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Wat Authorizations

The initial authorization for WAT should be issued for 90 days. Any supplemental WAT authorization should be issued for a maximum of 45 days to a total not more than 90 days.

During the WAT staffing at the end of 90 days and upon receipt of the report, the subsequent authorization for WAT should be issued as agreed upon by the vocational rehabilitation counselor and workshop staff. It is incumbent upon the vocational rehabilitation counselor to clarify with the facility staff the authorizations that will be forthcoming for services agreed upon. Facility staff will then have the necessary information for their records on the client and avoid confusing case entries and program placements which would be questioned by the facility specialist later, if the case is subject to review.

The facility directory and N.J. State Vocational Rehabilitation Facilities rules and regulations provides more detailed information on WAT Programs and authorization procedures.

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An Important Part of the Referral Process

Referral information is an important part of procedure in referring clients to service providers. This information becomes the guide for the workshop evaluators as they work with clients in determining the appropriateness of the referral for the services available at the facility and the need for other services to enhance the employability of the client. The purpose of a workshop evaluation is to determine the potential of an individual to become successfully employed.

It is essential for the facility to receive this information and for VR counselor to include it in the referral package to the facility.

Referral information can and should provide basic background information on the client and other medical, social education and family background which may impact on his behavior or performance in a facility program.

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Tech Reach Named A Regional Technology Center for NYS

ALBERTSON, NY - The National Center for Disability Services has announced that TECH°REACH will serve as one of the four regional technical centers in New York State's assistive technology project, Technology Related Assistance for Individuals with Disabilities (TRAID).

TECH°REACH responds to technology related requests for information, refers individuals to appropriate service providers, provides rehabilitation technology services in our area of expertise such as computer access and office and job accommodations for individuals with physical and/or multiple disabilities. TECH°REACH will also develop a device demonstration center and provide outreach activities to audiences in the greater New York area including Long Island, eastern New Jersey, NYC and Westchester. These activities will be mirrored by the other regional centers in the State located in New York City, Buffalo and Utica.

TECH°REACH has begun the development of an electronic Bulletin Board System (BBS) to facilitate the sharing of information between users of assistive technology. The TECH°REACH BBS, scheduled to come online in September, '91, will be accessible at no extra charge (only the cost of the call).

A toll free TDD number is available for the greater New York area: (800) 676-2831. Individuals outside of this area code with TDD devices may reach TECH°REACH at (516) 248-2837. This computer-based TDD device has answering machine capabilities, so calls received after working hours or on the weekend can be recorded and answered when staff return. TECH°REACH's toll-free number is (800) 487-2805.

TECH°REACH services are available to individuals with disabilities and their families, rehabilitation professionals, educators and employers.

The TR Aid project coordinated by the New York State Office of the Advocate for the Disabled was awarded funding from the National Institute on Disability and Rehabilitation Research (NIDRR) to provide technology-related assistance to individuals with disabilities. Under the grant, the TR Aid Program will initiate activities such as the development of a state-wide network of technology service providers, technology-related information and referrals, media awareness and training and education.

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New York University School of Education, Health, Nursing & Arts Professions Rehabilitation Counseling Program

New York University/ Rehabilitation Counseling Program is pleased to announce a new grant award by the Rehabilitation Services Administration for Rehabilitation Counselors who wish to complete doctoral study leading to the Ph.D.

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RSA to Convene Conference on Rehab Facilities

Nell Carney, Commissioner of the Rehabilitation Services Administration that RSA will sponsor a National Training Conference on Rehabilitation Facilities in Washington, D.C., either late this year or in early 1992.

According to Carney, "The State-Federal Vocational Rehabilitation Program has effectively used services provided by rehabilitation facilities to assist individuals with vocational handicaps to achieve employment and integration into the workplace and the community. The 1965 amendments to the Rehabilitation Act established facilities as important partners in the Public Program of Vocational Rehabilitation. Some state VR agencies operate complex networks of facilities ... Using the successful 1989 National Conference on Rehabilitation Facilities as a springboard, I am pleased to announce with the full support of the RSA Senior Management Team that RSA will demonstrate leadership by setting the framework for the second National Training Conference on Rehabilitation Facilities."

RSA plans to promote the theme of developing interdependence of state VR agencies, rehabilitation facilities, and RSA in carrying out the State Federal vocational rehabilitation mission.

The planning committee will be chaired by RSA senior staff members Ralph Pacinelli and Terry Conour. Other members of the planning committee will include the National Association of Rehabilitation Facilities (NARF) and the Council of State Administrators of Vocational Rehabilitation, as well as university educators of rehabilitation facility personnel.
