Citizenship and Integration Grant Program

U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) invites museum and library employees to participate in a webinar on **Thursday, March 21, from 2 to 3 p.m.**, to engage in dialogue with about the [Citizenship and Integration Grant Program](#).

Since 2009, USCIS has awarded nearly \$155 million through 644 competitive grants to immigrant-serving organizations, including public libraries. The webinar will provide an overview of the Citizenship and Integration Grant Program, highlight past recipients, seek feedback on how USCIS can partner with libraries to promote this information to their local communities, and answer questions.
