INTRODUCTION

With the enactment of a new Sex Offenders Law on April 11, 1949 New Jersey moved forward considerably in attacking this serious social problem of abnormal sex conduct inimical to the best interests of society.

The law as revised by the 1950 Legislature has the following main provisions:

If a person is convicted of the offense of rape, carnal abuse, sodomy or impairing the morals of a minor or of an attempt to commit any of these offenses, the judge shall order the commitment of such person to the Diagnostic Center for a complete physical and mental examination.*

If it appears from the report of the Diagnostic Center to the court that the offender's conduct was characterized by (a) a pattern of repetitive, compulsive behavior; and (b) either violence; or (c) an age disparity that the victim was under the age of fifteen years and the offender is an adult aggressor, it is the duty of the court to submit the offender to a program of specialized treatment for his mental and physical aberrations.

The disposition to be made by the court can include one or more of the following measures: (a) Probation with the requirement that he receive out-patient psychiatric treatment. (b) Commitment to an institution to be designated by the Commissioner of Institutions and Agencies for treatment best suited to care for his needs and upon release to be subject to parole supervision.

If it appears from the report of the Diagnostic Center to the court that the offender's conduct was not characterized by a pattern of repetitive, compulsive behavior and neither violence nor age disparity was indicated, the court shall impose sentence on such person in the manner provided by law.

Any person, believing himself to be suffering from a physical or mental condition which may result in sexual trends dangerous to the welfare of the public, may make application for voluntary admission to the Diagnostic Center for the purpose of diagnosis. If it appears that such person does in fact suffer from a physical or mental condition which may result in sexual trends of the type that might prove dangerous to the welfare of the general public, and he indicates a desire to receive treatment for such condition, he may make application for voluntary admission to an institution to be designated by the Commissioner of Institutions and Agencies.

* The original law included also incest, lewdness, indecent exposure, uttering or exposing obscene literature or pictures, indecent communications to females of any nature whatsoever, which offenses were not included in the revised Act of 1950. Added to the 1950 revision was the offense of impairing the morals of a minor.

Since the establishment of the law several hundred males convicted of sex offenses have been examined at the New Jersey State Diagnostic Center at Menlo Park.

In connection with the examination of the individual offender which involves "a complete physical and mental inventory" a great many facts are recorded which give an insight into the psychiatric and psychological make-up of sex offenders, the seriousness of the sex deviation, and recommendations for treatment measures which might profitably be applied.

These facts concerning the first 250 sex offenders examined under the original law have been brought together in this report* under the following main headings:

In presenting this first study the Diagnostic Center is carrying out one of the recommendations of the New Jersey State Commission on the Habitual Sex Offender** for "assumption of responsibility for the continuing development of research on the methods of effective treatment of the sex deviate, and to prepare periodic reports of the program of such research". Further and more detailed studies and analyses relating to sex offenders seen at the Diagnostic Center are planned.

CLASSIFICATION OF SEX OFFENSES

Forcible rape - unlawful carnal knowledge (*sexual intercourse involving penetration*) of a woman against her will.

Incest - carnal copulation of a man and woman, related to each other in any of the degrees within which marriage is prohibited by law. Under this category also has been included "incestuous conduct with a child".

Sexual assault - this is a broad category designed to encompass the charges of: indecent assault; intent to commit statutory rape; sexual assault; attempted carnal abuse.

Statutory rape - carnal knowledge of a woman child (*under age of 12 years or over 12 and under 16 years*) when accused is 16 years or over. In this study it involves those cases where indications are that the woman-child was willing but was under the legal age of consent.

Carnal abuse - act of debauchery of the female sexual organs by a person over the age of 16 years where the victim (*whether consenting to the act or not*) is (a) under 12 years (b) over 12 and under 16 years.

Homosexual acts - all acts of abuse, carnal indecency, fellatio, sodomy, indecent assault on a male, etc. involving men or boys as the victims.

Open lewdness - public acts of indecent exposure, masturbation, soliciting and disrobing or lewdness.

General charge of contribution to impairment of a minor's morals - this covers various charges or acts as follows: contributing to the delinquency of a minor; showing obscene pictures to a minor; having immoral purposes involving a minor. The law, under charge of "Contributing to Delinquency of a Minor" states: "any person who shall be willfully responsible for, or who by any continued negligence or willful act, shall encourage, cause or contribute to the delinquency of a child".

Possessing obscene pictures and sending indecent communications -
A. exposing to the view of another, or having in possession with intent to utter or expose to view of another, or to sell same, any obscene literature, pictures, etc.
B. willfully and wantonly sending or conveying to any female against her will or consent, an insulting, indecent, lascivious or disgusting communication or letter.

Animal contact - definition under the law governing "sodomy" - unnatural act with a beast,

*Of the 18 sex offenders classified as schizoid or borderline psychotics, 10 come under the Act; 8 do not. It has been suggested that not all schizoid personalities having come under observation show the sexual pathology necessary to bring them under the Act.

**This was a highly specialized case where the offender could not be classified psychiatrically without further study, where the case involved a charge of rape with some indications of willingness on the victim's part, and where it was felt insight would be gained by placing the offender under the Act, thus, compelling him to be located in a mental hospital for further surveillance and therapy.

*Of the 33 severe neurotics, 17 had previous sex offense records; 16 did not. However, another table indicates that of these 33 severe neurotics, 16 came under the Act, and 17 did not. It has been suggested that there does not appear to be any significant correlation between whether or not the severe neurotic had committed previous sex offenses and whether or not he came under the Act. Apparently some with records were not felt to exhibit the sort of sexual pathology which would bring them under the Act, and some, without previous known records, did, under the testing and examining situation, indicate such abnormality.

**Four of the situational offenders and one of the "normal" individuals has previous sex offense records. This is not necessarily a contradiction since it is possible for them to have previous sex offense records without exhibiting the abnormal sex pathology which would bring them under the Act.
