#### REPORT

#### OFFICE OF THE

NEW JERSEY STATE LIBRARIAN. TRENTON, N. J., Nov. 1st, 1894.

To His Excellency George T. Werts, Governor, and ex-officio President of the Board of Commissioners of the State Library of New Jersey:

SIR—Permit me to submit the following report of the condition of the State Library, for the fiscal year ending October 31st, 1891.

At the time of my last annual report, the number of books, nam-

At the time of my last annual report, the number of books, pamphlets, magazines and newspapers in the State Library was 41,859. During the past year the following additions have been made by exchange with the General Government, the States and Territories and Canada, donation and purchase, as more particularly specified in the appendix:

Making the whole number of books, &c., now in the Library, 43,388.

During the year 151 books and 21 newspaper files have been bound,
and 16 books and 1 file have been repaired. Of course, many more
books would have been repaired, but owing to the protracted session of
the Legislature and the subsequent meeting of the courts, they could
not be spared from the shelves. No more repairing can be done until
next summer, during the vacation of the courts and Legislature.

Allow me to reiterate what I have before intimated, that, as the Miscellaneous Library is one of reference, and not for general circulation—there being few books of light literature upon the shelves—it has been my effort to collect, by purchase or otherwise, all the most prominent works of science, art, history, philosophy, religion, travels and biography that were necessary to supply our needs, and to give scholars the benefit of books they could not afford to own.

To the Law Library every valuable work announced has been added and the collection of Laws, Reports and Text-books is the constant theme of admiration of the leading old lawyers of the State, and of New York and Philadelphia, who are employed in our State and United States Courts. According to Theodore Cole, an expert in regard to State laws, we have the most complete collection of the State and Territorial Laws, in the country—which are all arranged alphabetically according to the names of the States and chronologically, as to the time of passage.

My efforts to perfect the Library have been cheerfully indorsed by the Chancellor and Chief Justice, the purchasing committee of the Commissioners, until in Law and Miscellany, the Library will favorably compare with any State Library in the country—while as a practical, "working library," it has no superior.

I desire to call attention to the following additions to the Miscellaneous Library: "Skeat's Etymological Dictionary," "Craft's Pioneers of America from 1510 to 1849," "The Official History of the World's Fair," "Princeton's American Journal of Archæology," "The North American Review, from 1877 to 1893," "Memoirs of Baron Pasquier," "Potter's Bible Encyclopædia," "Duruy's History of Modern Times," "Meehan's Native Flowers and Ferns," "Madison's Journal of the U. S. Constitutional Convention," and "Babcock's Two Lost Centuries of Britain."

In my last report I referred to the fact that the tables of the Miscellaneous Library were constantly occupied by students of the State Schools and the Business Colleges; since then, I am gratified to be able to state that the pupils of the High School have discovered the benefits of the Library, and daily make it lively for the Assistant in that Department, in hunting up reference books, for their consideration. In fact, it seems to be getting to be generally understood that the Library is an important adjunct to educational institutions, and I learn that teachers frequently refer their scholars to our books of

and proves that the popular notion, that the State Library was exdusively for lawyers, is being rapidly dispelled. By the fortunate arrangement of the Library, the Law and Miscellaneous Departments are entirely separate, so that scholars and lawyers have no interference, while each department is similarly provided with furniture, stationery and attendance.

Allow me through this report to announce to the members of the bar, that, taking advantage of the derangement of the Library in the last three years, and of the depression in the book trade, we have economized sufficiently to be enabled to make arrangements for completing our sets of English, Scotch and Irish Reports, through the Boston Book Co., and of adding the entire set of the N. Y. Sup., to our State Reports, through the West Pub. Co. These will make the Law Department as complete as possible.

Exclusive of lawyers, scholars and other regular attendants, there were 2,610 transient visitors registered upon the books during the last year, being 260 more than the previous year, showing that the Library is not failing in attraction, even with those who do not use its treasures.

The accompanying Appendix presents an itemized statement of the additions to the Library since my last report.
