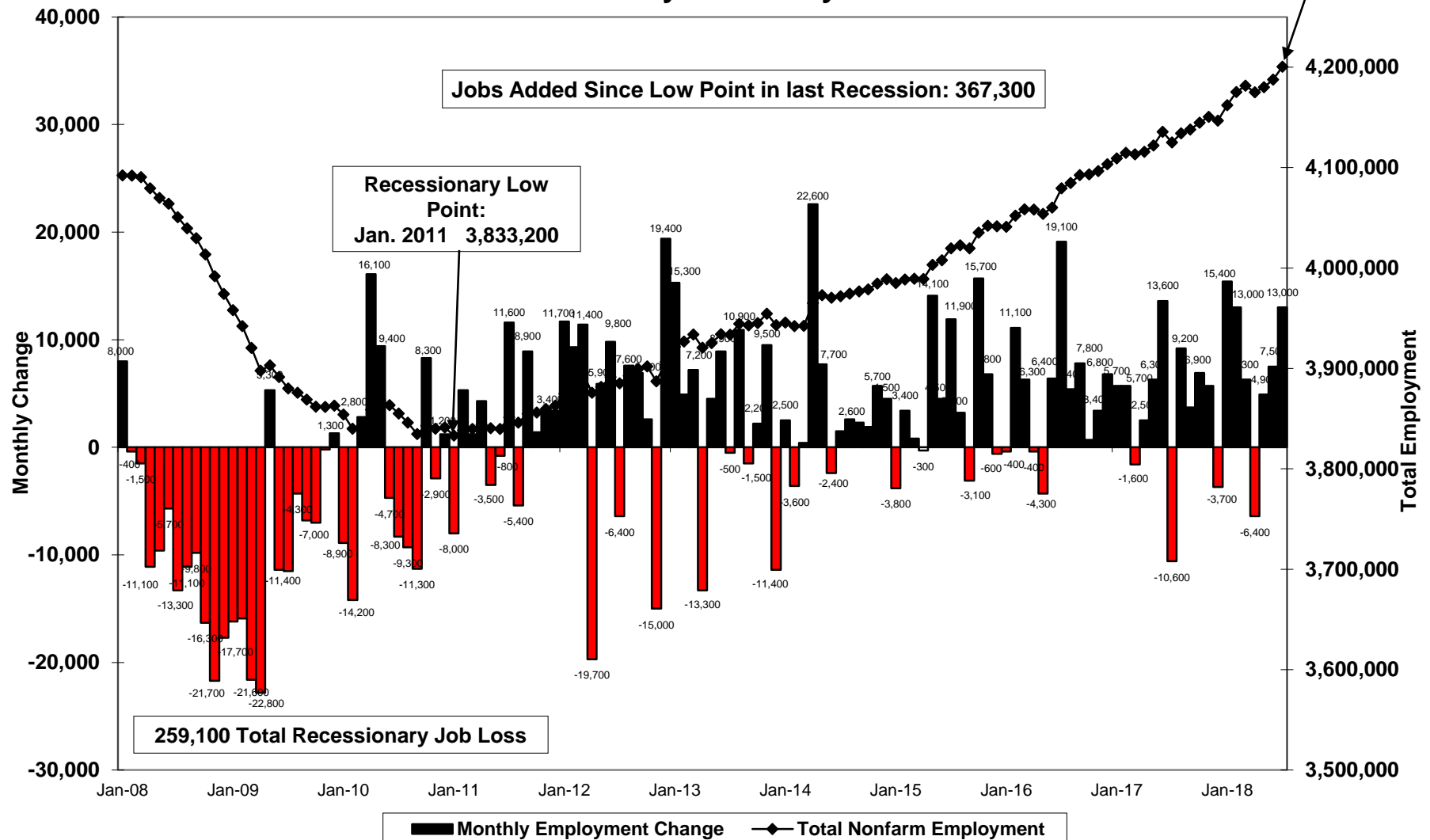

New Jersey Total Nonfarm Employment vs. Monthly Change January 2008 - July 2018

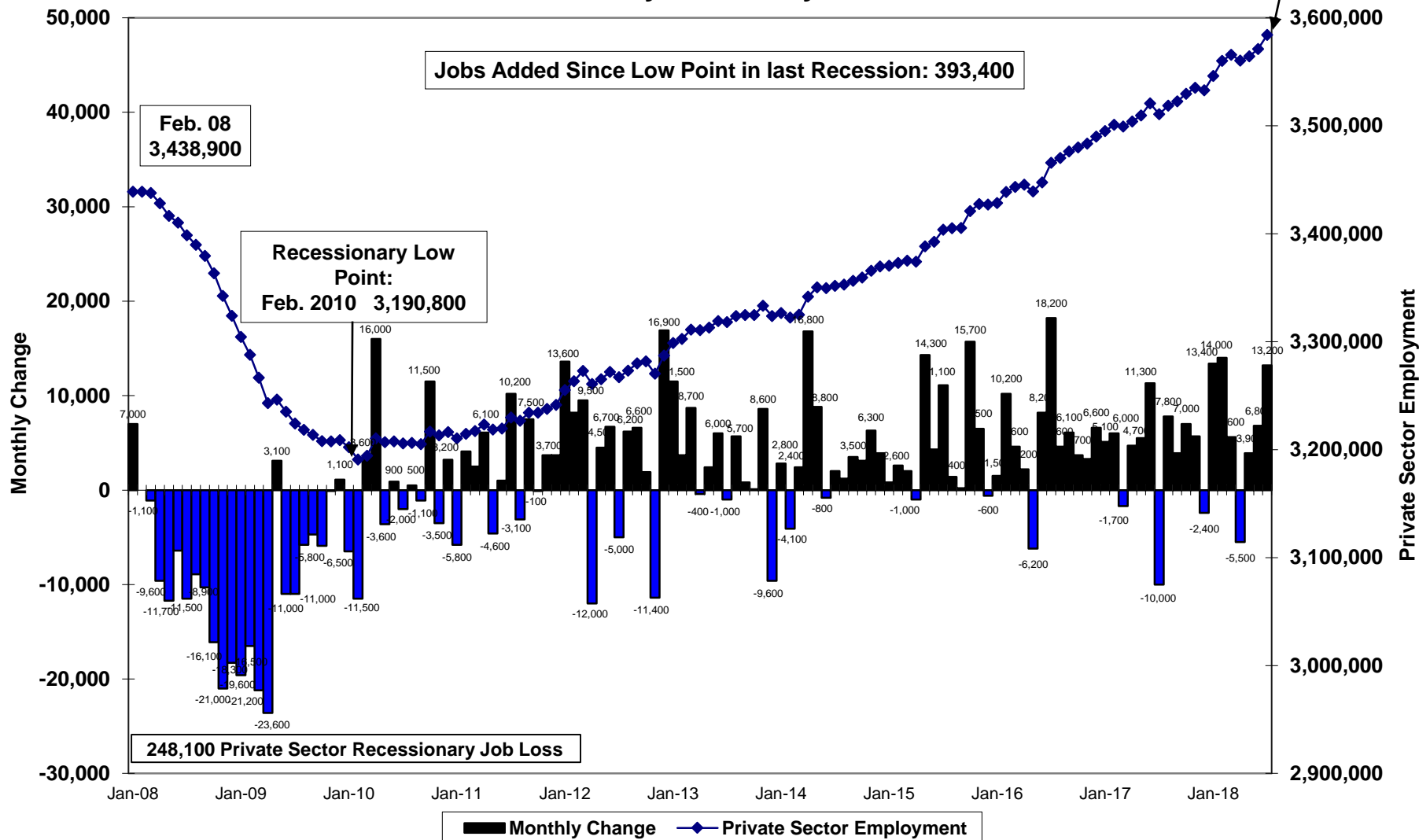

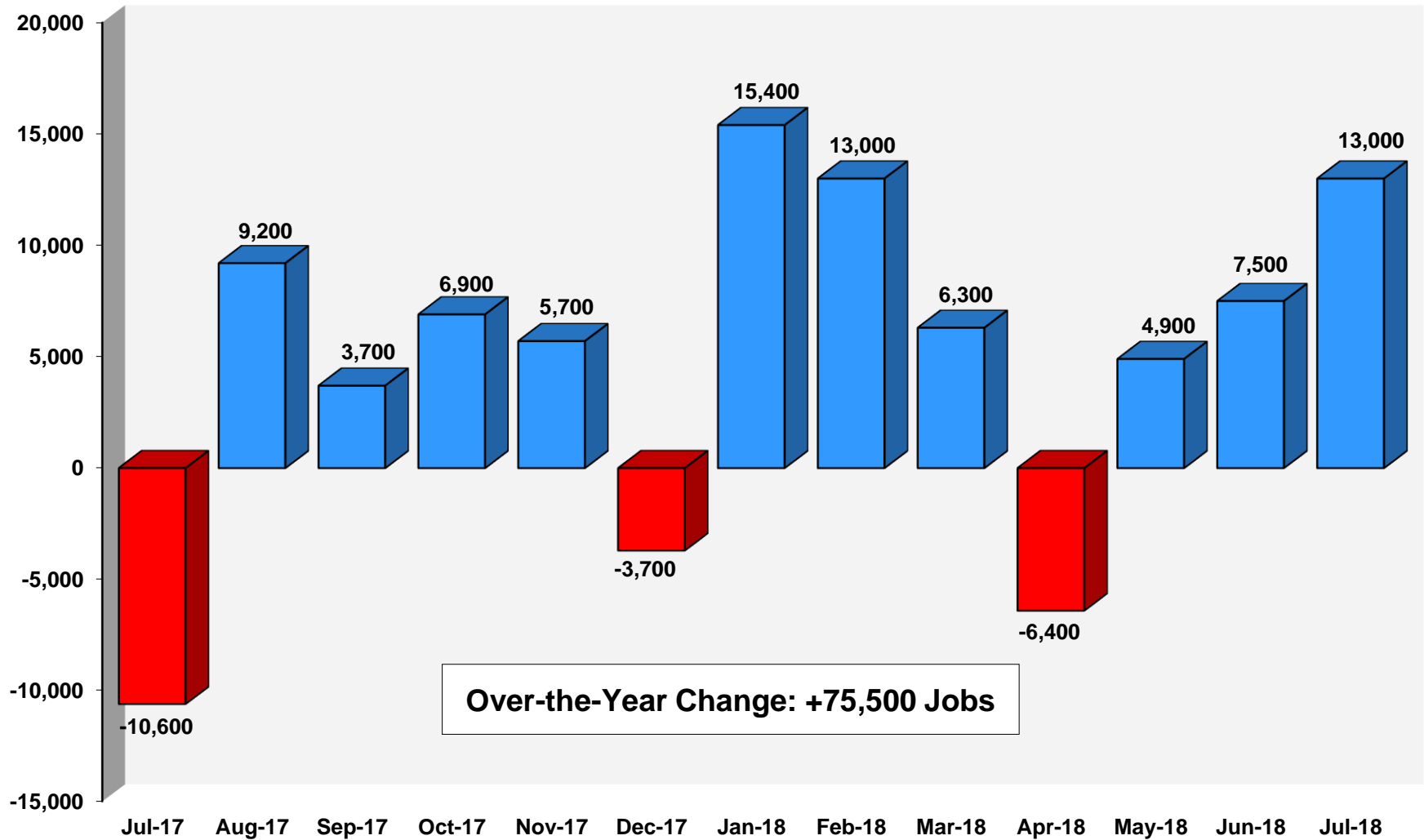
New Jersey Private Sector Employment vs. Monthly Change January 2008 - July 2018



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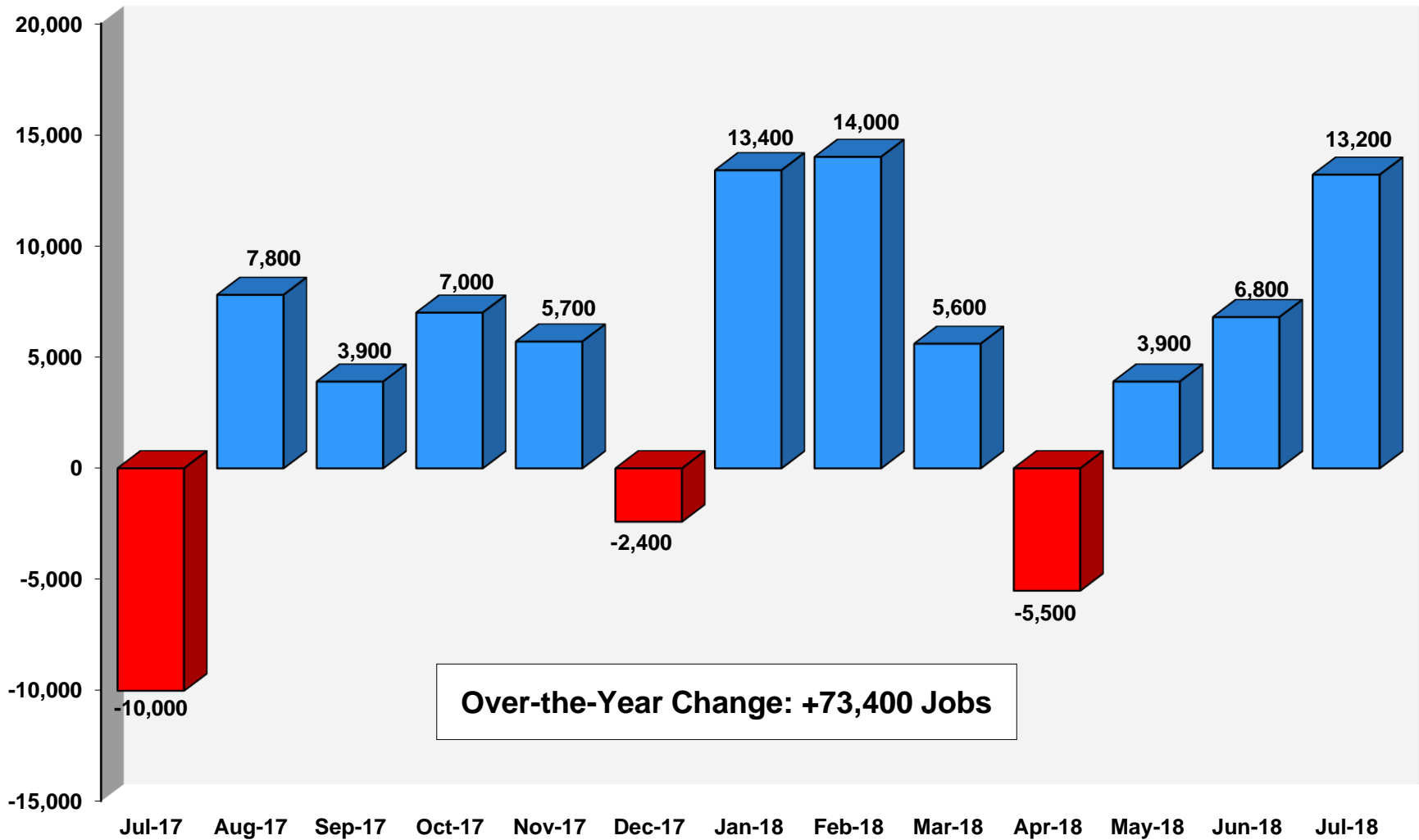
Monthly Total Employment Change New Jersey: July 2017 - July 2018



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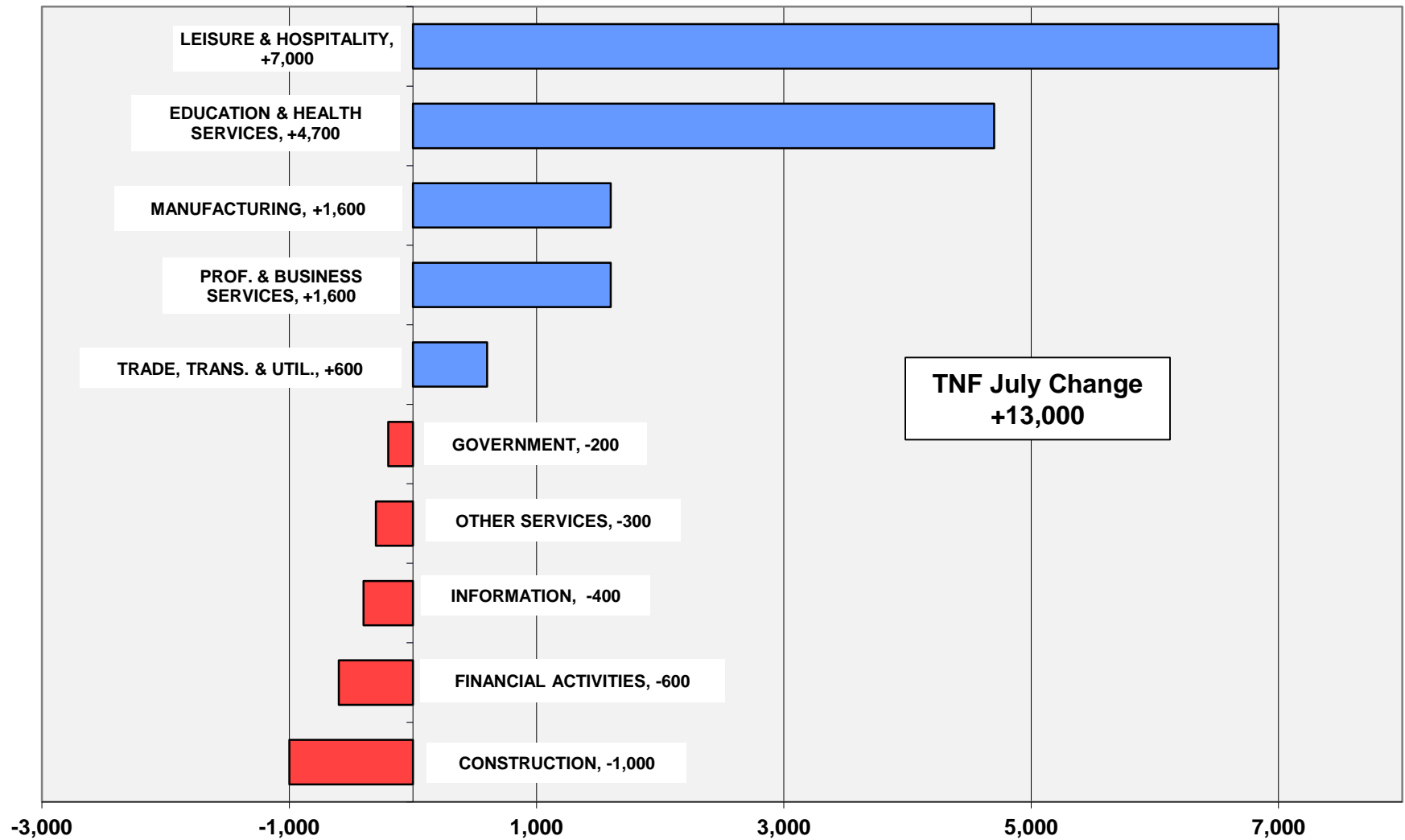
Monthly Private Sector Employment Change July 2017 - July 2018



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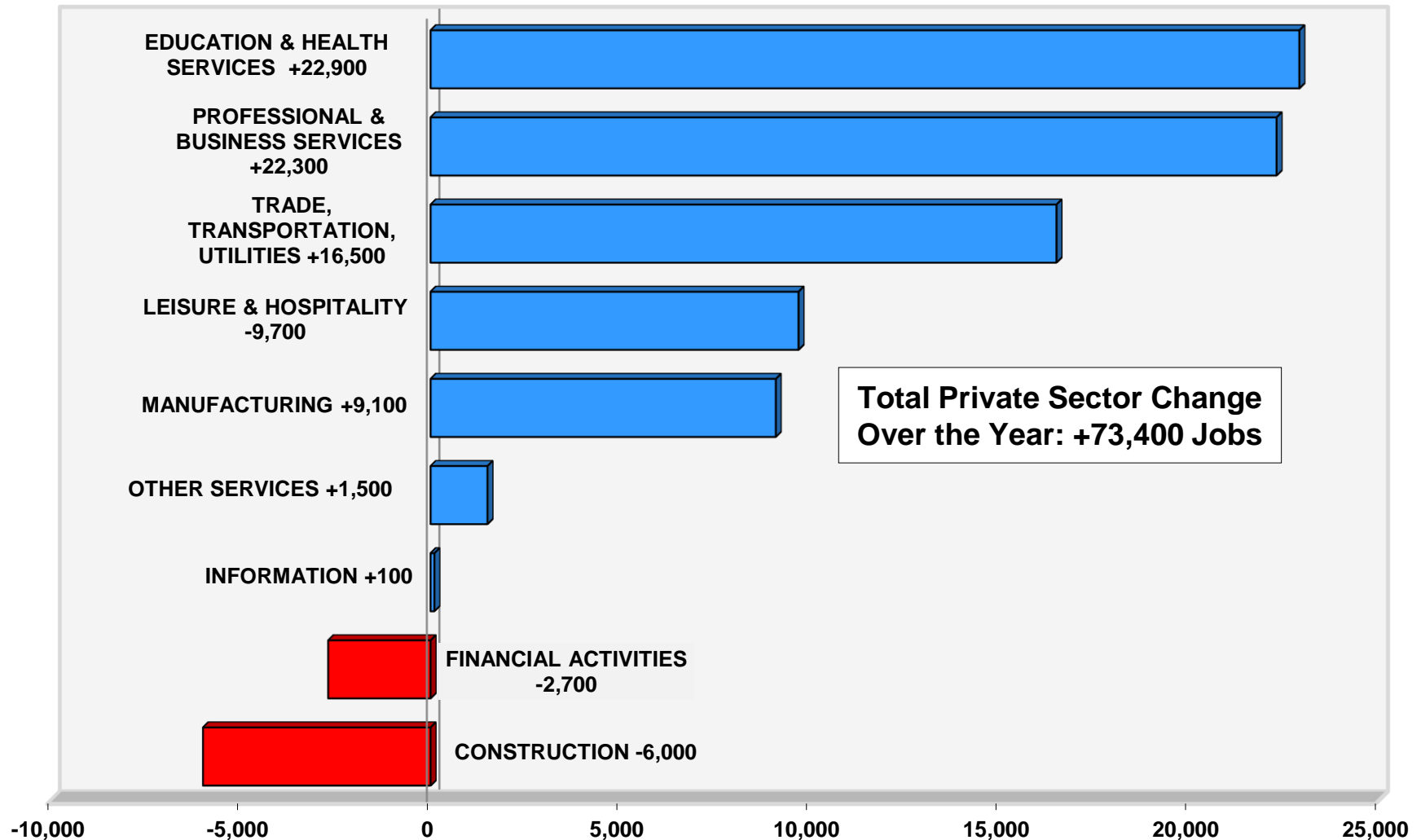
Monthly Employment Change: July 2018



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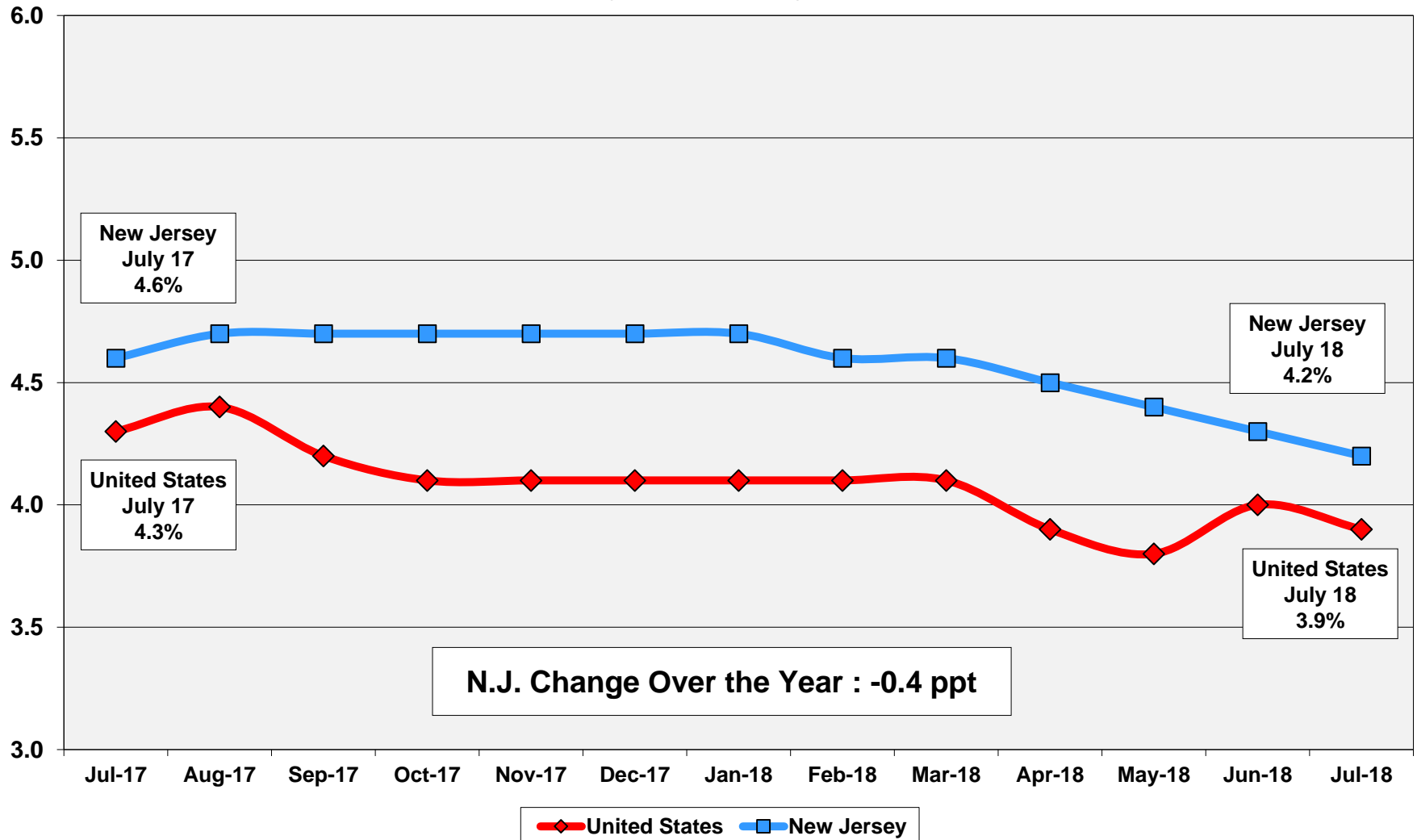
New Jersey Private Sector Employment Change by Industry July 2017 - July 2018



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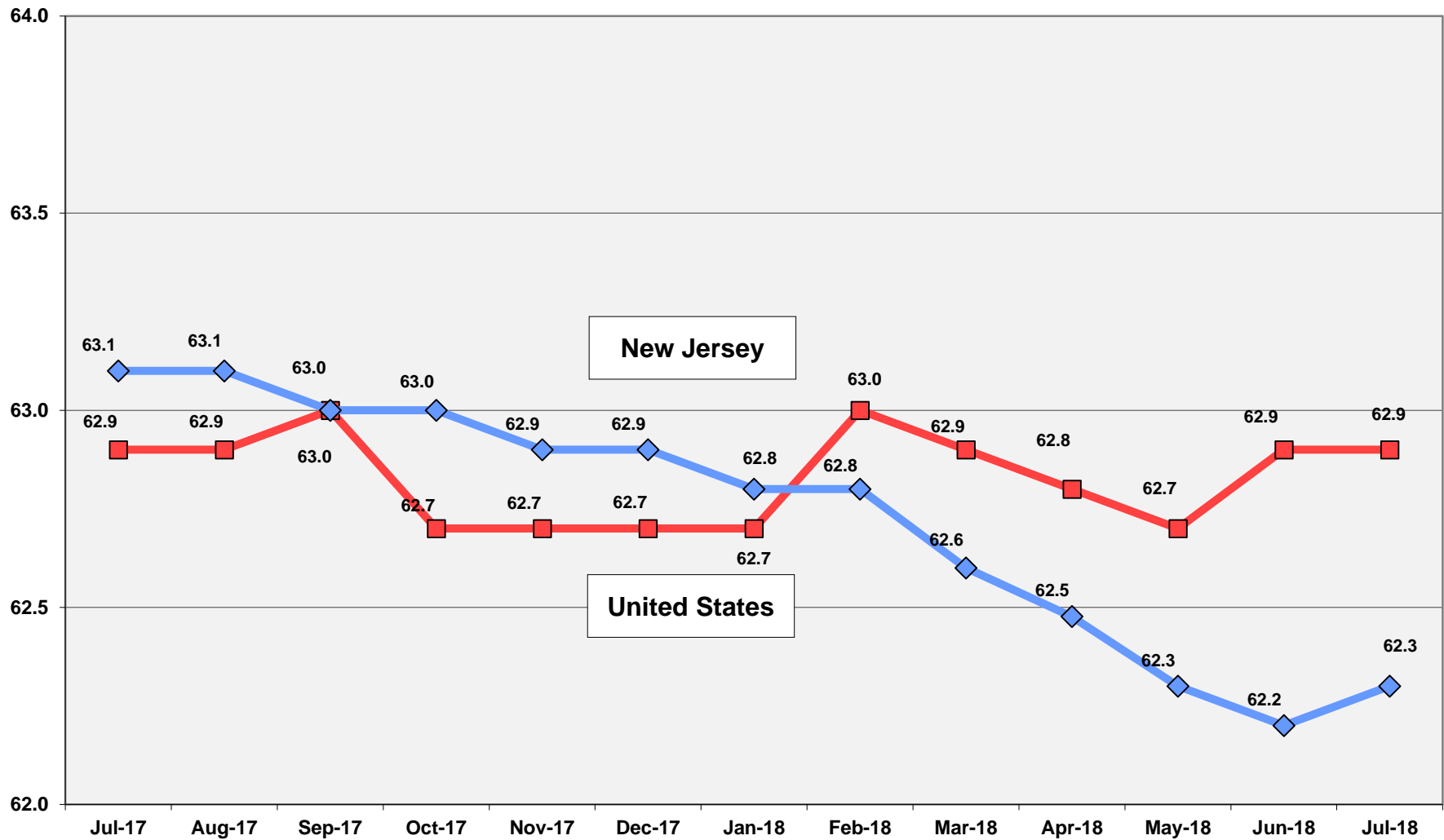
Unemployment Rates, New Jersey vs. United States July 2017 - July 2018



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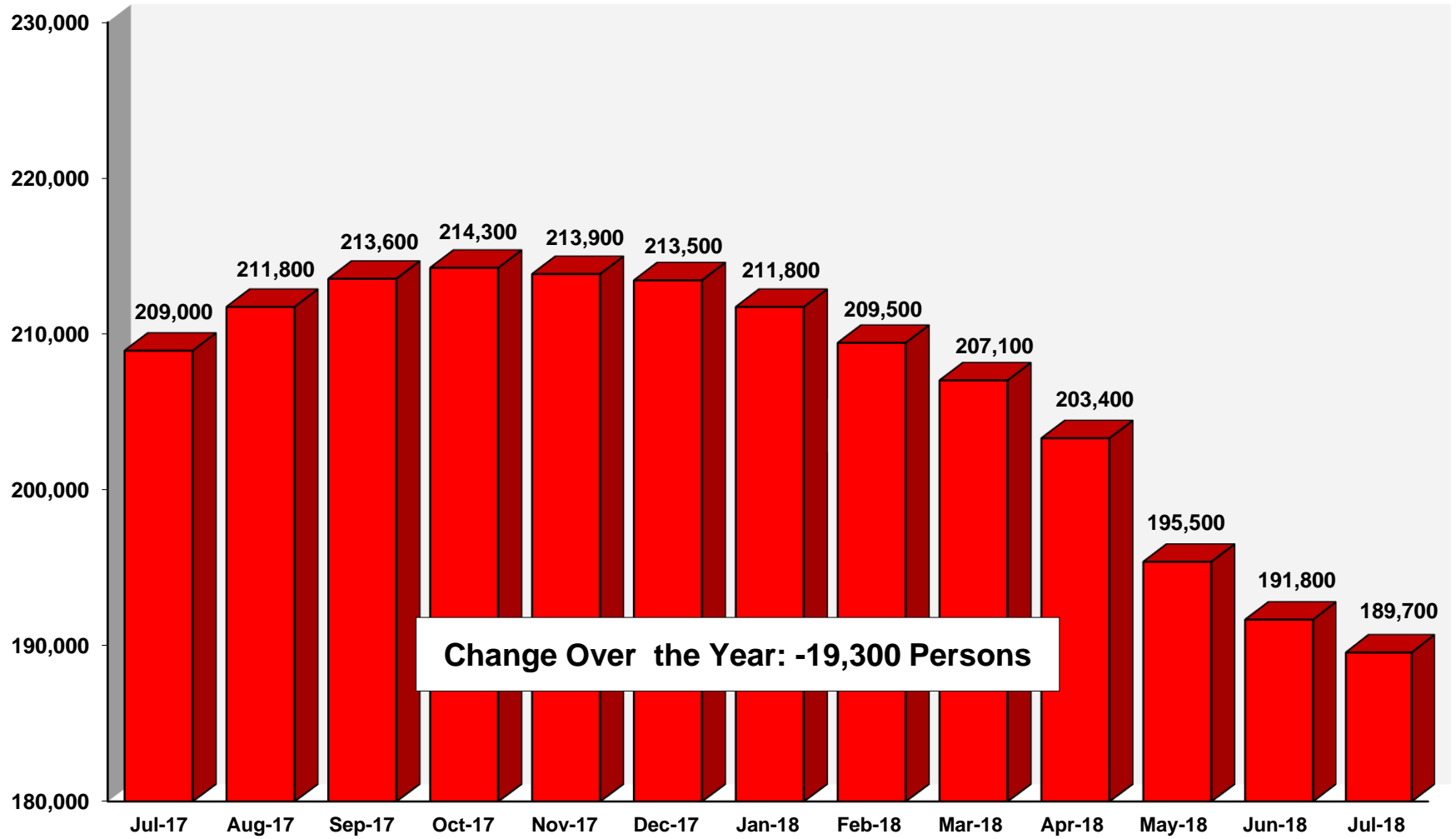
New Jersey vs. United States, Labor Force Participation Rate: July 2017 - July 2018



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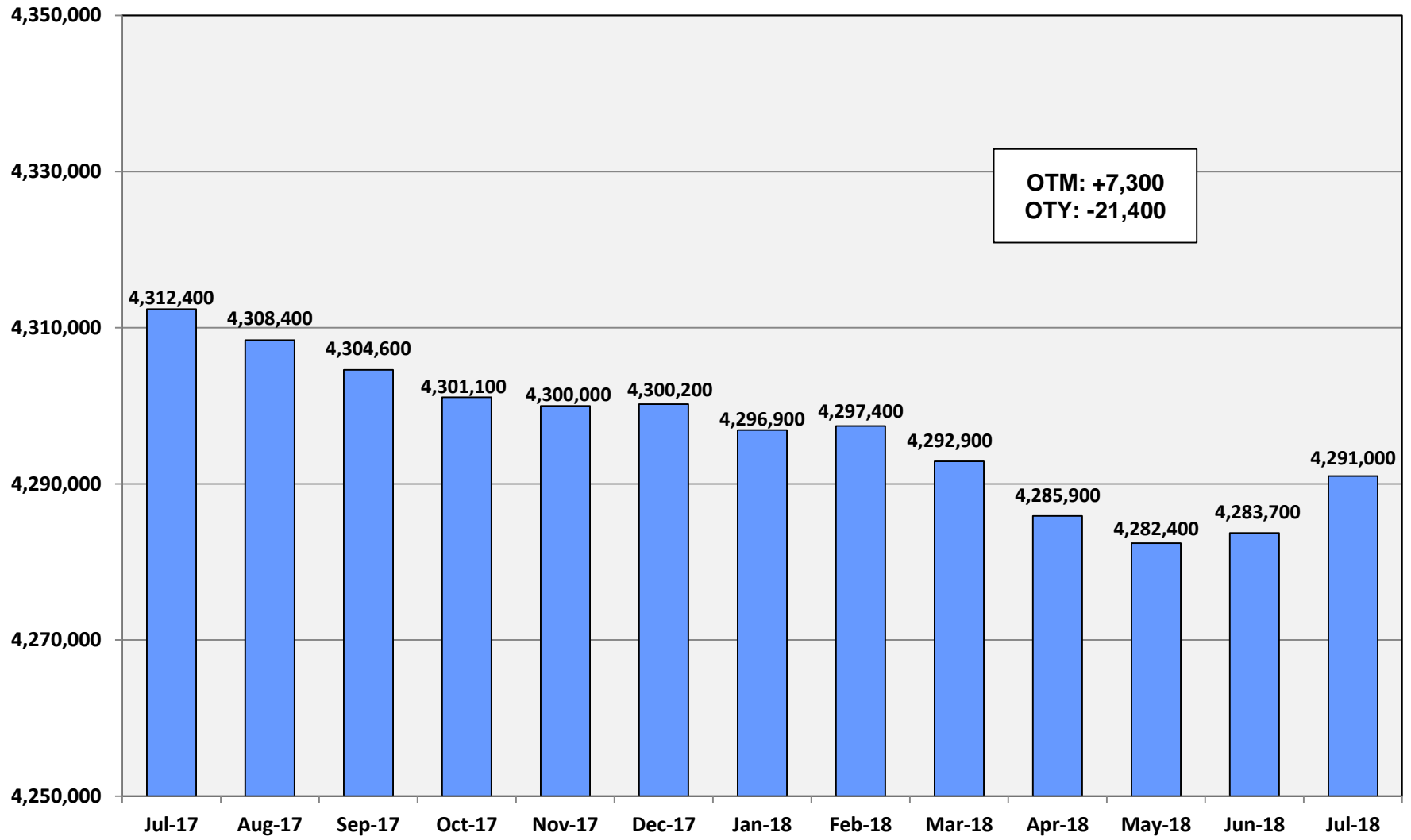
Unemployed New Jersey Residents July 2017 - July 2018



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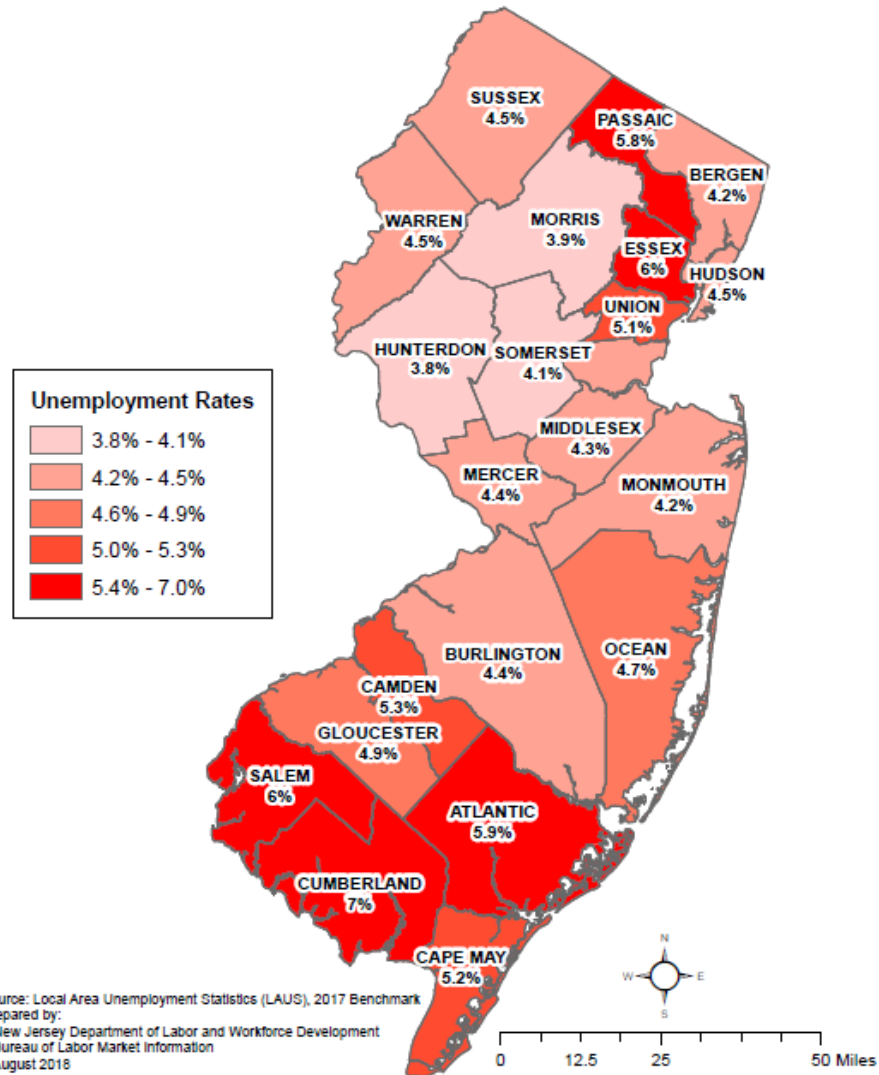
New Jersey Employed Residents: July 2017 - July 2018



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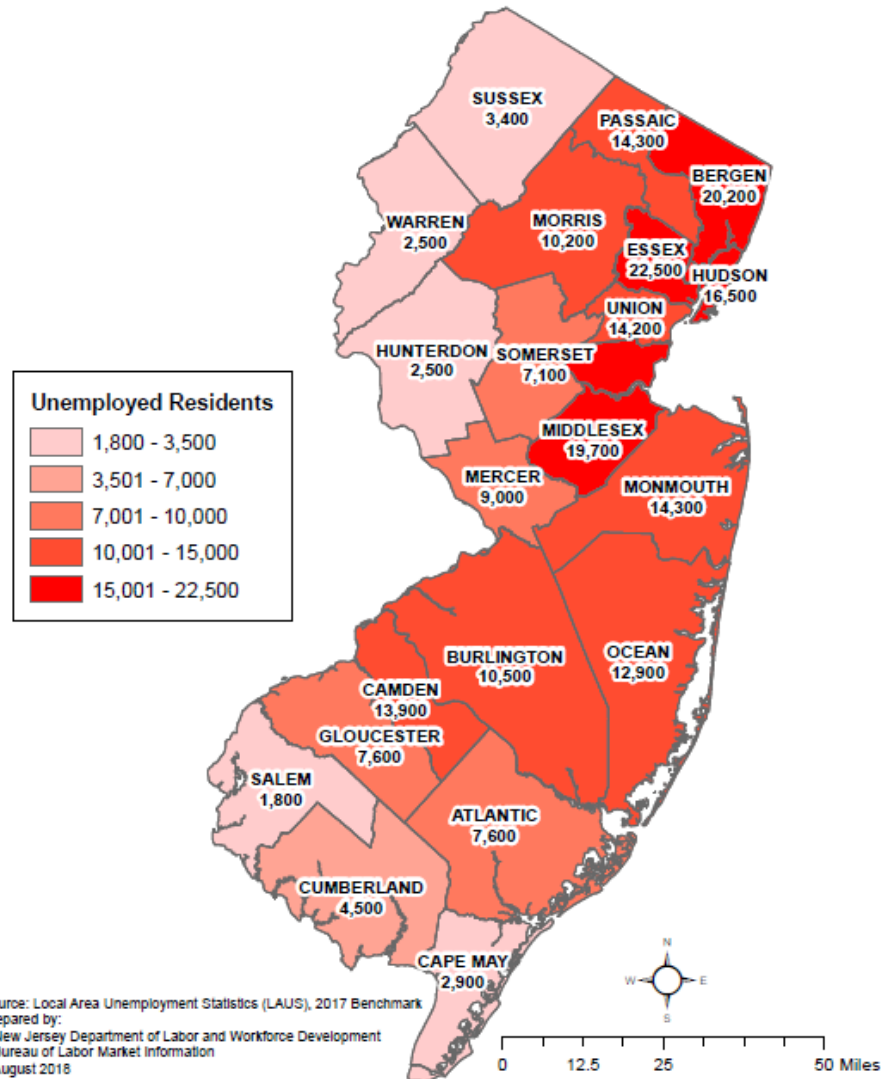
New Jersey Counties Unemployment Rates - July 2018 (Preliminary, Not Seasonally Adjusted)

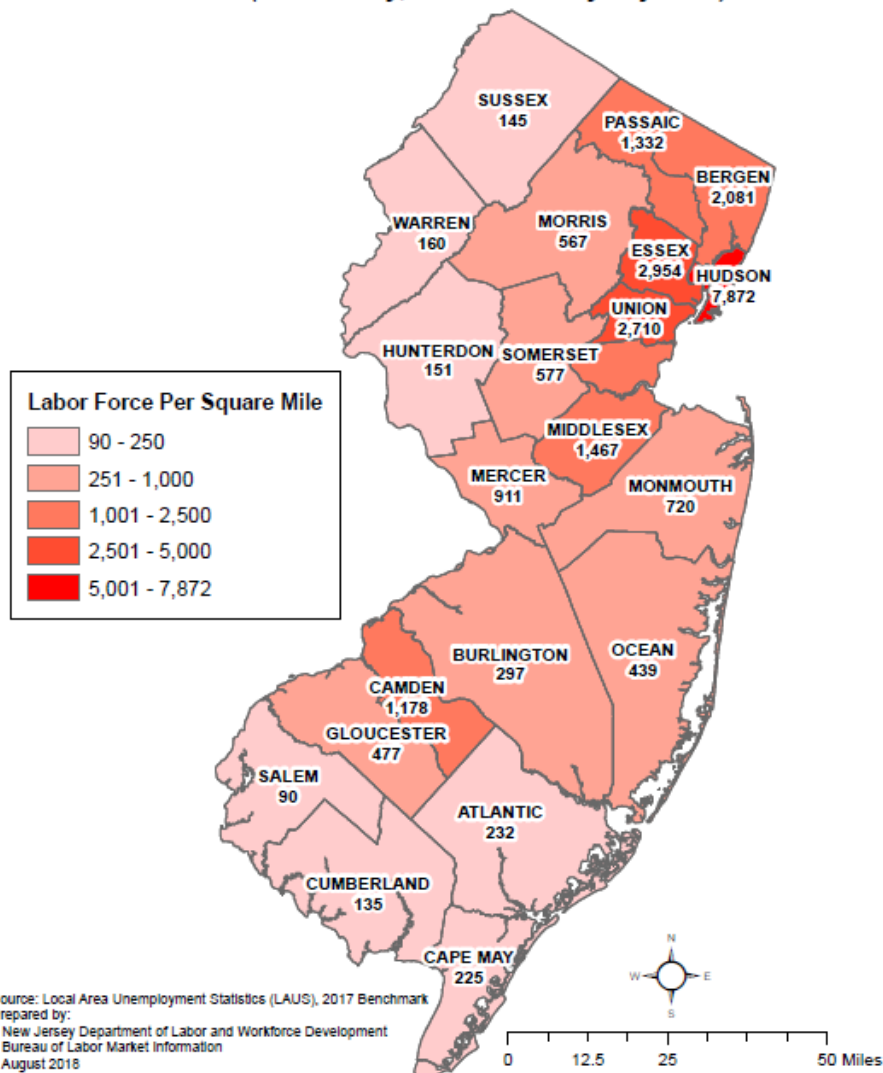

Labor Force Per Square Mile - July 2018

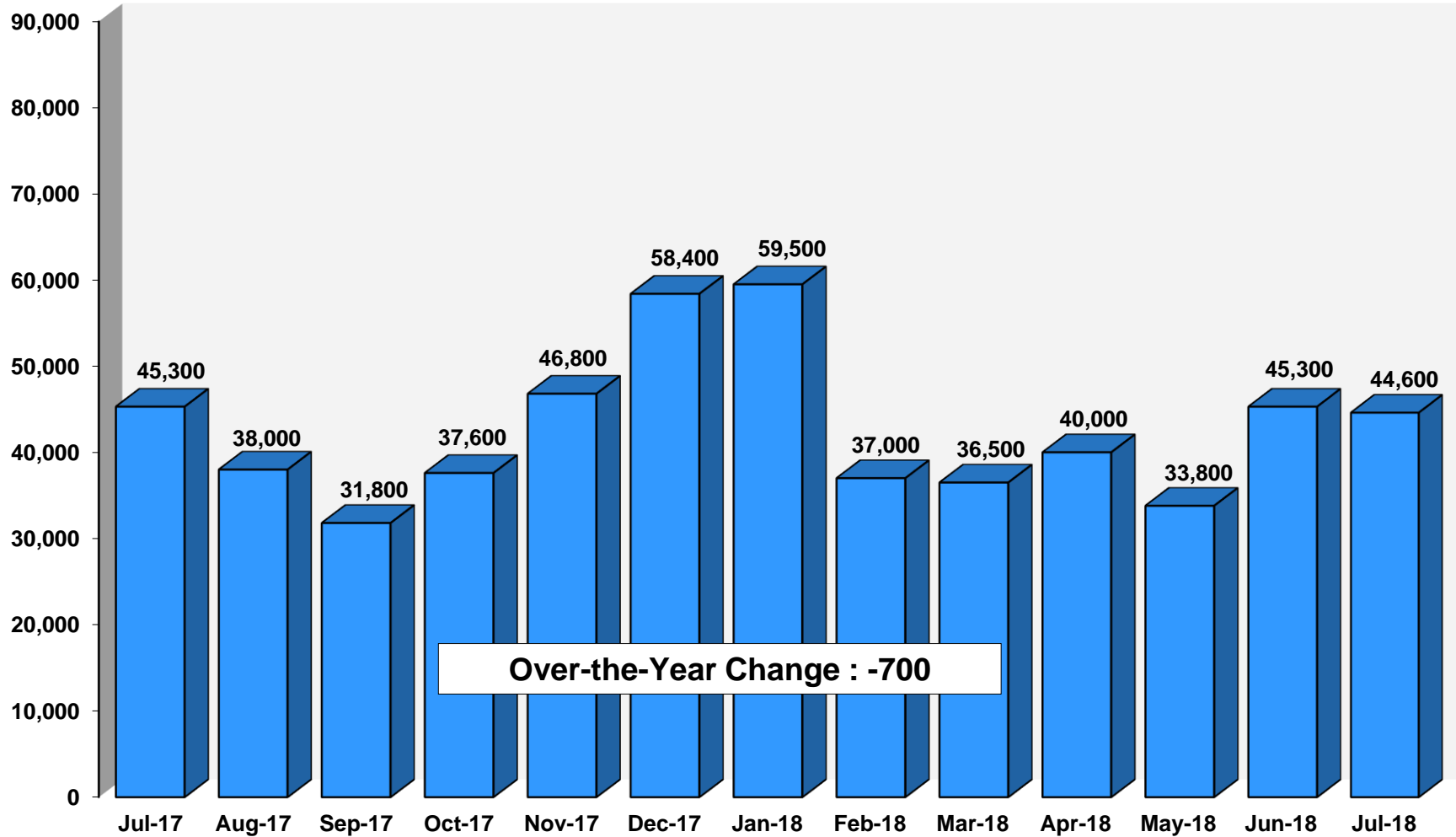
