





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


### Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup





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
NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 06

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



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

Students in both elementary and middles schools begin to demonstrate college readiness behaviors long before they even enter high school. 


### **Chronic Absenteeism Trend**




This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.




# Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup








### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 03














### **Chronic Absenteeism Trend**








