Hurricane Isabel.

The NJ National Guard's preparation to provide military support to Civil Authorities operations in response to the effects of Hurricane Isabel on the NJ branham@njdmava.state.nj.us National Guard Area of Operations was thorough and timely. Anticipated missions included the planning and coordination of NJ Army and Air National Guard assets for the possible evacuation and sheltering of displaced civilians, medical support, security operations civil engineering support, food service support, critical infrastructure security and to facilitate mutual support operations with neighboring states if required. Congratulations to all for successfully accomplishing the Adjutant General's objectives and completing this mission in a safe and professional manner.

The Department of Veterans Affairs seeks former POWs for possible benefits.

The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) is asking former prisoners of war, not currently using VA benefits, to contact the agency to find out if they may be eligible for disability compensation and other services. More than 23,000 former POWs already receive VA compensation. This year, the department mailed information about benefits to another 4,700 known ex-POWs not on its rolls. However, the VA estimates there could be as many as 11,000 more POWs for whom it does not have an address. Former POWs not receiving benefits, who did not receive a letter from the VA recently, should call the department at 1-800-827-1000. Former POWs have a special eligibility for enrollment in VA medical care, and are exempt from making co-payments for inpatient and On 13 September 2003

outpatient medical care. Free dental treatment is available for former POWs held for more than 90 days.

Computer virus spread by the use of "links."

The newest wave in virus transfer is to send e-mail with a link. The e-mail may be from someone you don't know, or may be spoofed (looks like it comes from someone you know, but really doesn't), and may say something like "check out this cool link" or "view the marketing presentation." The only requirement is that the item is executable, e.g. a web page or automated presentation. The user clicks onto the link and sees what appears to be a legitimate link or presentation. The link is actually a piece of software designed to manifest itself as something legitimate, leading the receiver to believe it is ok to link to another site. The user follows the link, which deploys a damaging virus to your computer.
