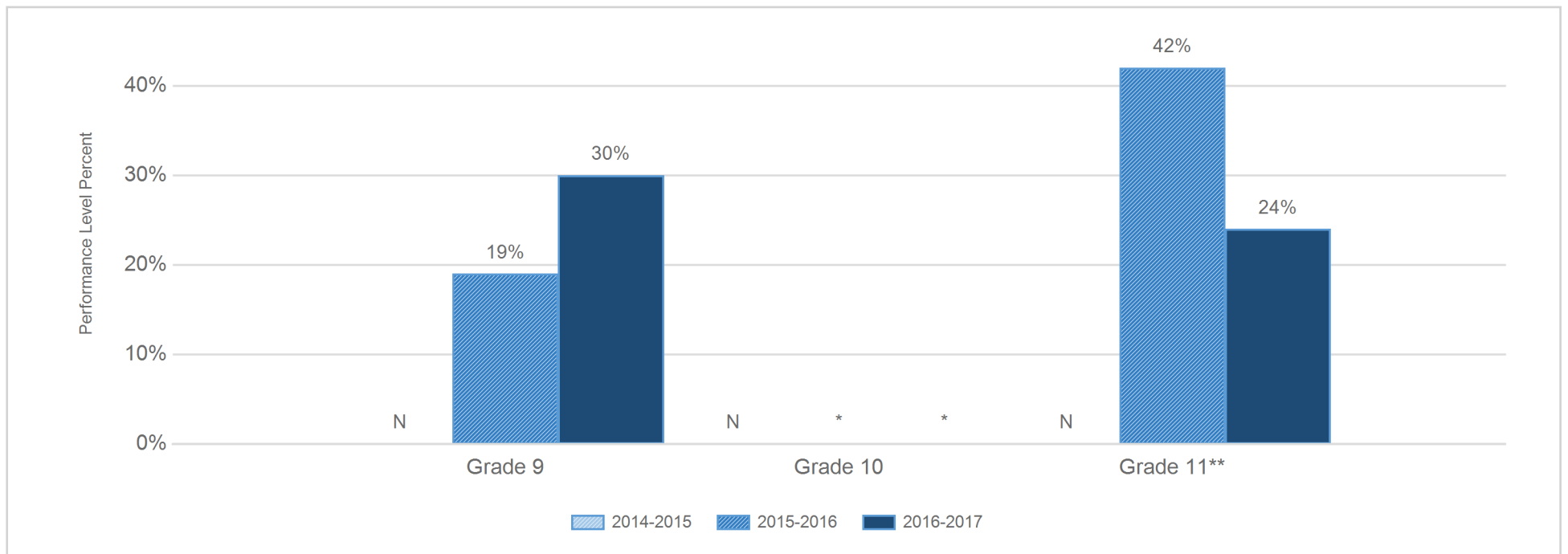

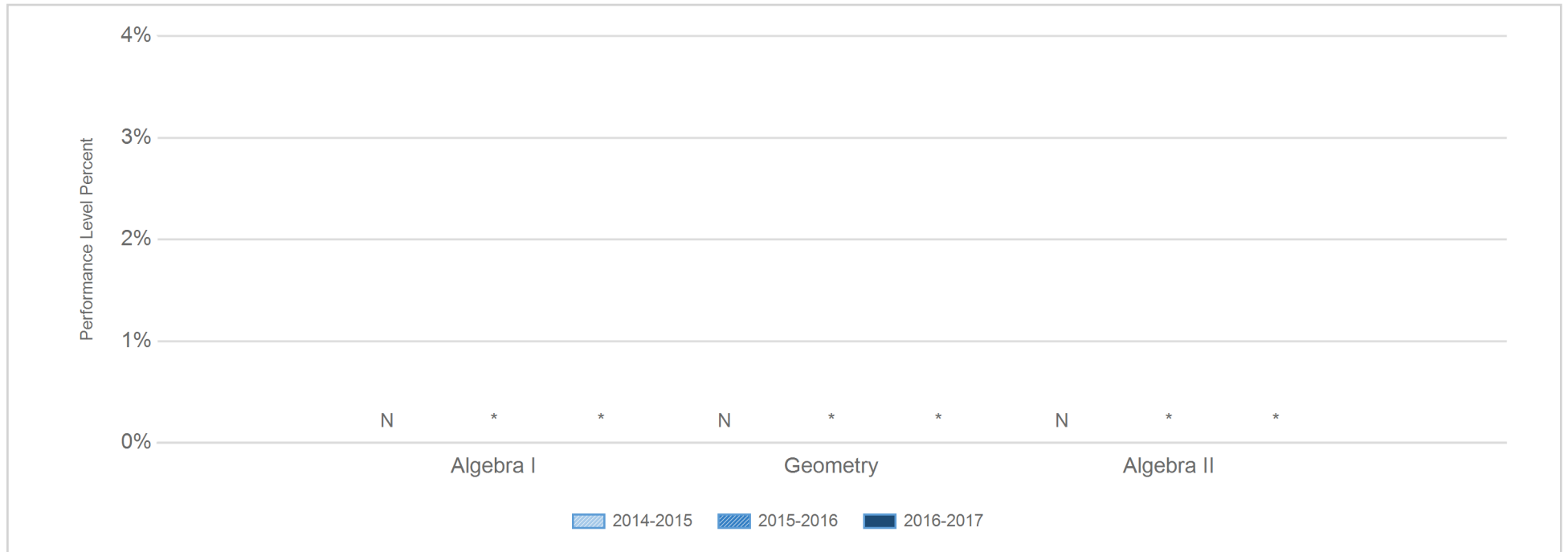

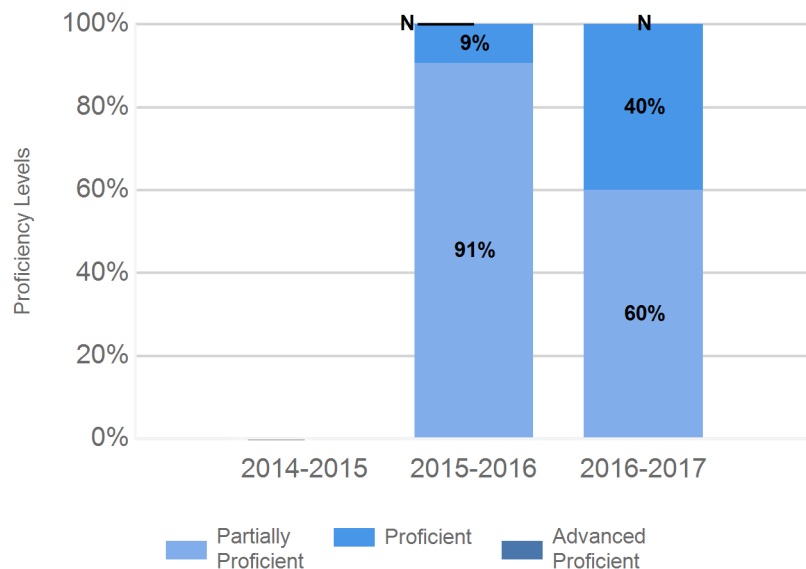

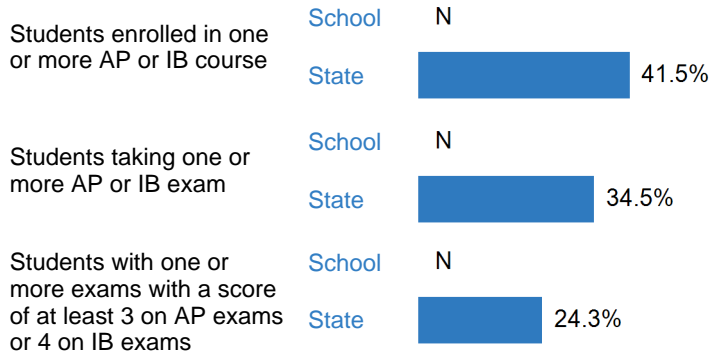

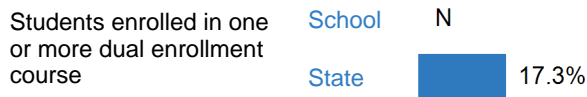

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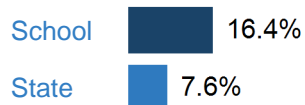

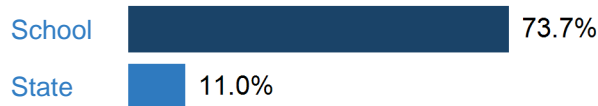

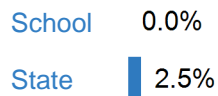

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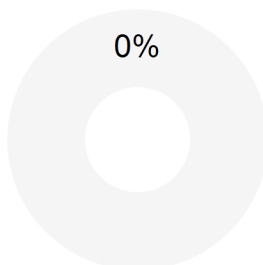

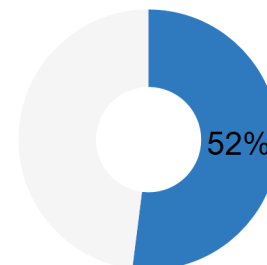

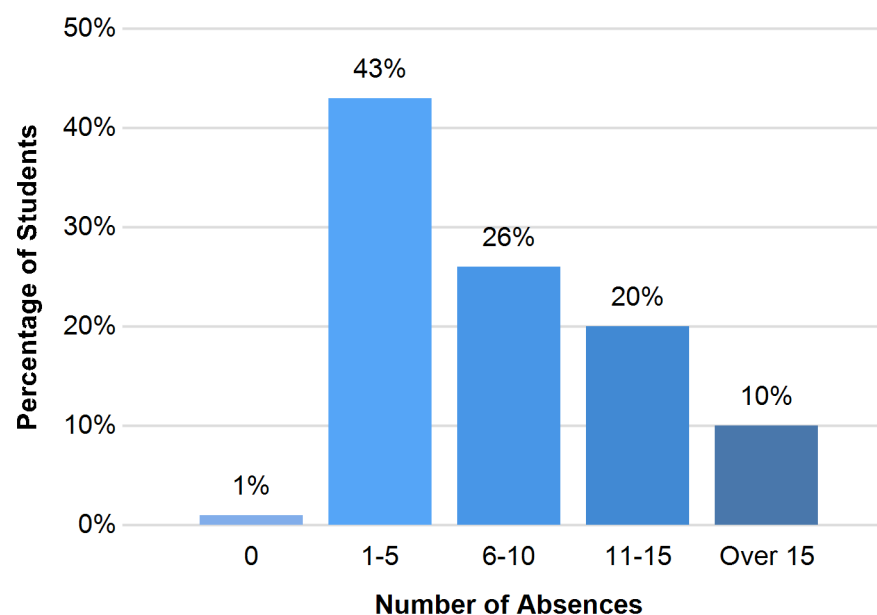

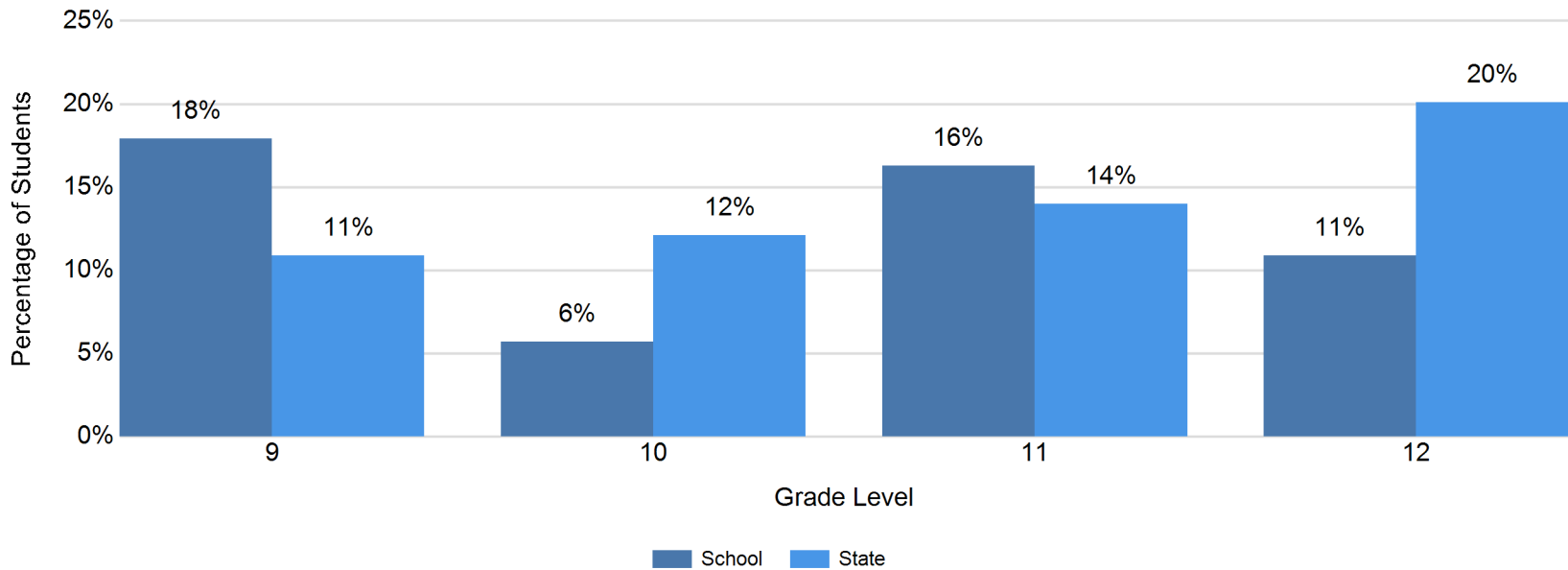

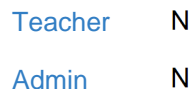

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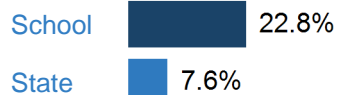

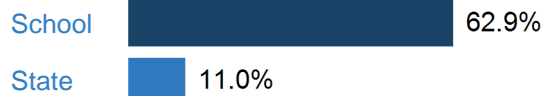
#### CTE Participants

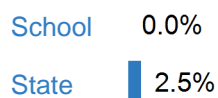

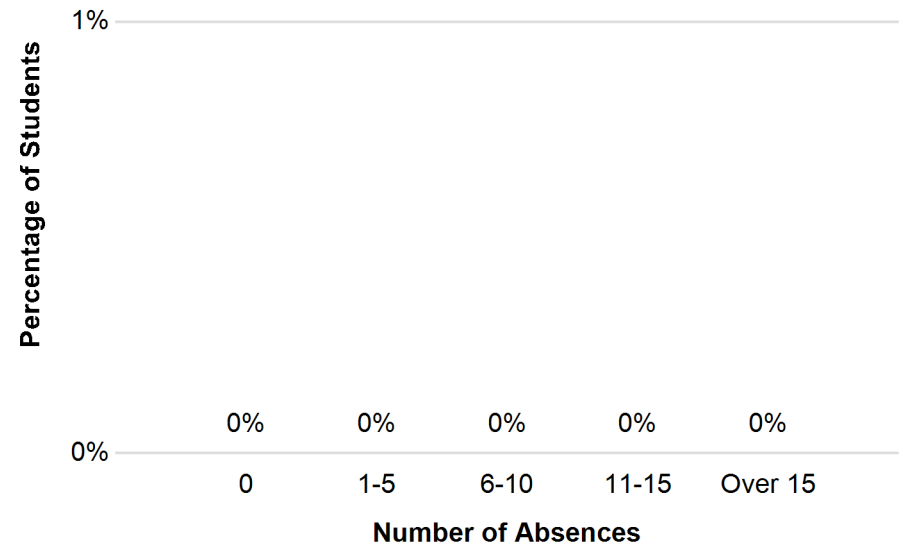

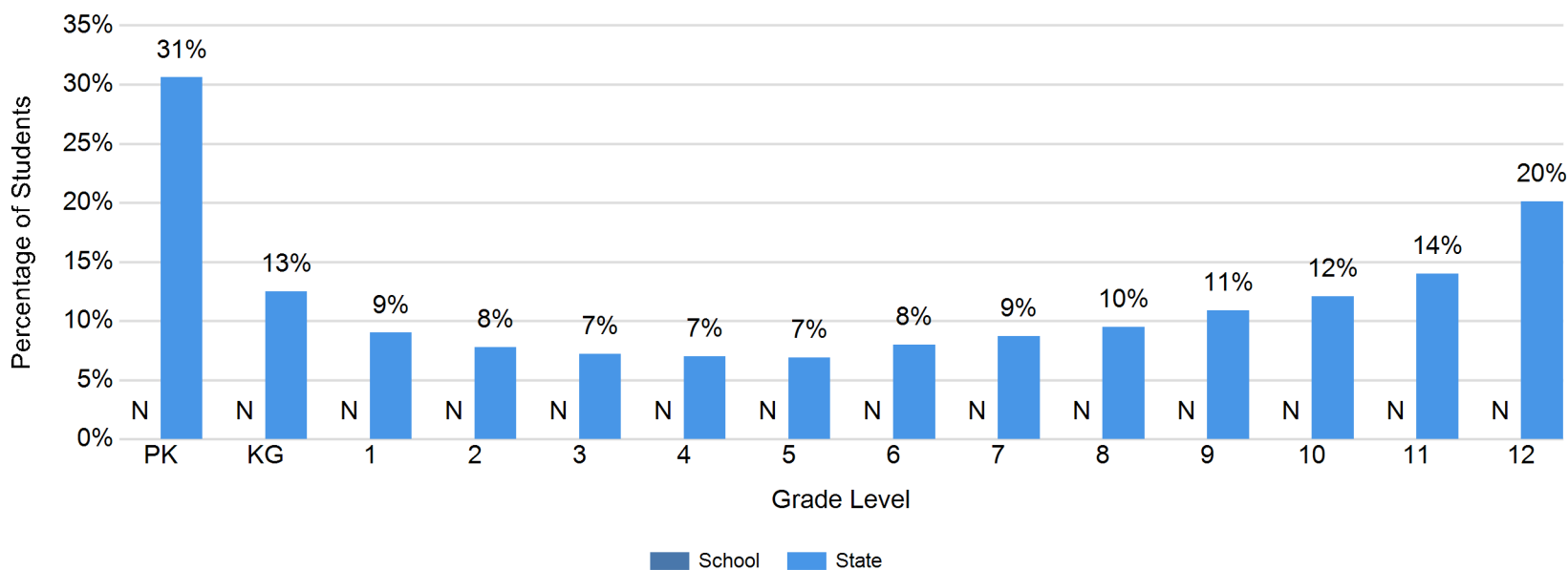

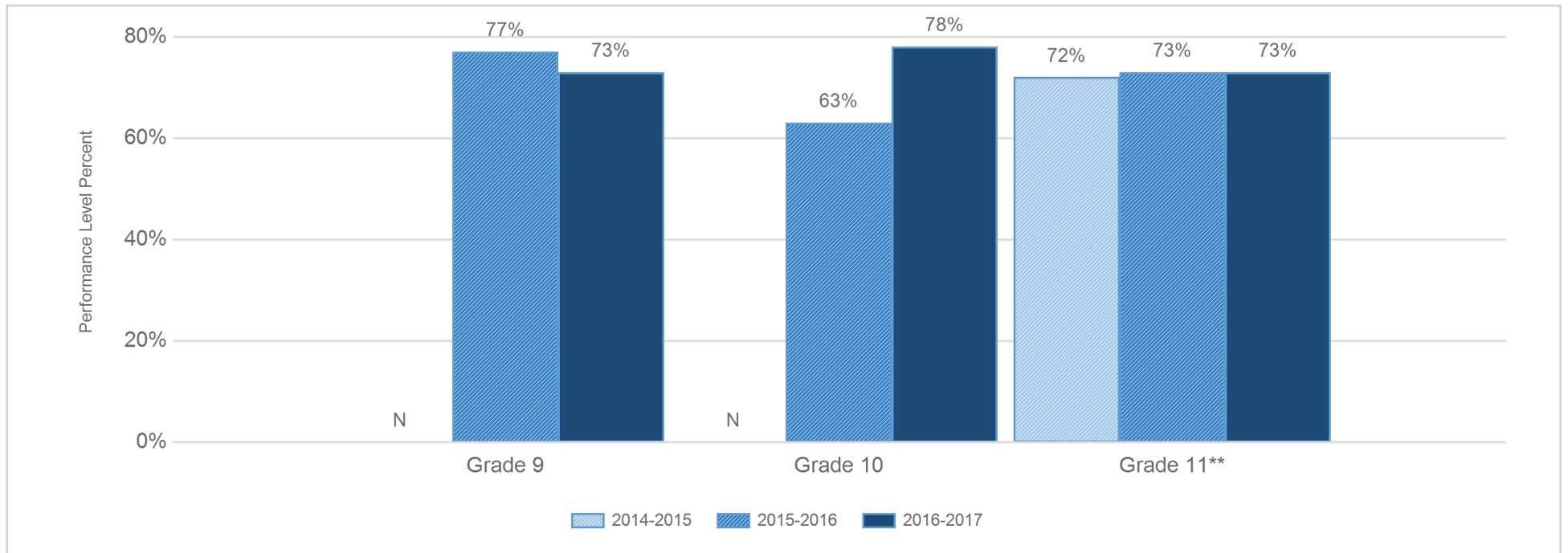

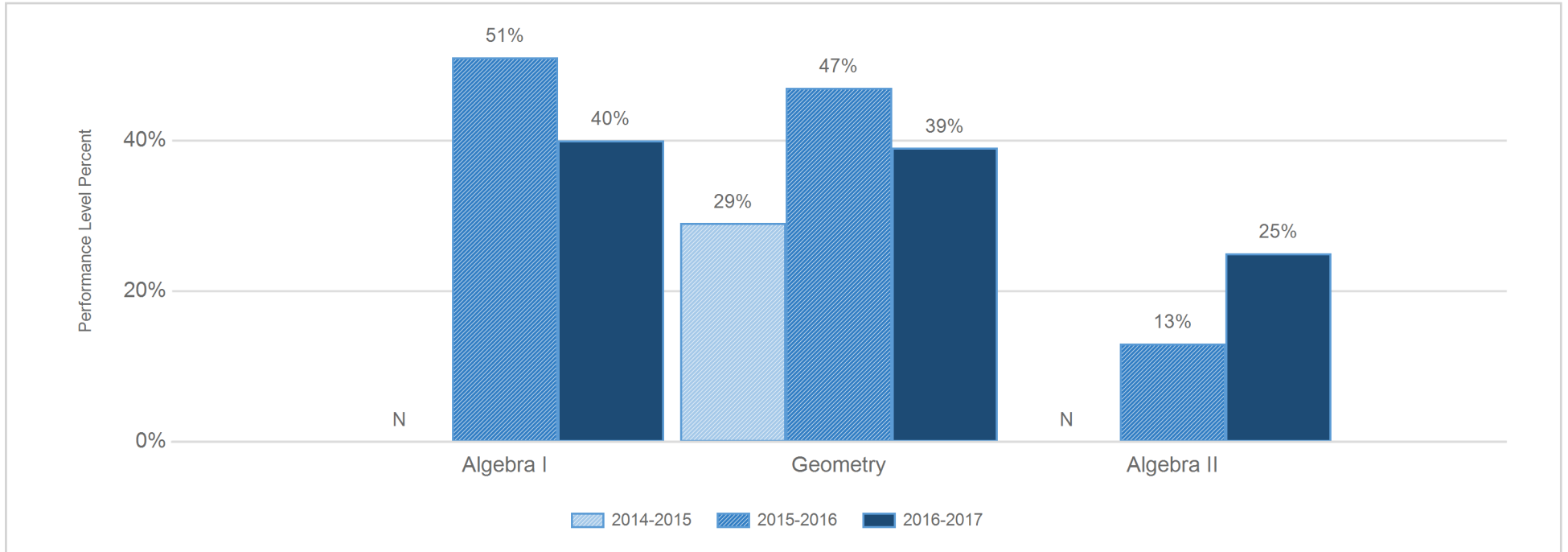

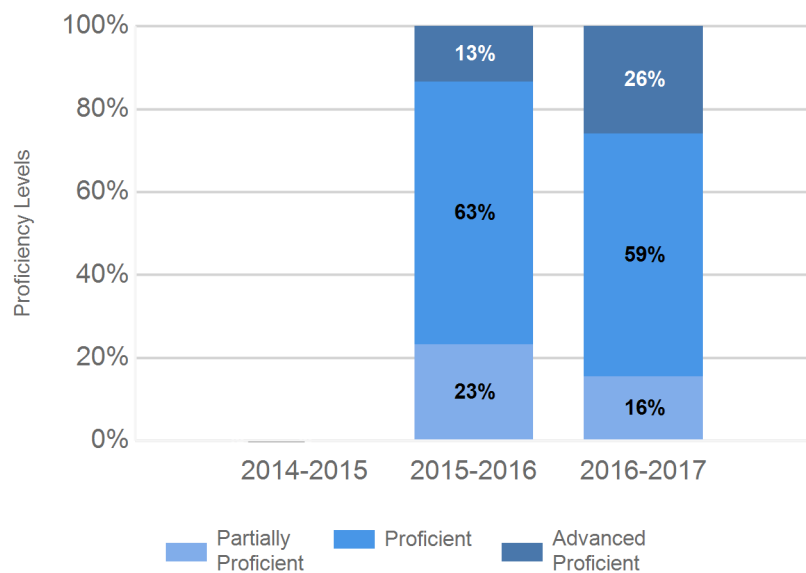

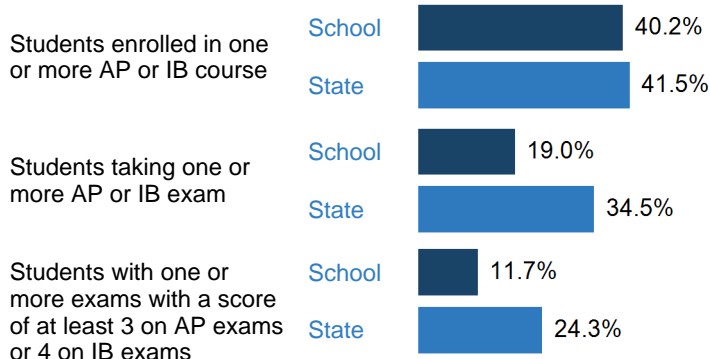

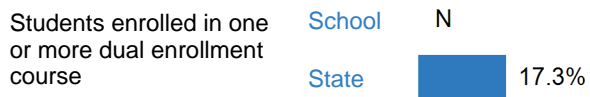

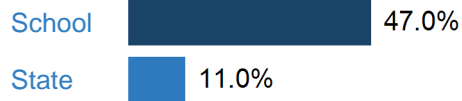

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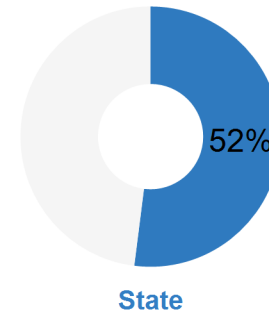

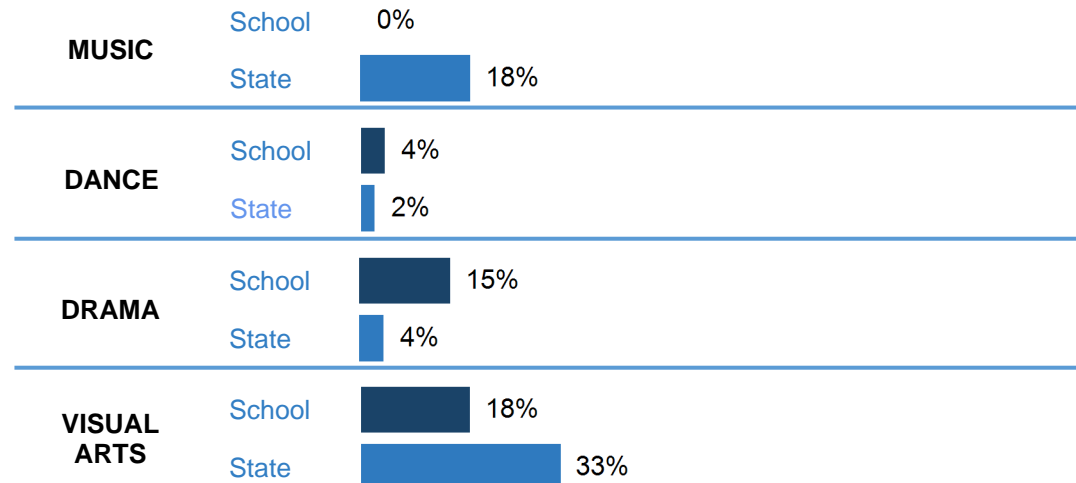

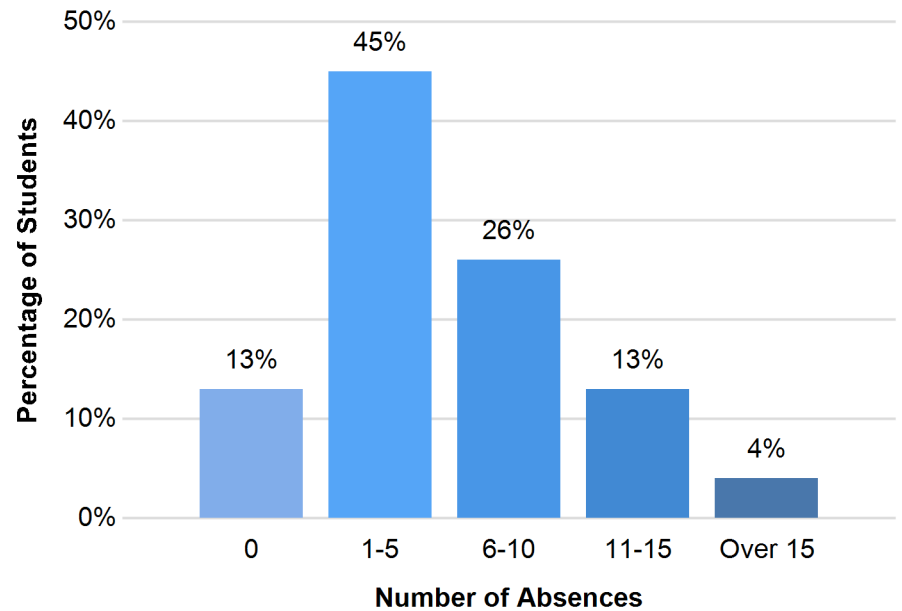

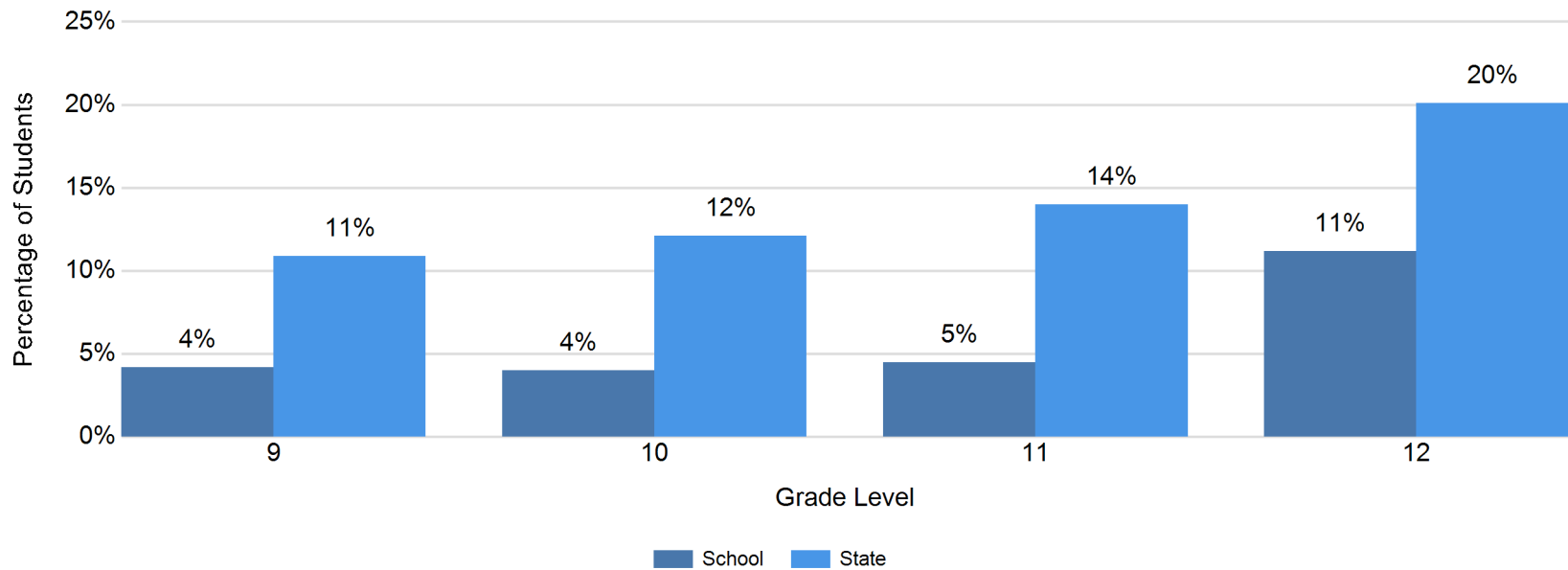


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Chronic Absenteeism by Grade

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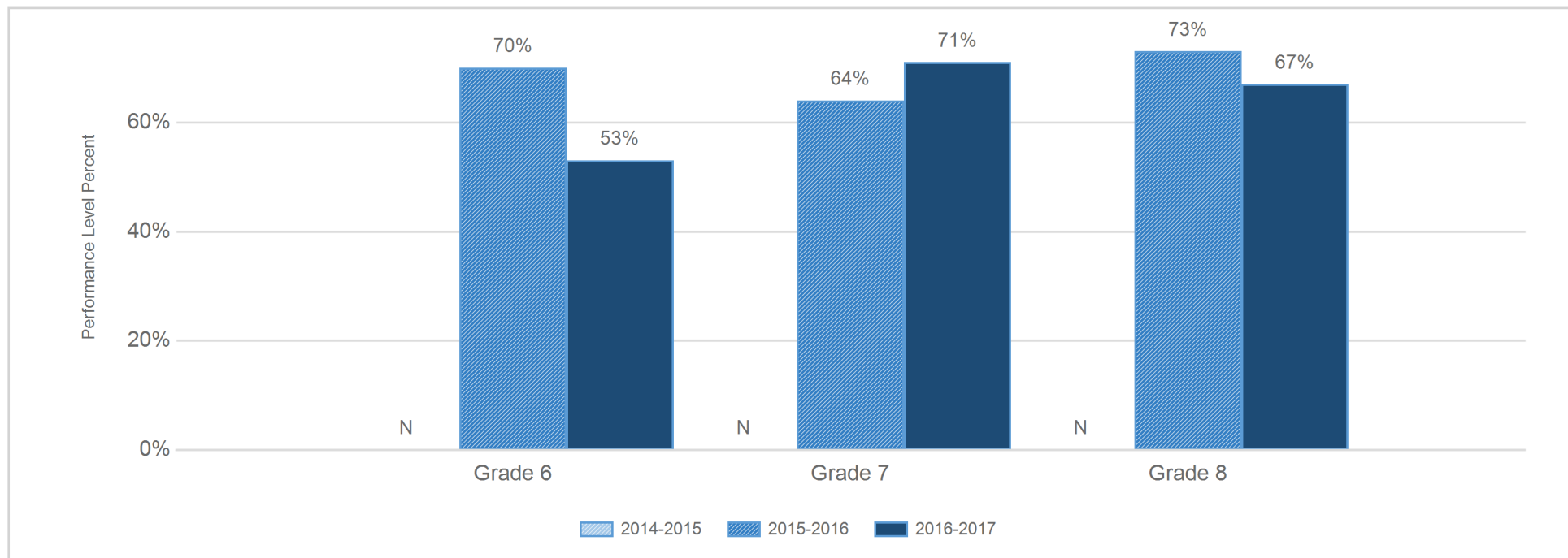

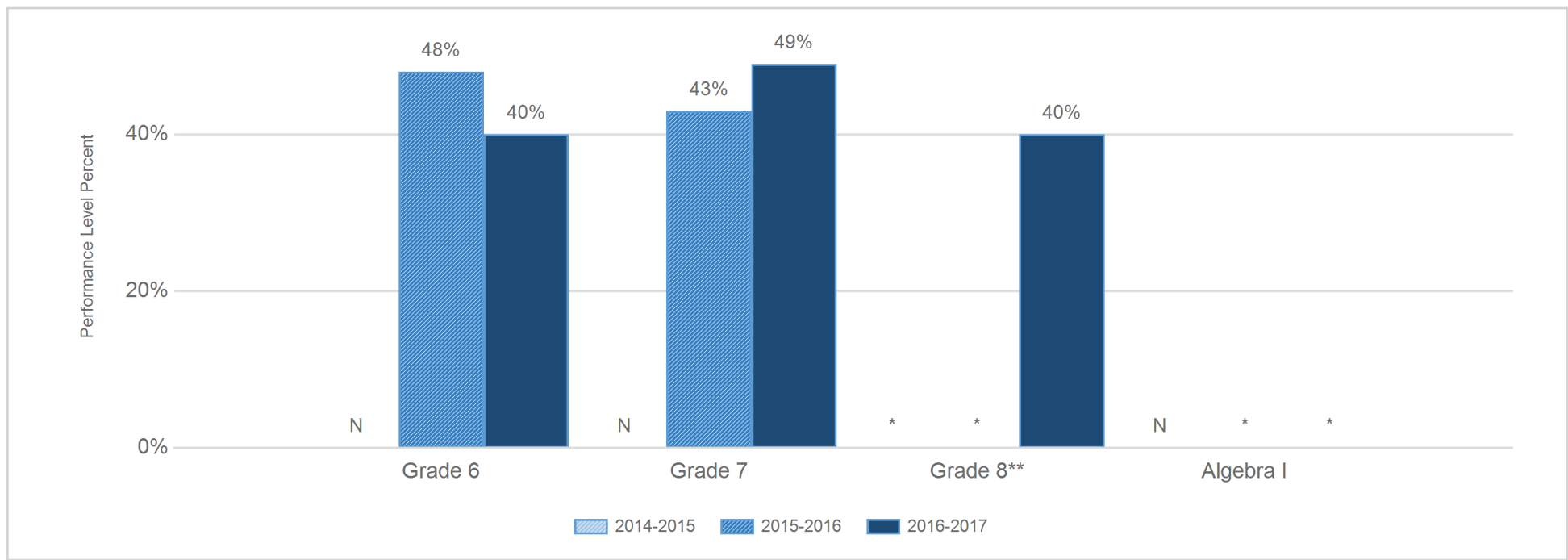

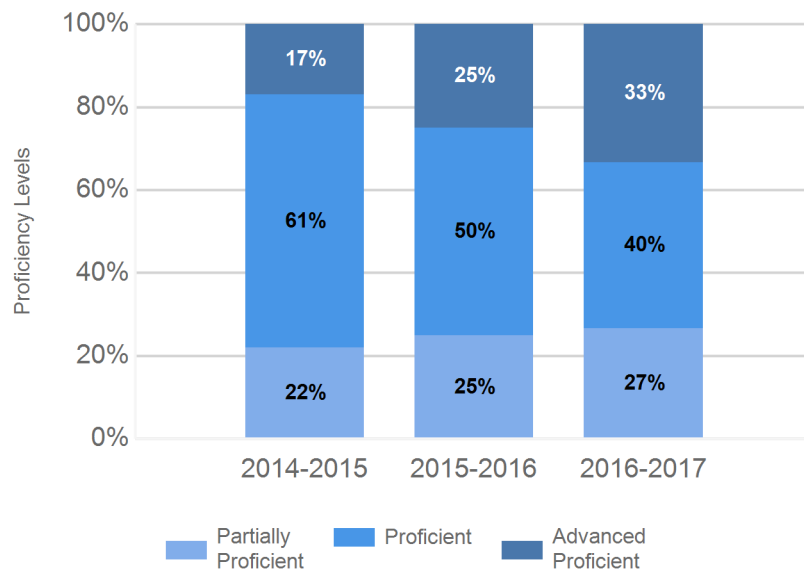

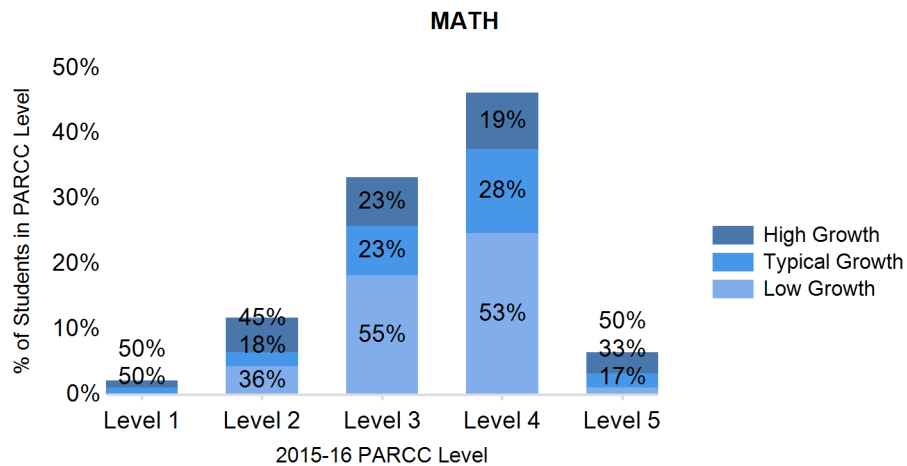
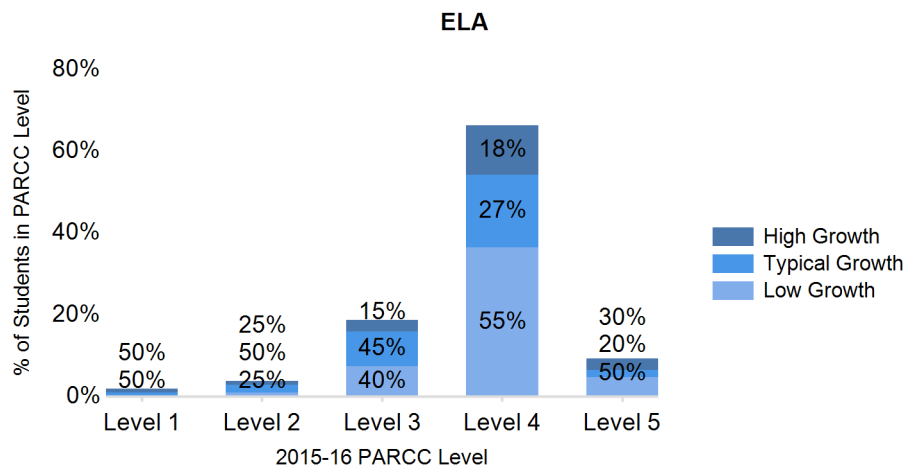

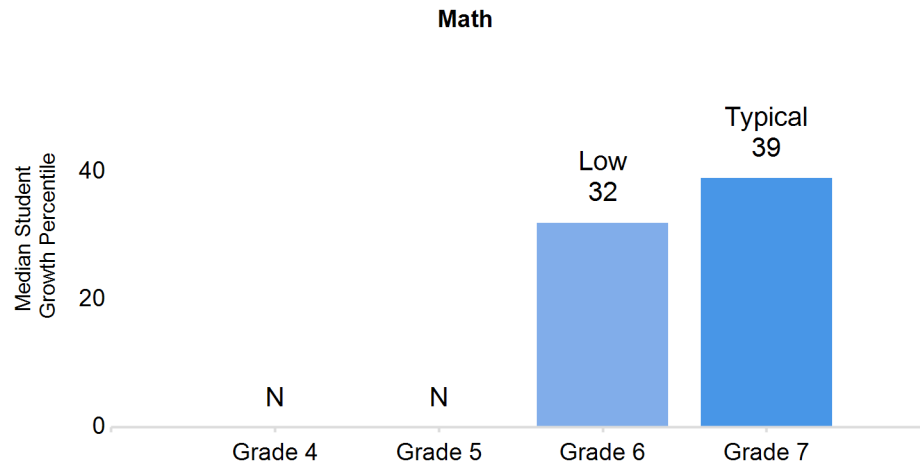
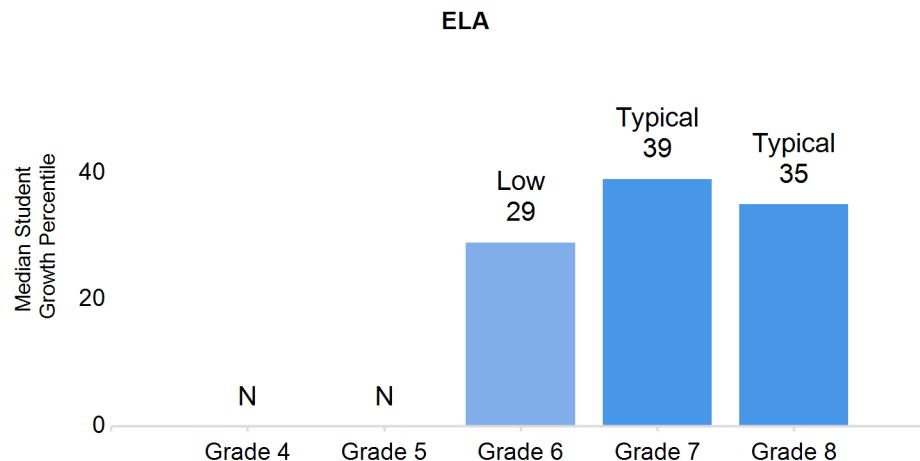

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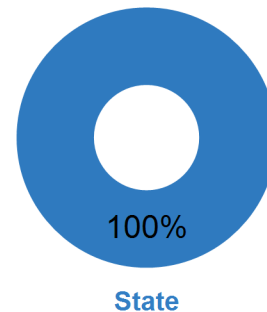
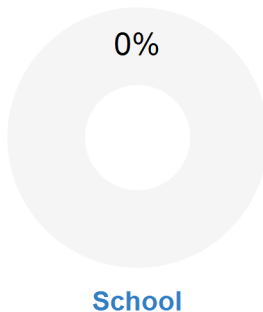

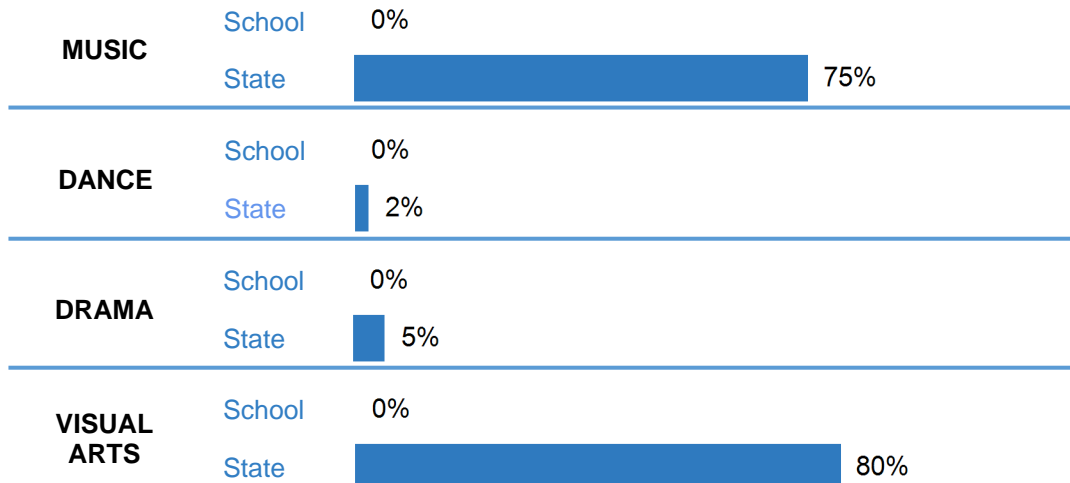

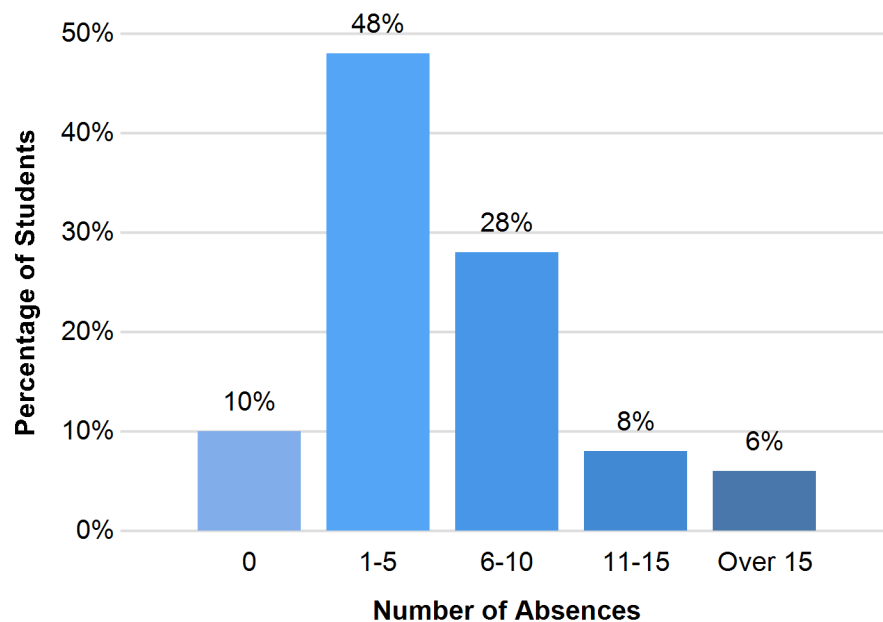

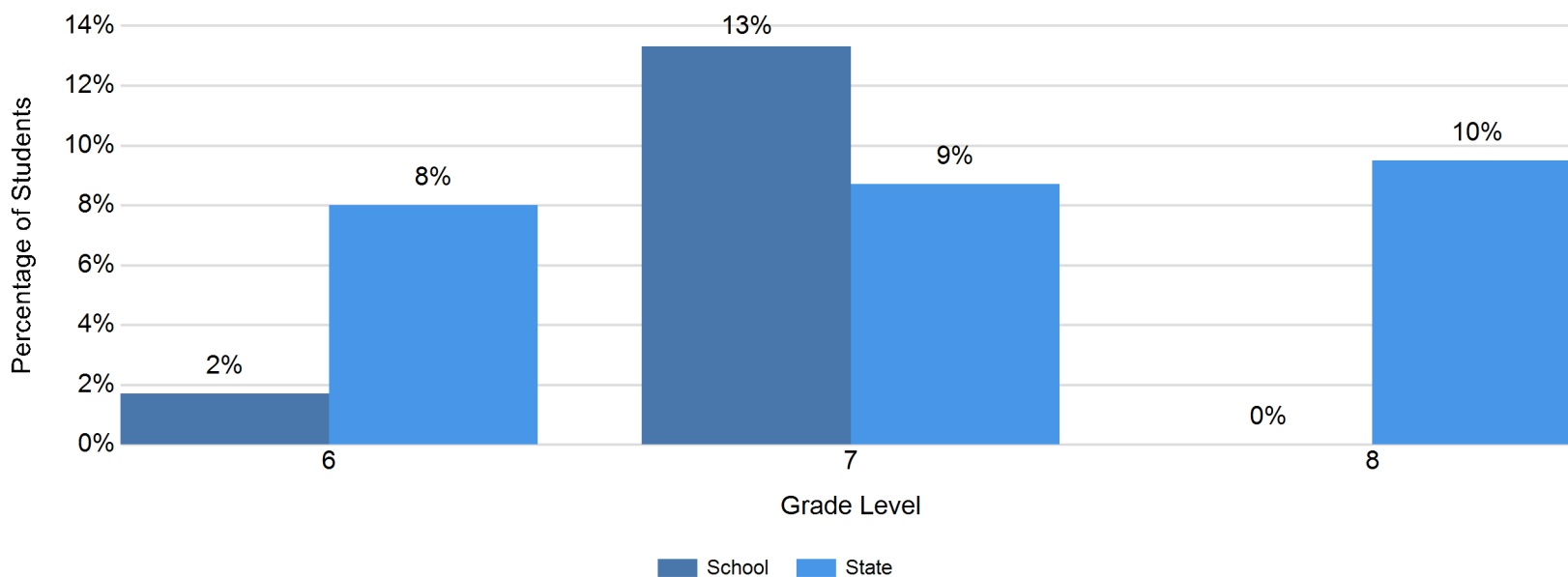

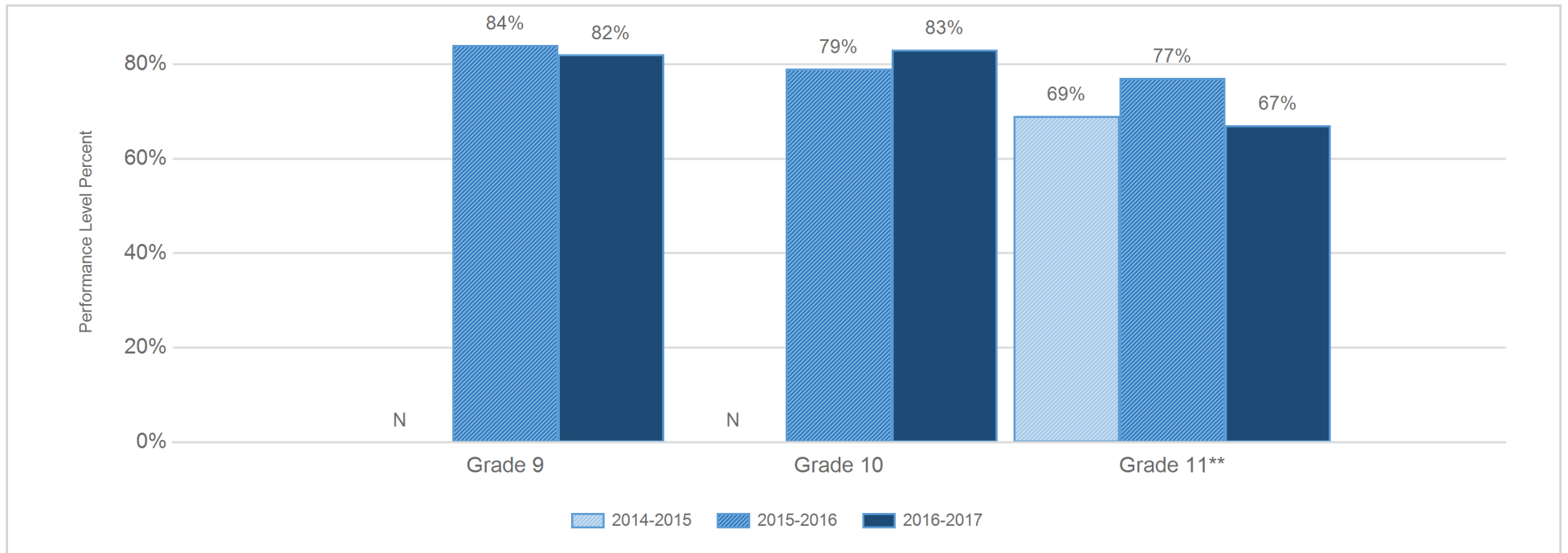

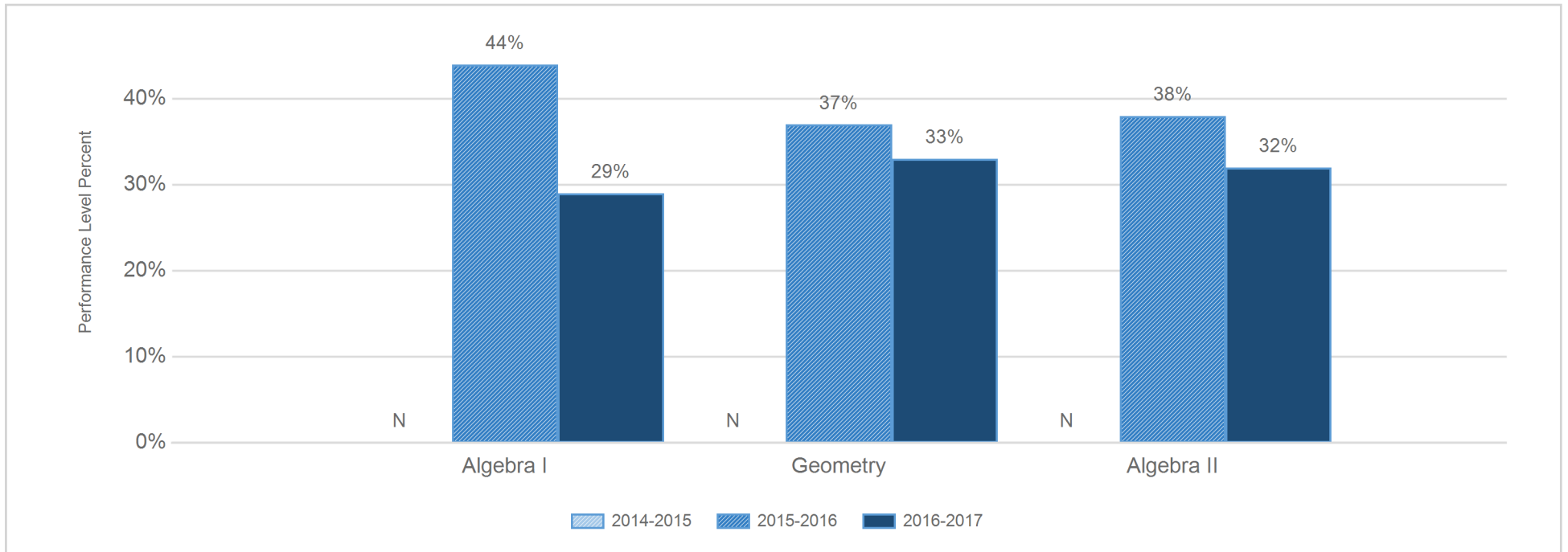

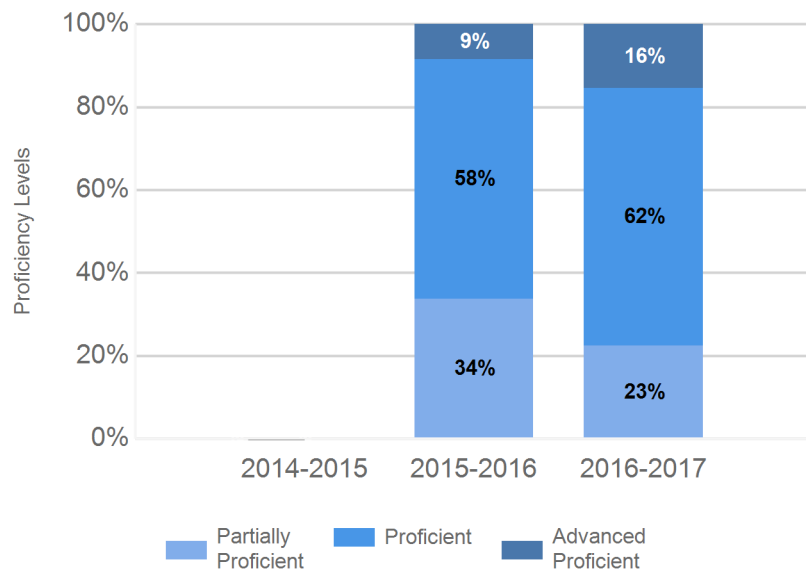

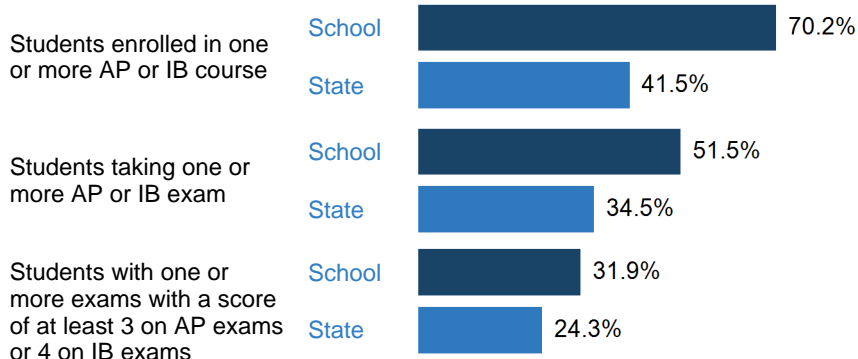

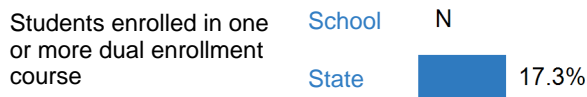

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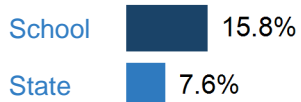

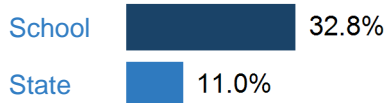

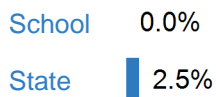

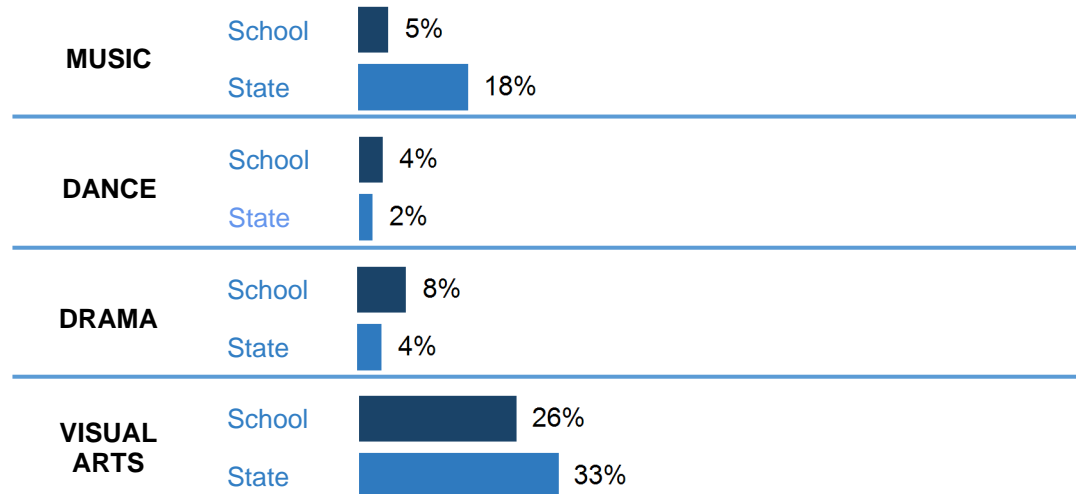

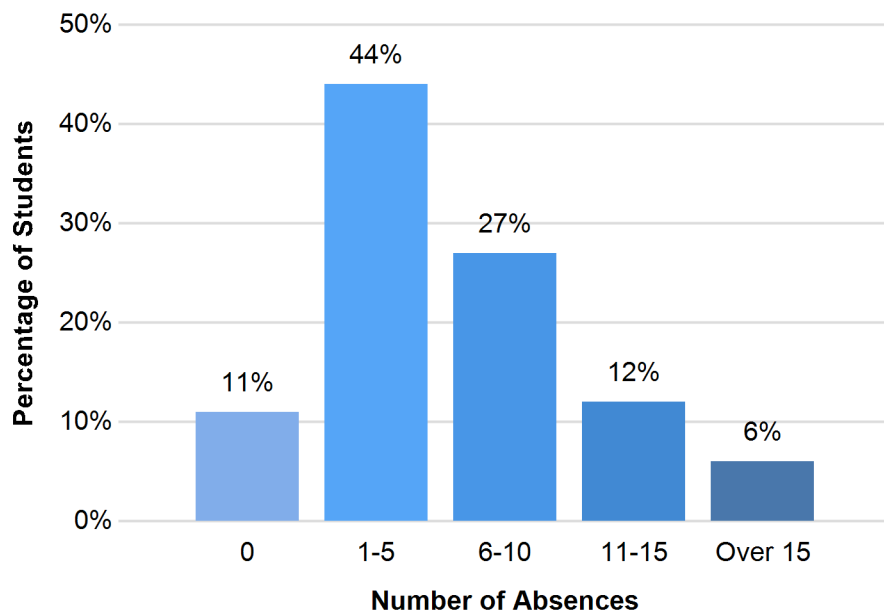

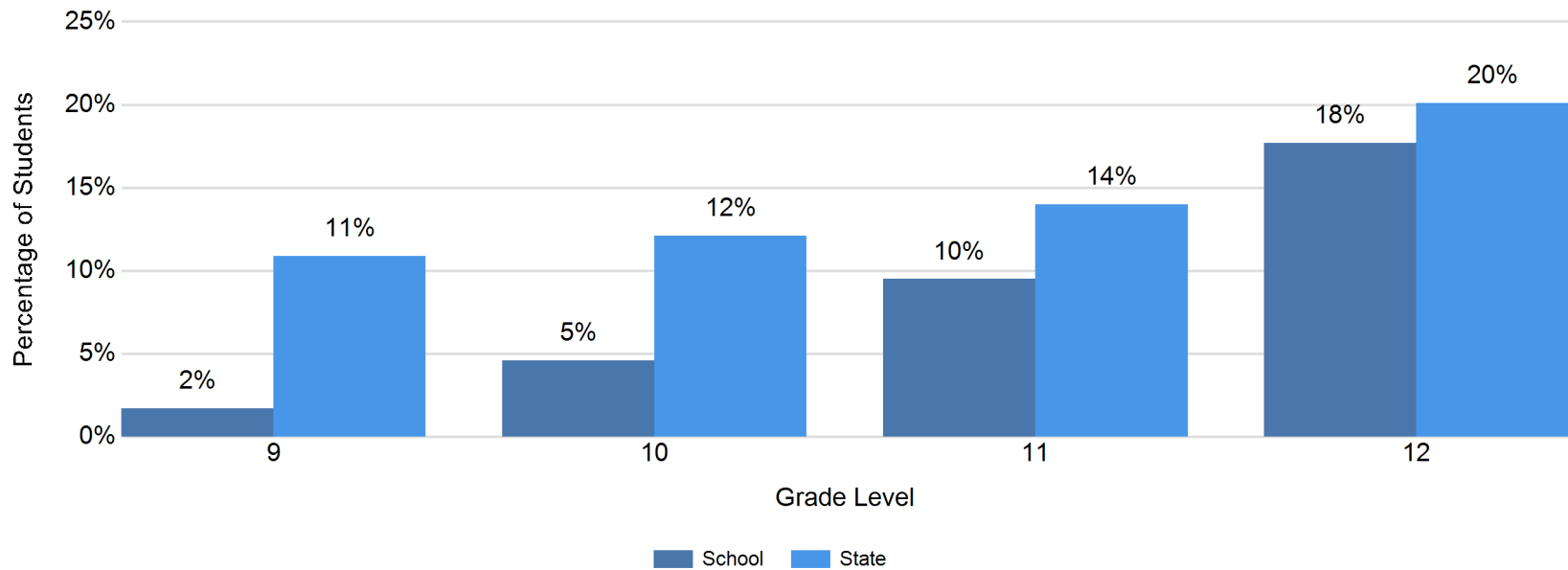

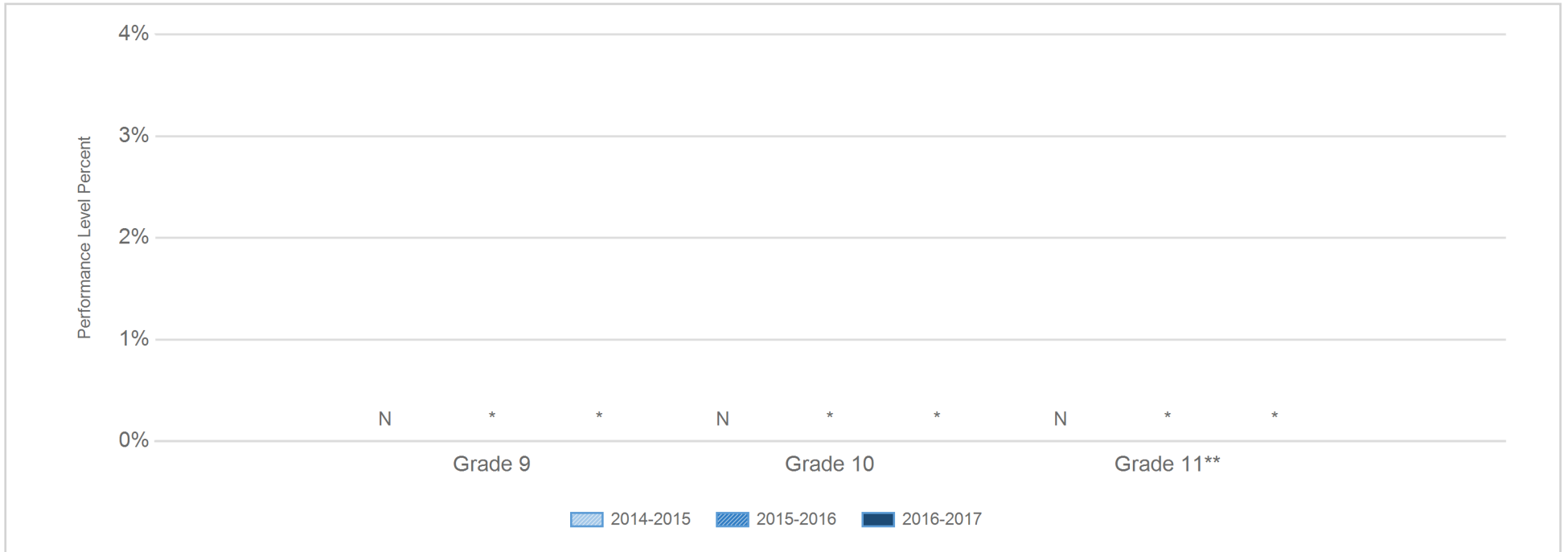

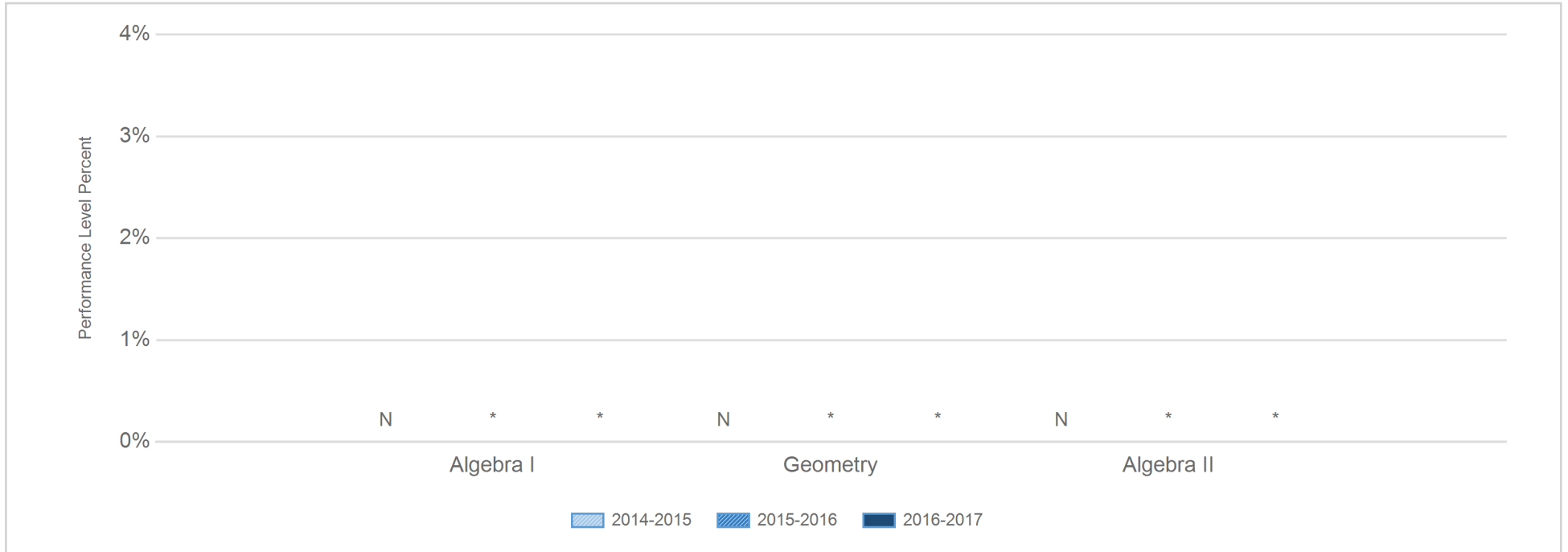

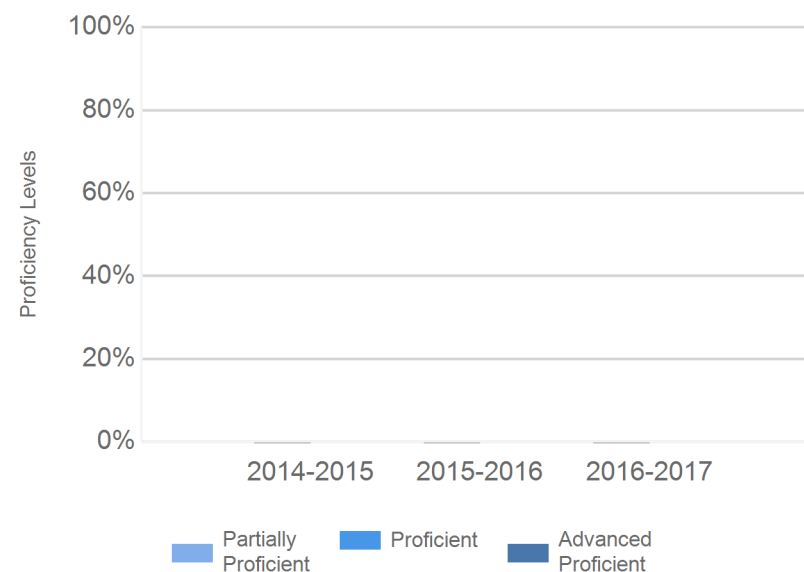

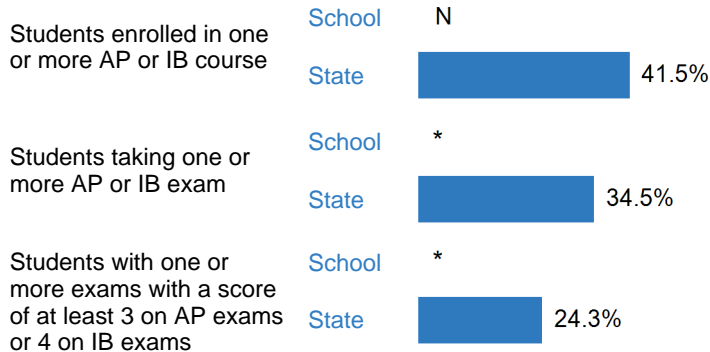

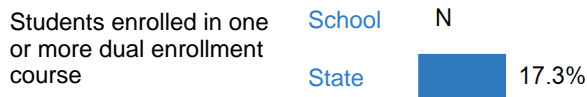

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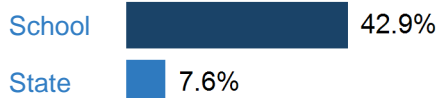

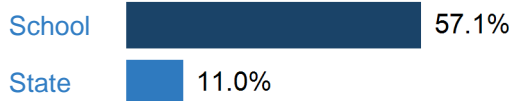

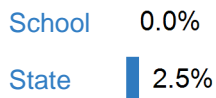

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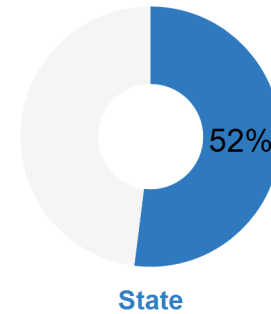
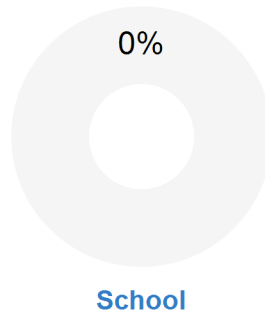

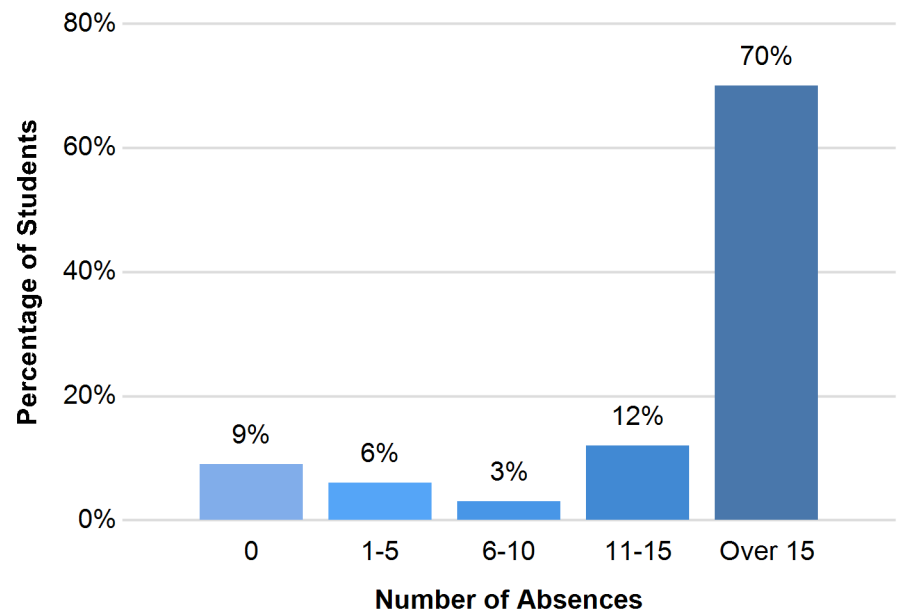

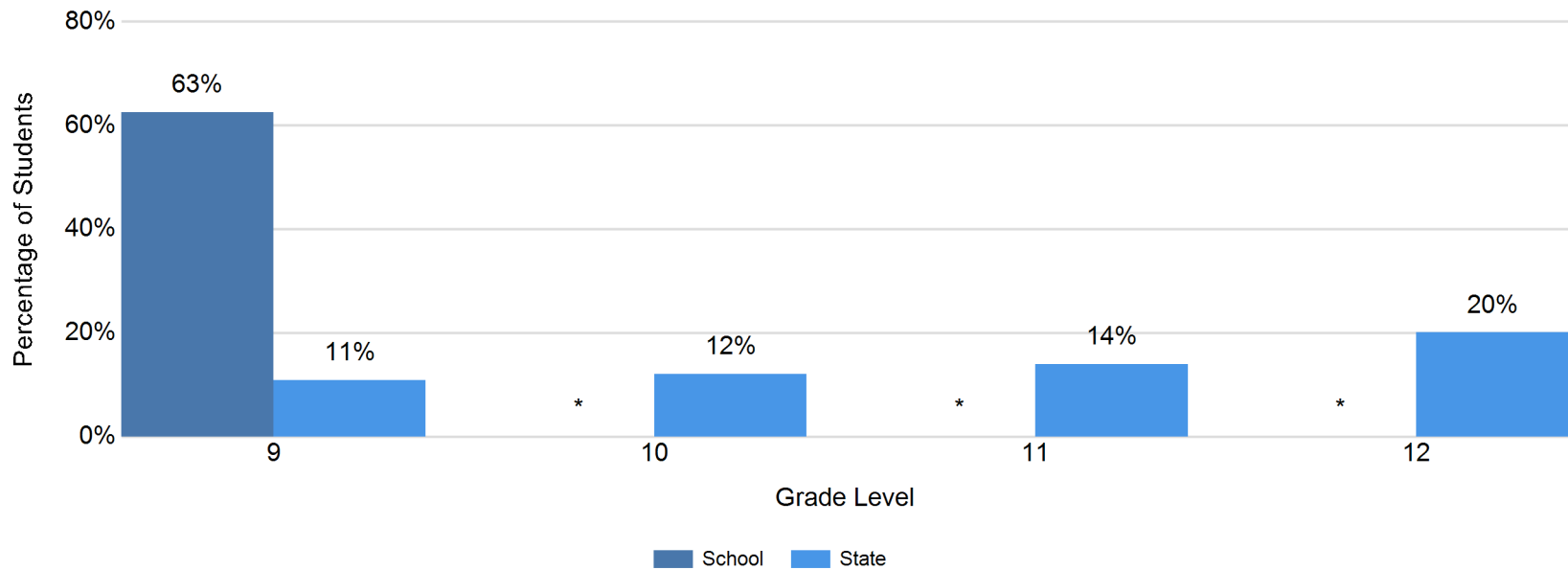

 <b>Mission, Vision, Theme:</b>	KAS Prep High School, is an alternative high school for students that did not find success completing their graduation requirements at their previous high school. This high school, requires both academic and vocational classes that provides the opportunity for students to take accelerated classes based on demonstration of proficiency in coursework, as opposed to required seat time. The vocational programs are structured to provide a foundation of knowledge and experience in their chosen field.
 <b>Awards, Recognition, Accomplishments:</b>	Nothing at this time but we are hopeful to be able to add information by the end of the school year.





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 <p><b>Courses, Curriculum, Instruction:</b></p>	<p>All Curriculum used in the KAS Prep classes has been Board approved. Our textbooks are between one and three years old. Most courses incorporate technology in the classes and students are provided access to the district software and applications both while in or out of the building. All classes have a teacher to instructor ratio of 1:12 and are provided with a Personalized Learning Plan. Project based learning is built into the curriculum to provide students with different learning options.</p>
 <p><b>Clubs and Activities:</b></p>	<p>We have begun offering clubs and activities for this school year, starting with a school newsletter and a beekeeping club. We are partnering with High Tech to allow our students to participate in clubs that the students have interest in and fit into their schedules.</p>







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 <p><b>Staff and Professional Learning:</b></p>	<p>Staff participated in four sessions of training and professional development over the summer including a presentation on how to use Naviance software and a Project-Based workshop led by Ms. Marilyn Roman, a former administrator with HCST and Ms. Linda DiGiacomo, a current administrator. Several staff members also participated in Test of Adult Basic Education (TABE) training as we are having all students take the TABE tests in order to assess their academic and skill levels.</p>
 <p><b>Student Supports and Services:</b></p>	<p>Our students benefit from the services of 3 guidance counselors, a full and part time principal, a director, a social worker, a support staff member, a structured learning experience and anti-bullying coordinator that work with our staff and 46 students we have enrolled. We offer a supplemental remediation resource room every Friday for math and language arts, and discuss interventions to prevent and address harassment, intimidation, and bullying to maintain a safe environment for everyone.</p>
 <p><b>Student Health and Wellness:</b></p>	<p>We provide health and physical education classes for our students and provide breakfast and lunch for all students that are in compliance with the USDA/NJDA standards. Students in the Culinary Arts vocational class have nutrition as a part of their curriculum. All students take a health class which also addresses nutrition.</p>
 <p><b>Parent and Community Involvement:</b></p>	<p>We are currently in the process of engaging in a KAS Prep parent group knowing the importance of parental involvement and the success it has on the students. The parents have access to our Parent Portal allowing them to access their students' grade and attendance information. We have successfully been partnering with community members including the Hudson County Community College and other business and government agencies as resources to help our students with their college and career goals.</p>



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Facilities:

The building is old but has gone through numerous upgrades to the classrooms and technology throughout the campus buildings. We are scheduled to move into a brand new campus in September, 2018. All of our classrooms have air conditioning. Our students have unlimited free wireless access to the Internet and has access to all software. We have several computer lab rooms available to our students to use before, during, and after school, and district software is available offsite as well.



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As we are an alternate education program, we run from the afternoon 2:30 into the evening dismissal at 6:40 and Fridays from 8:30am to 1:00pm. We provide class completion credits by semester, working with any previous high school credits that the student may have received. We provide course schedules to fill in the classes they need to graduate, as opposed to providing courses based on their age or grade level. We also offer students internships that can help them to reach their career goals.



Other Information:
