## **College and Career Readiness**

This school outperforms 32% of schools statewide as noted by its statewide percentile and 19% of schools educating students with similar demographic characteristics as noted in its peer school percentile in the performance area of College and Career Readiness. Additionally, this school is meeting 0% of its performance targets in the area of College and Career Readiness.



College and Career readiness measures the degree to which students are demonstrating behaviors that are indicative of future attendance and/or success in college and careers. For all elementary and middle schools, this includes a measurement of how many students are chronically absent. 

This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.






## Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup








### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 03




## NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 03






#### **Chronic Absenteeism Trend**



This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.






## Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup








## NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 03




## NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 03






#### **Chronic Absenteeism Trend**



## **Enrollment by Grade**












## **Proficiency Trends - Math**









### **Enrollment by Grade**






## Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup








## NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 07



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






#### **Chronic Absenteeism Trend**



This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.






## Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup








#### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 03




## NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 03






#### **Chronic Absenteeism Trend**




## Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup












#### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 05




# NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 05




#### **Chronic Absenteeism Trend**



This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.






# Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup








### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 03










#### **Chronic Absenteeism Trend**
















#### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 05




# NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 05




#### **Chronic Absenteeism Trend**







This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.




















#### **Chronic Absenteeism Trend**



This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.






## Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup


















#### **Chronic Absenteeism Trend**






## Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup


















#### **Chronic Absenteeism Trend**
