## State Offices are Closed on Friday, 18 April 2003.

In observance of the Good Friday holiday, all State offices will be closed on Friday, 18 April 2003. Federal offices will remain open.

#### The Secretary of Veterans Affairs Approves BG William C. Doyle Cemetery Grant.

Secretary of Veterans Affairs, Anthony Principi, in a letter to the Deputy Commissioner of Veterans Affairs, COL Emil H. Philibosian, announced the awarding of an \$80,000 grant to the BG William C. Doyle Veterans Memorial Cemetery. The funds will be used to upgrade the committal plaza, which is adjacent to the existing chapel. This upgrade will allow the cemetery to conduct committal services for large funerals. The project also includes construction of a sidewalk along the circular road that runs behind the chapel.

#### The 108th Air Refueling Wing's Medical Squadron Received an Overall Excellent Rating.

Following an inspection on 12-13 April 2003, the 108th's Medical Squadron was rated overall Excellent. Three major categories were inspected: Ex Medical Operations, In Garrison Medical Operations, and Leadership. At the "element" level, the inspection team once again gave the 108th an overall Excellent rating.

#### The Veterans Administration (VA) is Preparing for the Post Deployment Era.

According to Secretary of Veterans Affairs, Anthony J. Principi, when troops begin to return home from the Middle East, they will benefit from a wide array of programs and services not available to veterans of previous conflicts - "We will be on the alert for environmental exposures and other unforeseen risks to the health of our service personnel." Since 1998, the VA has had the authority to provide free medical care for veterans newly returned from a combat zone, even without a service-connected disability. That eligibility lasts for two years after a veteran leaves active duty; although anyone with medical problems related to medical service can qualify for life-long VA health care. He also cited the development by VA and the Department of Defense of standardized guidelines for physicians examining military personnel after deployment, and the establishment by VA of War-Related Illness Centers in Washington and East Orange, New Jersey. The National Guard Association of New Jersey (NGANJ) Schedules its 15th Annual Golf Tournament.

## Do you know who your IMO is?

Every site, directorate, or office is required to provide an individual designated as an Information Management Officer or IMO. This individual serves as a first responder to Information Technology issues at their site and serves as the conduit to the Customer Support Center (G6). The requirements for the additional duty is to be able to perform relatively simple troubleshooting tasks, such as checking to see if equipment is powered on, whether any cables are loose, or if an issue is with a single workstation or multiple workstations at a site. These tasks enable our support staff to determine the scope of the problem and where to direct it for the fastest resolution. They are also issued an IMO Handbook, which has instructions on how to set up personal folders, e-mail accounts, and other tasks. In recent weeks, it has become obvious that due to many of the personnel moves that have taken place, our list needs updating. # DMVA appears before the NJ Assembly Budget Committee.

On 15 April 2003, The Adjutant General (TAG) testified before the New Jersey Assembly Budget Committee regarding the Department's 2004 budget. BG Rieth opened the session with his written remarks, and then proceeded to report on the Global War on Terrorism and our efforts in Homeland Security and Defense. Subsequent to his testimony, TAG opened the floor to questions from the Committee. Questions ranged from Homeland Security to programs for Homeless Veterans. After almost two hours of testimony and questions dialogue, the Department walked away with a feeling of accomplishment and good dissemination of Departmental information.
