John J. Tucker, Morris Township Chairman, 1999 - present

Mr. Tucker was elected Chairman in January 2002, three years after his appointment to the Commission. Now retired, he had a long and distinguished career in the consumer products industry, most recently having served in senior management positions at Philip Morris Co., Inc. and Kraft, Inc. from 1985-1994. He received a BA in Business Administration from Upsala College and a MS in Business from Northwestern University. Mr. Tucker continues to be active in many professional and civic organizations and is a member of the Advisory Council for Human Resource Management for the Conference Board. Prior to his appointment to the Commission, Mr. Tucker owned and bred thoroughbred horses for over 15 years.

James G. Aaron Appointed 2006

Mr. Aaron is a distinguished attorney practicing presently with the firm Ansell, Zaro, Grimm and Aaron, whose offices are located in Ocean Township, New Jersey. Mr. Aaron graduated Long Branch High School in 1962, earned a B.A. degree from Dickinson College in Carlisle, Pa. in 1966, and a J. D. Degree from New York University School of Law in 1969. Mr. Aaron has founded, incorporated and is a member of the Board of Directors of the Monmouth Community Bank. Mr. Aaron is the Vice-President of ERBA Company, Inc. which is a Real Estate and Equity Investment Firm. Mr. Aaron has vast experience in the horse racing and breeding industry having owned standardbred horses from 1983 - 2006. Mr. Aaron was part owner of "San Gimignanao" who was the New Jersey Sire Stakes three year old pacer of the year in 2001. Mr. Aaron and his wife Madlyn, have been married 37 years and reside in West Long Branch, New Jersey.

Anthony T. Abbatiello Appointed 2006

Anthony T. Abbatiello's love for horses has resulted in 53 years dedicated to the horse racing industry. For 28 years, Mr. Abbatiello served the Standardbred Breeders and Owners Association of New Jersey, both as Co-Founder and as President. Mr. Abbatiello's previous titles included, Chairman of the Board for the United States Trotting Association, Director of the Standardbred Owner's Association of New York, Chairman of the New Jersey Sire Stakes Board of Directors, Trustee Chairman of the Board of American Horse Council in Washington D.C. and Trustee of the Trotting Horse Museum in Goshen, New York.

On July 2, 1995, Mr. Abbatiello was inducted into the Living Hall of Fame in Goshen, New York with his brother Carmine, a 1985 inductee, his induction resulted in the first brother tandem in the Hall of Fame. A decorated war veteran, Mr. Abbatiello served in the Korean War rising to the rank of Captain. Mr. Abbatiello demonstrated courage under fire, receiving numerous commendations including the Combat Infantry Badge, Silver Star, The Bronze Star with Valor, two Purple Hearts, the Presidential Unit Citation, Korean Campaign Ribbon with four Battle Stars and the Korean Service Medal.

Anthony R. Caputo, M.D. Commissioner since 2005

Dr. Anthony R. Caputo was born in Newark and raised in Belleville where he attended public school. For high school he enrolled at Seton Hall Prep where he excelled as their Quarterback for three years. After high school, he received his B.S. degree from St. Bonaventure University. Years later he was granted an Honorary Doctorate from St Bonaventure University.

Dr. Caputo earned his Medical Degree in 1969 from University of Bologna. His internship and ophthalmology training was completed at the New Jersey Medical School. In 1974, he was offered a Heed Fellowship at the Wills Eye Hospital in Philadelphia for pediatric ophthalmology. Upon returning to Newark, he was appointed Director of Fight for Sight Children's Eye Care Center and became the first pediatric ophthalmologist to practice in New Jersey.

Peter J. Cofrancesco III, Sparta Commissioner since 2001

Mr. Cofrancesco serves as Executive Officer of the Grinnell Group of Companies. Grinnell is family owned and operated with interests in manufacturing of construction materials, transportation services, as well as commercial and residential real estate development. The company was named the 2003 New Jersey Family Business of the Year, an award that recognizes the significant contributions to the economy and community made by New Jersey family businesses. He attended Delaware Valley College, concentrating in Business Management and also received an Honorary Doctorate in Humane Letters from Centenary College in 2003. He is extremely active in many community and professional organizations including directorship of college and hospital foundations, the NJ State Fair and the Interlocking Concrete Pavement Institute. Mr. Cofrancesco is a leading owner and breeder of American Quarter Horses and currently serves as a Director of the American Quarter Horse Association. He and his family have owned an unprecedented 24 AQHA World Champions, and have received the prestigious Leading Owner Award five times.

Francis X. Keegan, Jr. Appointed 2006

Mr. Keegan, a lifelong horsemen, was appointed to the Commission in 2006. He is a past President of the New Jersey Thoroughbred Breeders' Association, a past President of the New Jersey Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association and was a member of many horsemen organizations, including the Thoroughbred Club of America, the Green Mountain Horse Association, the National Hunt Association, and a patron of the Monmouth County Hunt. He has bred, owned and raced horses in New Jersey since 1963, and has also been a successful consignor at numerous thoroughbred auction sales including Saratoga and Keeneland. He is a graduate of Seton Hall University and attended Fordham Law School and served as an infantry officer after college in the United States Army. He is a Wealth Management Advisor and First Vice President of Investments with UBS Financial Services, Inc. and in March 2006 celebrated 40 years with the firm. Over the years he has served on numerous bank boards, including Carteret S & L Bank of Commerce in Newark and Monmouth Community Bank.

Noel Love Gross, Saddle River Former Chair and Commissioner since 1994

Mrs. Gross served as chair of the New Jersey Racing Commission from 1994 to 2001. She received her college education at Sarah Lawrence College in Bronxville, New York. In the private sector, she is President and Chief Administrative Officer of the Hudson Landing Corporation. In the public sector, Mrs. Gross has had a notable career highlighted by her appointment by President Reagan to serve as United States Alternate Representative to the 41st and 43rd United Nations General Assembly. She was asked to head the US Delegation to the UN Economic and Social Council Organizational Session, and was named head of the US delegation to the Special Session of the UN Development Program. She has also held various positions in the Republican National Committee and, locally, is a member of the Board of Trustees of 70001 Limited Development Foundation. Mrs. Gross is an owner/operator of two horse farms and her horses have won many competitions including multiple Grand Championships by Westfields and first-year Green Hunter of the Year National Championship by Ever So Dark.

Edward R. McGlynn, Point Pleasant Beach Commissioner since 1996

Mr. McGlynn received a B.A. degree from McKendree College in Lebanon III. and a J.D. from Seton Hall University School of Law. His career encompassed both the public and private sector. He served as Deputy and Chief of Staff to Governor Thomas H. Kean, and Executive and Special Assistant to Attorney General Irwin I. Kimmelman. Currently he is President of ERM Government Affairs, Inc., Senior Vice President of Government Affairs for the Alman Group, LLC, and is Of Counsel to Stone Mandia, Counsellors at Law. His community and professional affiliations are many and include medical and educational groups, and State Commissions.

Daniel A. Monaco, Woodbury Commissioner since 1985

Dr. Monaco earned a B.S. in chemistry from Mt. Saint Mary's College and a DDS from Temple Dental School. He served in the Army as captain in the U.S. Army Dental Corps. In 1957, he went into the general practice of dentistry and retired from practice in 1997. His professional and community affiliations include several dental associations and was a member of the dental staff of Underwood Memorial Hospital having served as chief of its Department of Dentistry. In public service, he served on several environmental commissions in West Deptford Township. Dr. Monaco was a co-founder and general partner of the Gloucester County Cable TV Co. He also was an incorporator and director of the Lenape State Bank and the Bank of Gloucester County having retired from banking in 2001. Prior to joining the Commission, Dr. Monaco was an owner and breeder of both thoroughbred and standardbred race horses for over 25 years.

Frank Zanzuccki, Wall Township Executive Director since 1992

Mr. Zanzuccki received a B.S. in Accounting from St. Francis College, Loretto, Pa. He was the Chief Accountant for United Mine Workers of America from 1975-1978. He started his career with the New Jersey Racing Commission in 1978 and served in various positions and was appointed Executive Director in 1992. Mr. Zanzuccki was awarded the prestigious Len Foote Award in 1998 in recognition of outstanding contributions to the horse racing industry. He is also the first non-commissioner to be elected to the Association of Racing Commissioners International Board of Directors. In addition to this honor, Mr. Zanzuccki was subsequently elected as an officer of this international organization and served as its chairman from April 2004 through April 2005.

STRUCTURE & FUNCTION

MISSION STATEMENT

The New Jersey Racing Commission ("NJRC"), a Division within the Department of Law and Public Safety, is responsible for regulating the horse race industry in the State through vigilant oversight of all racing related activities to ensure the integrity of the sport and the safety of its participants.

Commission Structure

Horse racing in New Jersey is regulated by nine Commissioners who, by law, are appointed by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Senate. They set policy and rule on all matters affecting racing such as issuing permits to conduct horse racing meets, approving expenditures and adjudicating licensing matters. They also consider the issuance of licenses of any applications filed pertaining to off-track wagering sites and are responsible for the oversight and regulation of account wagering and internet betting in New Jersey. This year, nine individuals served as Commissioners: John J. Tucker, Chair, James G. Aaron, Anthony T. Abbatiello, Anthony R. Caputo, Peter J. Cofrancesco, III, Francis X. Keegan, Jr., Noel Love Gross, Edward R. McGlynn, and Daniel A. Monaco.

The Commissioners employ staff to effect policy including an Executive Director who is responsible for overseeing the day-to-day operations of the Commission in accordance with accepted business and financial practices. Francesco Zanzuccki serves as the Executive Director.

NJRC has a staff of 73 full-time employees who conduct the daily functions of regulating horse racing. It also maintains a pool of 34 part-time workers to supplement staff as needed. Activities are divided into four functional areas: Administrative/Financial, Racing Operations, Pari-mutuels and Investigations.

Administrative/Financial

Much of the general administrative functions are performed by the Department of Law & Public Safety's Consolidated Administrative and Support Services unit specifically organized to streamline the personnel, budget and logistics functions of several State agencies.

Commission personnel perform administrative functions specific to racing matters including rule and regulation composition, staffing and scheduling, communications with and oversight of industry-related organizations, adjudication support, and report writing. Commission staff maintains a horse racing financial system that records and calculates all receipts and payments of funds from pari-mutuel wagering. In addition, it monitors the finances of certain industry organizations as required or requested.

Racing Operations

All matters related to the regulation of the actual "running of the races" are the responsibility of the employees in this functional area.

Each individual and entity associated with horse racing must be licensed by Commission personnel. All participants must also be fingerprinted. A state-of- the-art computer system networks the Trenton office with all satellite racetrack locations. The Commission has a very successful mail-out program and participates in the Association of Racing Commissioners International multi-jurisdictional licensing program for owners.

The Commission employs racing officials who are present at each racetrack to monitor the running of every race in New Jersey. They issue penalties for rule infractions and rule on matters affecting the integrity of racing, including licensing concerns.

Veterinarians are also present at every live race meet to ensure the safety of the animals and to verify that each is fit to race.

Race horses are tested for the presence of illegal drugs after each race. These randomly selected samples undergo a complete chemical analysis at Commission-sponsored State Police Forensic Laboratory at the Meadowlands Racetrack.

Pari-Mutuels

Every wager made on every live and simulcast race is recorded and checked for accuracy and compliance with Commission rules and regulations. Commission staff calculate financial

information from these wagers for proper distribution of funds. Racing Commission staff oversee all aspects of pari-mutuel operations to ensure they are conducted with integrity.

Investigations

An in-house investigative unit provides the Commission with the ability to oversee the integrity of racing by conducting case studies into alleged rule violations, and participating in the litigation process to punish offenders.

KEY ISSUES 2006

After a review of some of the key issues that affected the Horse race industry in 2006 the most significant is the enhanced revenues dedicated to the sport from slot machine or video lottery terminal (VLT) proceeds. Directly affecting New Jersey are West Virginia, Delaware and New York who already have these systems operational at racetracks and Pennsylvania started operations in December 2006. Revenues from these systems increase purse money in these jurisdictions and enable them to attract better quality horses resulting in a superior product. The New Jersey casino industry has dedicated \$86 million to the New Jersey horse racing industry, to be used for horse race purses and the balance of approximately \$22

million will be used through 2007. This money is essential in keeping the quality of racing in this state competitive with surrounding jurisdictions. The influx of these funds into New Jersey racing, coupled with the maturing of the account wagering initiative, has allowed our racing industry to meet the challenges imposed by expanded gaming in neighboring states.

Another concern garnering national attention is the use of illegal drugs and unacceptable performance altering drugs and therapies. Efforts continue to develop a national standard for medication use and to develop accurate testing methods for new concerns like the use of bronchial dilators and shock wave therapy.

The NJRC participated with other states in the Mid-Atlantic region in developing new medication and testing rules which address integrity concerns and will insure a greater consistency between New Jersey and neighboring jurisdictions.

On October 7, 2004 the New Jersey Racing Commission issued an initial license to the New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority to conduct account wagering, computer wagering and telephone wagering. The issuance of this license was a result of legislation passed almost five years ago, and a participation agreement being reached by the owners of the eligible New Jersey racetracks and the New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority (operator of the Meadowlands and Monmouth Park). As of October 2005, New Jersey bettors could wager through established accounts via computer without having to physically be at a racetrack. Telephone wagering commenced in New Jersey in April 2005 with 4,992,886 million dollars being wagered as of December 31, 2005. In 2006 the first full year of telephone wagering was completed with 9,045,307 dollars being wagered. 2006 also saw the first full year of computer or internet wagering with \$51,935,127 being wagered. The Commission insured this new initiative was instituted smoothly and consistent with national integrity concerns. The Commission looks forward to the expansion of New Jersey's wagering base, which will result in larger purses and better horses being attracted to compete here.

As a result of the Commission's receipt of New Jersey's first OTW application in December 2005, filed by the New Jersey Sports & Exposition Authority and the owners' of Atlantic City Racecourse, the Commission is preparing for the staffing and application of already existing regulations which were tailored to this new industry. The Commission has conducted hearings as per statute in 2006, in Vineland, Toms River and Woodbridge Townships.

Vineland was issued a license and this sites anticipated opening is in the first quarter of 2007. Woodbridge has also been issued a license with its opening expected in 2007 and Toms River has also been issued a license and should be operational in 2007.

Racing dates are approved every year, usually at the Racing Commission's November meeting. Following the conduct of a public hearing, the 2006 dates approved by the Commission totaled 124 for thoroughbreds and 352 for standardbreds.

Numerous matters relating to violations of racing rules were litigated and adjudicated by action of the Commissioners ranging from the detection of illegal drugs in horses on race day to various enforcement actions on licensees.

The Atlantic City Hub still handles all pari-mutuel wagering from participating casino properties. The Racing Commission maintains a staff at each location, during all hours when wagers are placed, to insure that such actives are conducted properly. After 2006 completed, the Atlantic City Hub and Data Center in Mount Laurel were functioning properly and within the Commission's stringent guidelines. The new state-of-the-art Data Center is operated by Scientific Games, Inc. and processes all wagers made at New Jersey racetracks. It is planned that the Atlantic City Hub will be merged into that facility as will other interstate wagering process centers to create one regional hub which will be housed at this facility in New Jersey.

Standardbred and thoroughbred horse racing is conducted at four racetracks in New Jersey: the Meadowlands Racetrack, Monmouth Park, Freehold Raceway and Atlantic City Race Course. Parimutuel wagering in New Jersey occurs at these locations and nine casino simulcast sites.

Through December 31, 2006 wagering at New Jersey racetracks totaled \$825,316,543. Wagers made outside of New Jersey on New Jersey races totaled \$595,533,224 resulting in a total handle of \$1,420,849,767 This represents a \$85,022,894 decrease when compared with the 12 month totals from last year. It is noted that there was 1 more day raced in 2005 compared to 2006.

Wagers made at the nine casino simulcasting sites, totaled \$114,134,411 as of December 31, 2006. This is \$4,599,537 million less than last year.

Attendance during live racing totaled 1, 548,991 through October 31, 2006.

NJRC 's FY 2006 budget totaled \$9,534,729. It is comprised of \$592,620 in licensing revenue and \$1,562,745 in revenue from uncashed tickets. The balance of \$7,379,386 is generated from direct assessments to the racing industry.

With the Breeders Cup World Championships being run at Churchill Downs in Louisville, Kentucky in 2006, all eyes will focus on New Jersey in 2007 specifically Monmouth Park for this megachampionship day in thoroughbred racing. The Breeders Cup Association was formed by Thoroughbred Breeders, most from Kentucky but have a worldwide membership board and is headquartered in Lexington, Kentucky.

They were formed to promote the worldwide breeding of thoroughbred race horses.

The Association charges fees to register stallions whose foals or offspring become eligible to race in this event.

The money from these fees go to create a huge purse structure and the Association each year chooses a location (racetrack) to conduct its event.

Over \$20 million is given in eight races to the best horses in the world and the New Jersey Racing Commission as well as the New Jersey Sports & Exposition Authority are tirelessly working to set the stage for the largest event ever in October 2007. The eyes of the entire world will be looking toward New Jersey when the Super Bowl of Thoroughbred Racing takes place here.

FUNCTIONAL AREA HIGHLIGHTS

Administrative/Financial

The Administrative and Financial area is responsible for effecting policies of the Commission as directed by the Executive Director. Staff assigned to this area prepares annual reports, authors rules and regulations, maintains the Commission's web site www.NJRCONLINE.com prepares special reports, liaisons with other State agencies and industry groups, maintains the horse racing financial system, prepares financial statements and conducts audits. (Detailed financial reports appear at the end of this report.)

Racing Operations

All activities related to the actual running of races is the responsibility of this section. Staff consists of licensing personnel, racing officials (stewards and judges), testing lab chemists, and veterinarians.

Licensing is conducted at all racetracks, the Trenton office, and through the mail. The computerized licensing system was upgraded last year to an online interactive site. This totally redesigned system is more user friendly and is more efficient in report compilation. Digital photography also became operational in 2006. This type of photography allows the Commission to computerize pictures of licensees enter and access them through the license data base along with the standard information such as name, address, etc. already contained.

The Commission issued 14,236 licenses through December 31, 2006. Over one-third of these licenses are processed through the Commission's mail out program and another ten percent through the RCI 's multi-jurisdictional owner's licensing and fingerprinting program. Revenue derived from the licensing function totaled \$591,570 in 2006.

The Commission employs Racing Officials who monitor every horse race run in New Jersey. These stewards and judges also rule on matters affecting the integrity of racing, conduct hearings and issue penalties for rule violations. The Commission issued 639 rulings in 2006, of which 288 included fines payable to NJRC totaling \$130,755.

Veterinarians are present at each racetrack to examine horses for soundness prior to and after racing. Six full-time (program) Racing Commission veterinarians, supplemented by a per diem staff, supervise the lasix program and supervise the gathering of samples for chemical testing.

NJRC's Equine Drug Testing Program is administered at the New Jersey State Police Forensic Science Laboratory located at the Meadowlands racetrack. A staff of 13 chemists use modern testing equipment

and methods to detect the presence of illegal substances in horses. In 2006, 28,010 blood samples and 7,821 urine samples were collected and tested resulting in 8 violations of the Commission's medication rules. In addition, 6,152 blood gas samples from standardbreds were collected resulting in 1 positive.

The Commission also randomly tests jockeys and drivers for the presence of illegal drugs. It also tests for alcohol abuse by race participants and officials. In 2006, 4 positives were detected from 860 samples tested.

Pari-mutuel Operations

Racing Commission staff monitors all aspects of pari-mutuel wagering to ensure compliance with rules and regulations governing betting. On-site supervisors of mutuels check for accuracy of system configuration relative to wagering options, proper transmission of wagers and television signals, and accuracy of pay-outs.

All wagering activity is now processed through two computer hubs located at the Data Center in Mt. Laurel while the casinos are processed though the Atlantic City Racetrack Hub. Recording and reporting of all wagers occurs there and are reviewed by Commission staff. These reports are subsequently forwarded to the Commission audit section for further compilation to effectuate the distribution of funds from wagers pursuant to law.

Investigations into irregularities in betting patterns and systems are initiated by the Racing Commission executive staff. Special reports are requested and generated that assist with the investigation of matters regarding pari-mutuels such as past-posting, unusual wagering patterns, system malfunctions or manipulations or illegal cashing of tickets and betting vouchers.

Ethics education and training for all Commission employees will be completed by the end of year 2006. This includes distribution of ethics material, an annual ethics briefing, and formal training session.

2006 marked the first year of New Jersey being a full member of the National Licensing Compact, a group of 23 racing state that offer the convenience of central licensing for owners, trainers, jockeys and drivers. New Jersey Racing Commission staff this year established a direct billing system for the Compact and is a member of its license applicant review committee.

Investigative Unit

Six individuals are assigned to this unit that is responsible for investigating matters relative to compliance with Commission rules at all racetracks, in connection with the account wagering initiative, and at licensed off-track stabling facilities in the state. Of utmost concern are those matters that affect the integrity of racing such as race fixing, illegal administration of drugs, and licensing falsifications.

Staff also participates in review of security procedures at racetracks, personnel and accounting

concerns at industry organizations, and conducts background investigations of officials.

COMMITTEES FUNDS & ORGANIZATIONS

NJRC COMMITTEES

Backstretch Advisory Committee - An industry funded organization that provides programs and oversight for matters that affect the health and well-being of stable area employees. On site chaplains and counselors, with assistance from horsemen's organizations and racetrack management, conduct a comprehensive program to address quality of life issues. Such programs include: drug and alcohol abuse counseling; soccer and softball leagues administration; educational services, including computer assisted English as a Second Language courses; health fairs; and other programs.

The Commissioners approved a \$222,035 budget for backstretch programs for 2006. Funding for these programs is from three sources: charity days at each race meet - \$16,235; a percentage of pari-mutuel handle - \$78,788; and revenues

from Commission levied fines - \$130,755 and funds from account wagering, \$10,517. A total of \$236,296 was deposited into the fund in 2006.

SPECIAL FUNDS

Casino Simulcasting Fund - Statutorily created to financially assist racetracks and horsemen's organizations following the 1992 introduction of casino simulcasting. The Commission distributed funds of \$1,820,669.42 in year 2006.

Local Expense Fund - Statutorily created to assist qualified municipalities to offset increased expenses from the operation of racetracks in their areas. Funds generated in 2006 were \$14,481.

Charity days - Proceeds from wagers designated by law to assist certain causes totaled \$109,468 and were allocated as follows: Developmentally Disabled - \$51,054; Horse Park of New Jersey/Care of Retired Horses - \$42,177; and Backstretch Improvement - \$16,235.

Compulsive Gambling Treatment - A total of \$200,000 was paid by racetracks to fund treatment and educational programs for compulsive gamblers as required by off-track and account wagering legislation enacted in 2002.

NEW JERSEY HORSE RACING INJURY COMPENSATION BOARD

The Commission encouraged the creation of this Board that provides low cost group workers' compensation insurance for the horse race industry. The Board consists of representatives of the public and private sector including members of horse race organizations, insurance providers, state insurance departments and the NJRC. The program covers employees of the Board, namely drivers, jockeys and exercise riders with 2006 premiums established at nearly \$1.1 million.

THOROUGHBRED ORGANIZATIONS

Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association of New Jersey, a not-for-profit corporation which advocates thoroughbred racing in the State. It provides general administrative services to its members including a group health benefits program.

Thoroughbred Breeders Association of New Jersey is an organization devoted to promoting and enhancing the breeding of New Jersey thoroughbreds. The Racing Commission administers the Breeders Award Program that provides monetary incentives to owners and breeders by offering purse enhancements for races for New Jersey breds.

STANDARDBRED ORGANIZATIONS

Standardbred Breeders and Owners Association of New Jersey is a not-for-profit organization dedicated to advancing the cause of standardbred racing in the State. It provides general administrative services to its members including a group health benefits program.

New Jersey Sires Stakes, an agency within the State Department of Agriculture, promotes the owning and breeding of New Jersey standardbreds. Nearly \$11 million in purse money is devoted to Sires Stake races restricted to horses sired by stallions resident in New Jersey. The program is funded by distributions from pari-mutuel handle at harness tracks and from nominating and sustaining payments by horse owners.

Wagering at Casinos

Wagering on horse racing also occurs at Atlantic City casinos. Nine "race books" accept wagers on races run in New Jersey and out of state. All bets are commingled with the host racetrack, via the Atlantic City hub, producing uniform pay-outs.

The amount wagered during the year at these facilities totaled \$114,134,411. This represents a 4% decrease from last year's total of \$118,733,948. By law, a portion of the commissions generated by these wagers is earmarked for deposit into the Casino Simulcast Special Fund for distribution to racetracks and industry-specific funds.

Pari-mutuel activity generated in 2006 at the casinos range from \$4,277,096 at the Showboat to \$30,127,692 at the Borgata.

PLANS & INCENTIVES

The New Jersey Racing Commission will continue its vigorous oversight of horse racing matters to ensure that racing is conducted in a fair and responsible manner. Staff will provide the administrative support to encourage its growth through expansion of wagering opportunities. The following is a list of incentives planned for 2007:

- In 2007, the Racing Commission anticipates the implentation of New Jersey's first stand alone off-track wagering facility which follows the already operating Account, Internet and Telephone Wagering systems. The New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority, Greenwood and Pennwood Racing Companies have applied for OTW sites at Vineland, Toms River and Woodbridge Townships. The NJRC has conducted hearings on the applications to establish these facilities and have issued licenses to all.
- 2. In recognition of the legislative & industry initiatives such as Account Wagering & the inception of off-track wagering, the Commission in 2007 will consider reorganizing its staffing which will include but not be limited to the addition of Commission personnel at all operating "OTW" facilities. The investigative unit will also be considered for expansion due to increased locations of pari-mutuel activities which enable the Commission to better regulate New Jersey's growing horse race industry.

- 3. In view of the awarding of the prestigious "Breeder's Cup" to New Jersey's Monmouth Park in 2007, the Racing Commission will be implementing various initiatives with the Breeders' Cup Committee and Monmouth Park to prepare for racings biggest event. Upgrades to the Monmouth Park facility in excess of \$15 million are planned and the Commission will oversee and be responsible for the approval of this massive undertaking to successfully set the stage for New Jersey to be spotlighted in front of the entire world of horse racing.
- 4. In 2005 the Racing Commission formed a committee headed by Commissioners McGlynn and Caputo, to study medication issues as they relate to New Jersey and various other jurisdictions. The Commission did a complete analysis of its medication testing program and state of the art chemical testing laboratory. In 2007 the Commission plans to implement the results of this review in an effort to create a more consistent environment with neighboring states regarding this issue. The Commission believes this initiative will continue to cause New Jersey to have an even more reliable and forward thinking testing program.
- 5. In 2005 the Racing Commission worked with the industry and our totalisator company (Scientific Games/Racing Corporation) to bring to New Jersey a state of the art multi-million dollar Computer Hub facility which will service the Northeast region. This facility went on-line in 2006 and will be staffed by Racing Commission representatives as it is an important factor in enhancing parimutuel wagering activities and integrity. 2007 will be the first full year of it's operation.
- 6. In 2006 the Commission introduced the inception of digital licensing photography and live scan fingerprinting. This technology enabled the Commission and its staff a better adaptation to its already operating computer licensing system by allowing immediate photo identification of all licensees and instant background criminal histories and more readily protect the integrity of the sport and its participants.
- 7. The Off-track and Account Wagering Act allows for the licensing of up to 15 off-track wagering (OTW) facilities. The Racing Commission has, thus far, approved three facilities. Prior to the opening of each OTW facility, the Racing Commission will develop financial equations for distributions of revenues from pari-mutuel handle generated at these facilities consistent with governing legislation; will initiate the license review process for a ll OTW employees; allocate necessary pari-mutuel and investigative staff to regulate the facilities once operational.
- 8. The Racing Commission will continue to work with the industry to comply with requirements to host the breeders' Cup in October 2007 at Monmouth Park Racetrack. The Breeders' Cup is an annual event scheduled at racetracks around the country which consists of eight stakes races. The event is considered the equivalent of the Super Bowl and is expected to generate positive economic impact of at least fifty million dollars to the state. The Racing Commission will prepare a regulatory oversight plan for security, licensing, medication standards and pari-mutuel matters.
- 9. The Racing Commission equine laboratory is located on the grounds of the Meadowlands racetrack and has out grown the facility. The facility was built at a time when the racing Commission administered a total of three permanent and two seasonal laboratories throughout the state. In an effort to improve uniformity and reduce costs, the five laboratories were

consolidated into the existing facility at the Meadowlands Racetrack. The laboratory is funded by the racing industry and falls under the jurisdiction of the Racing Commission in terms of testing policy. It is staffed by the State Police personnel and, thus, is part of the State Police Forensic Science Bureau. The Racing Commission is committed to ensuring that the facility maintains it's stature as a "state of the art" equine laboratory. We are presently evaluating the feasibility of deploying a new methodology designed to enhance the detection of illegal substances. Once completed, the Racing Commission will make a determination concerning this methodology.

10. The Racing Commission successfully deployed a new digital photography system at all licensing locations earlier this year. The next phase of the project is to convert the existing ink and roll fingerprint system to a digital system. The Racing Commission prints approximately 4,000 applicants per year. The conversion to a digital system is expected to expedite the processing of prints and thereby enhance our ability to regulate racing.

NEW JERSEY RACING IN THE NEWS

Big New Jersey racing Weekend features Masterly Driver & Trainer Performances in the Hambletonian

The 81st Hambletonian kicked off a great weekend of racing in New Jersey as more than 70,000 fans filled the Meadowlands and Monmouth Park and total wagering reached \$20 million. "It's been an extraordinary weekend for racing in New Jersey with the Hambletonian and the Haskell, and I have to thank the horsemen and the fans for making it all possible," said Dennis Dowd, the New Jersey Sports & Exposition Authority's Senior Vice-President for racing. "Anytime 70,000 people show up to watch racing you know you've created two great events that generate excitement not only statewide, but nationwide, and will continue to grow for many years to come." This year's Hambletonian, the 26th edition since the race was moved to the Meadowlands in 1981, drew 29,531 who wagered 2.7 million toward a total handle of \$8,096,924, the third highest in the history of the race and the harness industry. The pool for Saturday's Hambletonian was \$1,288,727 (Including foreign wagers), a record for the final heat of the Hambletonian. Monmouth Park drew its fifth highest attendance in Haskell history - 42,318 who contributed \$3.4 million toward a total handle of \$11,773,048. Favorite Bluegrass Cat won the \$1 million Haskell Invitational. A special Hambletonian - Haskell Double produced a \$46.80 payoff for the 8-9 combination. The \$1.5 million Hambletonian, which is the first leg of the trotting triple crown that also includes the Kentucky Futurity and Yonkers Trot, provided a showcase for the sport's most successful driver, John Campbell, and a trainer Blair Burgess, who has made the most of his Hambletonian starts - two wins in two tries. Campbell posted an unprecedented sixth Hambletonian victory with Glidemaster. The 51 year-old who has now won 22 million dollar races, had previously hoisted the Hambletonian trophy in 1987 with Mack Lobell, 1988 with Ambro Goal, 1990 with Harmonious, 1995 with Tagliabue, Stanley Dancer and Mike LaChance. Campbell had last won a million dollar race in 2002 with Mach Three, his unmatched seventh victory in the \$1 million Meadowlands Pace. "It always been fun," said the native of Ailsa Craig, Ontario who has called New Jersey home for more than 25 years and tops all drivers with more than \$238 million in career earnings. "It sure beats working for a living. Obviously, I've gotten better opportunities this year, and we've been able to take advantage of those. This is the ultimate; this is what we all strive for in this game, to be in

this race and get to where we're standing here today." Glidemaster, who had overcome a foot injury the previous week, went on to set a stakes record with his mile in 1:51.1. Blair [Burgess] and [his wife] Karin have done a tremendous job," Campbell said, referring to the trainer and caretaker of the Yankee Glide colt. "It's just amazing what he went through. He had a nail in his foot. They weren't sure if he was going to be able to race last week. We got through last week [the eliminations]. They had him at the top of his game. That's really difficult to do. Besides the soreness and the stress factor, to get a horse back at his level and set a track record, all the credit goes to Karin and Blair." Burgess, 44, had previously sent only one other starter to the Hambletonian final and won in 2003 with Amigo Hall. Campbell had qualified Amigo Hall for the Hambletonian and opted off to drive the favorite, Power to Charm. Instead long shot Amigo Hall won with Mike Lachance as the 27-1 longest priced winner in Hambletonian history, Burgess' remarkable string in the million-dollar stakes at the Meadowlands also including a pair of winners Frugal Gourmet in 1987 and Real Desire in 2001. "It feels as good as it did last time," Burgess said of winning his second Hambletonian trophy. "There's no more fun than this race." Glidemaster is owned by Robert Burgess [Blair's father], Karin Olsson-Burgess [Blair's wife]. Marsha Cohen of Asbury, New Jersey and Brittany Farms of Versailles, Kentucky which bred the son of Yankee Glide - Cressida Hanover, Glidemaster has a career record of six wins and five seconds for 12 starts and earnings of \$916,782. "He has the American-National Balmoral [next on his schedule], but he was pretty good," Burgess noted. "I earned a rest, and he might have earned a rest, too. We might take a month off [with Glidemaster] and get him ready for the Mohawk. We go up to Maine [for vacation] and then head home [Milton, Ontario].

Total Truth takes \$301,587 Cane Pace Final at Freehold

North American Cup Champion, Total Truth led from start to finish to win the 52nd running of the Cane Pace on Labor Day at Freehold Raceway. Ron Pierce guided the three year old in a brisk 1:51.3, holding off a late charge from Took Hanover with John Campbell. George Teague, Jr. was not concerned with the extended layoff. "He warms up real well and I knew he was ready to go." George Teague, Jr. was the only trainer in the field to have previously sent out a horse of the year (2004 rainbow Blue). Total Truth is the first horse in 18 years to win the North American Cup and the Cane Pace. Third in the Adios, Total Truth earned a bye in the final based on being a top money earner. Total Truth will now set his sights on the second leg of pacing's Triple Crown, the Little Brown Jug September 21st. John Campbell was looking on his 30th Triple Crown victory but came up a length short. Just two years ago Pierce and Campbell dead heated the Cane Pace with Timesareachanging (Pierce and Western Terror (Campbell). Finishing third was Dave Panlone (David Miller) while Cane elimination winner Artstanding (George Brennan) finished fourth. Total Truth rewarded supporters with a payout of \$4.80, 2.80, 2.10. In the \$78,944 Shady Daisy, George Brennan guided Xhilaration to a new track record for three year old pacing fillies with a time of 1:53.0. The victory was her fifth in fourteen starts and paid \$19.00, 11.00, 3.80. In the other major stakes race, Olay Olay with John Campbell won \$126,210 Battle of Freehold for two year olds. The one to five favorite finished in an impressive 1:54.0, matching his time in last week's elimination. Beam of Life (Daniel Dube) was second while Outsource (Ron Pierce) finished third. Also on Monday, David Miller was honored in a winner's circle ceremony in recognition of his 8,000th career win.


