### Academic Achievement

This school outperforms **49%** of schools statewide as noted by its statewide percentile and **49%** of schools educating students with similar demographic characteristics as noted in its peer school percentile in the performance area of Academic Achievement. Additionally, this school is meeting **63%** of its performance targets in the area of Academic Achievement.



Academic Achievement measures the content knowledge students have in language arts literacy and math. For elementary and middle schools, this includes measures of the school's proficiency rate on both the Language Arts Literacy and Math sections of the New Jersey Assessment of Skills and Knowledge (NJASK). A proficiency rate is calculated by summing the count of students who scored either proficient or advanced proficient on the assessment and dividing by the count of valid test scores.

### College and Career Readiness

This school outperforms **87%** of schools statewide as noted by its statewide percentile and **84%** of schools educating students with similar demographic characteristics as noted in its peer school percentile in the performance area of College and Career Readiness. Additionally, this school is meeting **100%** of its performance targets in the area of College and Career Readiness.



College and Career readiness measures the degree to which students are demonstrating behaviors that are indicative of future attendance and/or success in college and careers. For all elementary and middle schools, this includes a measurement of how many students are chronically absent. For schools with middle school grades, it also includes a measurement of how many students take Algebra I in eighth grade.

### Student Growth

This school outperforms **40%** of schools statewide as noted by its statewide percentile and **35%** of schools educating students with similar demographic characteristics as noted in its peer school percentile in the performance area of Student Growth. Additionally, this school is meeting **100%** percentage of its performance targets in the area of Student Growth.



Student Growth measures the performance of students from one year to the next on the New Jersey Assessment of Skills and Knowledge (NJASK) in Language Arts Literacy and Math when compared to students with a similar history of performance on NJASK.

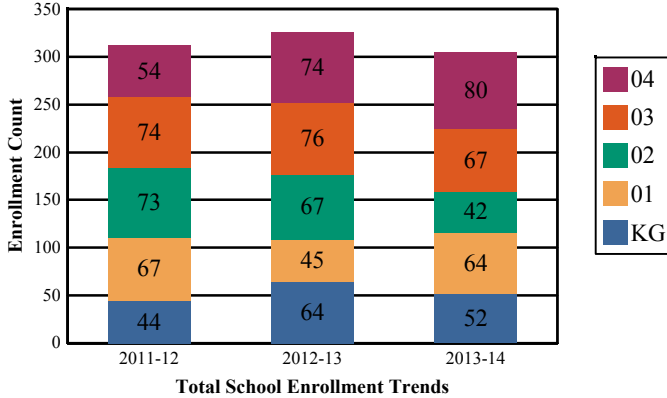

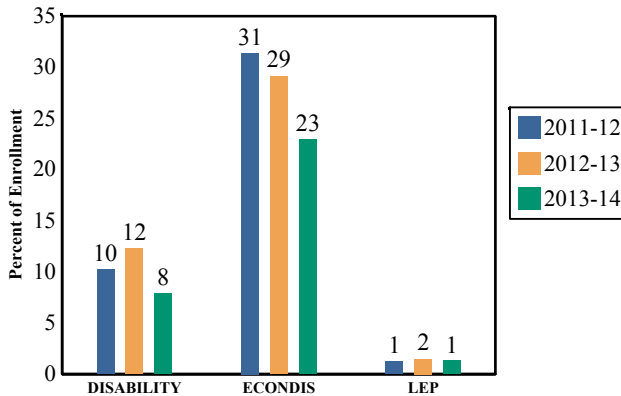

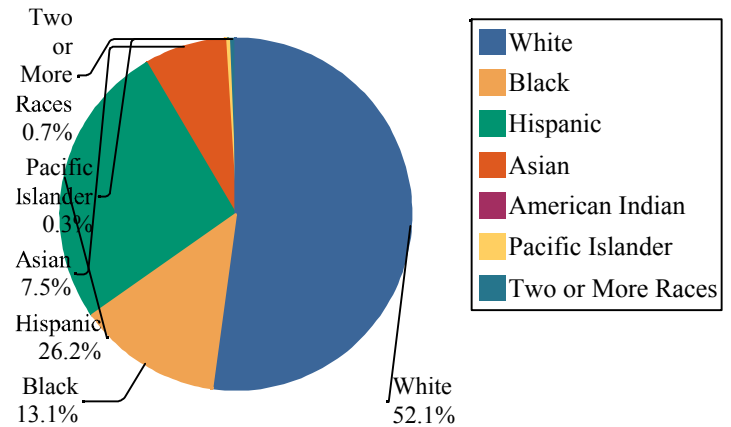

#### Enrollment Trends by Program Participation



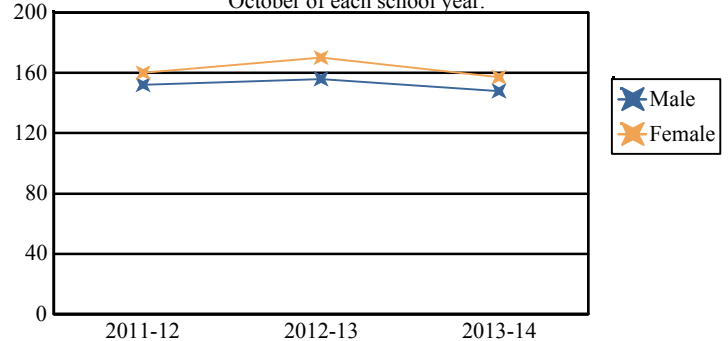
#### Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup

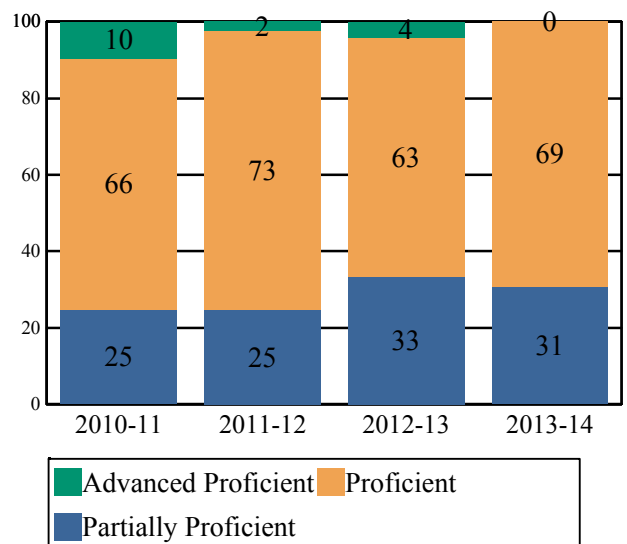

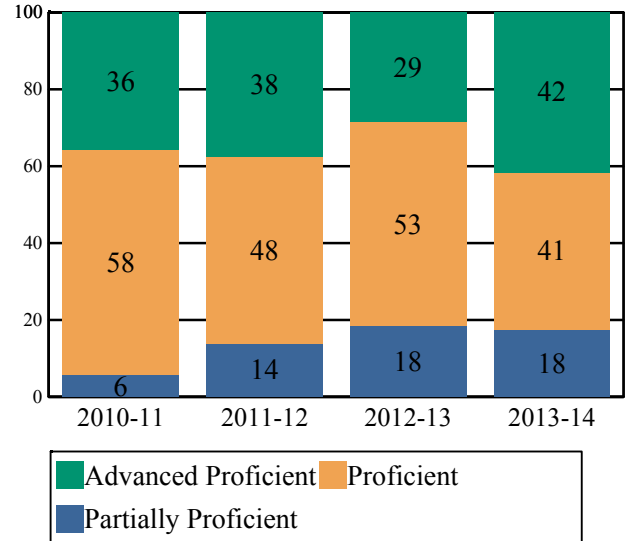

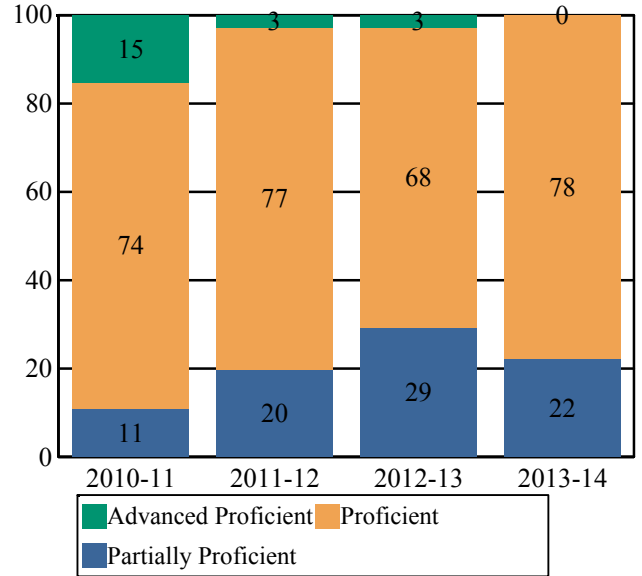

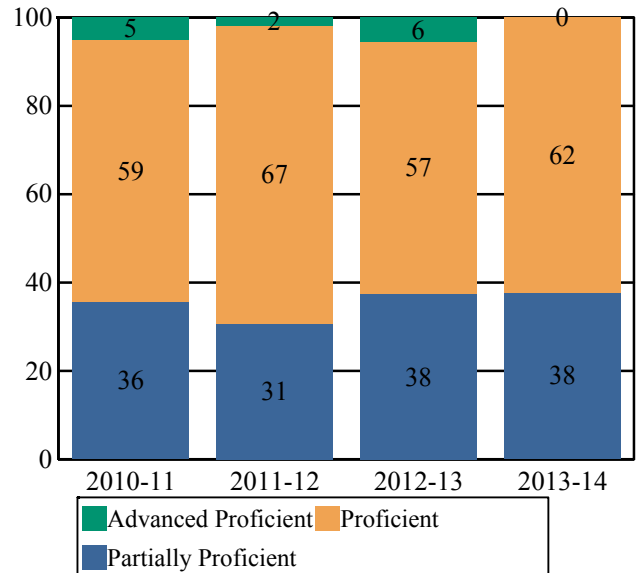
### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy - Grade Level - 03

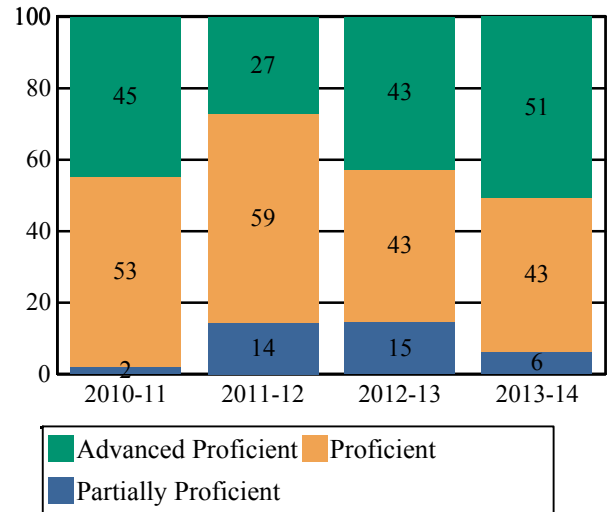

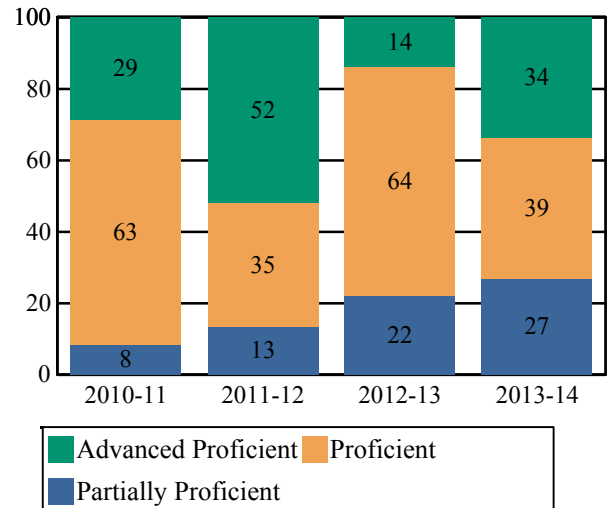
### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 03

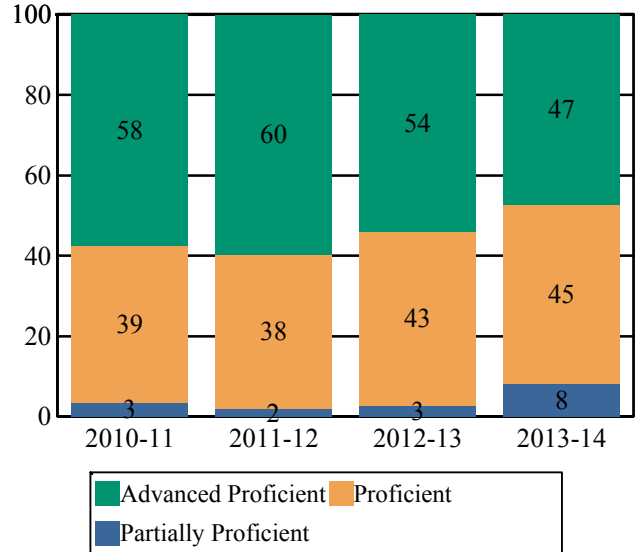

## COLLEGE AND CAREER READINESS

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Students in both elementary and middle schools begin to demonstrate college readiness behaviors long before they even enter high school. Among the behaviors that research has shown to be indicative of success and college and career readiness are regularly attending school and challenging themselves with rigorous course work. The table presents the percentage of students who were chronically absent during the prior school year. A chronically absent student is a student who was not present for any reason for 10% or more of the total days possible for that individual student.

The first column - Schoolwide Performance - represents the outcomes for these particular indicators in this school. The second column - Peer School Percentile - indicates how the school's performance compares to its group of peer schools. For example, a school whose peer school percentile is 65 in Chronic Absenteeism has a lower Chronic Absenteeism than 65% of its peer group. The third column - Statewide Percentile - indicates how the school's performance compares to schools across the state. The fourth column - Statewide Target - provides the statewide targets for each of these indicators. The last column - Met Target? - indicates whether the School Performance met or exceeded the statewide target.

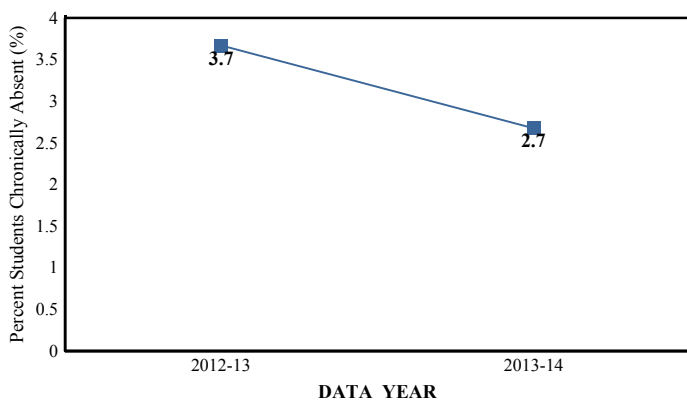

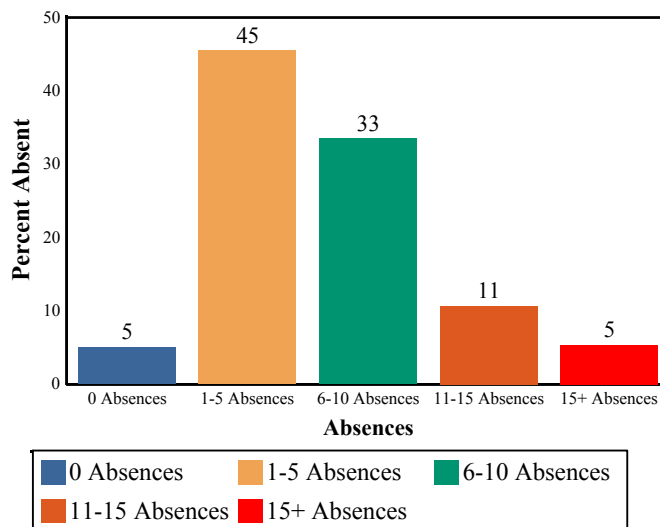
### Chronic Absenteeism Trend

## WITHIN SCHOOL ACHIEVEMENT GAP

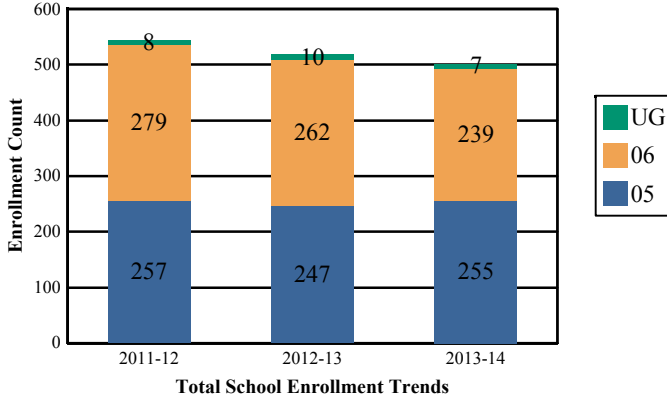

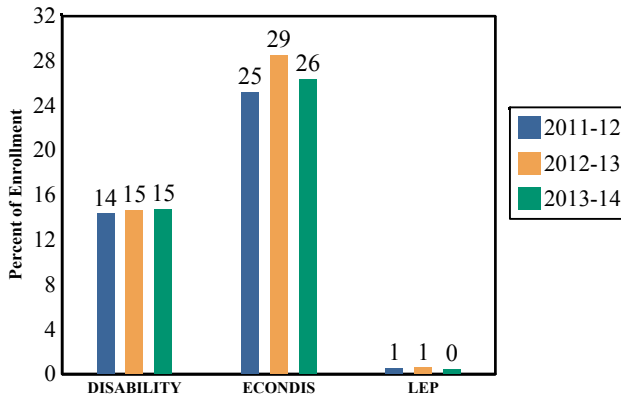

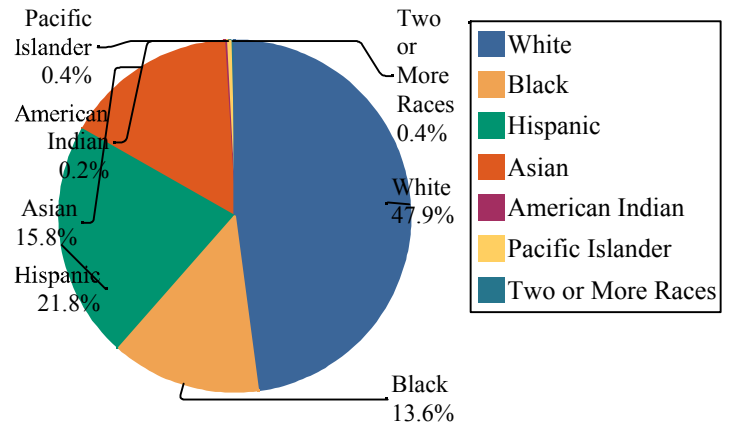

### Enrollment Trends by Program Participation



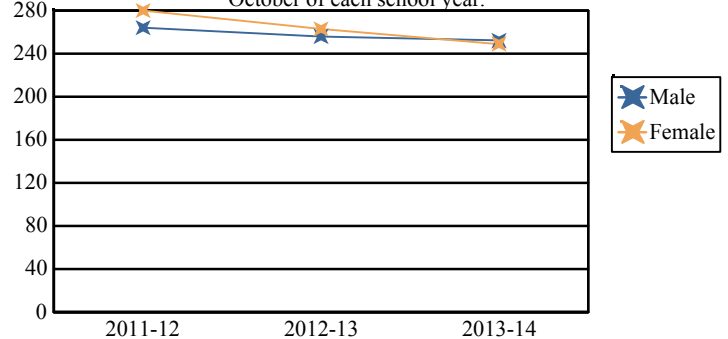
### Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup

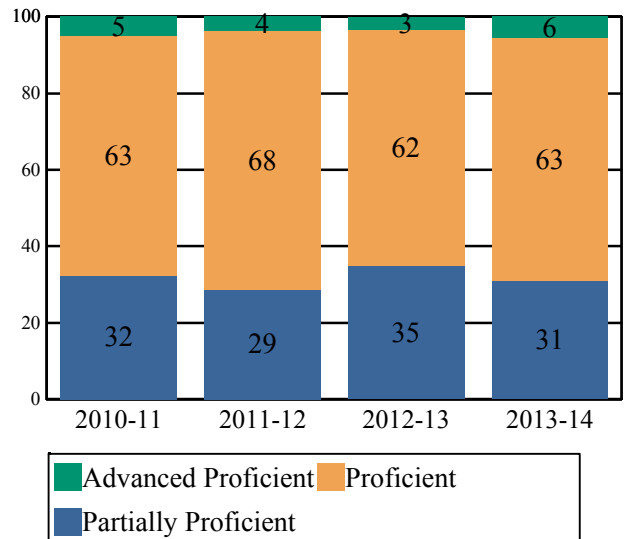

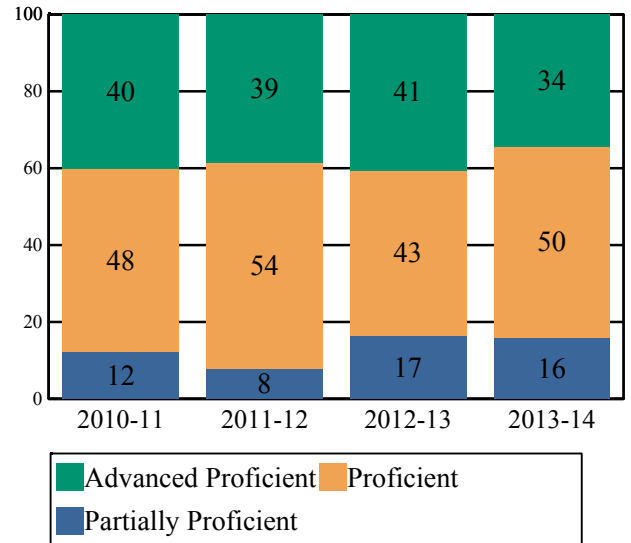

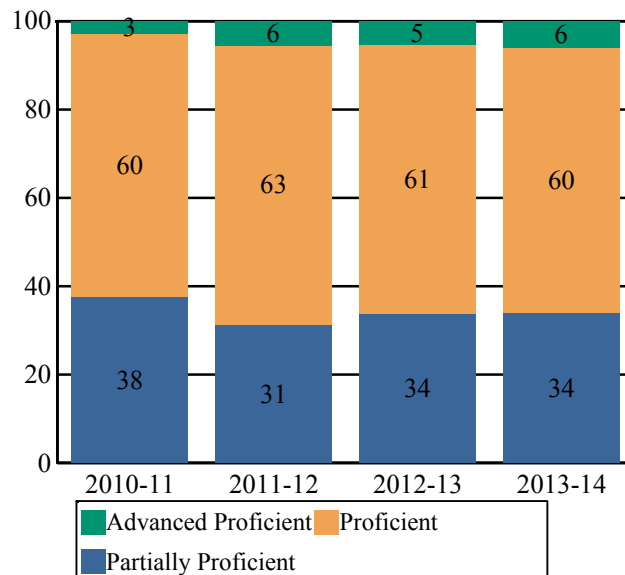

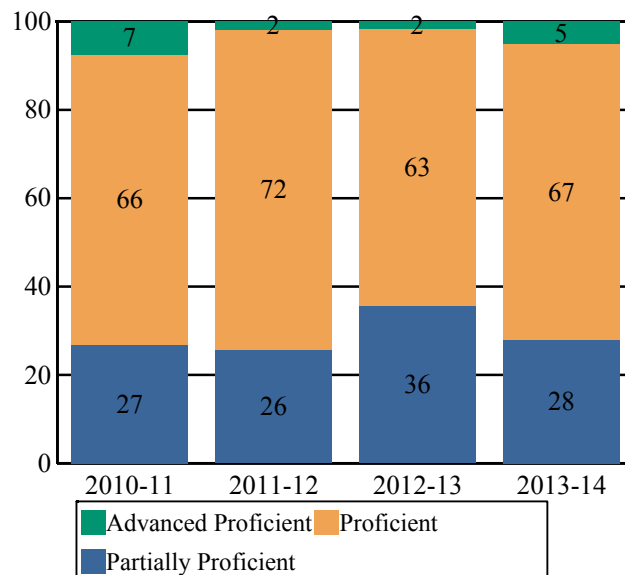

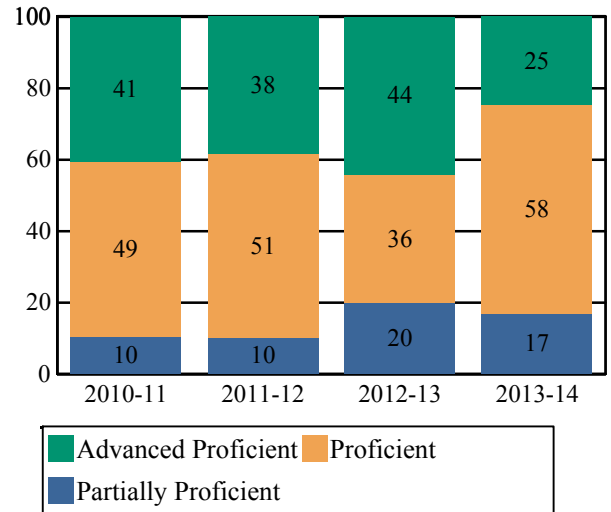

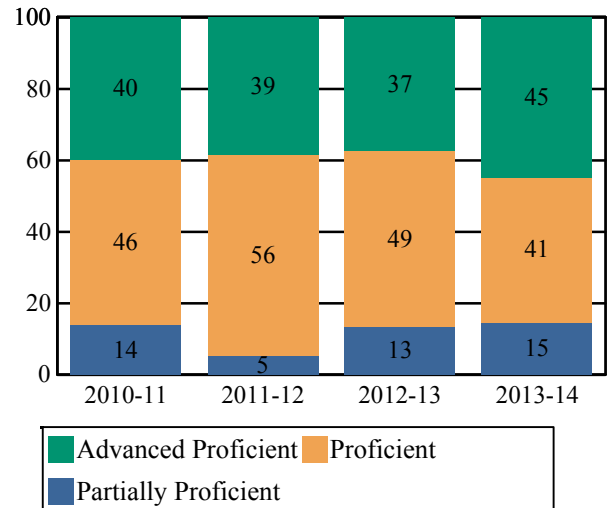
#### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 05

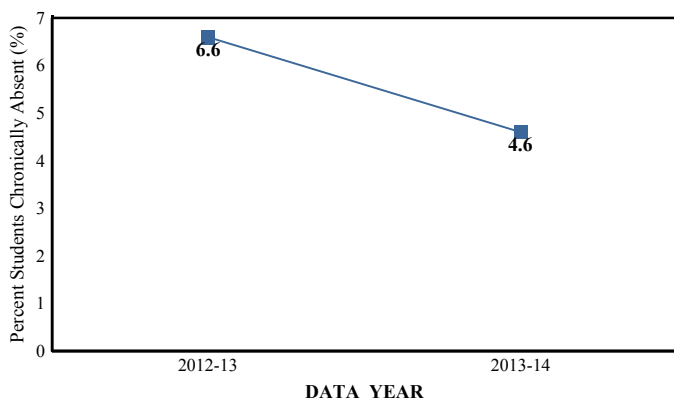

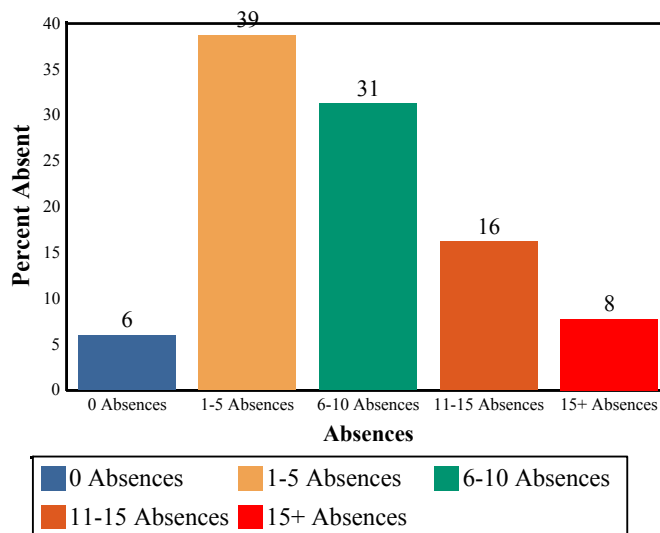
### Chronic Absenteeism Trend

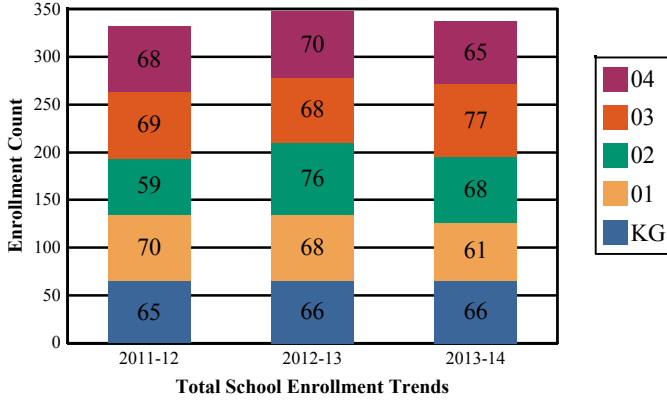

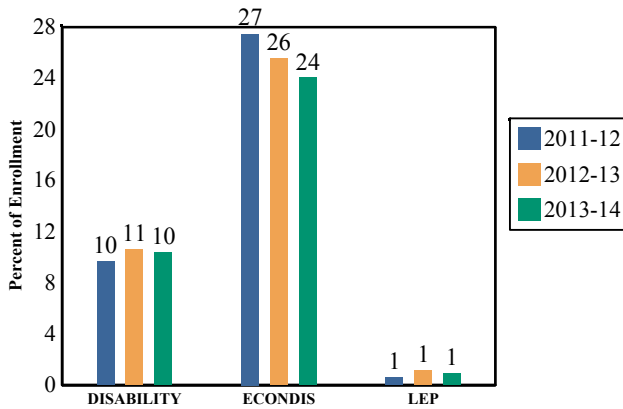

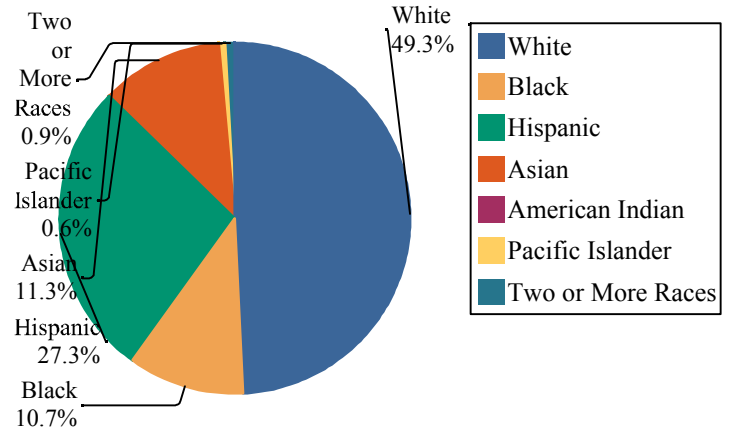

### Enrollment Trends by Program Participation



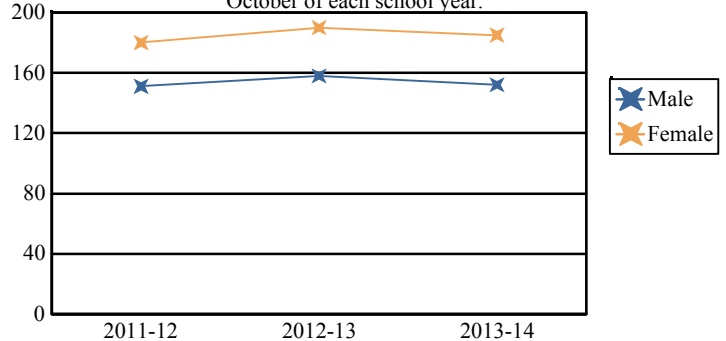
### Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup

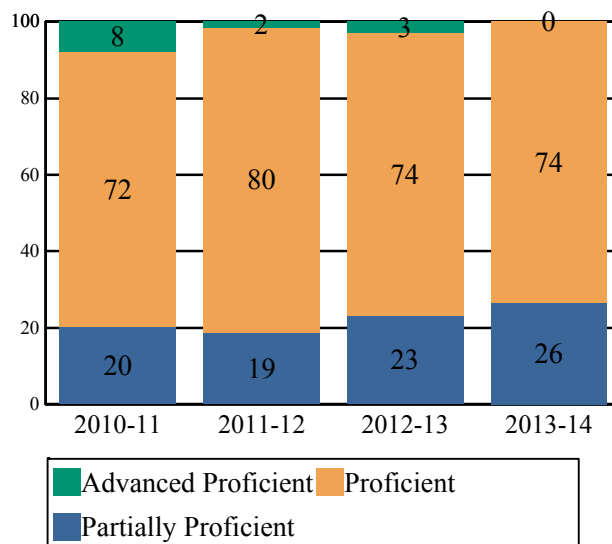

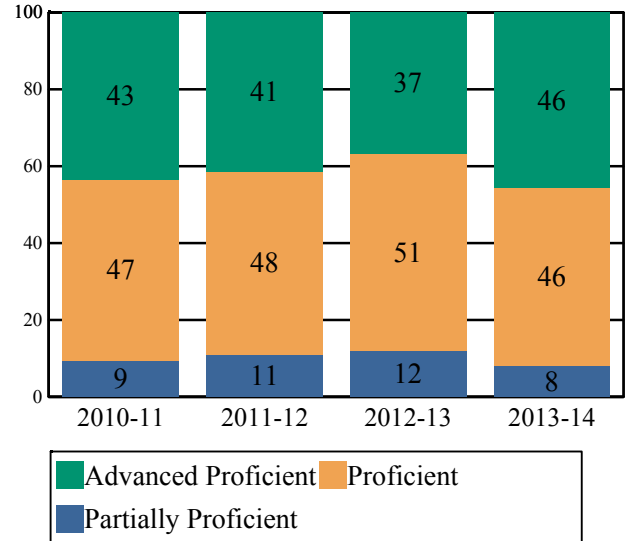

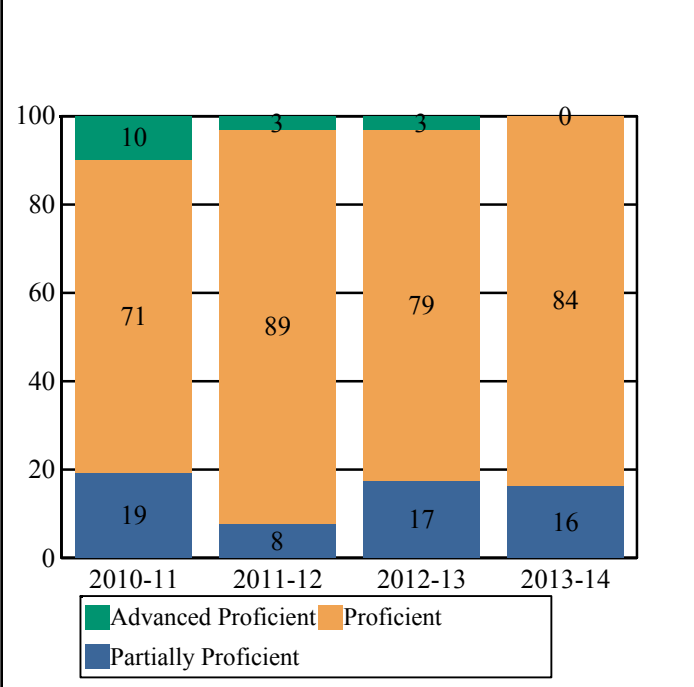

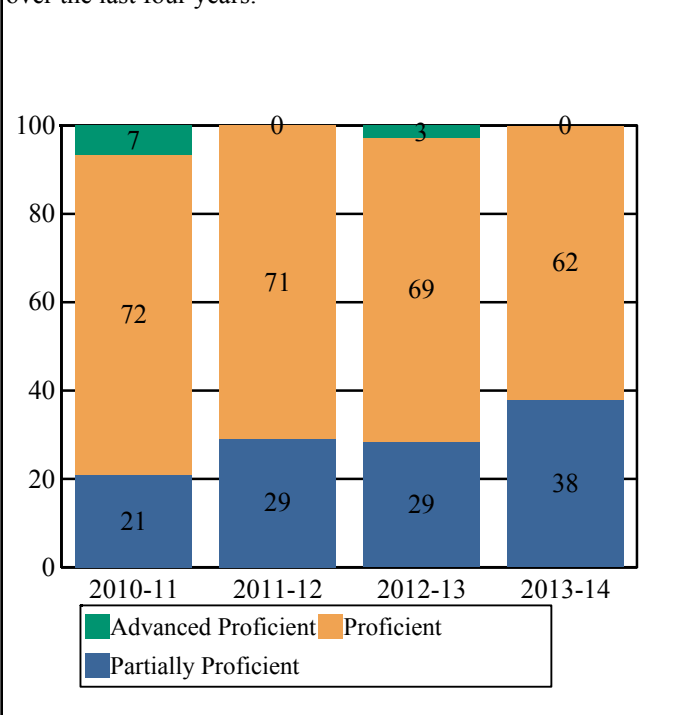
#### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy - Grade Level - 03

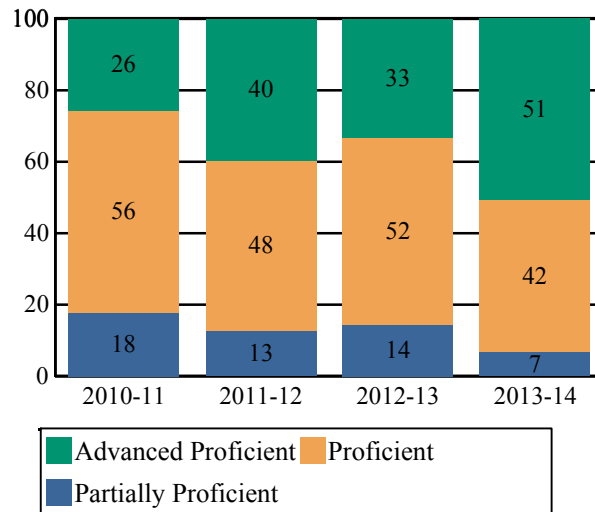

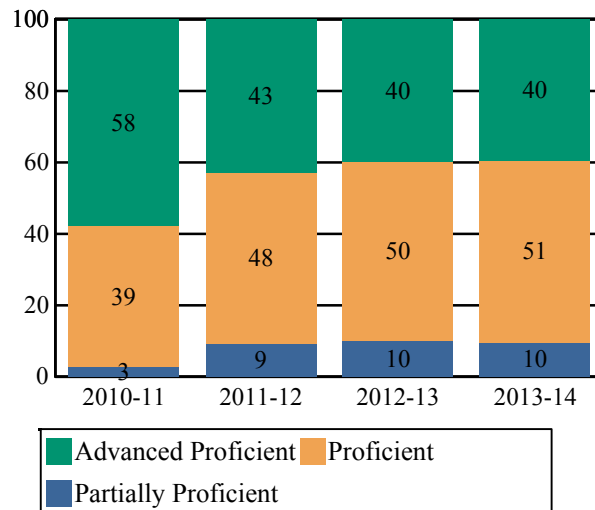
### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 03

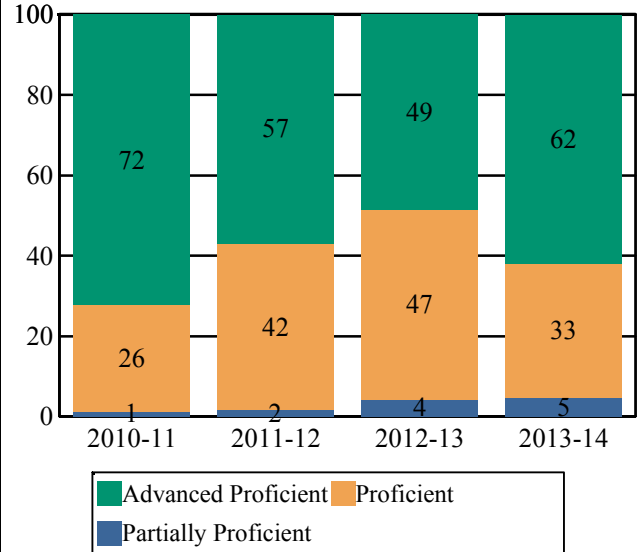

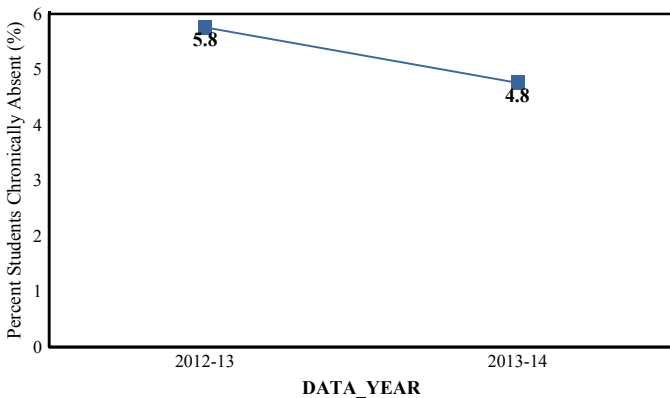

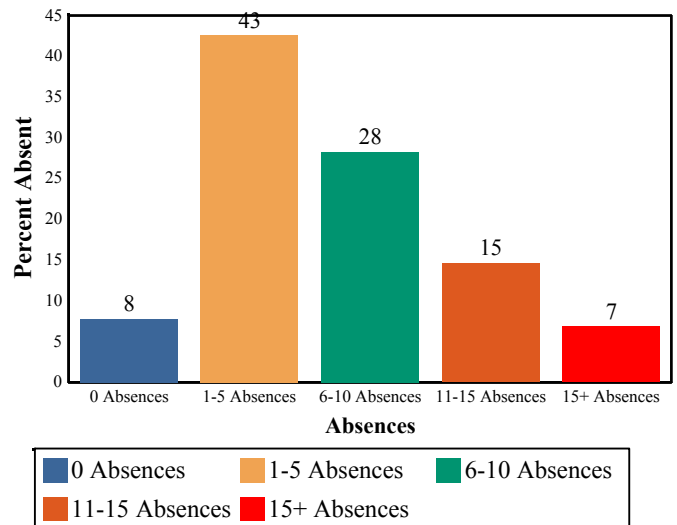
### Chronic Absenteeism Trend

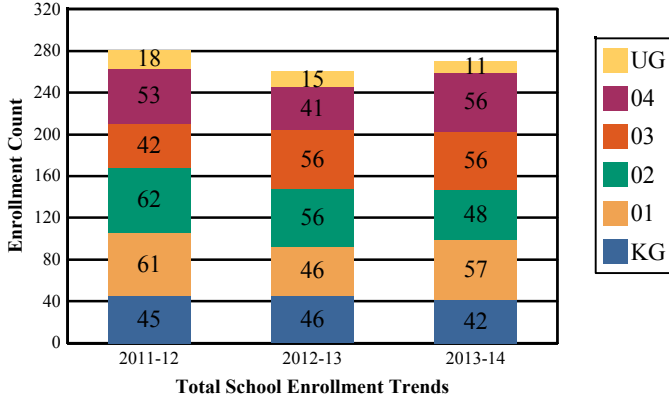

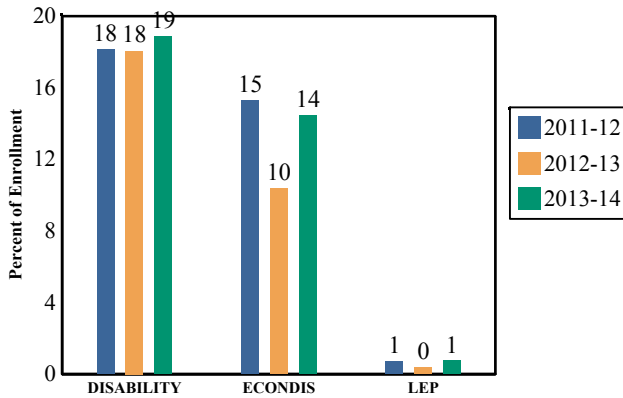

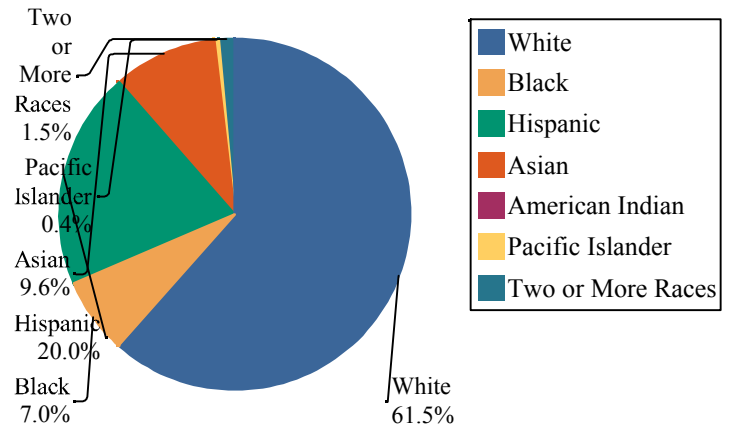

### Enrollment Trends by Program Participation



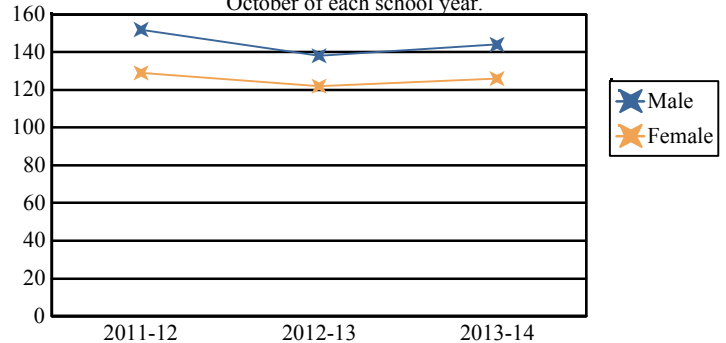
### Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup

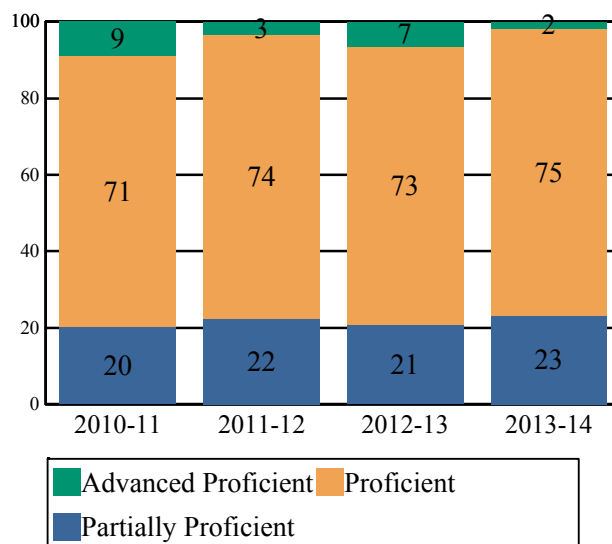

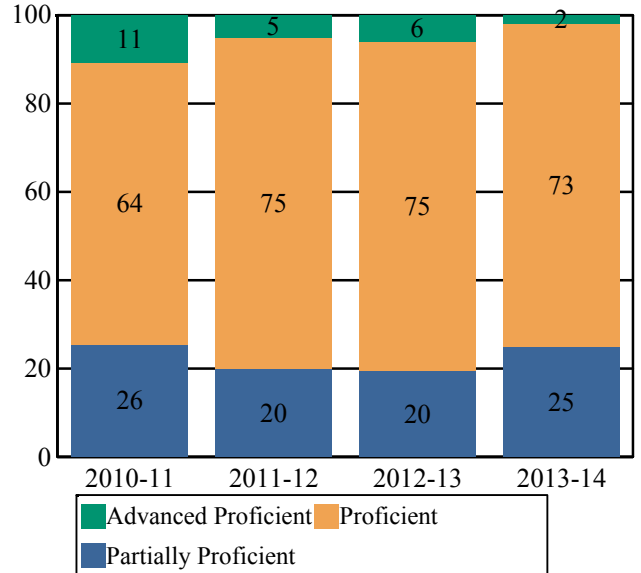

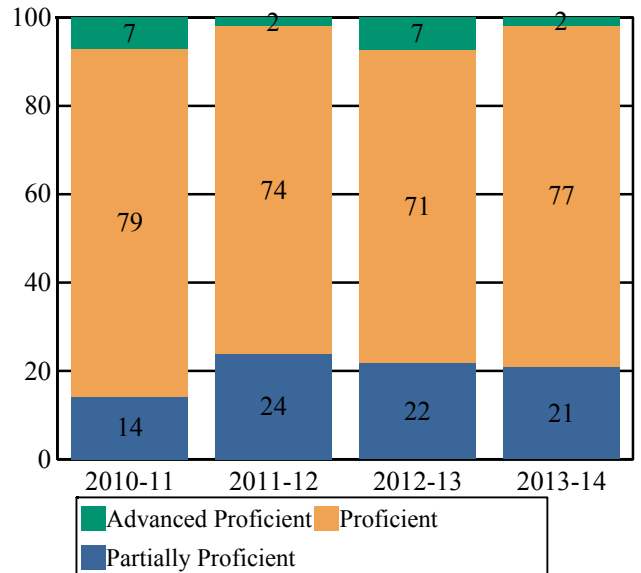
### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy - Grade Level - 03

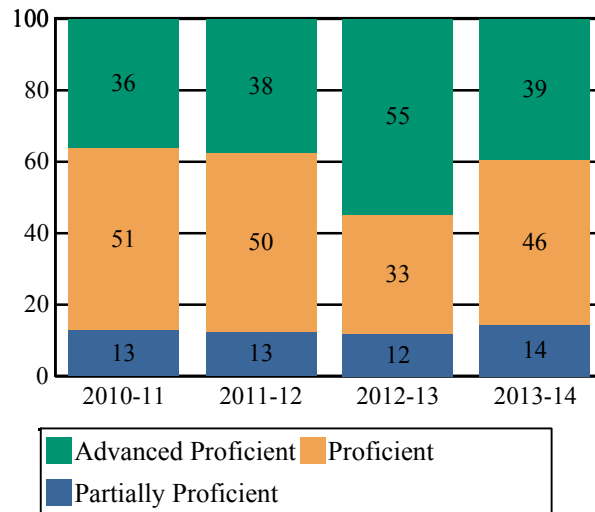

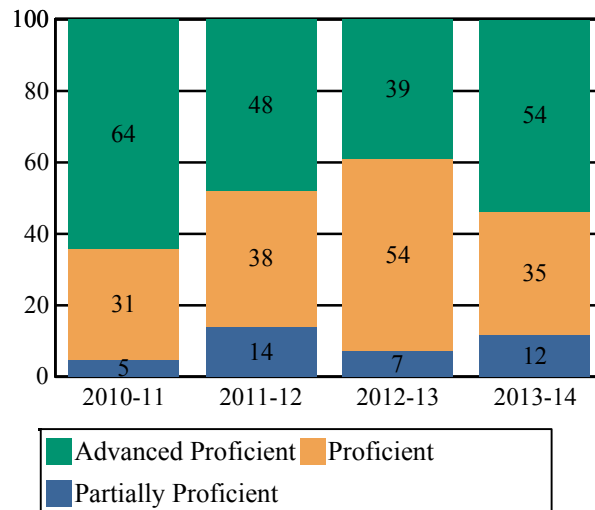
### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 03

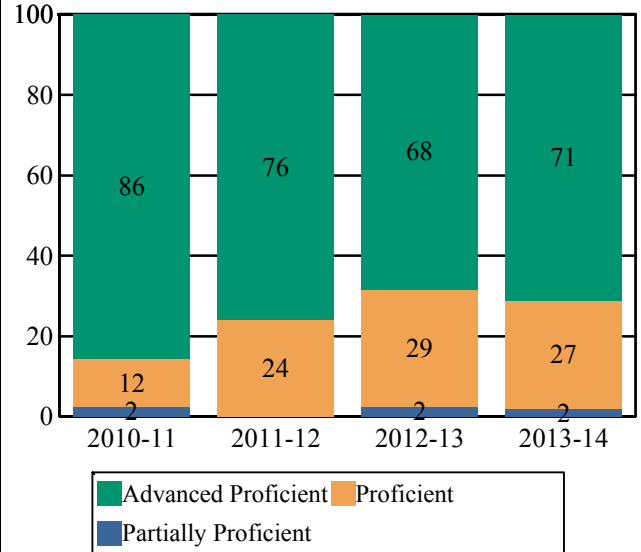

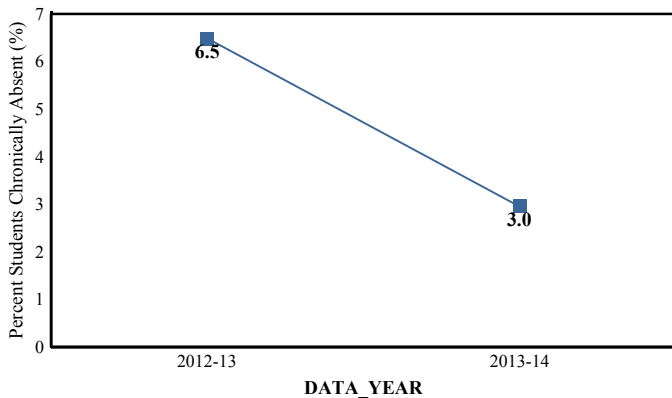

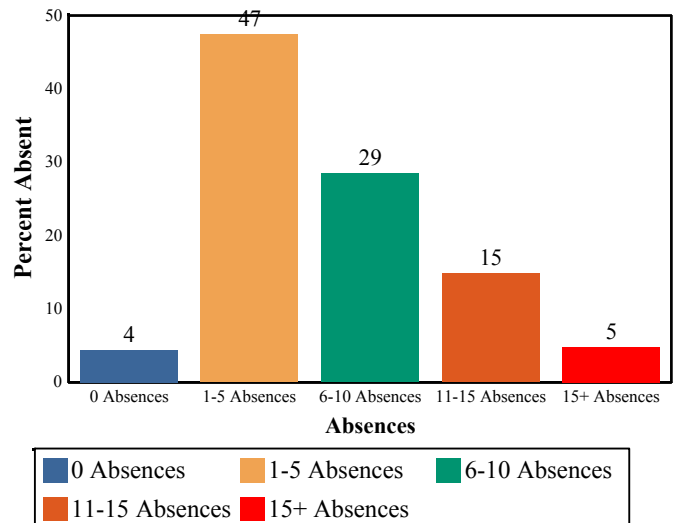
### Chronic Absenteeism Trend

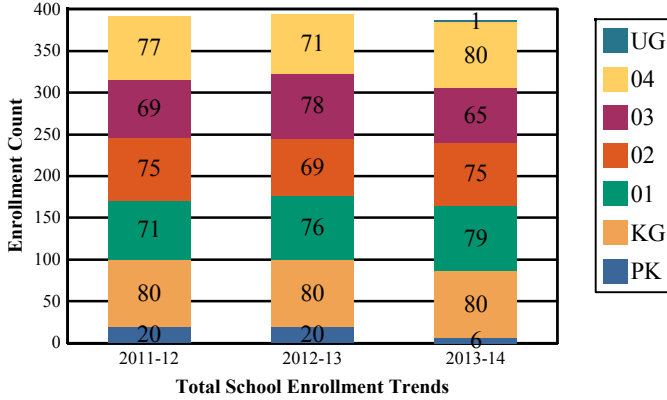

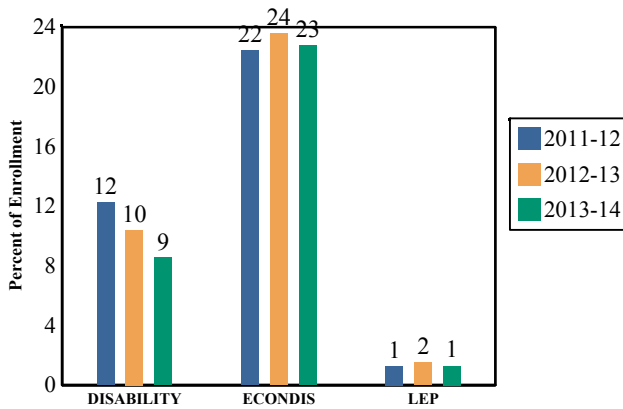

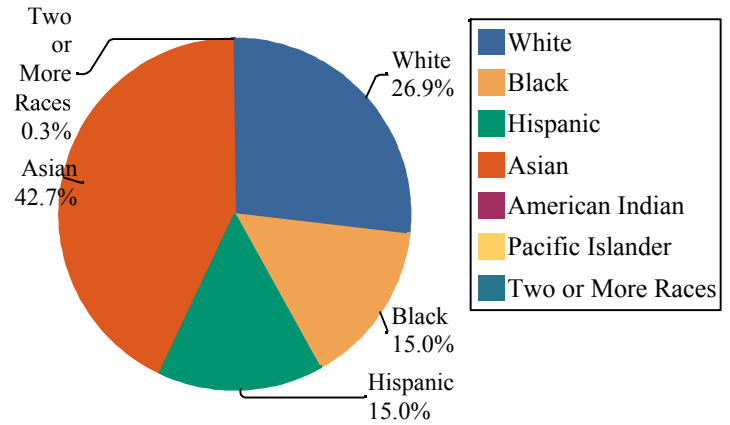

### Enrollment Trends by Program Participation



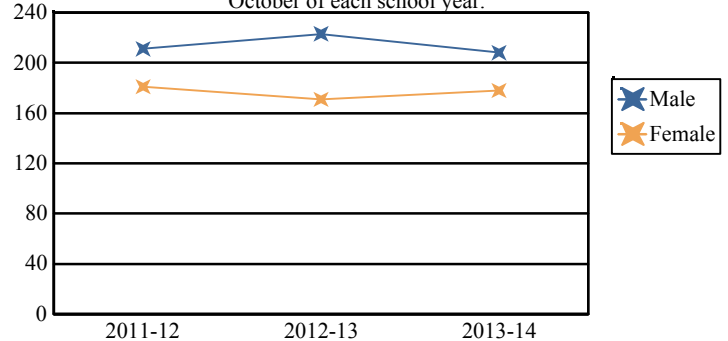
### Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup

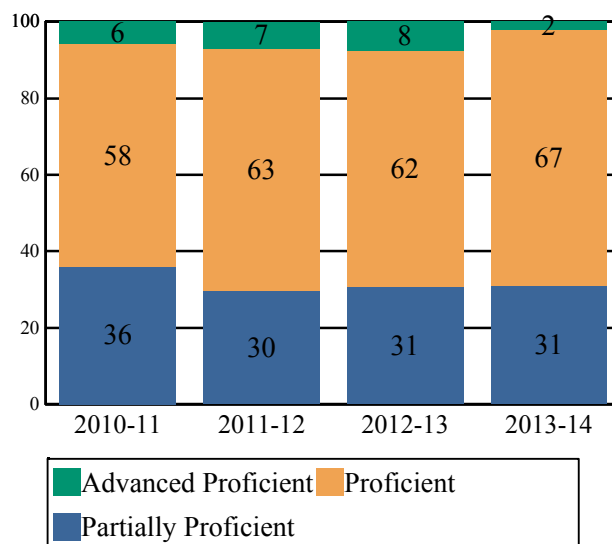

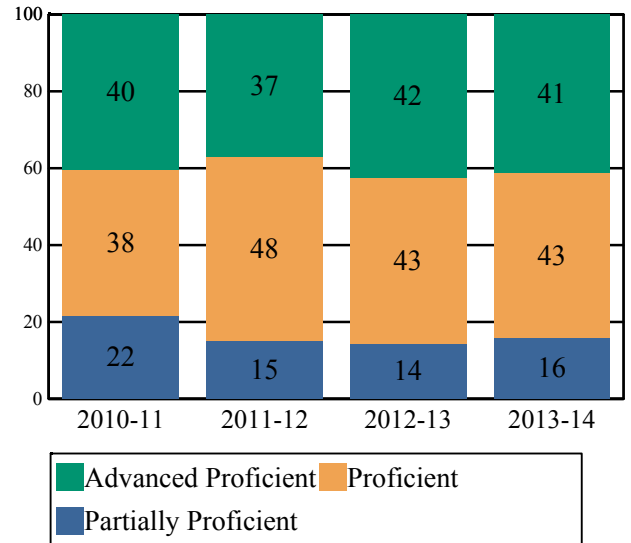

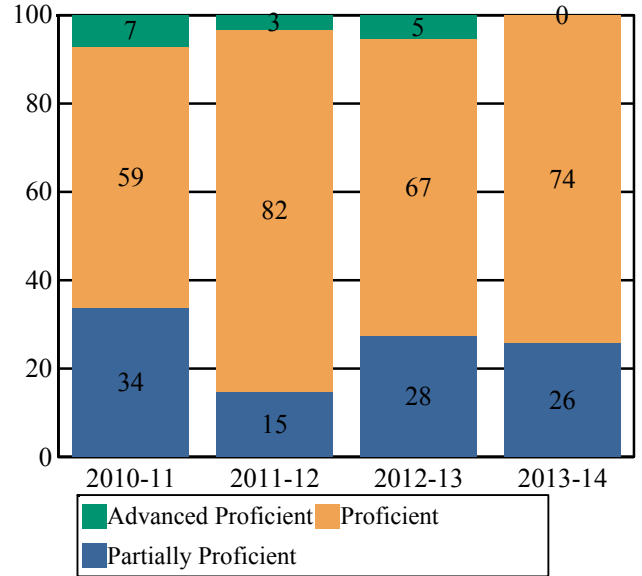

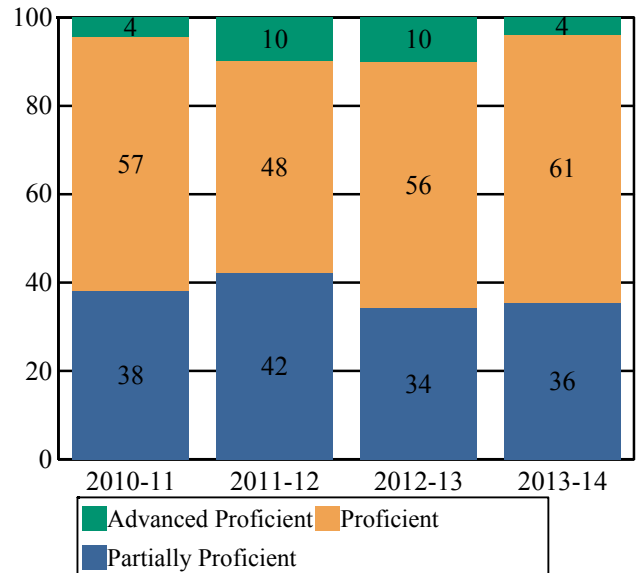

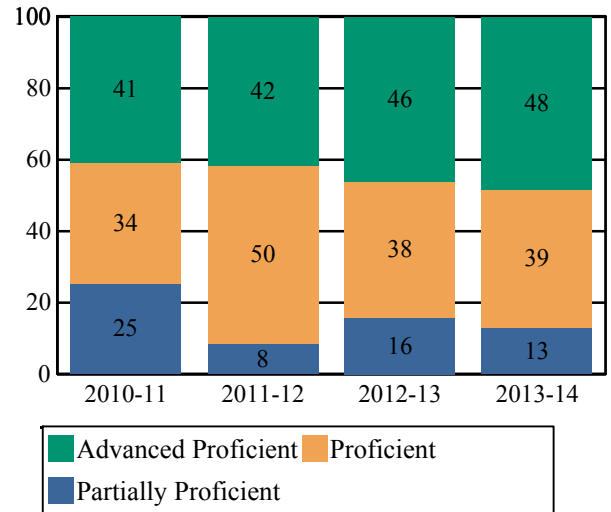

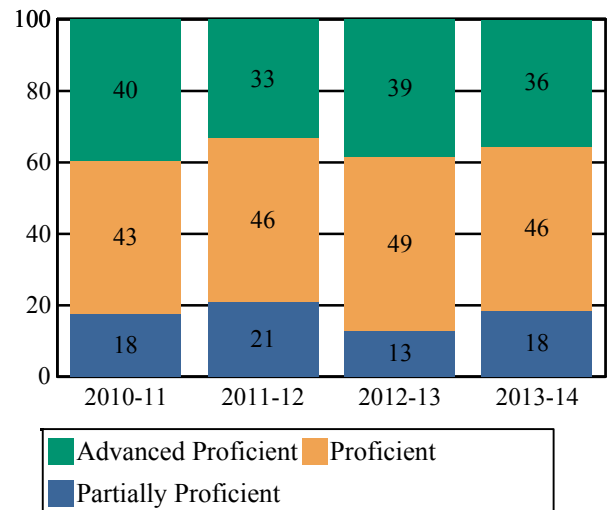

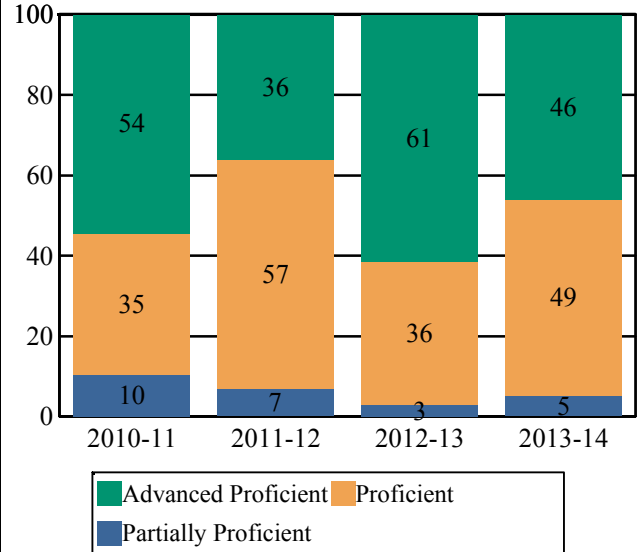

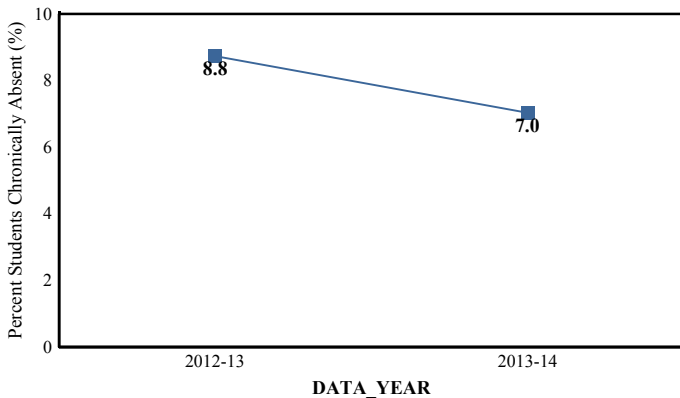

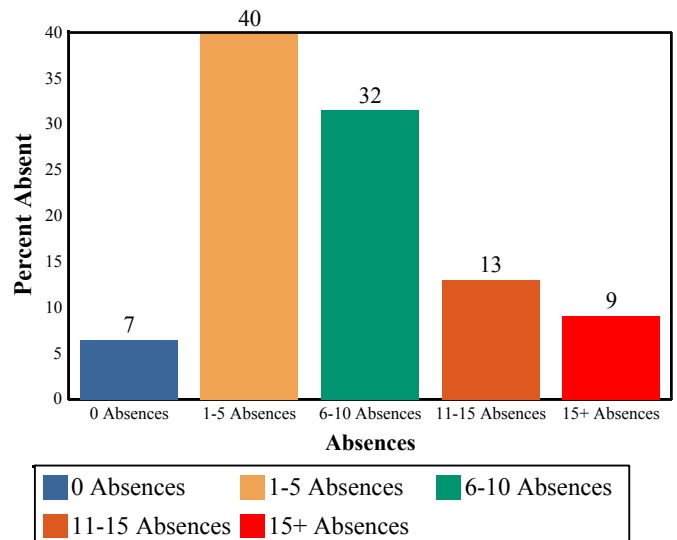
### Chronic Absenteeism Trend

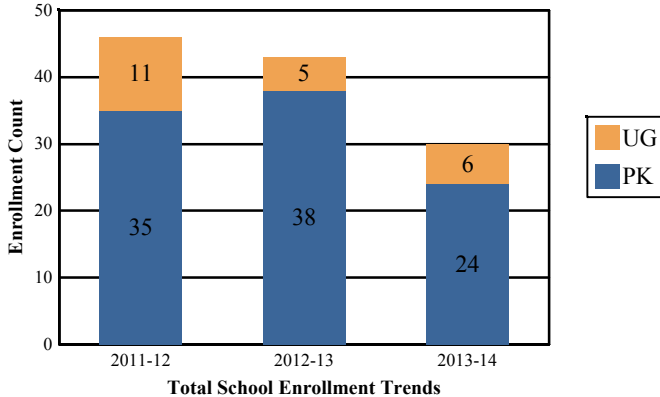

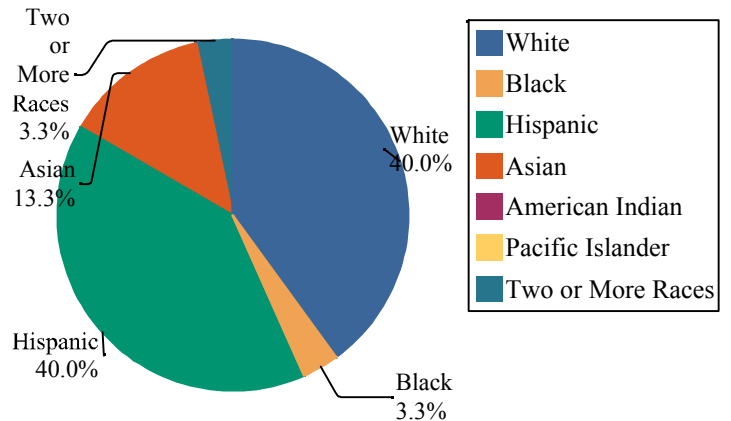

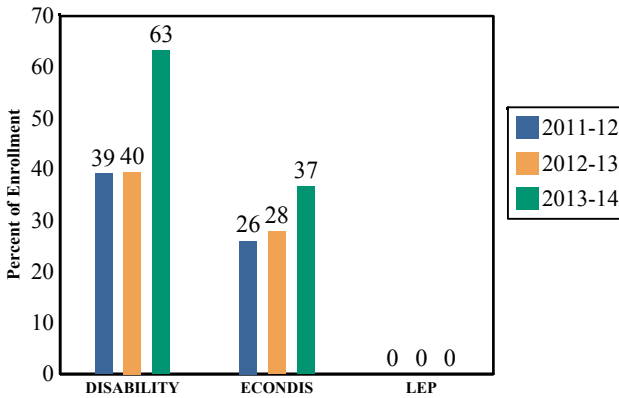

This graph presents the percentages of enrollment for each subgroup defined by the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001

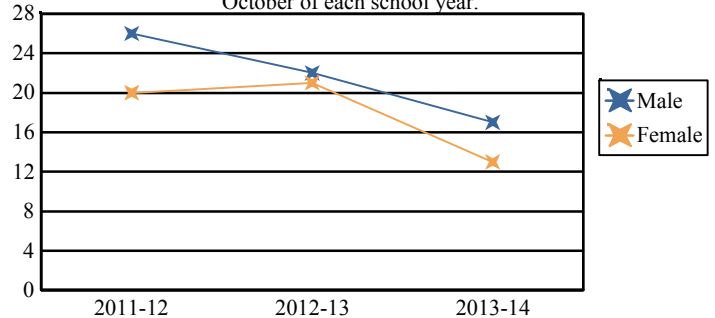


### Enrollment Trends by Program Participation

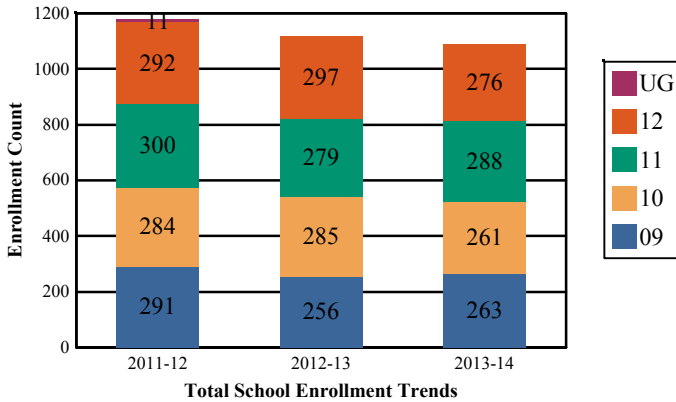

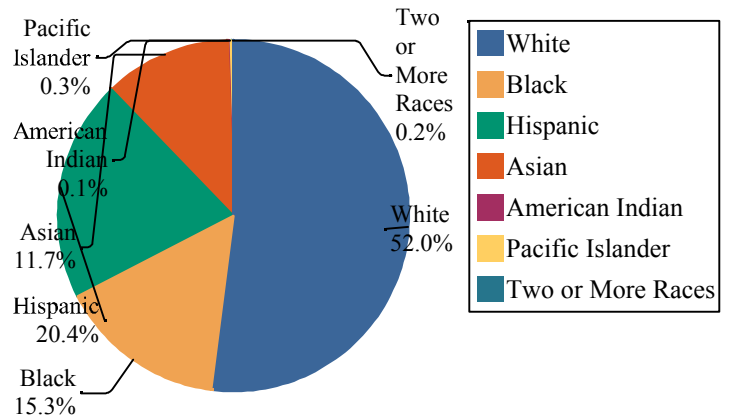

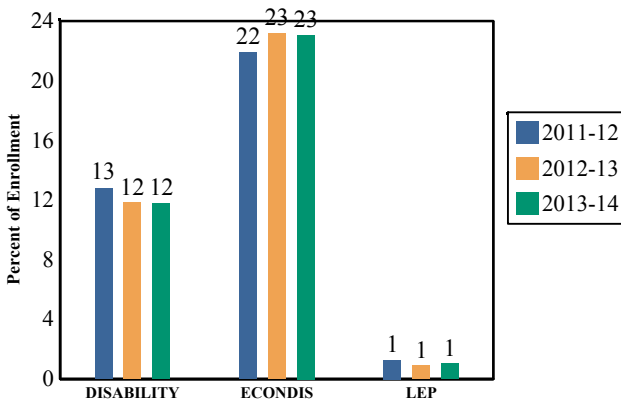
### Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup

This graph presents the percentages of enrollment for each subgroup defined by the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001



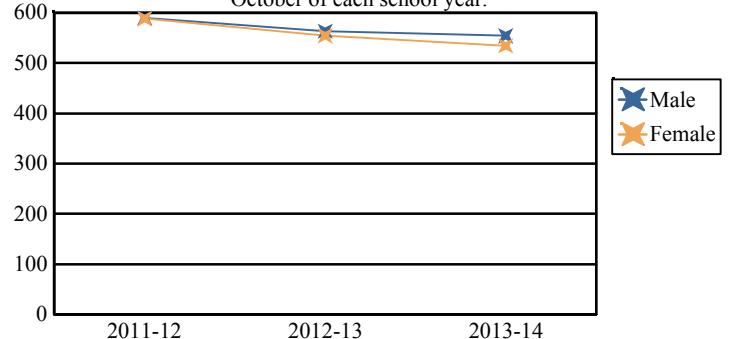

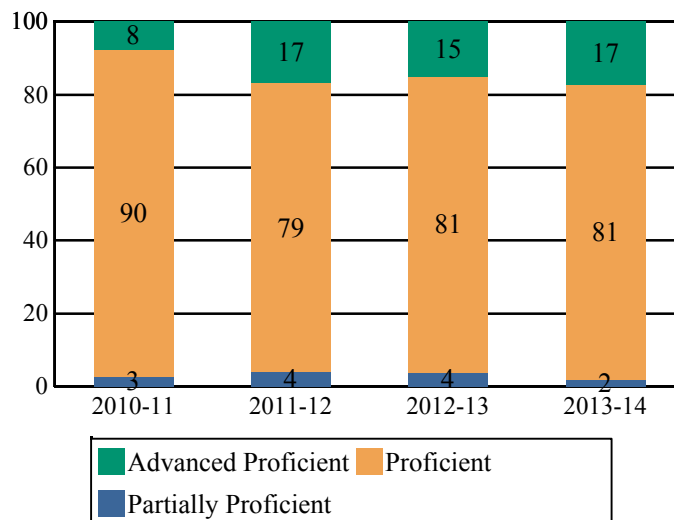

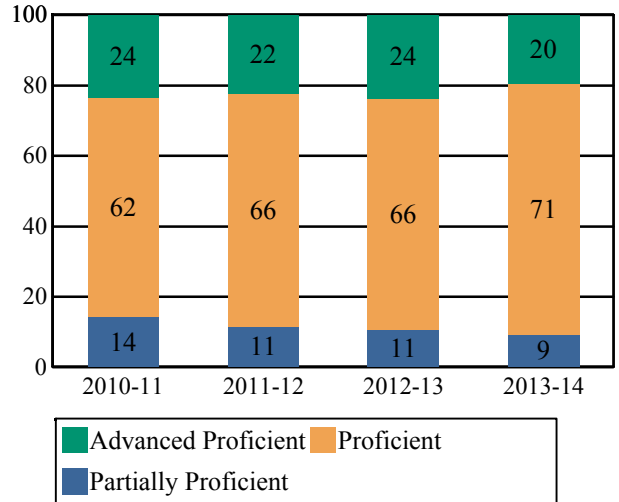

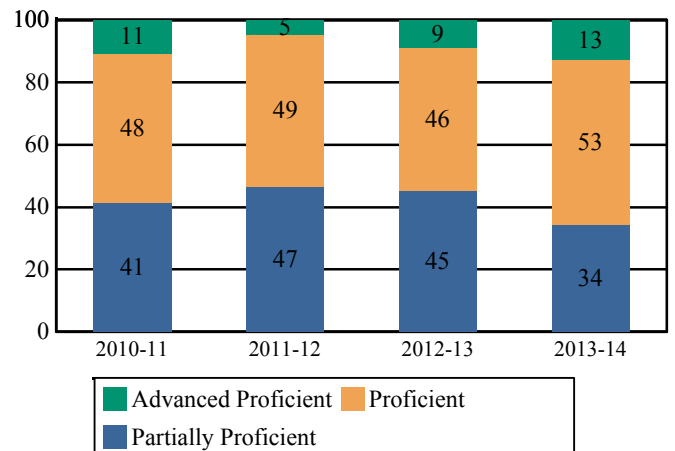
### Proficiency Trends - Math

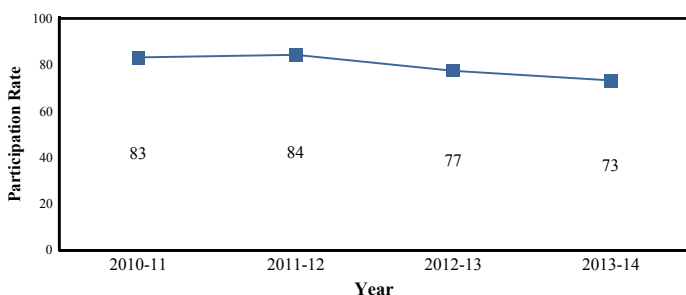

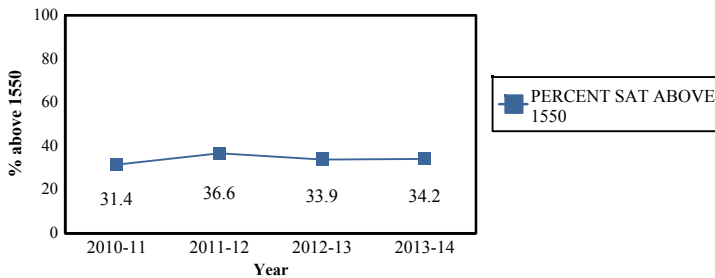

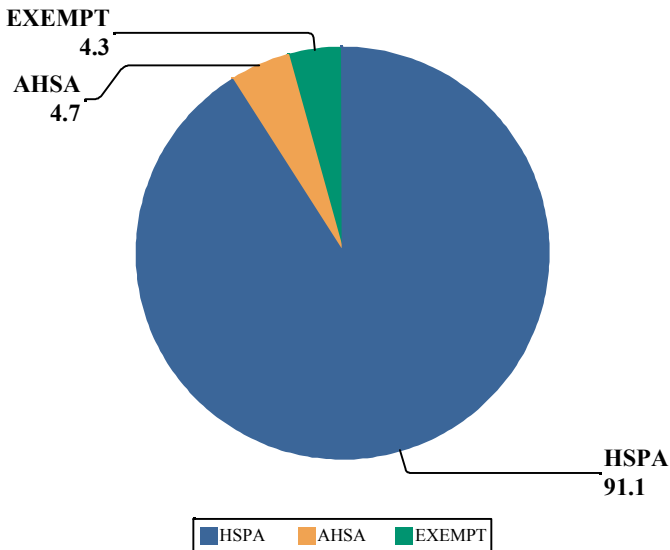

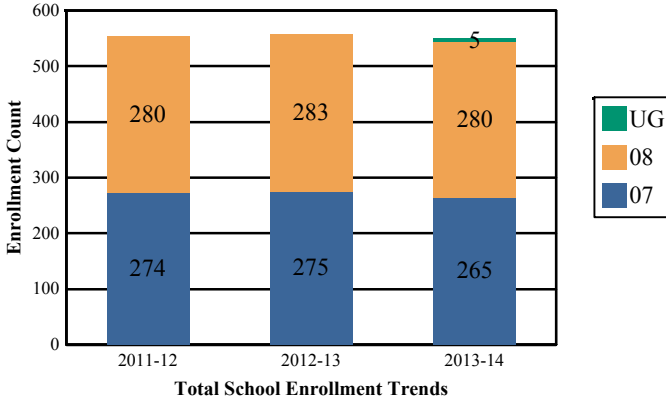

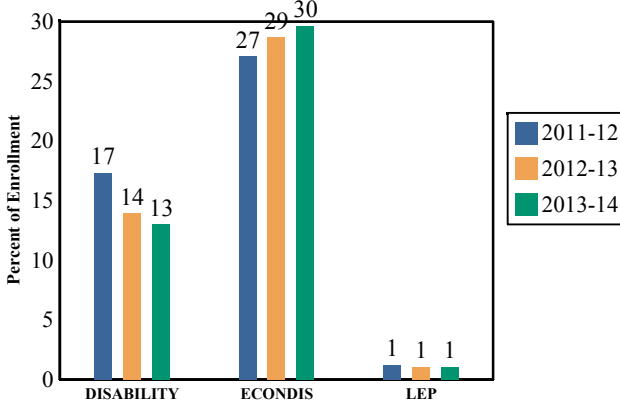

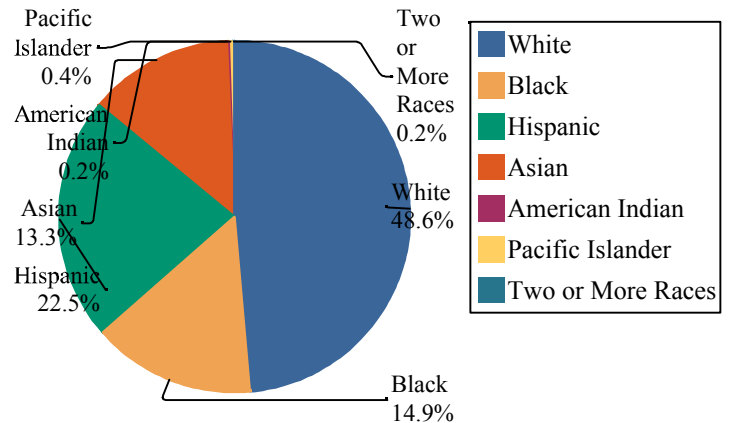

**Enrollment Trends by Program Participation**



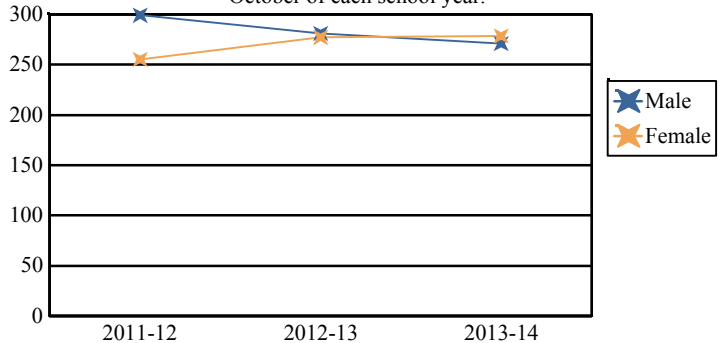
**Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup**

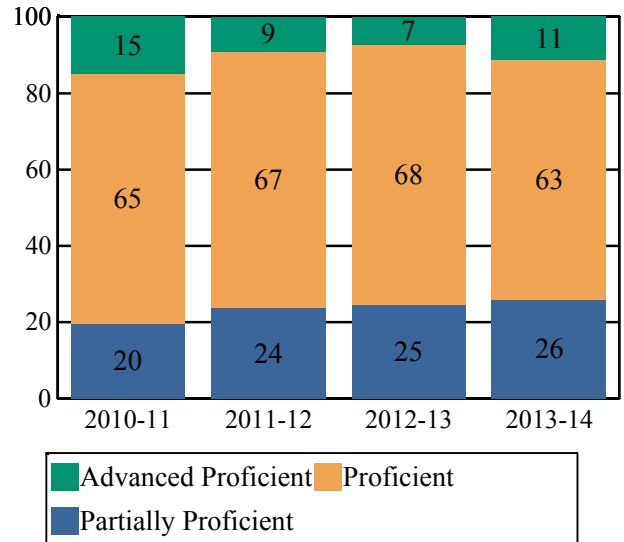

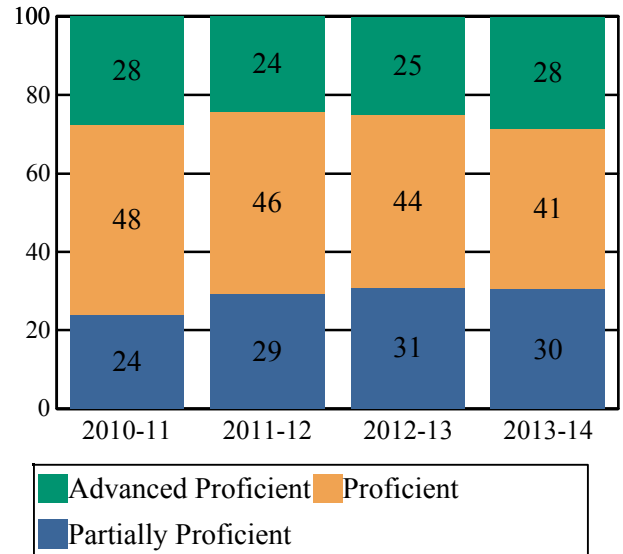

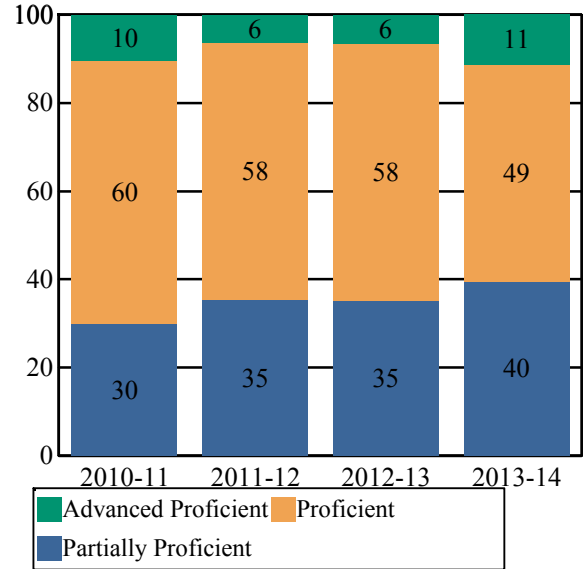

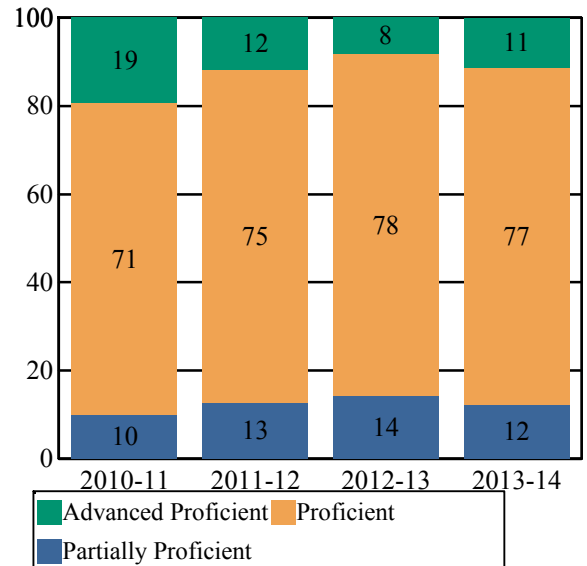

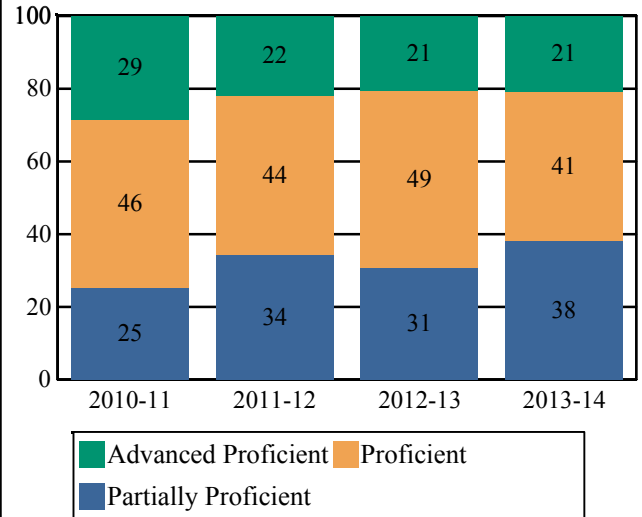

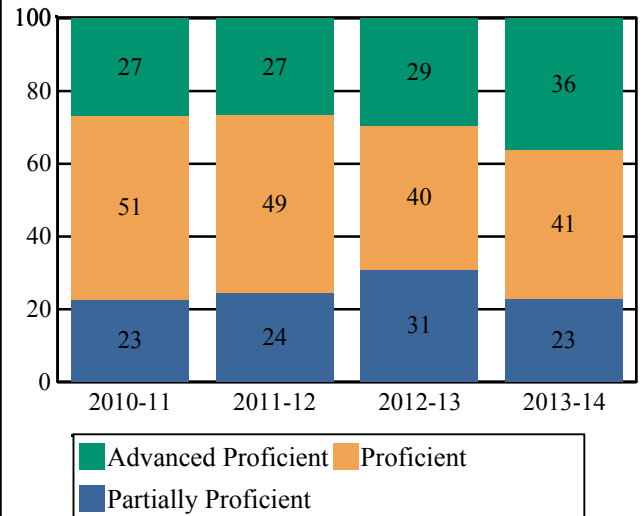
**NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 07**

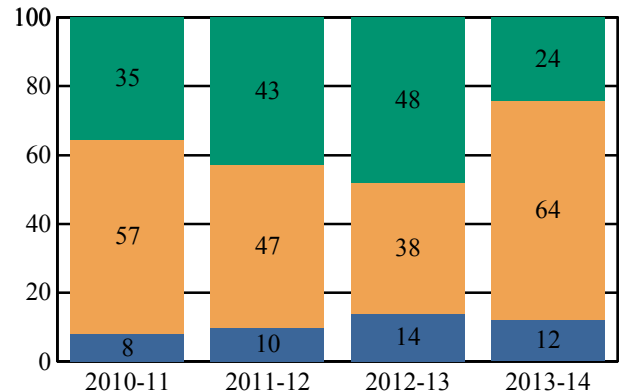

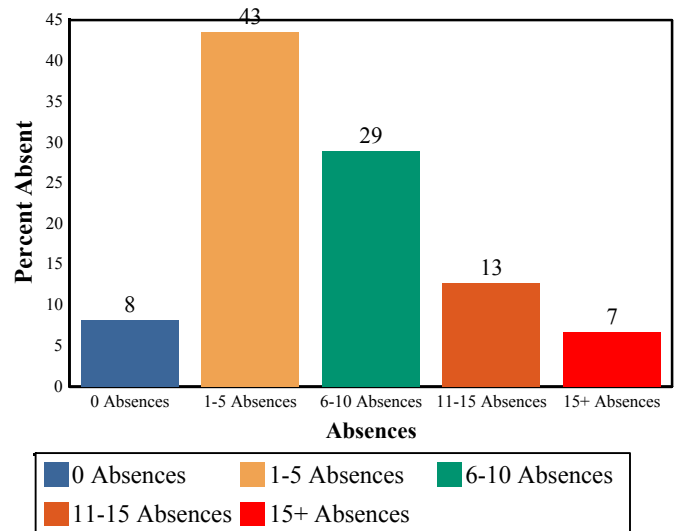

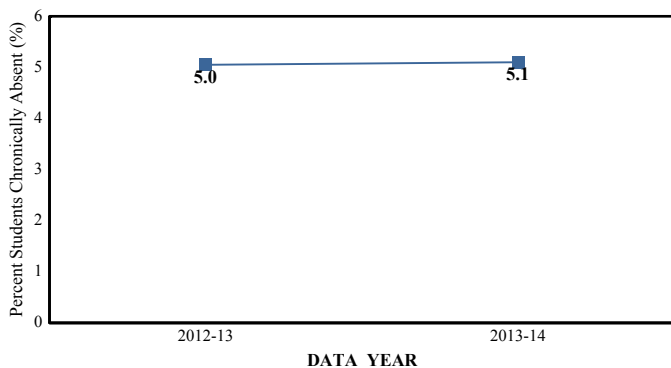
