

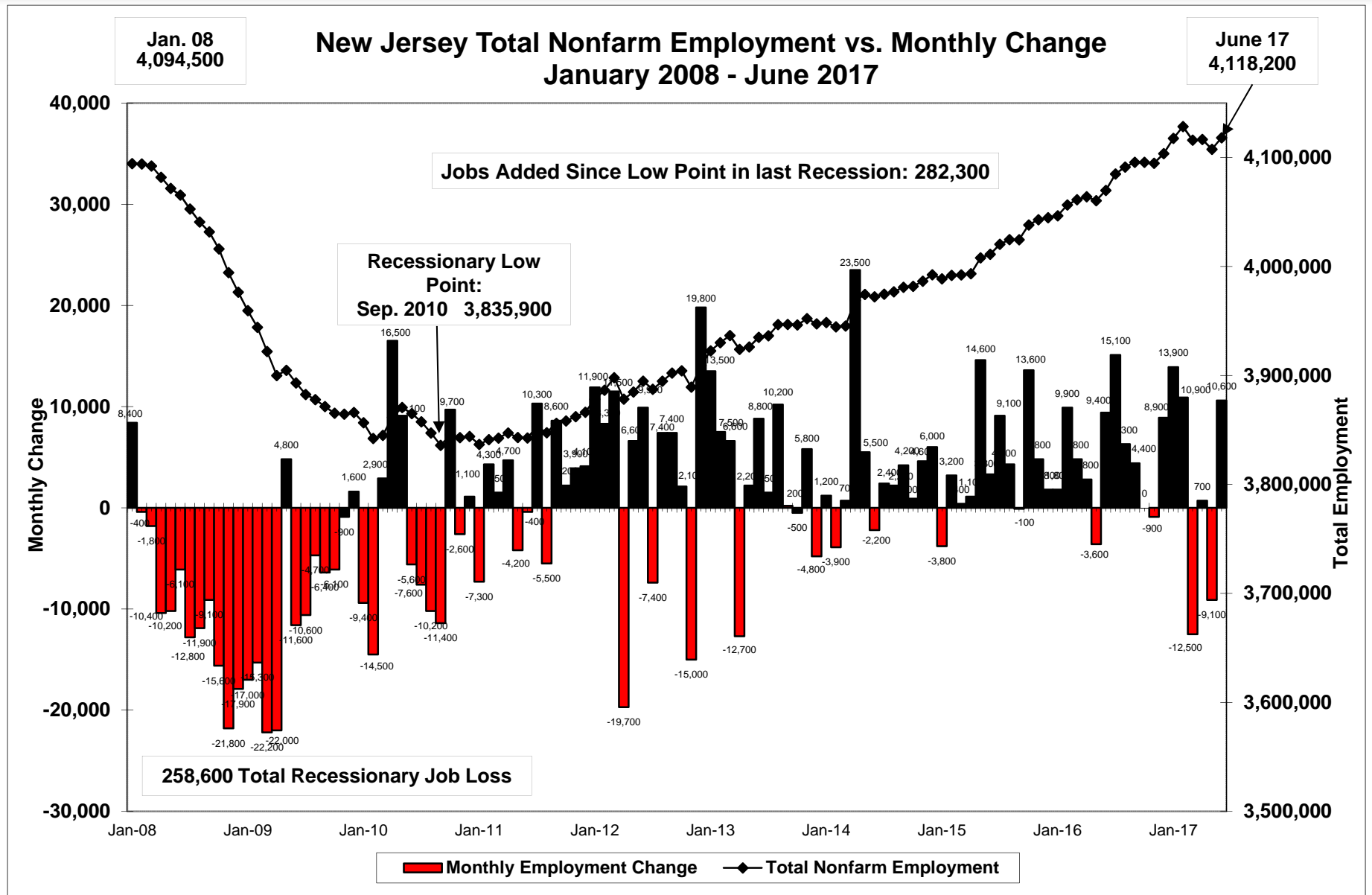

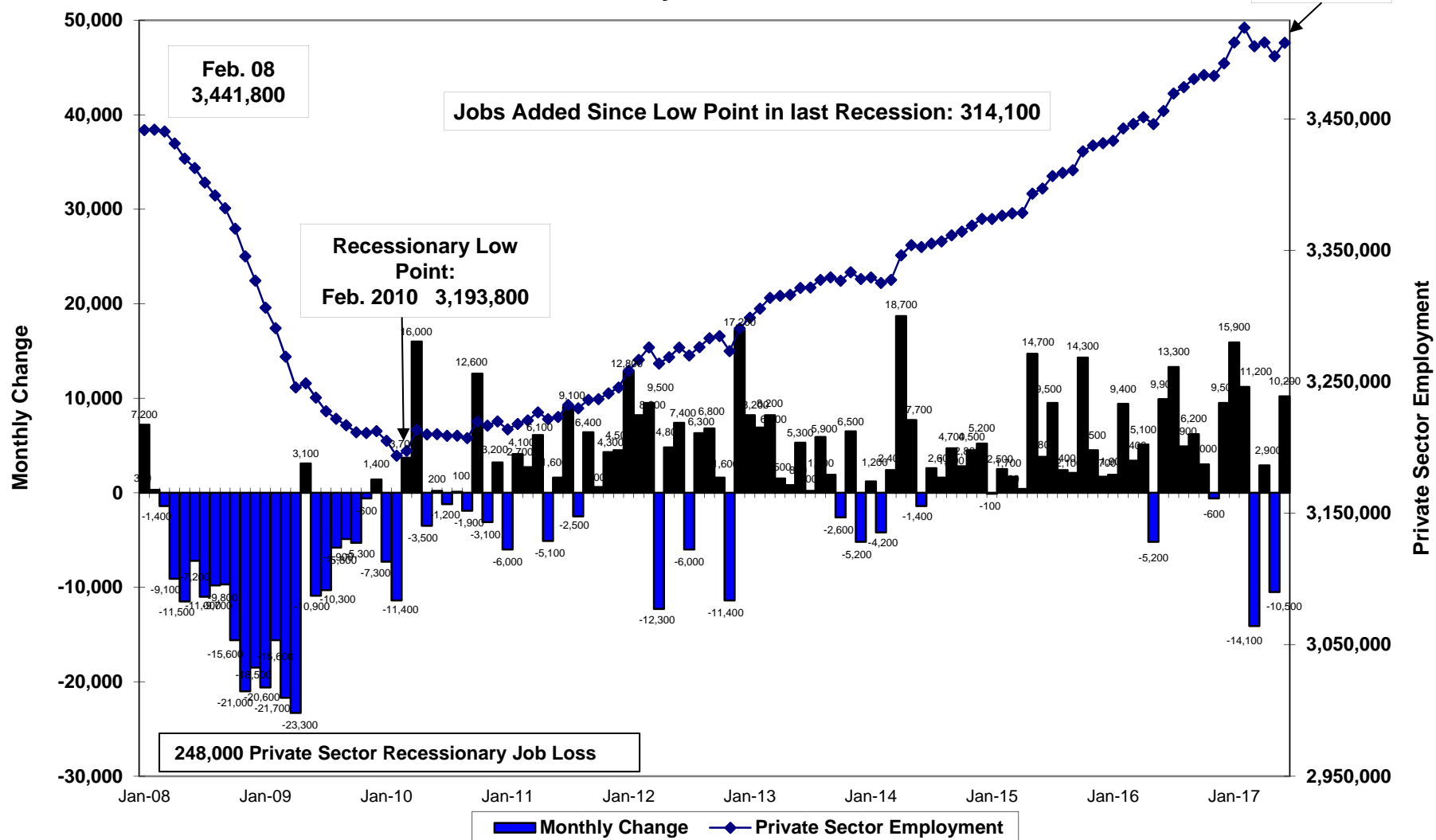

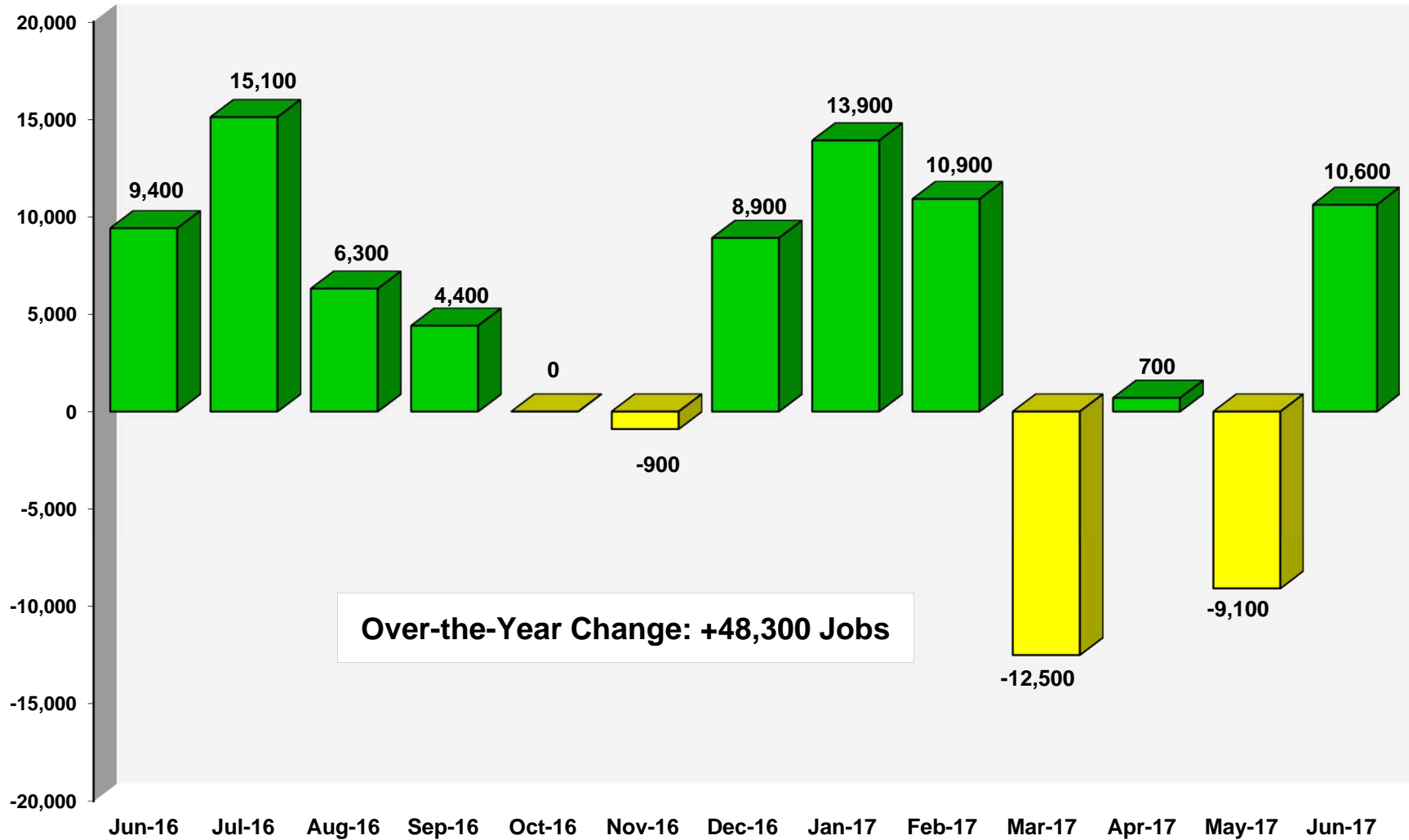

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## New Jersey Private Sector Employment vs. Monthly Change January 2008 - June 2017



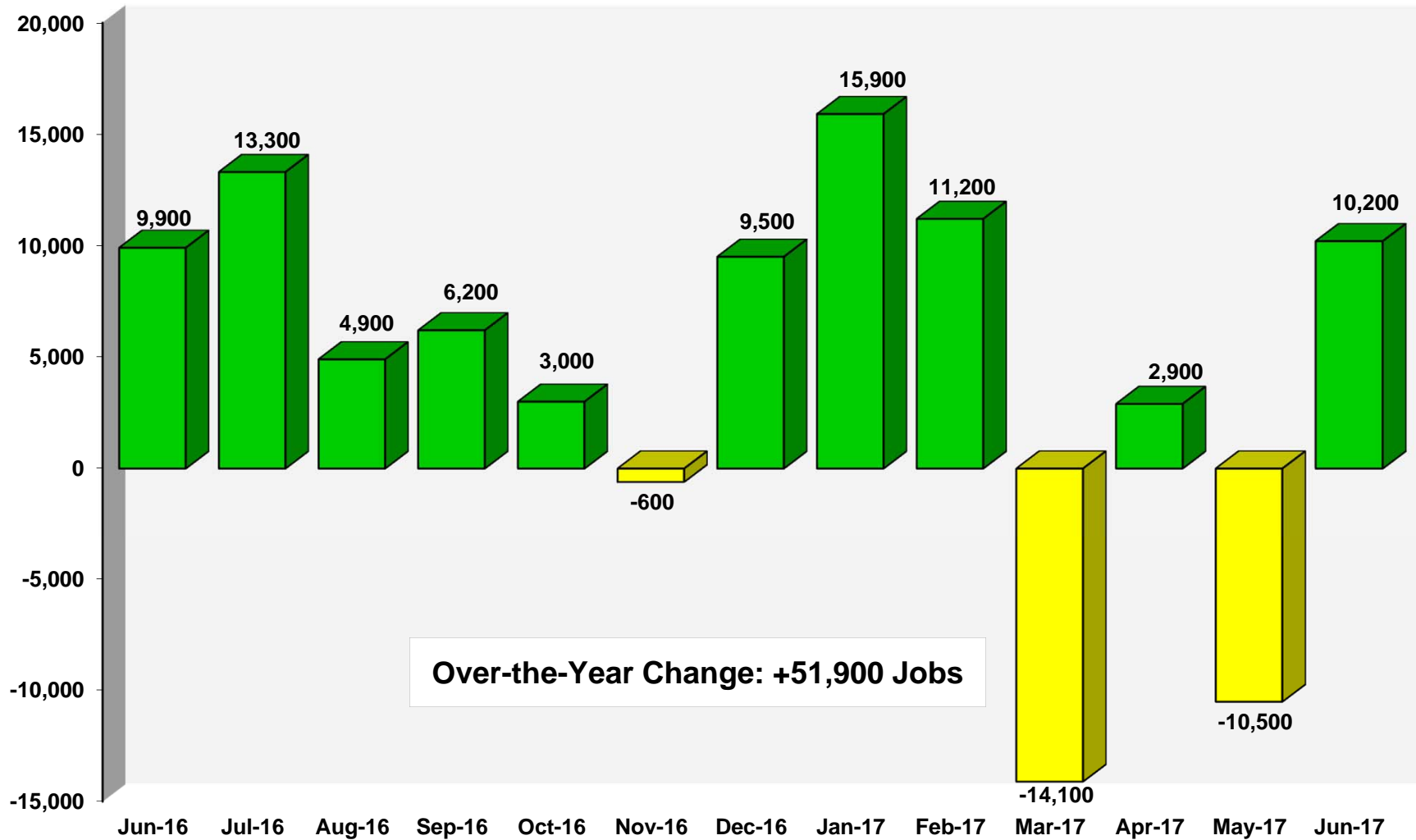
## Monthly Total Employment Change New Jersey: June 2016 - June 2017



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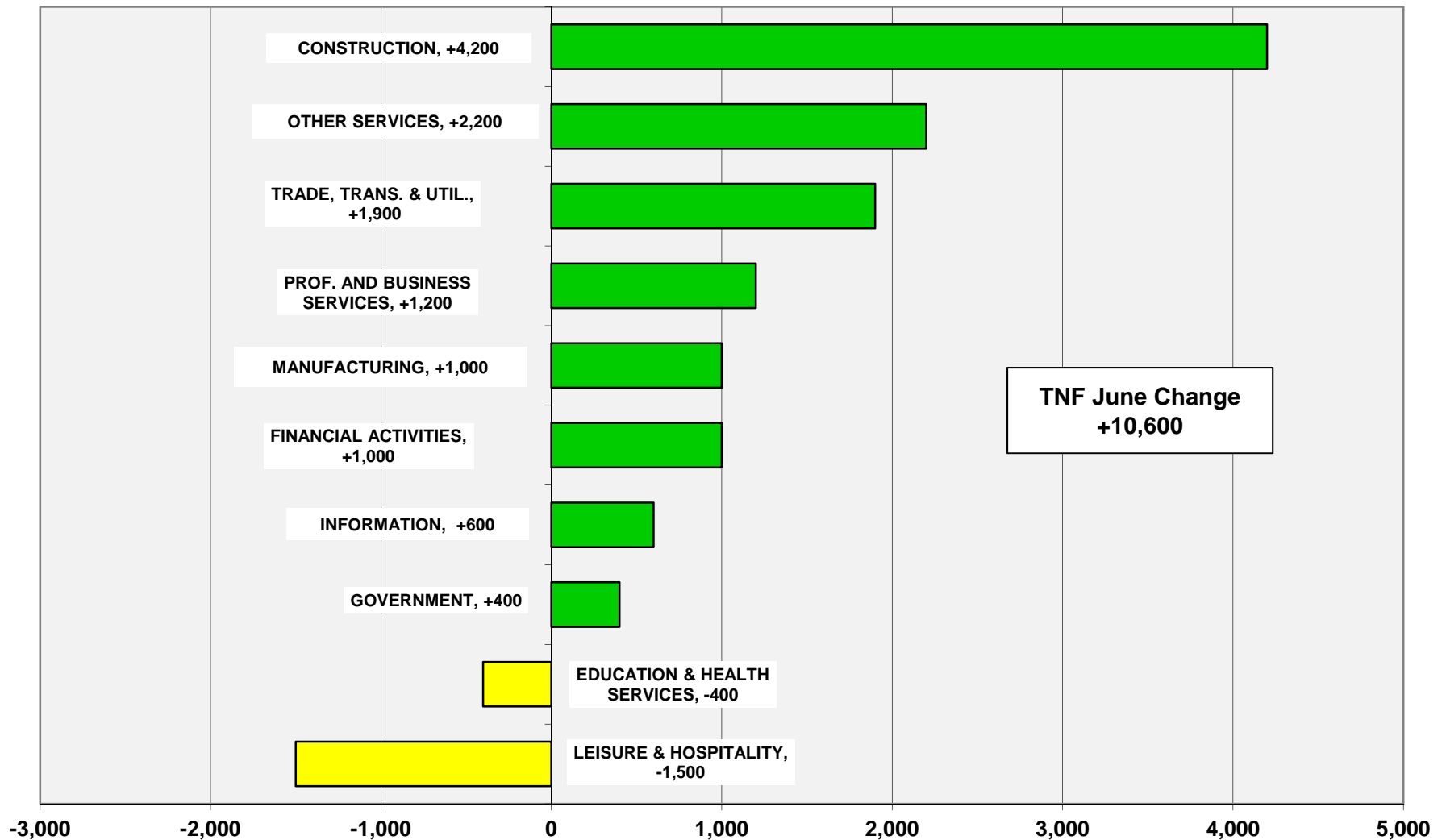
## Monthly Private Sector Employment Change June 2016 - June 2017



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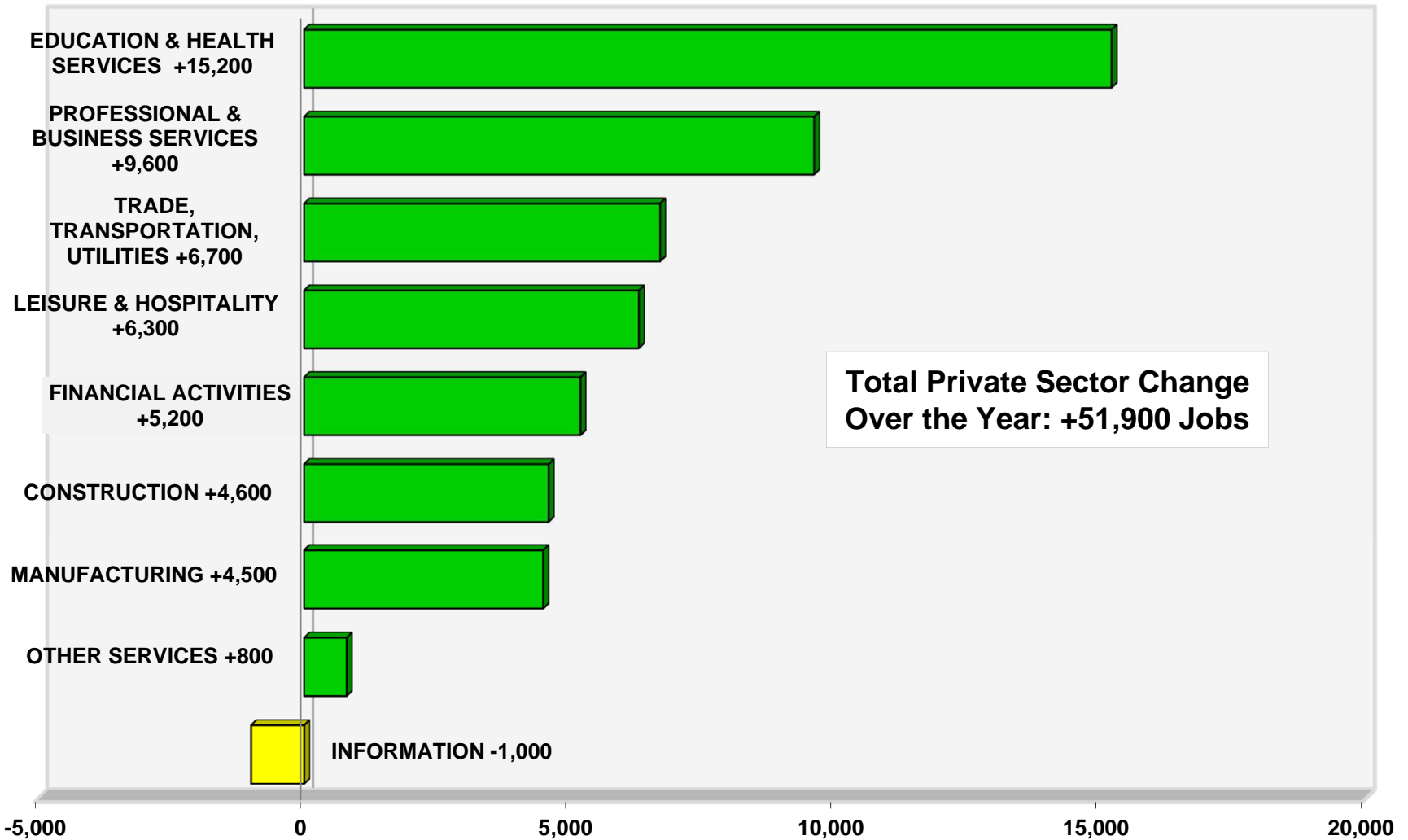

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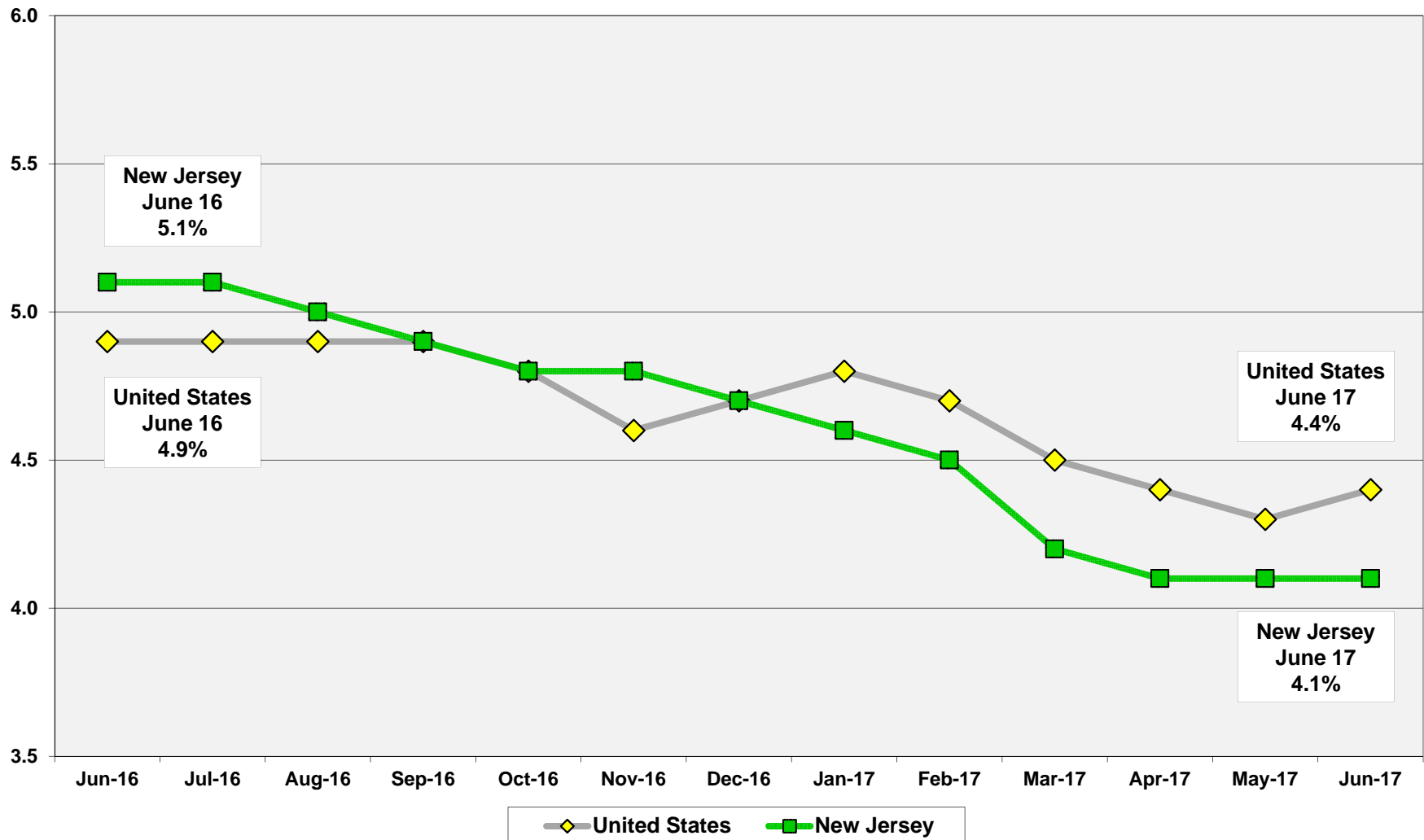
## New Jersey Private Sector Employment Change by Industry June 2016 - June 2017



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## Unemployment Rates, New Jersey vs. United States: June 2016 - June 2017

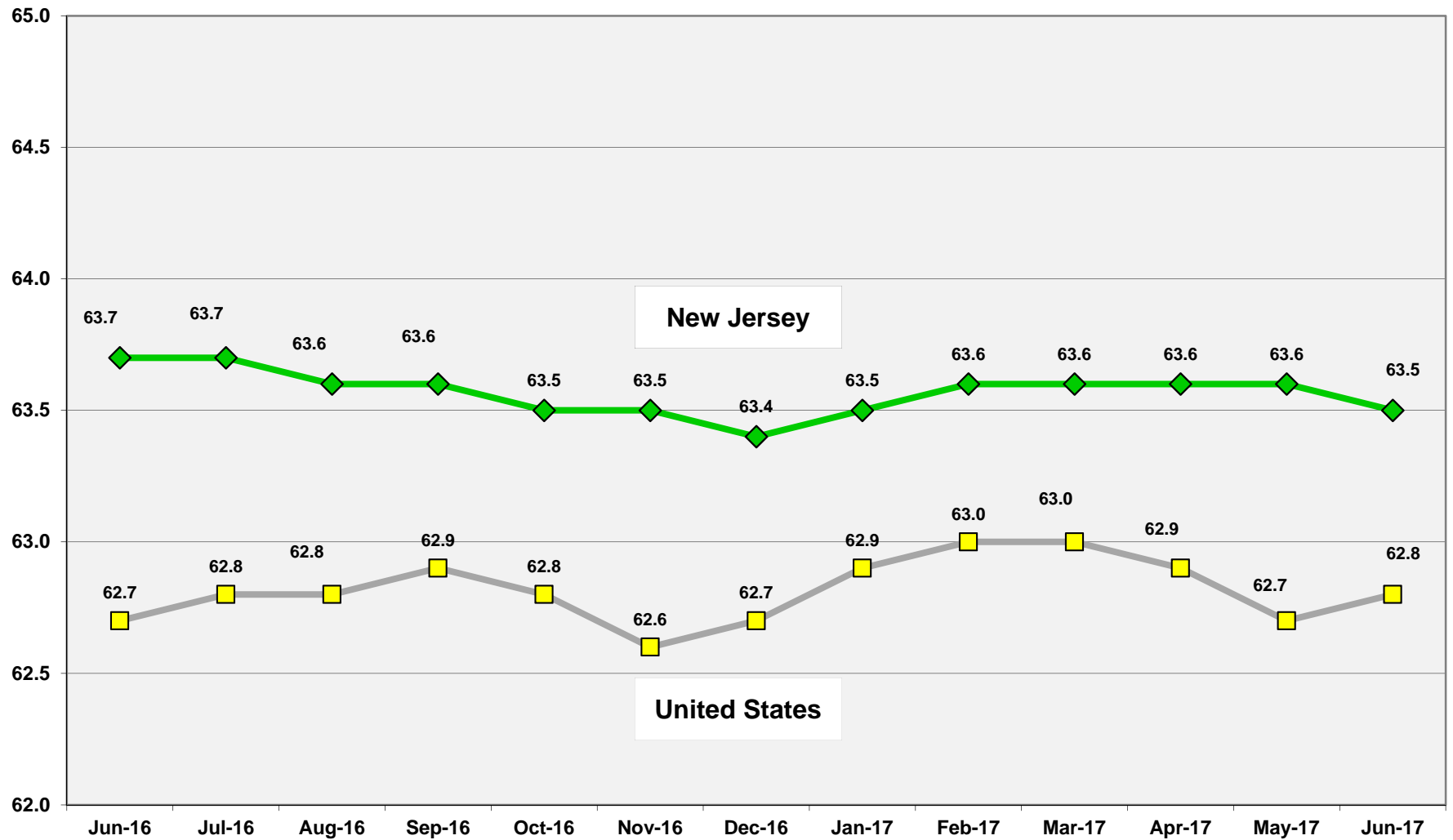


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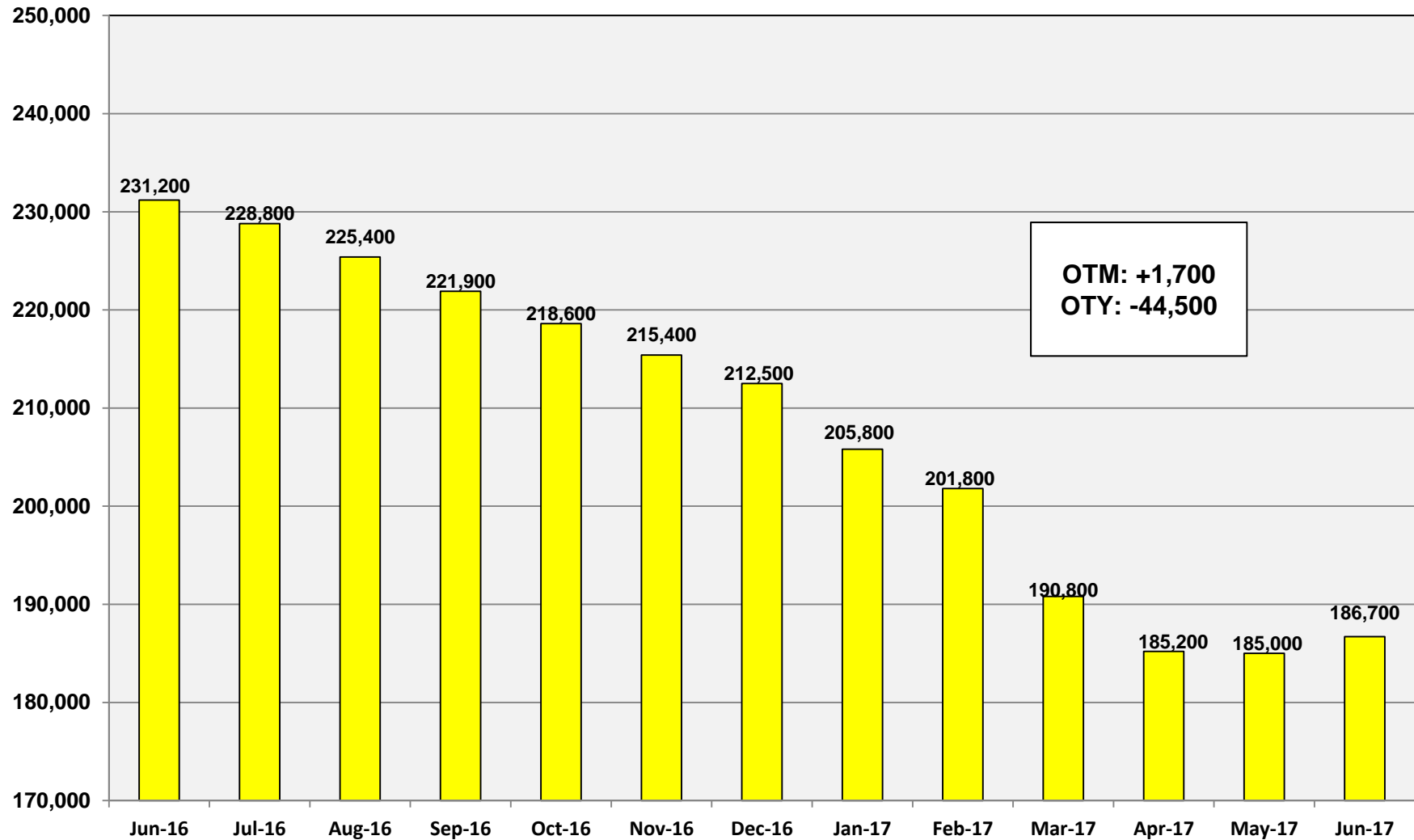
## New Jersey vs. United States, Labor Force Participation Rate: June 2016 - June 2017



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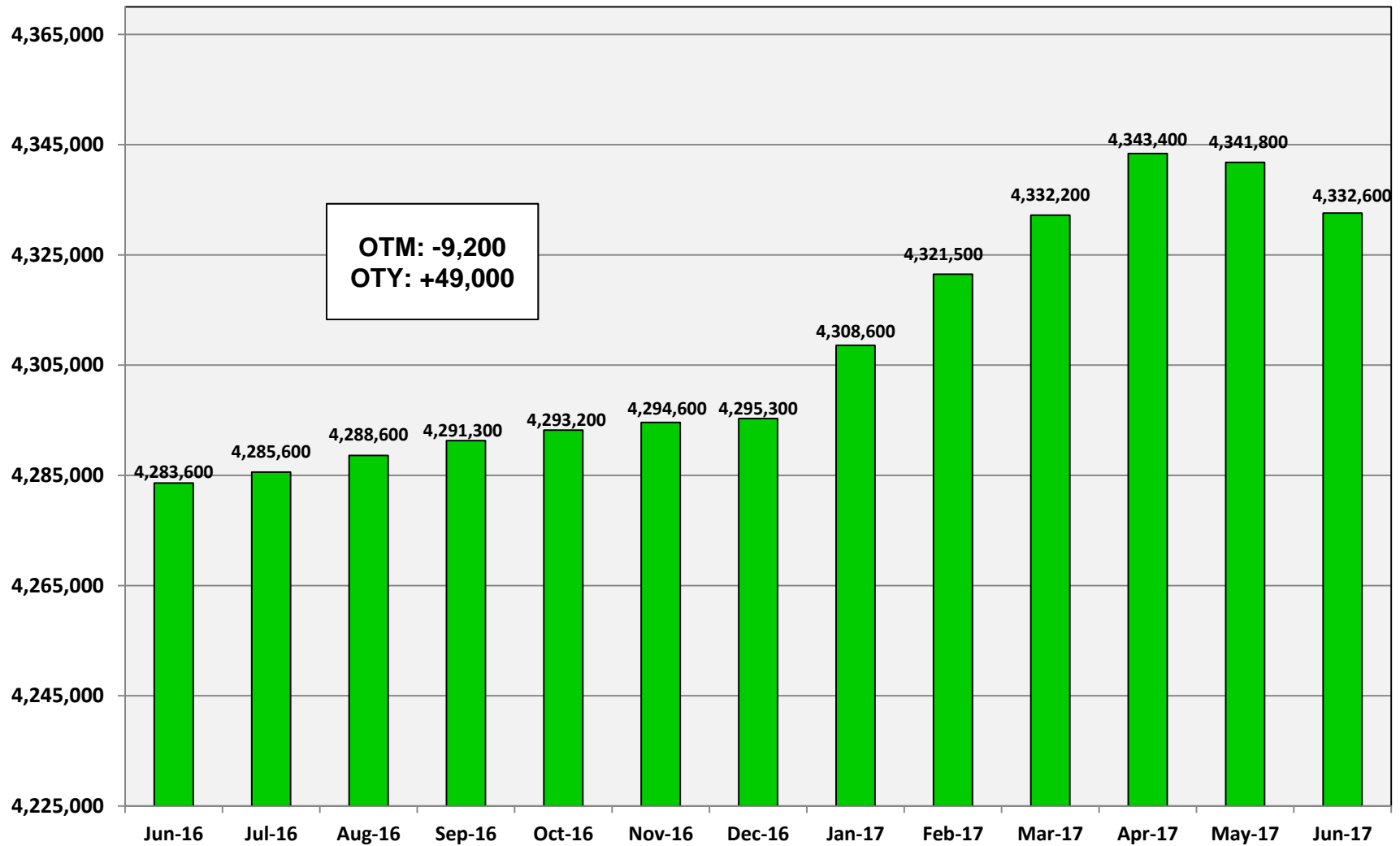
## New Jersey Unemployed Residents: June 2016 - June 2017



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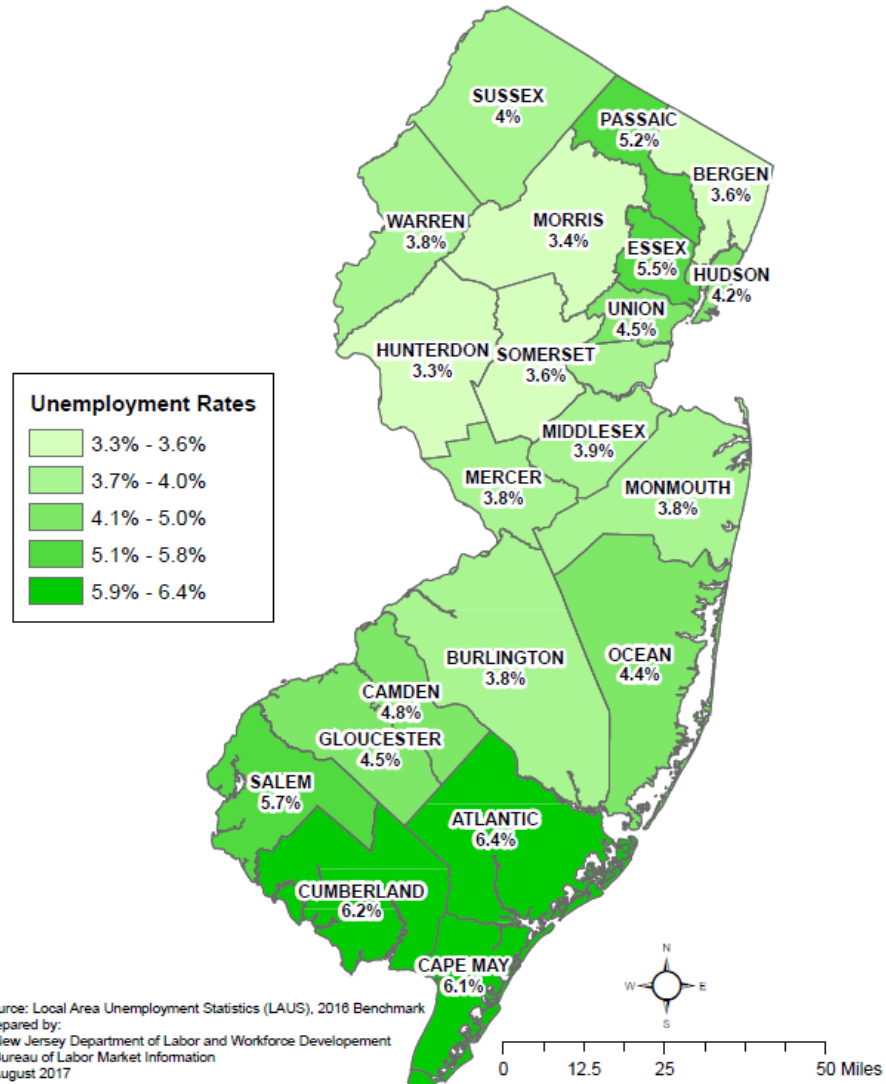
## New Jersey Employed Residents: June 2016 - June 2017



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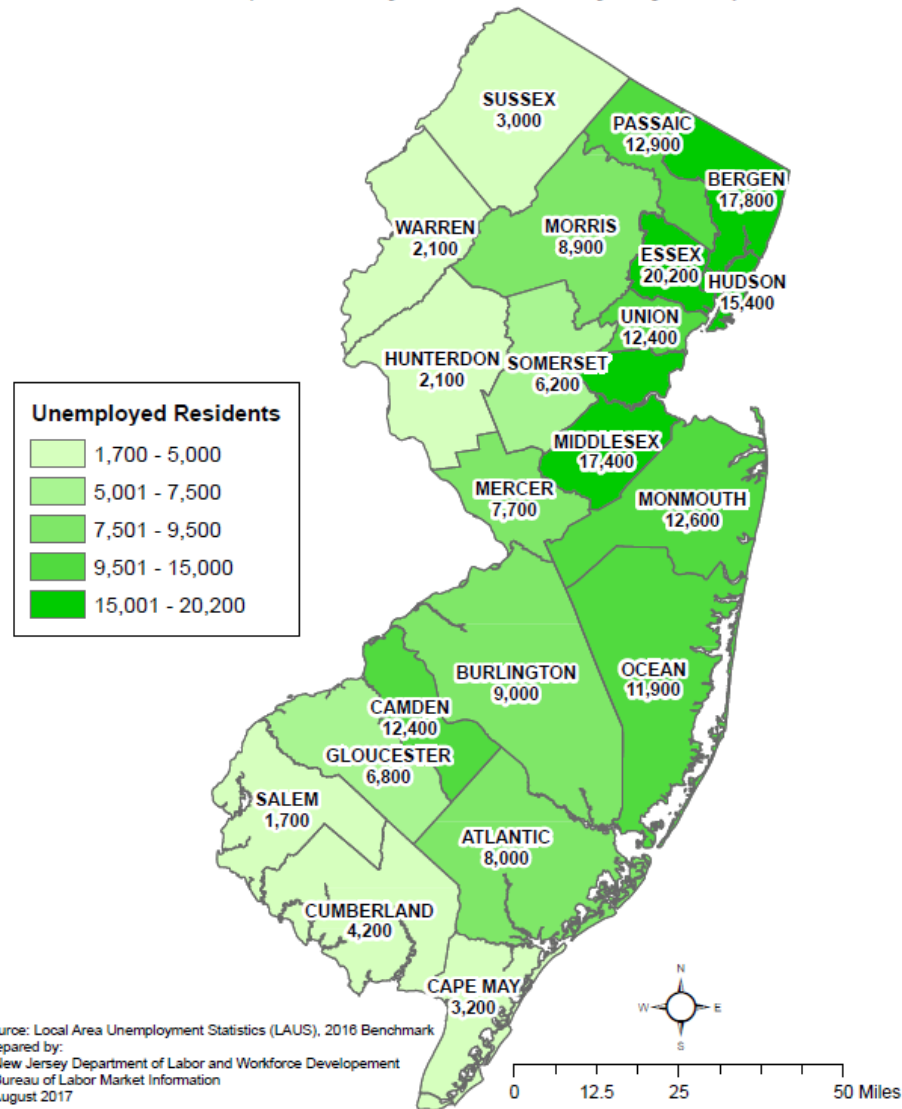
## New Jersey Counties Unemployment Rates - June 2017 (Preliminary, Not Seasonally Adjusted)



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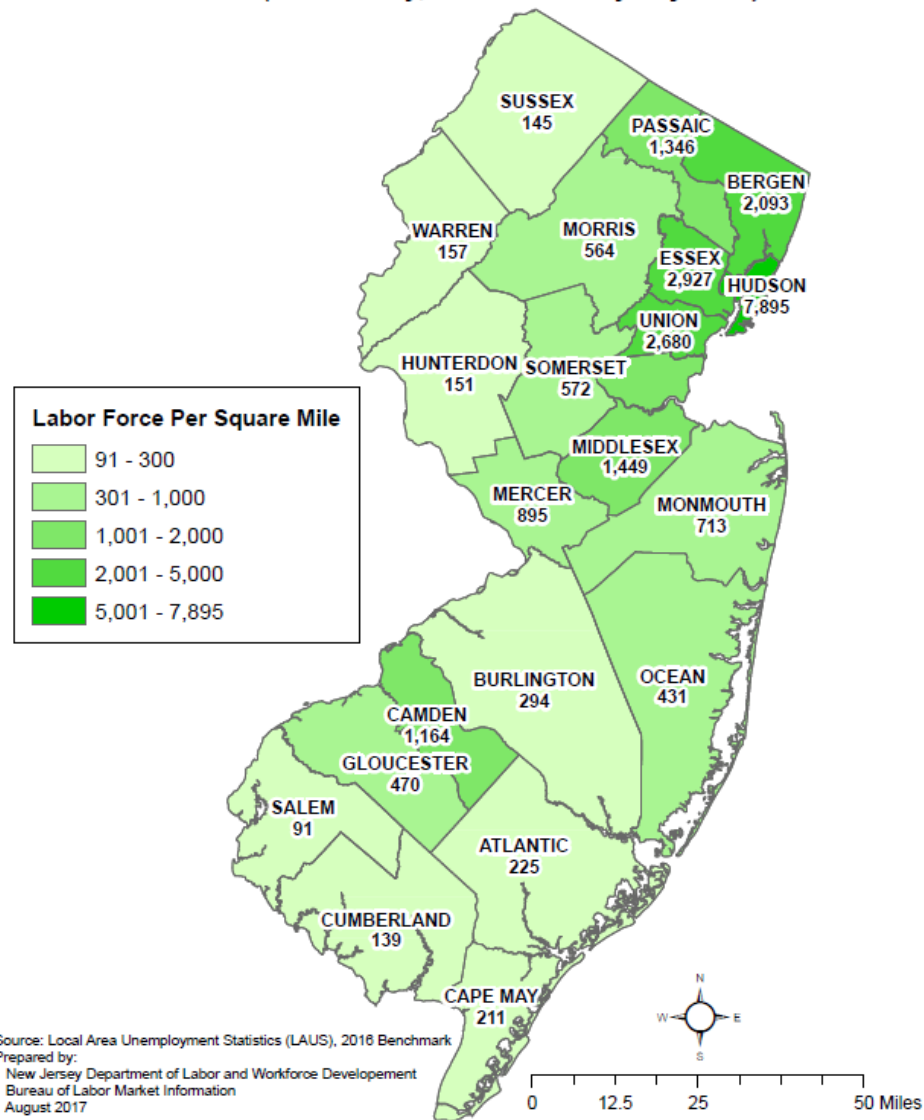

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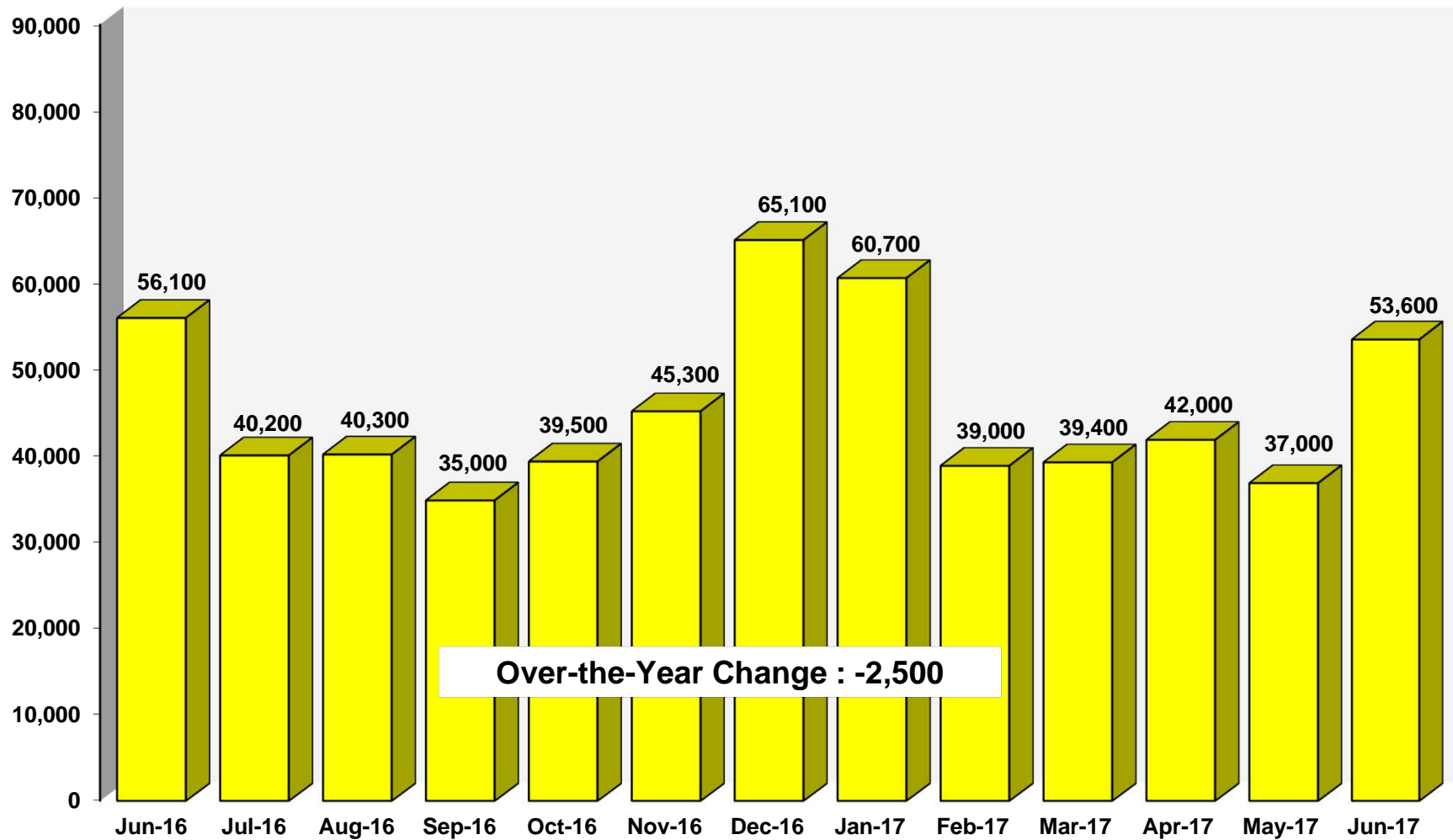
## New Jersey Counties Labor Force Per Square Mile - June 2017 (Preliminary, Not Seasonally Adjusted)
