MEMORANDUM TO: THE HONORABLE JON S. CORZINE AND THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY

The New Jersey Wiretapping and Electronic Surveillance Control Act (N.J.S.A. 2A:156A-1 to -34) requires the Chief Justice to submit an annual report to the Governor and the Legislature (N.J.S.A. 2A:156A-23E). In accordance with that section, I am submitting this report to inform you of the operation of the Act during 2006.

N.J.S.A. 2A:156A-2(i) provides that only Superior Court judges designated by the Chief Justice are authorized to hear wiretap applications. For the year 2006, the following judges were authorized wiretap judges: by order dated April 26, 1994, Judges Kevin G. Callahan and Robert A. Longhi; by order dated July 22, 1997, Judge Linda R. Feinberg; by order dated December 3, 1997, Judge Samuel D. Natal; by order dated June 11, 1999, Judge Albert J. Garofolo; by order dated July 22, 1999, Judge Marilyn C. Clark; by order dated June 15, 2004, Judge B. Theodore Bozonelis; by order dated September 1, 2004, Judge Ronald B. Sokalski; by order dated December 27, 2004, Judge Maurice J. Gallipoli; by order dated July 1, 2005, Judge Maria M. Sypek; and by order dated January 6, 2006, Judge John S. Triarsi.

The data for the year 2006 include reports of all orders granting permission to intercept wire, electronic and/or oral communications, or to perform electronic surveillance, for any period that ended in 2006. It is the actual termination date of the surveillance that governs which reports are included within the reporting year. During 2006, the reports to the Administrative Office of the Courts reflected 196 applications¹ seeking permission to intercept wire, electronic or oral communications. No applications were denied. Thus, in 2006 the authorized judges entered 196 orders granting permission to intercept wire, electronic and/or oral communications.

Note that the Office of the Attorney General reports 178 applications. The numbers differ because of differences in reporting methods for the two reports. The Judiciary reports a wiretap in the year that it terminated. The Attorney General does not report a wiretap until the investigation in the case is complete.

Of the 196² orders entered, 190 permitted interceptions of wire communications, 5 permitted interception of electronic communication, and 1 permitted interception of oral communication. There were 73 orders authorized for 30 days each, 118 were specified for 20 days each, and 5 others were authorized for less than 20 days each. Additionally, 98 extensions of previously entered orders were granted during the reporting year. Of these, 43 extensions were for 30 days and 0 extensions were for 20 days. There were another 55 extensions for 10 days or less.

² Of the 196 orders granted, 2 applications were authorized for the retrieval of stored communications and another was authorized for the use of an "On Star" system to indicate the location of a motor vehicle, rather than the interception of wire, electronic and/or oral communication.

N.J.S.A. 2A:156A-11 provides that in certain instances a showing of special need is required before an order for interception of wire, electronic and/or oral communication is to be granted. The reports made by the authorized judges indicate that in reporting year 2006, a showing of special need was required in 0 of the orders, a showing was not required in 116 orders, and the special need information was not available in 80 orders.

COURT-AUTHORIZED ELECTRONIC SURVEILLANCE 2006

Following is a summary of the attached 2006 electronic surveillance report.

- . In 2006, 178 applications were made statewide for electronic surveillance orders. As a result of these applications, 178 orders were granted authorizing the use of electronic surveillance.
- . Extensions were requested and granted for 56 intercept orders. In addition to the first extension granted in 56 instances, second extensions were granted in 16 instances.
- Of the total 178 orders granted, 160 authorized wire (telephone) intercepts and 11 orders authorized electronic communications intercepts. In addition, seven intercepts were granted for stored communications: two intercepts for computers and five for voice mail.
- Of the 178 orders granting electronic surveillance, 176 were installed and utilized. Two intercepts were never installed or utilized.
- . Considering the most serious offense being investigated, the largest number, 125 (70%) involved controlled dangerous substance violations.
- . In addition, 22 (12%) of the orders involved racketeering, 21 (12%) involved murder offenses, 8 (5%) involved gambling offenses, and 2 (1%) involved theft.
- At the close of the report year, 245 defendants were indicted statewide as a result of 2006 electronic surveillance orders.
- . In addition, 360 defendants were arrested and awaiting grand jury,17 were referred to municipal court, one was referred to family court and 17 were referred to the U.S. Attorney's office. Three defendants pled guilty to disorderly persons offenses and two were dismissed prior to indictment.
- At the close of the report year, 143 of the 245 defendants indicted reached final disposition. Of those reaching final disposition, 110 were convicted through guilty pleas, 30 were admitted into pre-trial intervention programs, and 3 had indictment charges dismissed.

The New Jersey Wiretapping and Electronic Surveillance Control Act requires the Attorney General to report annually on the use of court-authorized intercepts. To accomplish this, the Act directs the Attorney General to collect and maintain records of all court-authorized intercepts, regardless of whether the intercept is carried out by the Attorney General's Office, a county prosecutor's office, or a local law enforcement agency.

Data reported pursuant to *N.J.S.A.* 2A:156A-23 were compiled to report on the operation of the New Jersey Wiretapping Act. As required by statute, this report contains data concerning:

- (1) The number of applications made.
- (2) The number of orders issued.
- (3) The effective periods of such orders.
- (4) The number and duration of any renewals.
- (5) The crime in connection with electronic surveillance orders.
- (6) The name of the applicants.
- (7) Indictments resulting from each application.
- (8) The crime which each indictment charges.
- (9) The disposition of each indictment.

In addition to the detailed information provided for 2006 applications and orders, supplemental follow-up data is provided for electronic surveillance orders reported in previous calendar years.

APPLICATIONS

In 2006, 178 applications for electronic surveillance orders were reported statewide pursuant to the Wiretap Act. The applications made were authorized by prosecution officials as follows.

The 178 applications for electronic surveillance resulted in 178 orders granting the use of electronic surveillance.

ORDERS FOR ELECTRONIC SURVEILLANCE

In all, 178 court orders were entered granting court authorization for electronic surveillance in 2006.¹

- Bergen County. The federal report lists four orders that we previously reported in the state 2005 report. These 4 orders (and respective application date and offense investigated) for Bergen County are: AO#2005-1: MCCBER0405 (3/28/05, CDS violation); AO#2005-2: RBSBER0505 (3/28/05, CDS violation); AO#2005-3: RBSBER0605 (4/2/05, Money Laundering); AO#2005-4: RBSBER1205 (5/19/05, CDS violation). Application date for AO#2005-2 is reported incorrectly in the federal report. The application date for that wire is (RBSBER505) 3/28/05.
- **Camden County.** The federal report incorrectly lists AO#2 as an intercept order, microphone. It was actually the use of On Star to indicate the location of the vehicle. There was nothing to seal or file as no communication was recorded. The order submitted was SDNCAM0606.
- Cumberland County. Cumberland County reports one electronic surveillance order (AJGCUM0206, application date 2/10/06, murder investigation) for 2006. This intercept order was not reported by the US AOC.
- Gloucester County. The US AOC report incorrectly lists seven court authorized electronic surveillance orders. It is actually only one order for seven truncated lines. SDNGLO0406 involved a murder investigation, and the wire was set up in a prison which had seven truncated lines to monitor. The other six orders listed, AO#2 AO#7, are duplicates of the first order.
- **Middlesex County.** The federal report AO#1 is not a New Jersey order. The authorizing officials listed are Judge Lauriat and Prosecutor Cheng, neither of which are New Jersey officials.
- **Somerset County.** The US AOC report lists 16 court authorized electronic surveillance orders; New Jersey lists 15 orders. Intercept AO#2005-21 (LRFSOM3905) was previously reported in the 2005 state report.
- *Union County.* Union County reports 14 electronic surveillance orders. The federal AOC does not include any of these orders. The 14 orders not included in the federal

report are: JSTUNI0106 (2/01/06, CDS); JSTUNI0206 (2/1/06, CDS); JSTUNI0306 (2/10/06, CDS); JSTUNI0406 (2/24/06, CDS); JSTUNI0506 (2/24/06, CDS); JSTUNI0606 (3/2/06, CDS): JSTUNI0706 (3/3/06, CDS); JSTUNI0806 (3/10/06, CDS); JSTUNI10906 (3/10/06, CDS); JSTUNI1006 (3/28/06, CDS); JSTUNI1106 (4/20/06, CDS); JUSTUNI1206 (4/26/06, CDS); JSTUNI1406 (10/19/06, CDS); and JSTUNI150610/19/96, CDS)

State Attorney General. The US AOC reports 84 intercept orders; the state Attorney General's Office reports 45 intercept orders.

AO# 2, 3, 4, 11, 14, 17 - 20, 27, 30 - 47, 49, 50, 52 - 63, 73, and 76 - 80 refer to intercepts used in conjunction with ongoing investigations and are not reported by the state. These 48 intercept orders will be reported by the Attorney General's Office at the conclusion of the investigation.

Five entries in the federal AOC report refer to extensions of original orders or are duplicates of original orders. Duplicate report information occurs when reports are filed for the original order and again when an extension is approved. Also, in some instances two separate reports may be filed with the federal AOC for the same intercept order. Those entries in the federal report which refer to extensions of original intercept orders or are duplicate reports include the following: AO#15, 22, 48, 51 and 75.

AO#15 is not an original order, but refers to an extension granted on AO#14 (BTSMOR0906, 3/7/06).

AO#22 is a duplicate of AO#21 (MMSMER1206, 5/12/06)

AO#48 is not an original order, but refers to an extension granted on AO# 49 (JSTUNI1706, 10/30/06).

AO#51 is not an original order, but an extension granted on AO#50 (JSTUNI1806, 10/30/06).

AO#75 is not an original order, but refers to an extension granted on AO#76 (BTBMOR8105, 11/17/05).

The New Jersey Attorney General's report includes 14 intercept orders not included on the federal AOC report. These intercept orders were not previously reported by New Jersey as they were used in conjunction with ongoing investigations. However, they were included in prior federal AOC reports. These 14 intercept orders (and the corresponding application date) include: JAFESS0904 (4/05/04), JAFESS1104 (4/19/04), JAFESS1204 (5/11/04), JAFESS1404 (6/10/04), JAFESS1504 (6/10/04), BTBMOR0104 (6/30/04), BTBESS0304 (7/16/04), BTBESS0804 (9/24/04), BTBESS0904 (9/28/04), BTBESS1004 (9/24/04), BTBESS2004 (11/3/04), BTBESS2104 (11/3/04), LRFMMSMER4905 (11/25/05), and LRFMMSMER4805 (11/25/05).

Extensions were requested and granted for 56 intercept orders. In addition to the first extension granted in 56 instances, second extensions were granted in 16 instances.

- Of the 178 orders granting electronic surveillance, 160 authorized wire (telephone) intercepts.
- . In addition, intercepts were granted in seven instances for stored communications: two intercepts were for computers and five intercepts were for voice mail
- . The remaining 11 orders authorized an electronic communication intercept. Ten of these were for text messages while one was for a pager.
- . Of the 178 orders granted for electronic surveillance, 176 were installed and utilized. Two intercepts were never installed or utilized.
- Of the total 178 original orders, 111 authorized use of intercepts for 20 days, 58 authorized use of intercepts for 30 days, 1 order authorized use for 10 days, and 1 order authorized an intercept for 1 day. For the remaining seven, which involved stored communications, number of days authorized is not applicable since the intercept is for stored communications.

Section 8 of the Wiretap Act specifies the crime for which electronic surveillance may be granted. Offense data collected and analyzed for court-authorized electronic surveillance consider the most serious offense investigated. Offense data consider only substantive offenses and not conspiracy to commit the offense.

Overall, electronic surveillance orders were granted in connection with investigations involving the following offense categories: controlled dangerous substance offenses, racketeering, murder offenses, theft, and gambling.

- Of the 178 orders authorizing electronic surveillance, considering the most serious offense, the majority, 125 (70%), involved controlled dangerous substance offenses.
- In addition, 22 (12%) of the orders involved racketeering, 21 (12%) involved murder offenses, 8 (5%) involved gambling, and 2 (1%) involved theft.

DEFENDANT INDICTMENTS AND DISPOSITIONS

Summary information concerning defendant indictments resulting from electronic surveillance applications is provided below with detailed information on the following pages.² The information provided concerns defendant indictments resulting from each application, the offenses charged, and indictment dispositions.

- At the close of the report year, a total of 645 defendants were arrested of which 245 were indicted statewide as a result of electronic surveillance applications and orders.
- . Of the total 645 defendants, 360 were arrested and awaiting grand jury, 17 were referred to municipal court, one was referred to family court and 17 were referred to the U.S. Attorney's office. Three defendants pled guilty to disorderly persons offenses and two were dismissed prior to indictment.
 - Of those 245 defendants indicted, 240 (98%) were indicted for controlled dangerous substance offenses.
- In addition, 3 defendants were indicted for murder offenses.
- . Of the remaining 2 defendants indicted, one was indicted for obstructing justice while the other was indicted for a weapons offense.
 - At the close of the report year, 143 of the 245 defendants indicted reached final disposition.
 - Of those defendants reaching final disposition, 110 (77%) were convicted through guilty pleas, 30 (21%) were admitted into a pretrial intervention program, and 3 had indictment charges dismissed.
