## Anthony T. Abbatiello <br> Appointed 2006

Anthony T. Abbatiello's love for horses has resulted in nearly 60 years dedicated to the horse racing industry. For 28 years, Mr. Abbatiello served the Standardbred Breeders and Owners Association of New Jersey, both as Co-Founder and as President. Mr. Abbatiello's previous titles included, Chairman of the Board for the United States Trotting Association, Director of the Standardbred Owners' Association of New York, Chairman of the New Jersey Sire Stakes Board of Directors, Trustee Chairman of the Board of American Horse Council in Washington D.C. and Trustee of the Trotting Horse Museum in Goshen, New York.

On July 2, 1995, Mr. Abbatiello was inducted into the Living Hall of Fame in Goshen, New York with his brother Carmine, a 1985 inductee. ## Frank Zanzuccki

Executive Director since 1992
Mr. Zanzuccki received a B.S. in Accounting from St. Francis College, Loretto, Pa. He was the Chief Accountant for United Mine Workers of America from 1975-1978. He started his career with the New Jersey Racing Commission in 1978 and served in various positions and was appointed Executive Director in 1992. Mr. Zanzuccki was awarded the prestigious Len Foote Award in 1998 in recognition of outstanding contributions to the horse racing industry. He is also the first non-commissioner to be elected to the Association of Racing Commissioners International Board of Directors. In addition to this honor, Mr. Zanzuccki was subsequently elected as an officer of this international organization and served as its chairman from April 2004 through April 2005.

## MISSION STATEMENT

The New Jersey Racing Commission ("NJRC") governs, directs and regulates horse racing and pari-mutuel wagering. The NJRC is a member of the Department of Law and Public Safety and is responsible for regulating the horse racing industry in the State through vigilant oversight of all racing and wagering related activities to ensure the integrity of the sport and the safety of its participants.

## Commission Structure

Horse racing in New Jersey is regulated by Commissioners who, by law, are appointed by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Senate. They set policy and rule on all matters affecting racing such as issuing permits to conduct horse racing meets, approving expenditures and adjudicating licensing matters. They also consider the issuance of licenses for off-track wagering sites, are responsible for the oversight and regulation of account wagering which includes telephone and internet wagering in New Jersey. This year, the following individuals served as Commissioners at year's end: Anthony T. Abbatiello, Manny Aponte, Dr. Michael Arnone, Pamela Clyne, Peter J. Cofrancesco III, Anthony De Paola, David Gruskos, Francis X. Keegan, Jr. and Peter T. Roselle.

The NJRC employs staff to effect policy, including an Executive Director who is responsible for overseeing the day-to-day operations of the Commission in accordance with accepted business and financial practices. Frank Zanzuccki serves as the Executive Director.

NJRC has a full-time staff of 36 employees who conduct the daily functions of regulating horse racing. The Commission also maintains a pool of 29 active hourly workers to supplement staff as needed.

Activities are divided into four functional areas with the FY2014 budget as follows:

## Administrative/Financial

Much of the general administrative functions are performed by the Department of Law \& Public Support Services unit specifically organized to streamline the personnel, budget and logistics functions of several State agencies.

Commission personnel perform administrative functions specific to racing matters including rule and regulation composition, staffing and scheduling, communications with and oversight of industry-related organizations, adjudication support, and report writing. Commission staff maintains a horse racing financial system that records and calculates all receipts and payments of funds from pari-mutuel wagering. In addition, it monitors the finances of certain industry organizations as required or requested.

## Racing Operations

All matters related to the regulation of the actual "running of the races" are the responsibility of the employees in this functional area.

Each individual and entity associated with horse racing must be licensed by Commission personnel. All participants must also be fingerprinted. A state-of- the-art computer system networks the Trenton office with all satellite racetrack locations. The Commission has a very successful mail-out program and participates in the Association of Racing Commissioners International multi-jurisdictional licensing program for owners, and is a member of the National Racing Compact.

The Commission employs racing officials who are present at each racetrack to monitor the running of every race in New Jersey. They issue penalties for rule infractions and rule on matters affecting the integrity of racing, including licensing concerns.

Veterinarians are also present at every live race meet to ensure the safety of the animals and to verify that each horse is fit to race.

Race horse samples are tested for the presence of illegal drugs after each race, and on occasion, before a race and in out-of-competition settings. These randomly selected samples undergo a complete chemical analysis at Truesdail Laboratories in California.

## Pari-Mutuels

Every wager made on every live and simulcast race is recorded and checked for accuracy and compliance with Commission rules and regulations. Commission staff calculate financial information from these wagers for proper distribution of funds. Racing Commission staff oversee all aspects of pari-mutuel operations to ensure they are conducted with integrity.

## Investigations

The investigative staff is responsible for monitoring activities at all New Jersey racetracks, offtrack wagering facilities, participating casinos, and off-track stabling facilities.

An in-house investigative unit provides the Commission with the ability to oversee the integrity of racing by conducting investigations into alleged rule violations, performing inspections to determine compliance with regulations, monitoring activity on racetracks and off-track stabling facilities, providing testimony at administrative hearings and much more.

## 2014 HIGHLIGHTS AND KEY ISSUES

Note: Items in italics actually occurred in 2015 but are included here for clarity purposes

## Off-Track Wagering

An application for a new off-track wagering facility ("OTW") was approved by the Commission at a public hearing on October 23, 2013 and was subsequently approved by the Attorney General on November 23, 2013. The facility, located in a former restaurant in Gloucester Township, Camden County, opened in July 2014. This is the second OTW owned and operated in Freehold Raceway's approved site location area and represents the fifth OTW facility in the State.

An application was received for an OTW to be located in Hillsborough Township, Somerset County. The application was returned to the applicant for clarification and amendment of material deficiencies, and these changes are currently under review. The proposed OTW is in the Monmouth Park site location area and it is expected this facility will become operational in 2015.

Pertinent to the OTW issue, the Racing Commission issued a temporary stay of its September 18, 2013 decision ordering permit holders to comply with benchmarks set forth in N.J.A.C. 13:742.4(B)(1) by March 14, 2014 until legal challenges (ACRA Turf Club, LLC v. Zanzuccki) to the Off-Track and Account Wagering Act are resolved in District Court. ACRA Turf Club, LLC challenged the constitutionality of certain state laws that affect their rights under a contract between them and the New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority. A partial decision from the District Court was issued in February 2015 affirming the constitutionality of the governing statute and regulations. The remaining matters pending before the District Court are expected to be resolved by the summer of 2015 .

## Pilot Program

P.L. 2011, c. 228 authorizes the establishment of a pilot program allowing parimutuel wagering on horse racing at a limited number of taverns, restaurants and similar venues in certain designated areas of the State through the use of electronic wagering terminals. An application was submitted to the Commission on behalf of the Monmouth Park permit holder for a location in Clifton, Passaic County. This application was deemed complete on March 23, 2015 and approved by the Commission at its May 13, 2015 meeting. It is pending review by the Attorney General's Office.

## Exchange Wagering N.J.A.C. 13:74C

Comprehensive proposed regulations concerning Exchange Wagering were advertised in the "New Jersey Register" for comment. The comments received were summarized and draft responses were submitted to the Commission. The Commission approved the summary of the comments, the draft responses and the rules for adoption at its November 2014 public meeting. Exchange wagering is a form of parimutuel wagering, in which two or more persons place identically opposing wagers in a given market, and which wagering is conducted by the exchange wagering licensee pursuant to a valid exchange wagering license issued by the Racing Commission, and pursuant to and in compliance with the Exchange Wagering Act, N.J.S.A. 5:5168, et seq., and the Commission's rules, which became effective when published in the New Jersey Register on April 20, 2015.

## Medication Rules N.J.A.C. 13:70-14A.1, 14A.7, 14A.17; 13:71-23.1, 23.7, 23.16

Model rules concerning allowable threshold levels of approved medications administered to racehorses as well as multiple medication penalties associated with violations were adopted by the Commission this year. These changes are incorporated by reference to the Association of Racing Commission International's model rules and are part of a nationwide effort to standardize medication rules in racing jurisdictions.

## 2015 Race Dates

At its November 2014 meeting, the Commission approved the following 2015 race dates: Freehold Raceway 110, Monmouth Park 49, Meadowlands Harness 81 and Atlantic City Racecourse 6. At its March 2015 meeting, the Commission approved 13 thoroughbred race dates at the Meadowlands Racetrack, all of which will be conducted on the turf track. These race dates are similar to last year's totals.

## Closure of Atlantic City Race Course

The Atlantic City Race Course ("ACRC") permanently ceased all operations on January 16, 2015 at 4:00 p.m. By letter dated January 22, 2015, Executive Director Zanzuccki informed ACRC that its closure rendered the Commission's November 19, 2014 determination to issue it a thoroughbred racing permit for 6 thoroughbred race dates and a simulcasting license null, void and of no effect. The Executive Director ordered ACRC to account for all monies collected from

parimutuel wagering by February 16, 2015 and provide the Commission with bank statements evidencing the existence and location of said monies. ACRC has complied with this order.

Drug Testing
The Racing Commission continued its comprehensive drug testing program during the year. In addition to testing for a wide array of drugs in post-race samples, the Commission conducted out-of-competition testing, most of which were at licensed New Jersey off-track stabling facilities and a few at New Jersey racetracks. Also, nearly all of the horses entered for the Breeders Crown Racing Program at the Meadowlands were tested prior to racing.

As part of the Commission's regular testing program Truesdail Laboratories tested 29,062 blood and urine samples collected from horses with 41 testing positive for the presence of illegal drugs. They also tested 322 samples taken from humans with none being positive for the presence of illegal substances.

## Workers' Compensation Insurance

The Commission's Executive Director is also the Chair of the New Jersey Horse Racing Injury Compensation Board that provides workers' compensation insurance that covers certain horse racing industry employees. During the year, the Board continued with its loss prevention program that hopefully will result in a reduction of the number of serious injuries.

Several Court Cases of note were processed this year:
Esposito v. New Jersey Racing Commission, App. Div. Docket No. A-3016-12T2; 2014 N.J. Super. Unpub. LEXIS 2808)(December 2, 2014).

Esposito was convicted of promoting gambling and possession of gambling records in New York in January 1998. In January 2011, Esposito applied for a N.J. trainer's license, the NJRC did not recommend him for licensure and Esposito appealed. Although the ALJ recommended that Esposito be licensed, the NJRC issued a Final Decision rejecting the Initial Decision. After analyzing factors required by the Rehabilitated Convicted Offenders Act, the NJRC found that Esposito's 1998 conviction adversely related to the license he was seeking. The NJRC also faulted the ALJ for disregarding Esposito's testimony at the OAL admitting he had been training his wife's horse at a N.J. off-track stable without a N.J. trainer's license in violation of the NJRC's rules. Esposito appealed the Final Decision. After reviewing the NJRC's "thorough treatment of the evidence in its careful findings" set forth in the Final Decision, the Appellate Division affirmed.

Michael Gulotta, on behalf of the owners of Crys Dream v. New Jersey Racing Commission; App. Div. Docket No. A-1774-12T3; 2014 N.J. Super. Unpub. LEXIS 2179 (September 5, 2014).

The owners of the horse Crys Dream appealed NJRC's Final Decision affirming the NJRC's Board of Judges' application of N.J.A.C. 13:71-1.10 and 1.12 which mandate that reciprocity be granted to the official rulings of other horse racing regulatory bodies. The NJRC granted reciprocity to an Ontario Racing Commission ("ORC") ruling which declared the horse ineligible to compete for 90 days as a result of a drug positive. The NJRC granted reciprocity to the ORC's ruling after the NJRC's Board of Judges afforded the owners an administrative hearing. The owners appealed the Final Decision. In an unpublished decision, the Appellate Division reversed, finding that the NJRC's application of its reciprocity rules was not consistent with principles of administrative fairness. Although the NJRC granted the owners an administrative hearing before applying its reciprocity rules, the court nevertheless reversed the NJRC's Final Decision because the ORC declared the horse ineligible to compete without first granting the owners an administrative hearing in Ontario.

Turano v. New Jersey Racing Commission, App. Div. Docket No. A-000928-14T4 (filed October 20, 2014 but withdrawn); Throckmorton v. New Jersey Racing Commission, App. Div. Docket No. A-000929-14T4 (filed October 20, 2014 but withdrawn).

Both parimutuel wagering tellers, Turano and Throckmorton, were found to be in violation of N.J.A.C. 13:71-26.5 (conspiracy to commit a corrupt or fraudulent practice in racing) by facilitating a "ten-percenting" scheme which allowed certain individuals to circumvent the tax reporting requirements for winning parimutuel wagering tickets as required by the Internal Revenue Service. In addition, Turano was found to have violated N.J.A.C. 13:71-26.7 for failure to cooperate during the Racing Commission's investigation. At the OAL, the ALJ determined that Turano and Throckmorton violated these rules but reduced the penalty sought for Turano. In a Final Decision dated September 23, 2014, the Commission increased the reduced penalty which the ALJ recommended for Turano from $\$ 2,000$ to $\$ 2,500$ and increased the reduced suspension from 6 months to one year. Both licensees filed a Notice of Appeal with the Appellate Division but later withdrew their appeals.

IMO Order of the New Jersey Racing Commission Approving New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority's Application for Approval of an Account Wagering Management Agreement; App. Div. Docket Nos. A-2146-14T1 and A-2352-13T1; 2015 N.J. Super. Unpub. LEXIS 279 (February 17, 2015).

New Jersey Account Wagering, LLC ("NJAW") appealed the NJRC's orders approving the appointment of Darby Development, LLC ("Darby") as manager of the account wagering system and took issue with language in the Account Wagering Management Agreement, executed by the New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority ("NJSEA") and Darby, which stated that Darby would be acting as an independent contractor and not as the agent of the NJSEA. At its November 30, 2012
meeting, the Commission approved the NJSEA's petition to appoint Darby as the manager of the account wagering system but ordered that conditions be imposed on the NJSEA requiring it to maintain sufficient oversight responsibilities over Darby in order to create the agency relationship required by N.J.S.A. 5:5-140© and ensure that account wagering continued into the next calendar year without interruption. NJAW appealed the Commission's December 6, 2012 order which approved Darby as manager of the account wagering system for the remainder of 2012 and 2013 and also appealed the Commission's December 12, 2013 order which approved Darby as manager for 2014. The appeals were consolidated. On February 17, 2015, the court issued its decision and ordered that the Commission modify its orders to require that the NJSEA amend the Account Wagering Management Agreement "to provide that Darby is acting as the NJSEA's agent with respect to all [account wagering system] matters, and that Darby has no final decision making authority, the NJSEA retains ultimate control and decision-making authority, and the NJSEA shall oversee and manage Darby." The Commission voted to amend its orders at its March 18, 2015 public meeting.

## NEW JERSEY EQUINE TESTING PROGRAM

NJRC's Equine Drug Testing Program is administered by NJRC staff and samples are tested at Truesdail Laboratories in California. The following is a summary of the results of those tests:

The Commission encouraged the creation of this Board that provides group workers' compensation insurance for the horse racing industry. The Board consists of representatives of the public and private sector including members of horse race organizations, insurance providers, risk management, state banking and insurance department, and the NJRC. The program covers employees of the Board, namely drivers, jockeys, exercise riders and thoroughbred trainers' employees, with 2014 premiums established at $\$ 1,581,885$. In 2014, the Board continued in the Assigned Risk Program with NJM being the provider.
