Purpose: To provide online access to the New Jersey Union List of

Serials.

Project Description: The State Library will provide the grantee with an annual

update of the New Jersey Union List of Serials produced by OCLC on magnetic tape. The grantee will load the tape on its computer. Telecommunications access to the NJULS will be provided by the State Library via an 800 toll-free line which will connect to the grantee's computer via the

Internet.

Eligible Applicants: All library or library-related agencies which maintain a

computer system providing access to an online public access catalog (OPAC) of library holdings and who currently have full time access to the Internet through a

mid-level network.

Priority for Award: To be eligible for funding, an application must achieve a

total average score of 75 points or more. The applicant having the highest score will be awarded the grant.
