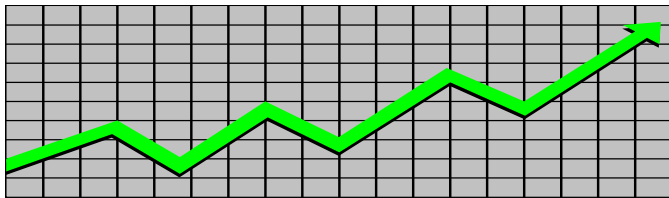

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DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS JULY 2013

Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Reporting.

WFNJ/TANF

- As of the end of July, the TANF caseload had decreased by 2,810 cases, from 39,294 in July 2012 to 36,484 in July 2013, a decrease of 7.2%.
- The counties with the highest family caseload percentage increase since July 2012 include Warren (2.5%) and Cumberland (1.2%).
- The counties with caseloads that decreased since July 2012 were Hunterdon (-14.3%), Bergen (-17.5%), and Sussex (-28.8%).
- Of the WFNJ/TANF cases, 8,075 or 22.1% were child-only in July 2013.
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Essex (1,272), Camden (1,110), and Hudson (1,017).
- Essex (19,290), Passaic (11,652), and Hudson (10,980) counties had the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in July 2013.

NJ SNAP (formerly FOOD STAMPS)

- In July 2013, there were 428,181 households receiving NJ SNAP benefits. The number of NJ SNAP households increased by 21,483, or 5.3%, since July 2012.
- There were 863,642 persons receiving NJ SNAP benefits as of July 2013, an increase of 47,061 or 5.8% since July 2012.
- The three counties having the highest caseload increase since July 2012 are Ocean (17.4%), Salem (9.0%), and Mercer (8.7%).

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

- There were 6,515 families receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in July 2013, an increase of 142 or 2.2% since July 2012.
- In July 2013, EA payments were made for 1,727 SSI recipients.

GENERAL ASSISTANCE

GA Emergency Assistance

- There were 5,766 Emergency Assistance payments made to GA cases in July 2013, a decrease of 879 or 13.2% since July 2012.
- The three counties that show an annual percent increase in emergency assistance payments are Warren (48.4%), Atlantic (45.6%), and Hudson (28.9%).

GA Program

- The total numbers of cases receiving GA has decreased from 43,250 to 37,329 since July 2012, a decrease of 13.7%.
- There were 24,405 Employable GA and 12,924 Unemployable GA cases in July 2013.
- Warren (11.7%), Middlesex (11.3%), and Salem (2.9%) counties showed the highest percent increase for GA cases since July 2012.
- In July 2013, GA cases showed a 2.9 percent decrease since June 2013.

CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (Quarterly Report)

- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about \$330 million from April 2013 to June 2013, an increase of 1.4 percent over the same period for FFY 2012.
- Total distributions increased 1.6% from June 2012.

WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)

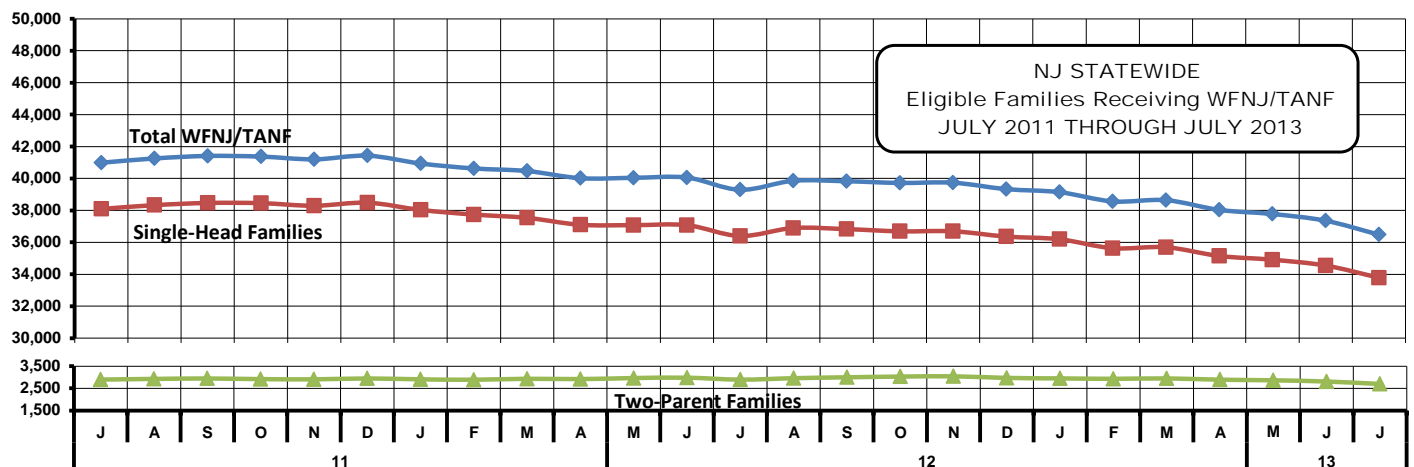
- During the report month of July 2013, there were 4,164 families in which at least one member was employed and an additional 616 families whose WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment - related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active WFNJ recipients were: Essex (973), Hudson (520), and Camden (431).
- There were 3,996 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.

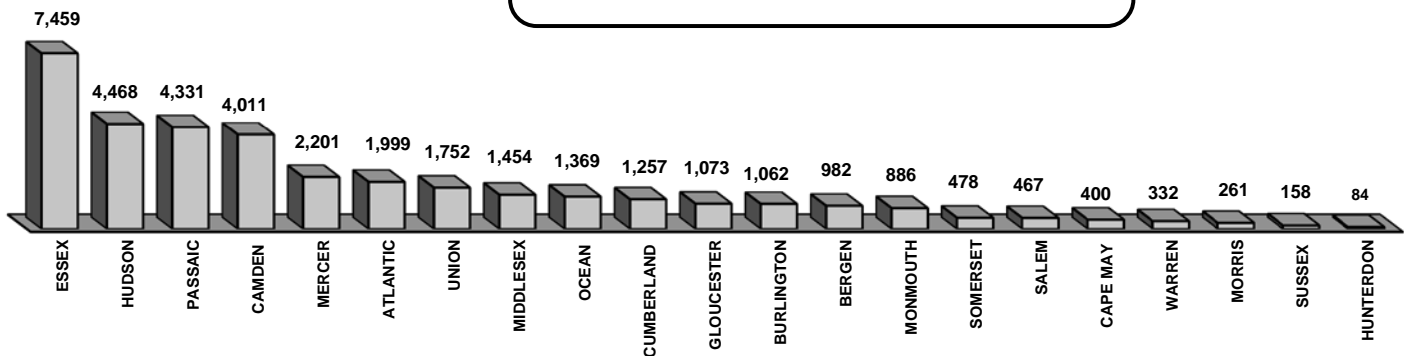

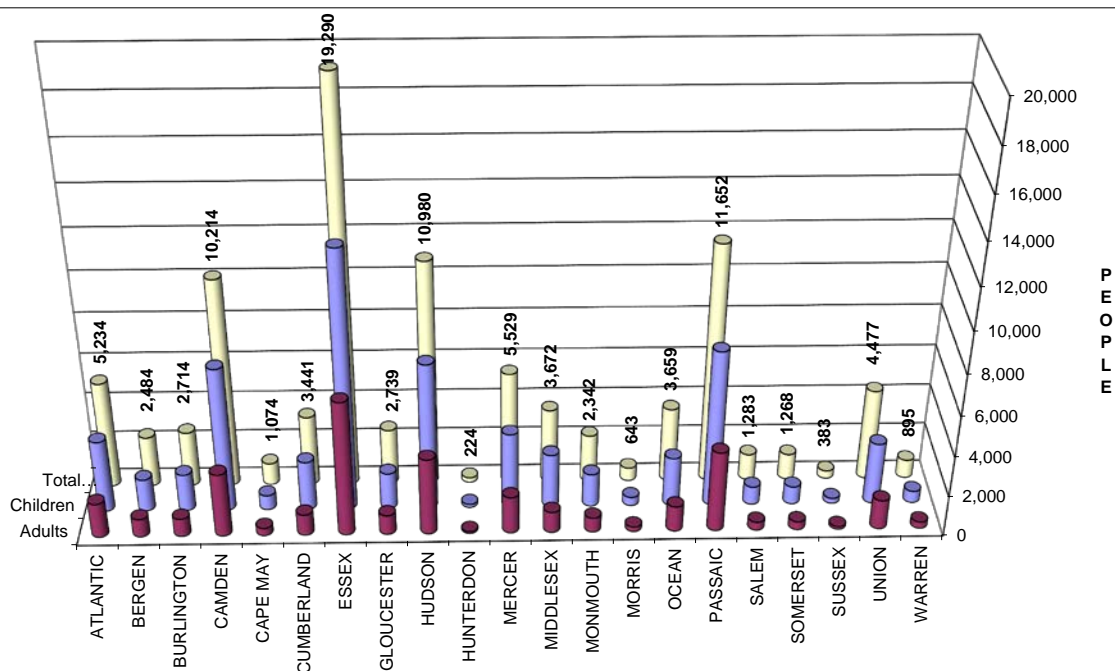

Ending With JULY 2013**

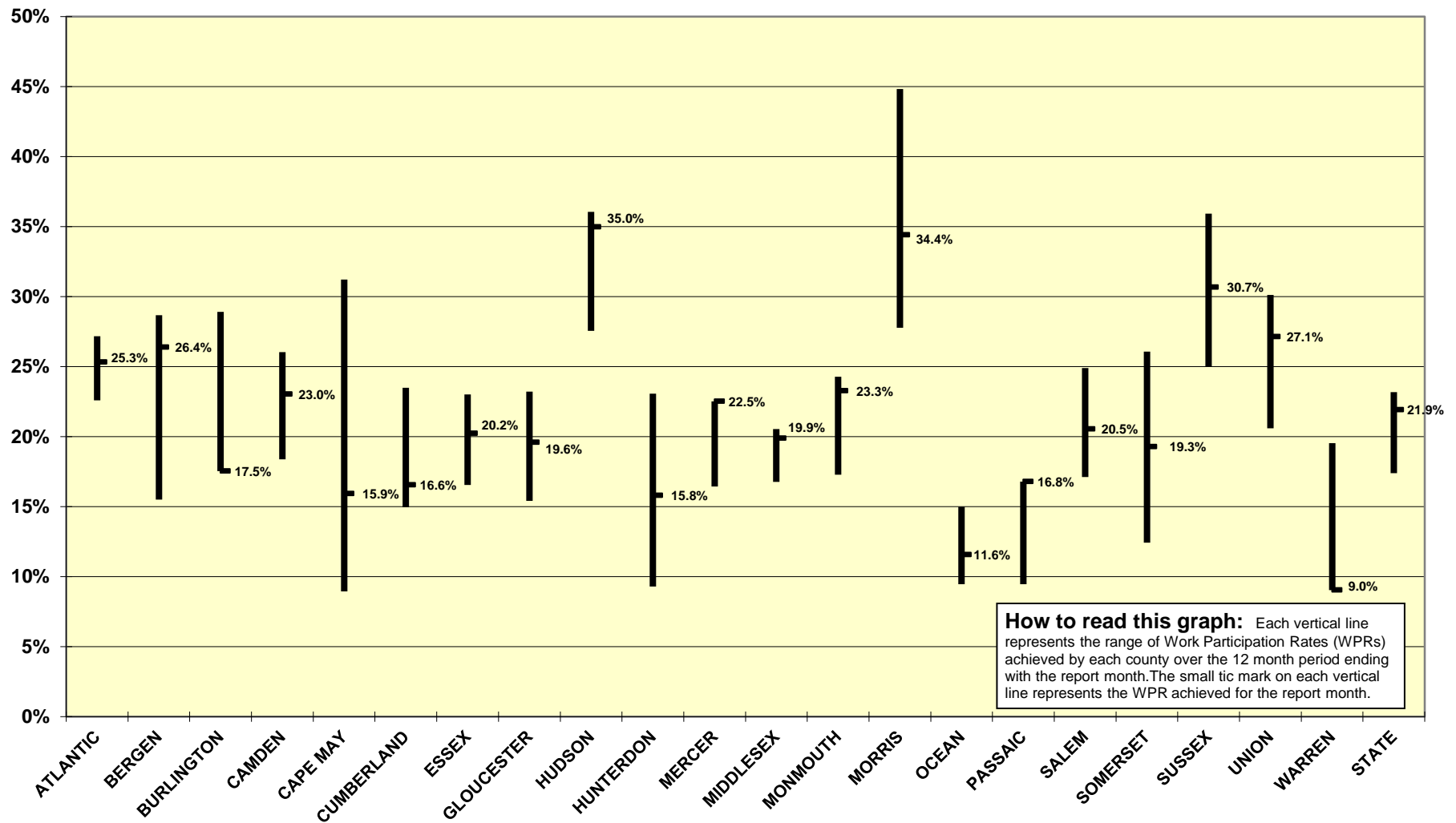
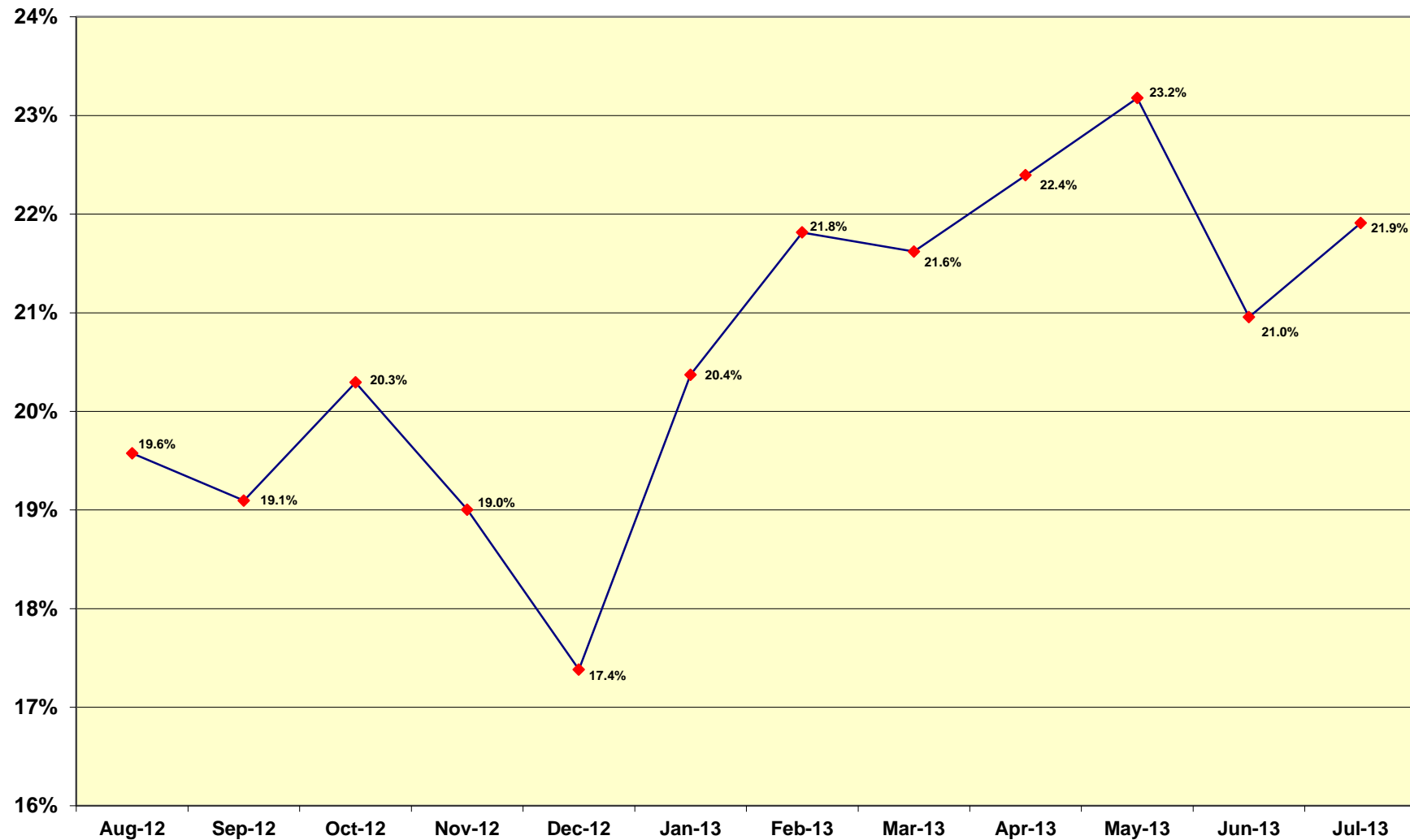

JULY 2011 THROUGH JULY 2013 (STATEWIDE)**

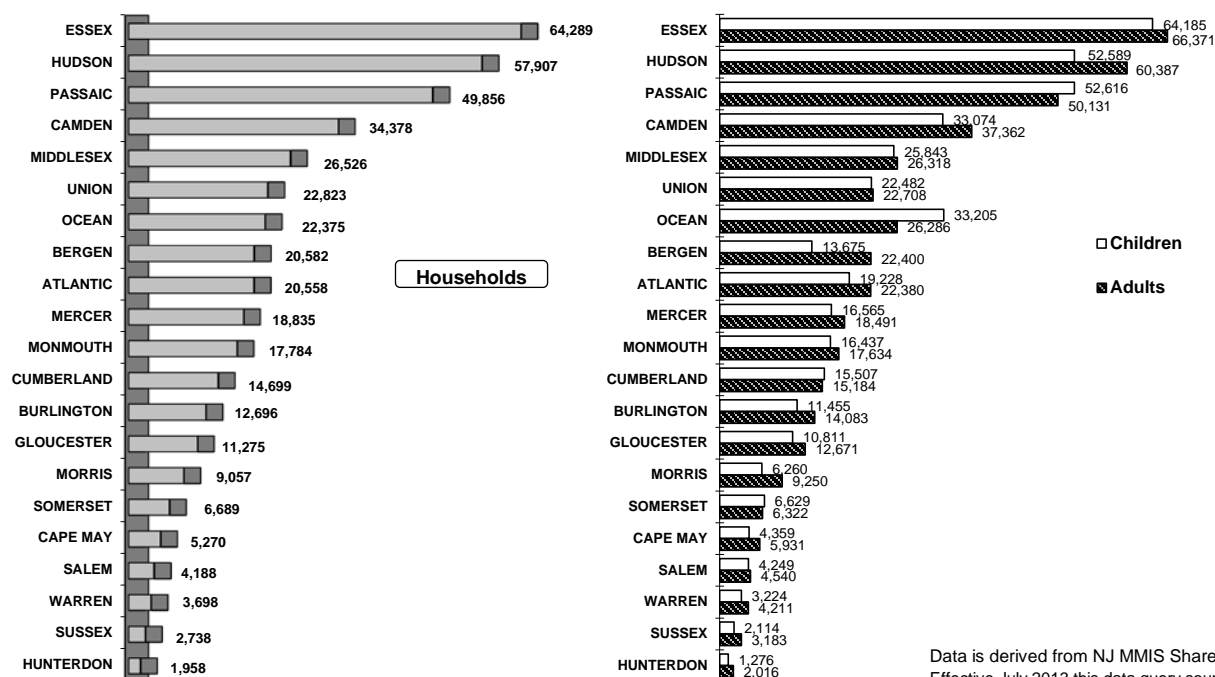

ACRONYMS

CASS: Consolidated Assistance and Support System

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA) - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is in an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

NJ SNAP - Formerly the Food Stamp Program, now known as **NJ SNAP** (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

FAMIS: Family Assistance Management Information System

GAAS: General Assistance Automated System

NJKiDS: New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE: The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, OptumInsight has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

OMEGA: Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

SSI-EA: Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

WFNJ: Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (**PRWORA**) of 1996. PRWORA established Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (**TANF**) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, **WFNJ/TANF** for families with children, and **WFNJ/GA** (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. WFNJ emphasizes achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.
