INTRODUCTION

The New Jersey State Library each year compiles statewide library statistics to help libraries develop and improve programs and services. Trustees and library directors use the statistics to develop and justify budgets and for comparative evaluation of programs, staffing practices and collections development. School and college library staffs employ the statistics to identify interlibrary loan resources and to develop cooperative service programs.

Public library services in New Jersey are provided primarily by three types of libraries:

- 1) Municipal - library established by law following a referendum in which the majority of voters vote to establish such a library. It is supported by taxes and is governed by a seven-member board, appointed by the mayor, which must include the mayor and the superintendent of schools. There are 215 municipal libraries identified in the tables by an M.
- 2) County - library established by law following a county-wide referendum passed by a majority of voters. It is supported by taxes and governed by a board known as the county library commission which is composed of five members appointed by the freeholders. There are 14 county libraries identified in the tables by a C.
- 3) Association - library established, governed and supported by an association of citizens. Such an association is incorporated, forms its own constitution, appoints or elects its own board and is responsible for operation of the library. It may receive tax support from the local governing body. Only those association libraries whose services are free to the use of the public are included in the publication. Some libraries formerly listed as association libraries are now branches or stations of their county library. Association libraries, numbering 84, are identified in the tables by an A.

There are six joint libraries in the state which are identified in the tables by a J. A joint library is established by law following a referendum in two or more municipalities in which the majority of voters approve establishing such a library. It is governed by a board appointed by the mayors of the participating municipalities.

The State Library has designated 26 libraries as area libraries. Each of these libraries is a headquarters library under contract with the state for specialized services to libraries within a given geographic area. The 26 area libraries are indicated in the tables by an asterisk (*) before the library name.

Tables showing individual library statistics by county and a state summary constitute the body of this publication. Additional data in these tabulations is supplied for estimated population served and equalized valuation. Where a public library is supported equitably by more than one municipality, the figures shown represent combined municipalities. The explanation of the captions is as follows:

Caption

Explanation

Estimated Population Served

Total population of New Jersey was estimated by Department of Labor and Industry in 1978 as 7,349,130. Based on the accessibility of the public library within the municipal boundary only 7,276,102 of this population was served by a local public library. The remainder of the population, 73,028, reside in municipalities not served by a county library.

<u>Caption</u>	<u>Explanation</u>
Equalized Valuation	Equalized valuation of municipalities is supplied by the Division of Taxation, New Jersey Department of the Treasury, 1979. Figures are shown to the nearest thousand and exclude municipalities which do not officially support library services.
Local Tax Support	Tax support is shown as reported by individual libraries. Calculation of state aid is made on basis of expended amounts from municipal budgets.
State Aid and Total Income	Amounts shown as <u>per capita state aid</u> represent amounts transferred in October 1979 to municipalities and counties with libraries. County total represents the entire amount of per capita state aid in return for local official support of library service. Some county totals are larger than the sum for the libraries listed. State aid to area libraries, research libraries and incentive grants are not shown in this column, but are included as <u>total income</u> showing library operating income from all sources.
Expenditures	Total expenditures for 1979, as reported by libraries, represent current operations and exclude amounts spent for new buildings, repayment on loans, etc. Expenditure when divided by the estimated population served yields the column <u>per capita local expenditure</u> . For county member libraries, <u>per capita expenditure including library dedicated tax</u> is also shown, although the library services are provided through the county library.
Staff	Figures appearing under caption <u>professional certified</u> represent individual librarians who hold New Jersey certification. Under <u>employed full-time</u> , the number of individuals working on a full-time basis for a minimum of 30 hours per week is reported (as of December 1979). Figures appearing under caption headed <u>total in full-time equivalents</u> represent the addition of part-time help and the full-time help <u>averaged</u> for the entire year. Minimum work week is assumed to be 30 hours. Number of volunteers working on a non-paid basis are shown under column headed <u>vol.</u>
Volumes Owned	Figure represents books reported as owned at the end of 1979. Other materials which are prepared, cataloged and recorded in the same manner as books are also reported here.
Subscribed Periodicals	Figure shows reported number of titles under subscription including newspapers and magazines other than annuals at the end of 1979.
Hours Open Weekly	The number of <u>hours open weekly</u> represents time the main library was open for public service during the major part of 1979. Figures appearing under totals represent averages for the county or state.
Per Capita Books in Library	Derived from volumes reported in library divided by estimated population served.
Unreported Items	Where information requested of a reporting library was not provided, N.R. is inserted in the column to indicate not reported. Libraries failing to submit a report are indicated by <u>no report received</u> .
