138TH ANNUAL REPORT OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF PILOTAGE OF THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY

FOR YEAR ENDING DECEMBER 31, 1984

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Pursuant to Title 12, Chapter 8 of the New Jersey Statutes, the Commissioners of Pilotage respectfully submit their 138th Annual report to the Legislature of the State of New Jersey. This report covers the year ending December 31, 1984.

B. AN ABSTRACT OF THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE COMMISSIONERS WITHIN THE YEAR 1984.

At the annual Meeting held on January 20, 1984 the following officers were elected for the coming year:

In 1984, the Commissioners advanced three pilots from Second to First Grade, one pilot from Third to Second Grade, two pilots from Fourth to Third Grade, one pilot from Fifth to Fourth Grade, one pilot from Sixth to Fifth Grade and two pilots were granted an original license as Pilot of the Sixth Grade. During the same period, the Commissioners registered four apprentices.

The Commissioners investigated a total of seven marine casualties during 1984. After conducting hearings on these seven incidents, the Commissioners determined that no action should be taken against the licenses of the pilots and the cases were closed.

The Board continued to participate in the activities of the Harbor Operations Committee which had been established in 1982.

The United New Jersey Sandy Hook Pilots' Benevolent Association moved into new headquarters located at 201 Edgewater Street, Staten Island, New York 10305.

A primary concern of the Commissioners of Pilotage of the State of New Jersey during the year 1984 dealt with the planning and design phase and related policy decisions in connection with the building of a replacement for the pilot boat New Jersey and the station vessel Chapel Hill. Two joint meetings were held with the Commissioners of the Pilots of the State of New York on September 18, 1985 and October 30, 1985 during which lengthy presentations were made for the necessity of replacing the vessels and consideration of the nature and type of the proposed replacements and the manner in which payment for same could be effected. The Joint New York - New Jersey Task Force was established and during the year held three meetings on April 27, 1984, August 2, 1984 and December 13, 1984 regarding a man power study established for the purpose of determining the population level of pilots for the safe and economic manning of the Port and the proper number of apprentices to maintain that level of manning. There was discussion regarding the arrival of a joint policy with the New York Board in connection with the examintation and licensure of registered apprentices to Pilots of the Sixth Grade. An additional subject of the Joint Task Force meetings was the consideration of the combining of the Sandy Hook Pilots and the Hudson River Pilots service and a manner for examination and licensing the Hudson River Pilots of the future.

Meetings of the Joint New York and New Jersey Task Force also dealt with the replacement of existing vessels and the nature of payment therefor. Ultimately, the replacement of both vessels was approved by both the New York and New Jersey Boards and a surcharge of \$75 was authorized to finance the cost of such new vessels which surcharge went into effect on December 1, 1984. The resolution authorizing the surcharge limited the use of the funds collected therefrom to the replacement of the pilot boat New Jersey and the station vessel Chapel Hill and required constant reporting on the part of the pilots as to the status of the surcharge.

The Commissioners of Pilotage of the State of New Jersey reviewed the standards for licensing Pilots of the Sixth Grade and the differential in standards between New York and New Jersey. The Commissioners approved a resolution authorizing the New Jersey members of the Joint Task Force to enter into negotiations with their New York counterpart towards the goal of arriving at a joint policy in connection with the examination of licensure of registered apprentices to Pilots of the Sixth Grade. The Commission also instructed the Executive Committee of the United New Jersey Sandy Hook Pilots' Benevolent Association to develop a book of examination questions which would provide a broader and more intense scope of examination for licensure and promotion of pilots.

Commissioner Edward B. Pulver was sworn in at the March 15, 1984 meeting.
