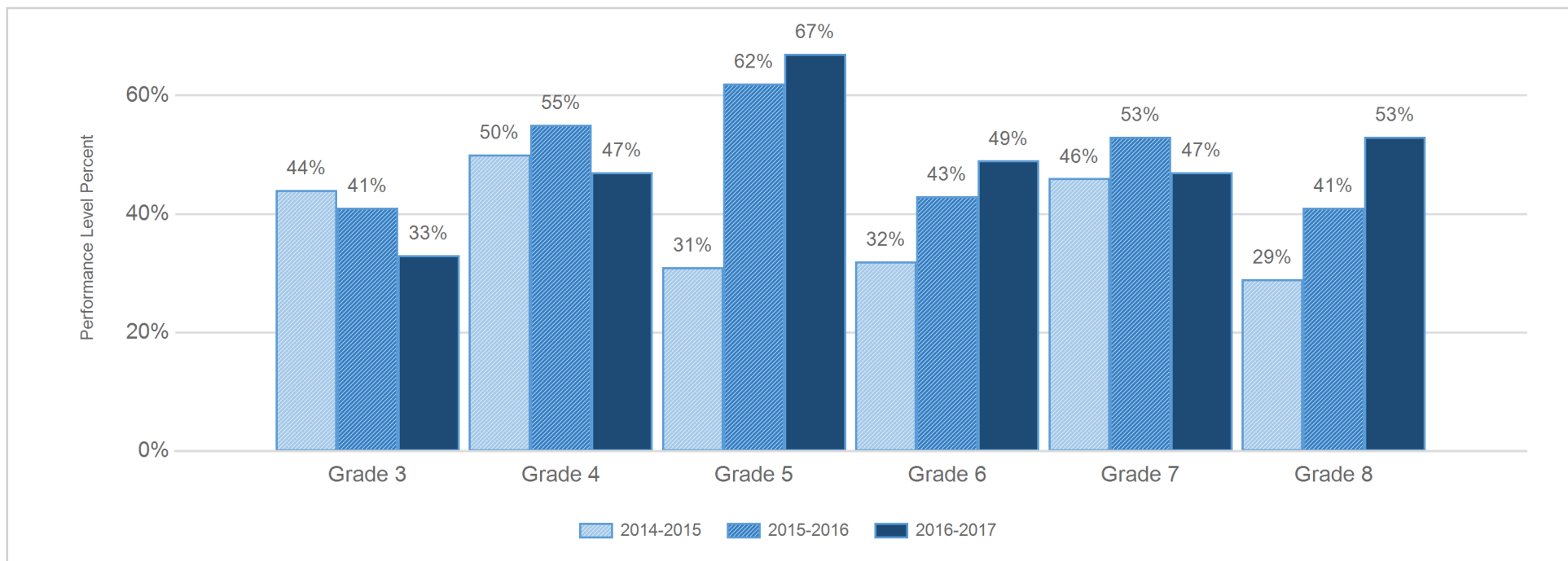


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English Language Arts/Literacy Assessment - Performance Trends

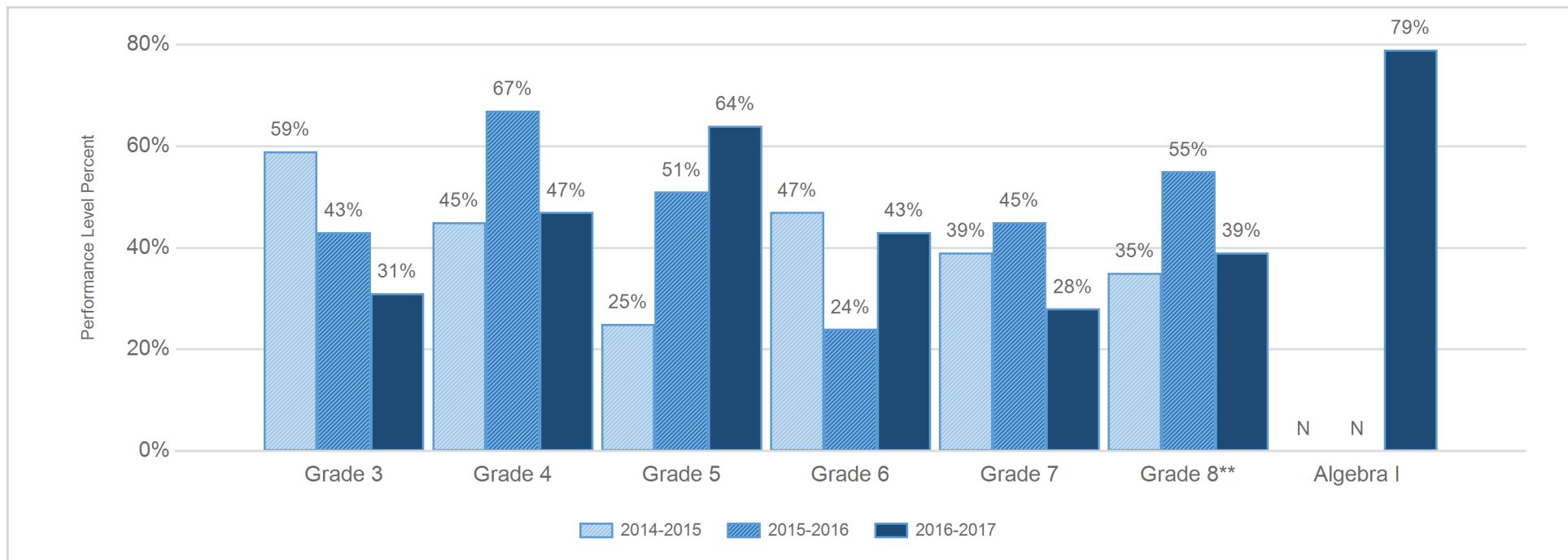

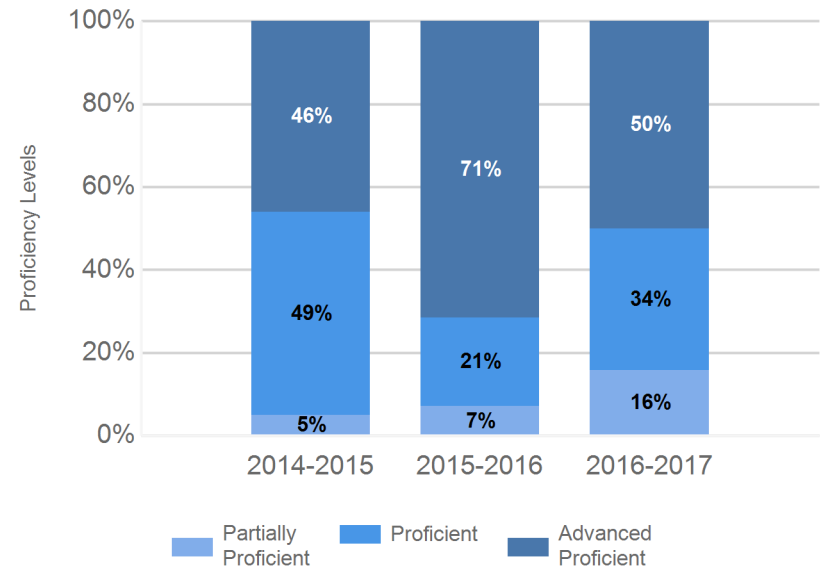

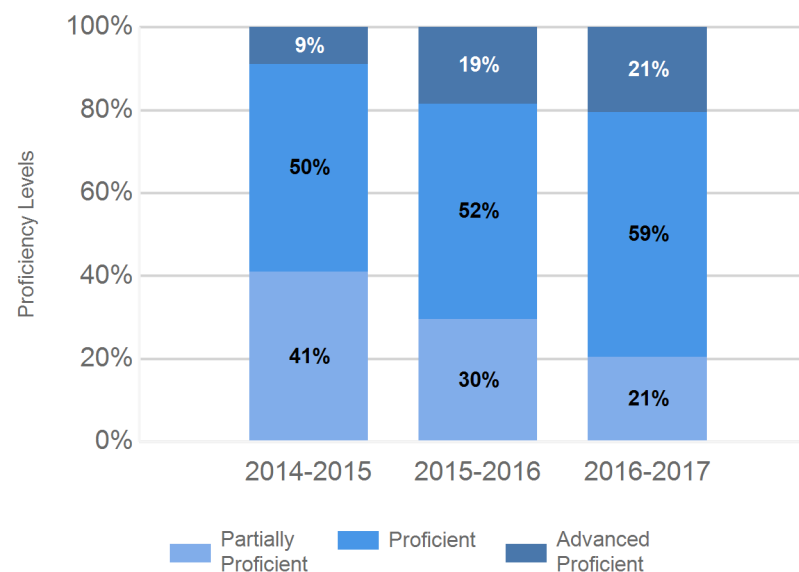

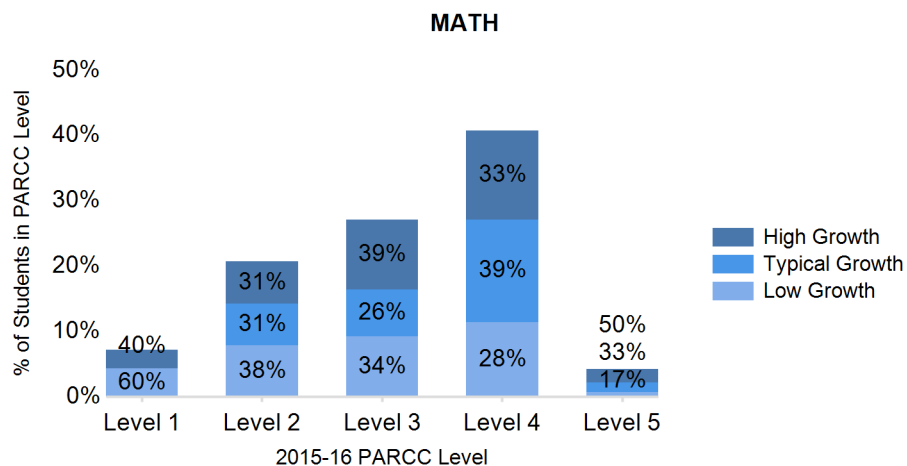
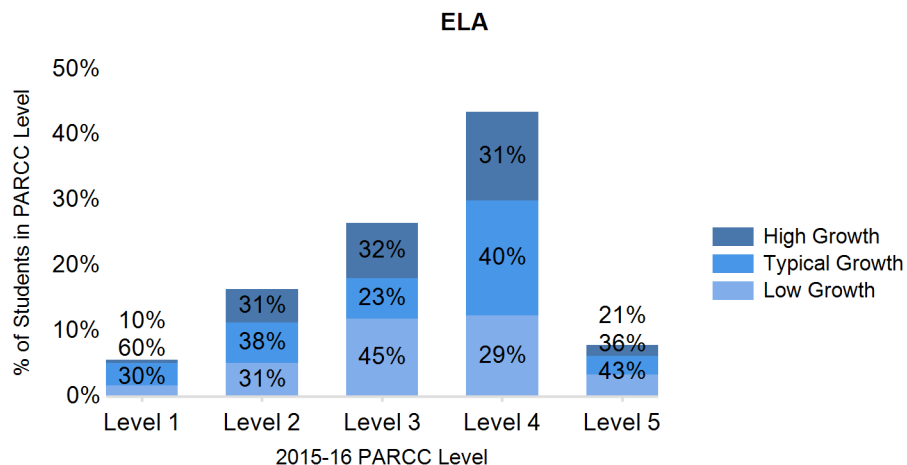

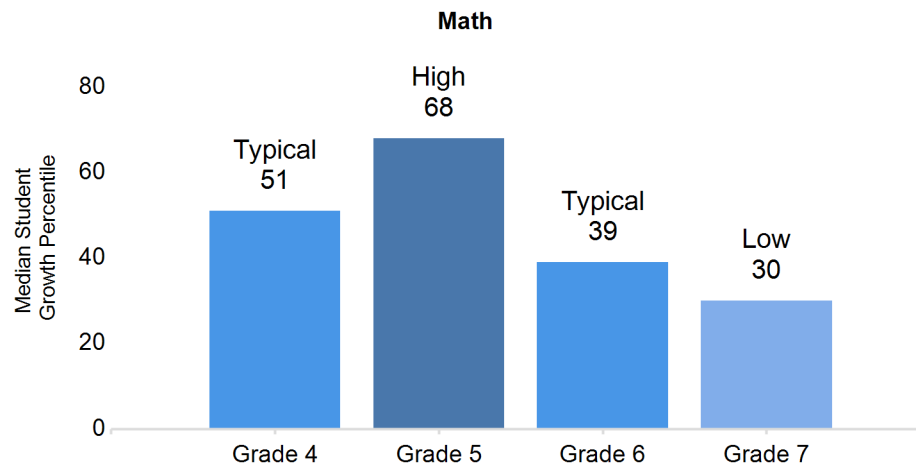
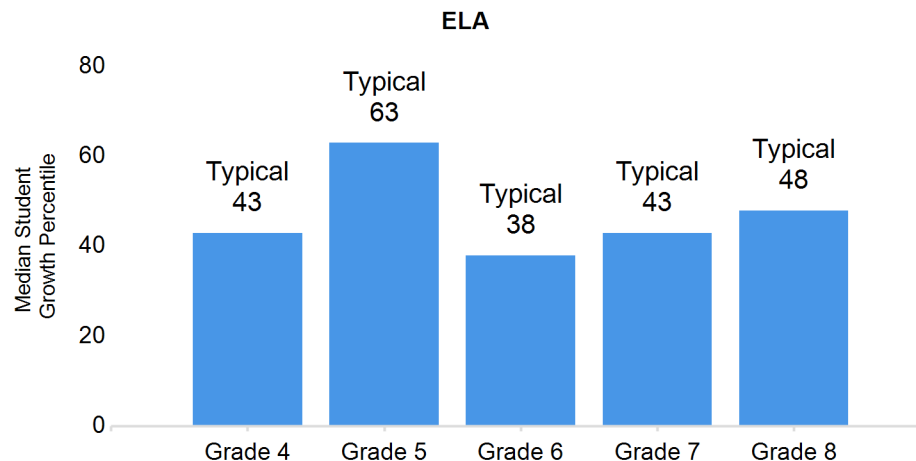

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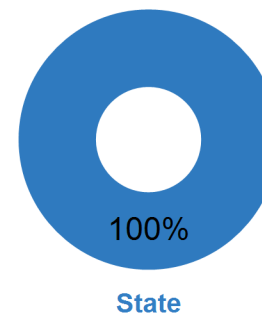
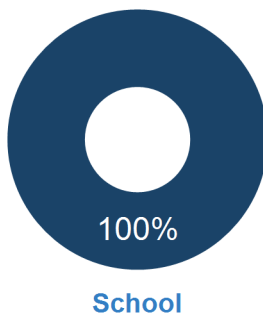

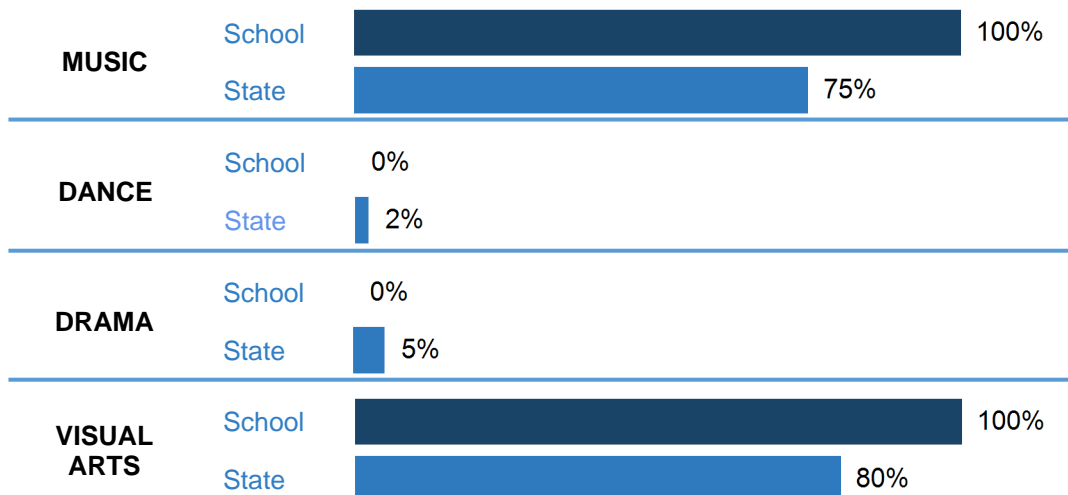

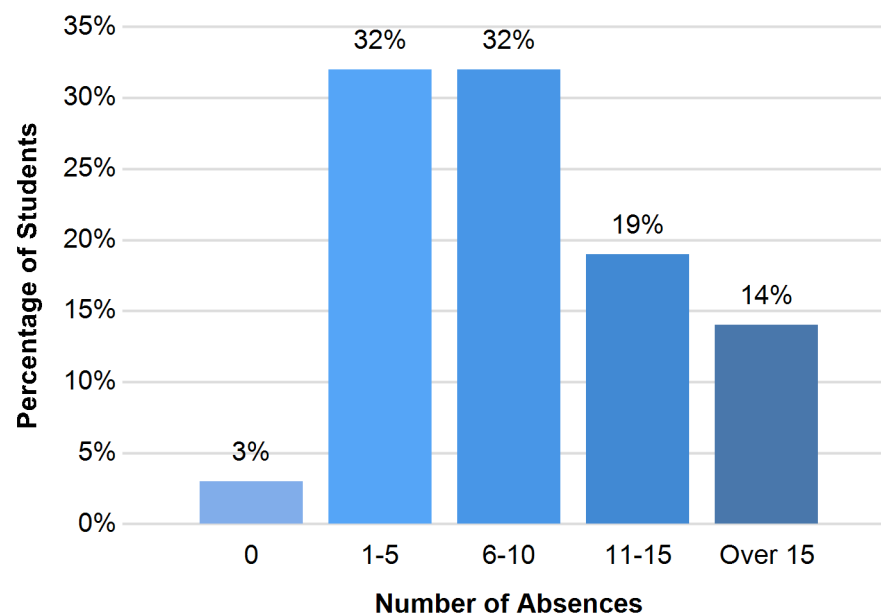

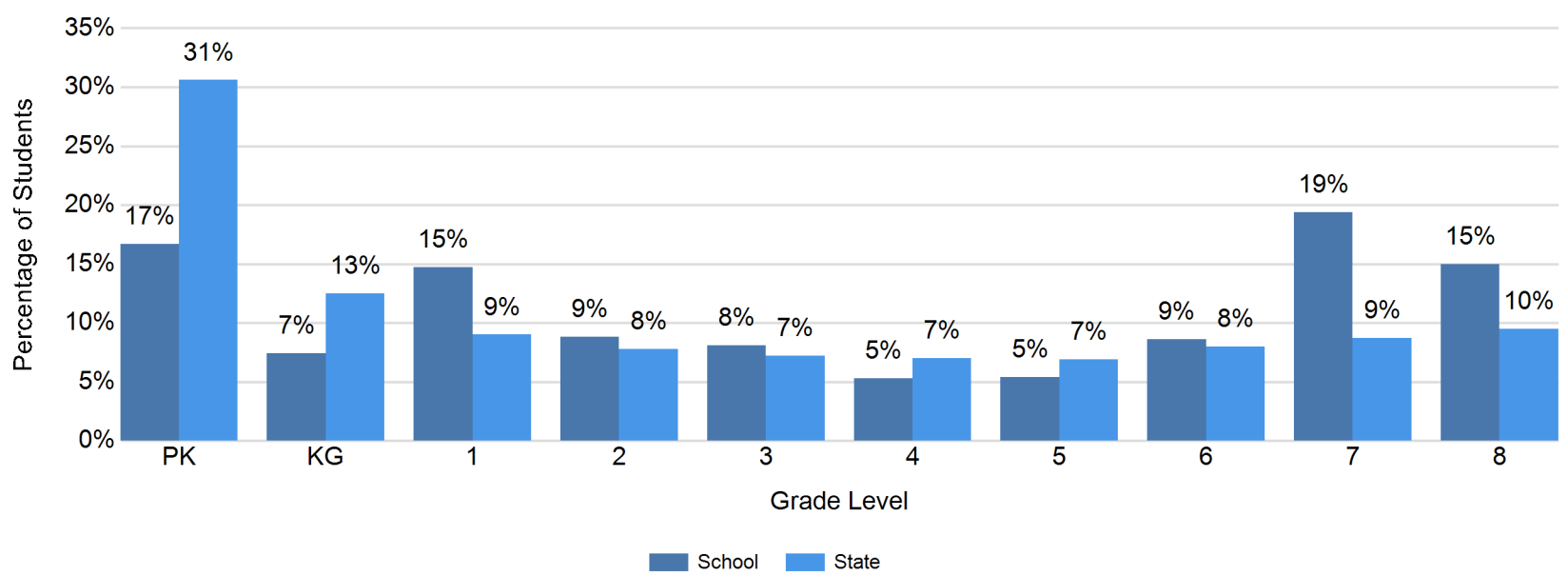

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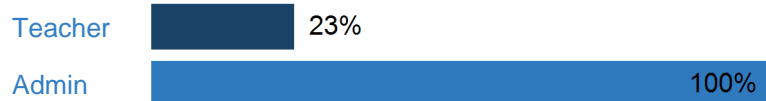
Teachers and Administrators - Level of Education
