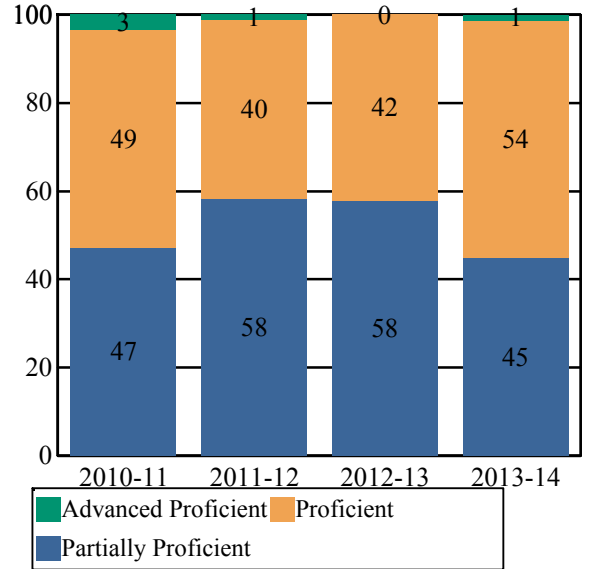

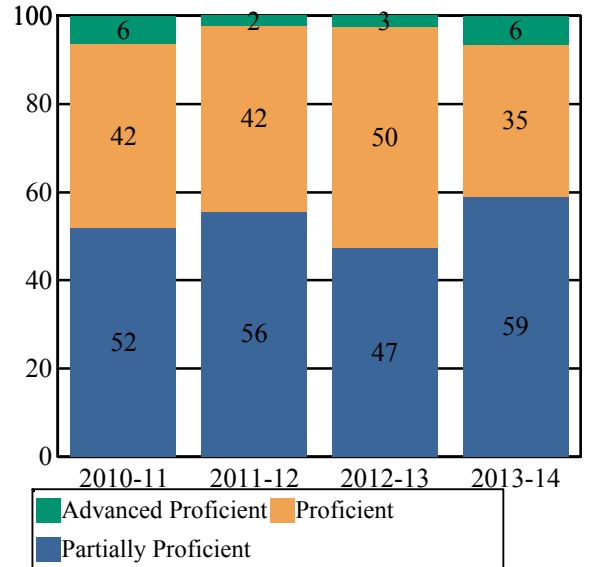
NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy - Grade Level - 06

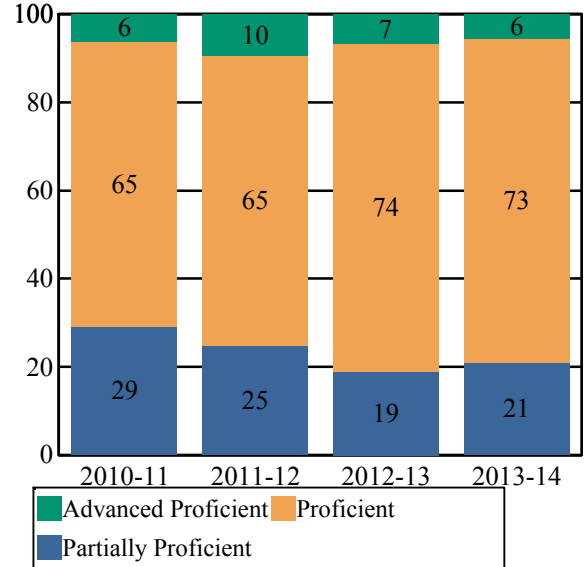

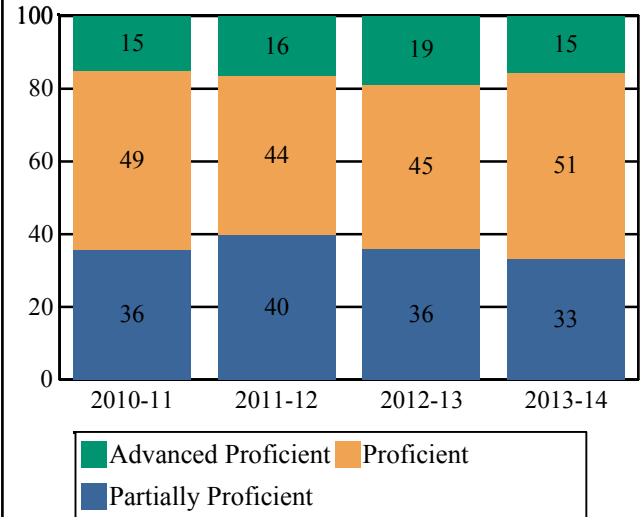

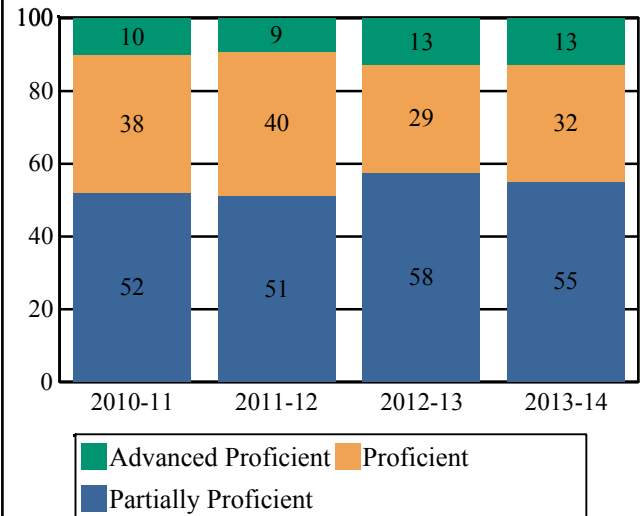
NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 06

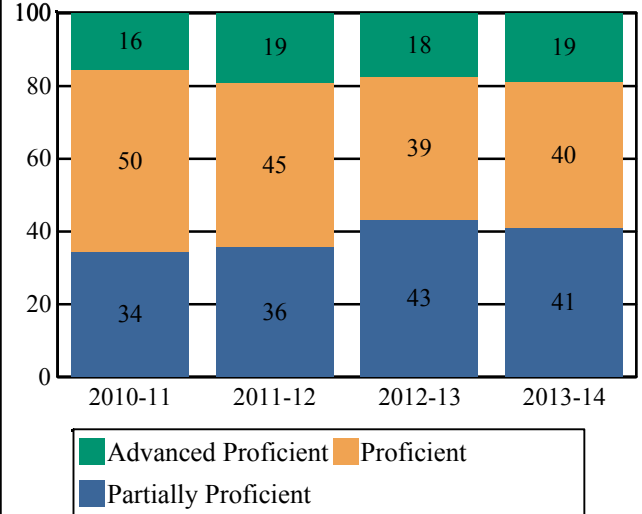

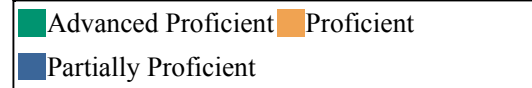

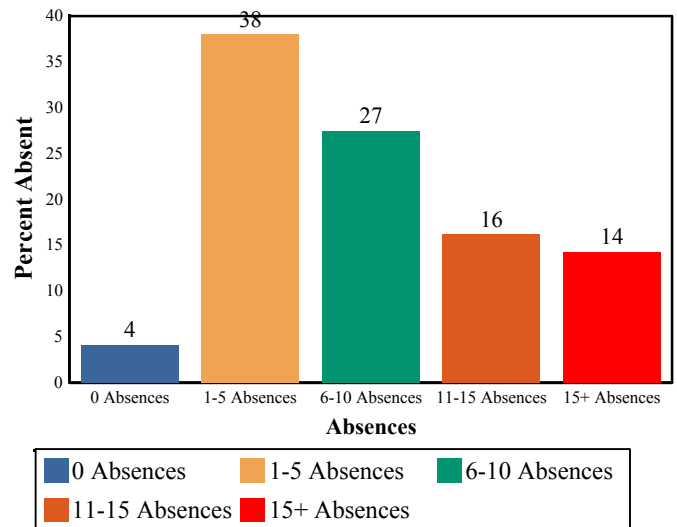

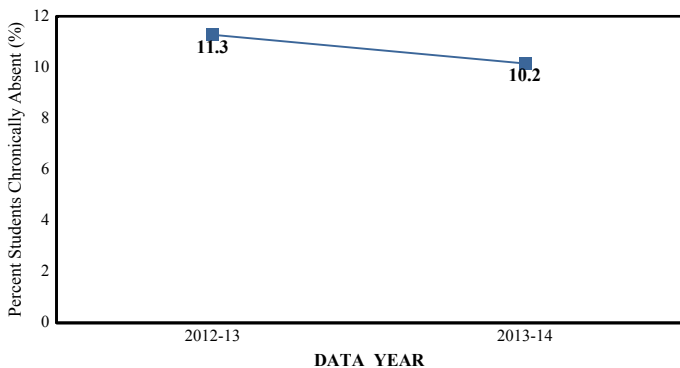
