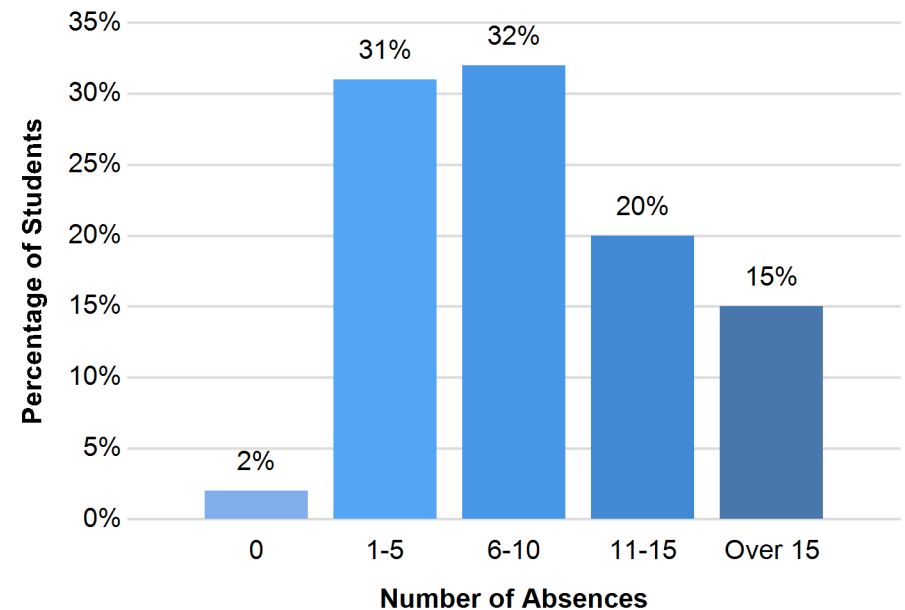

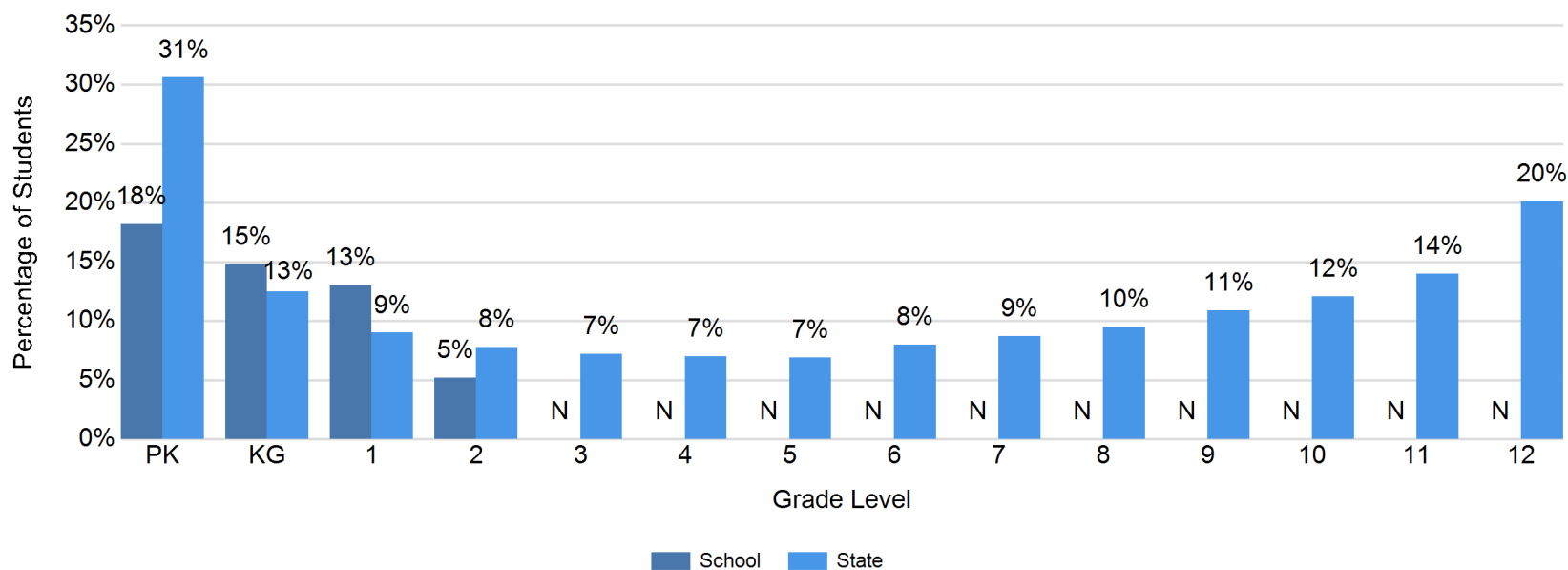

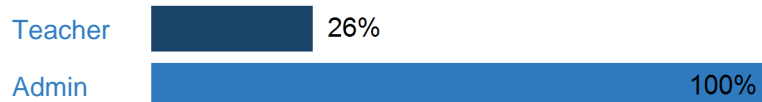

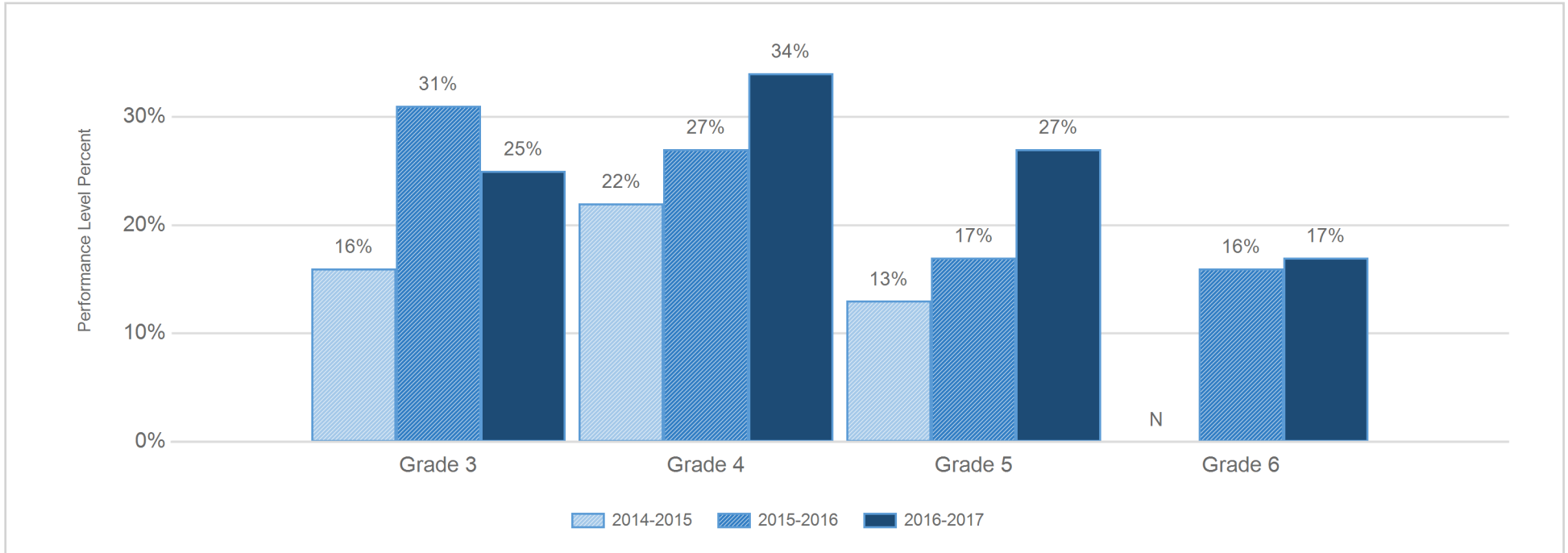

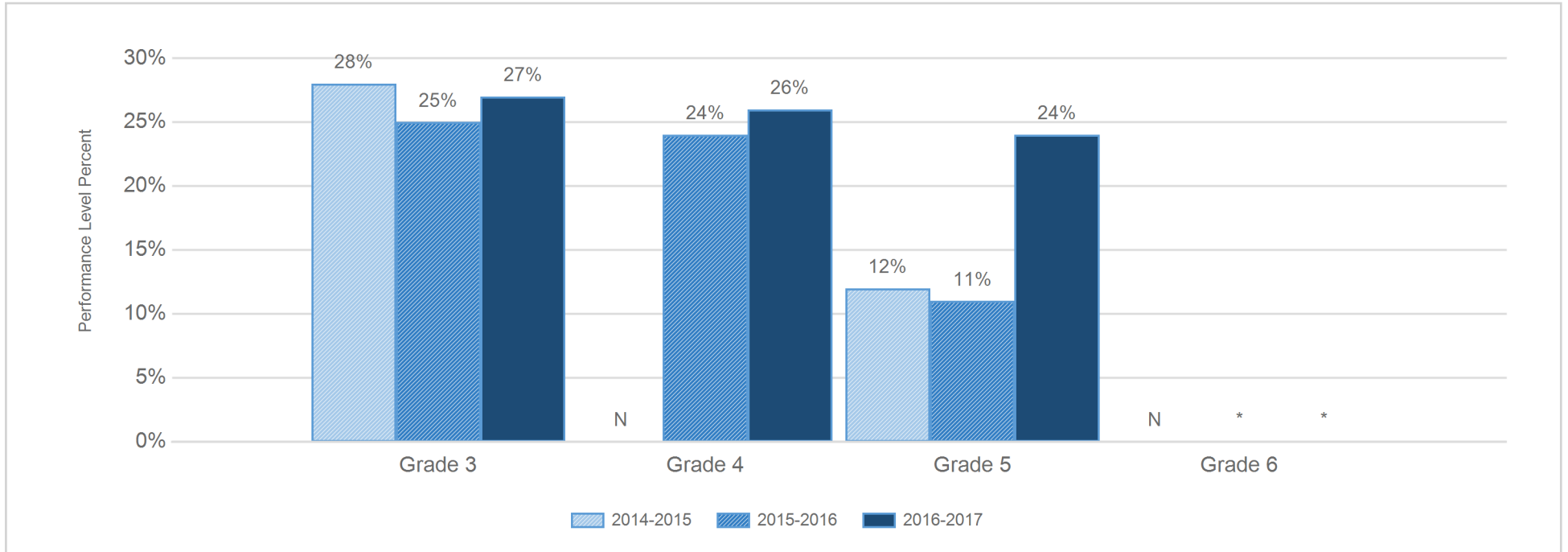

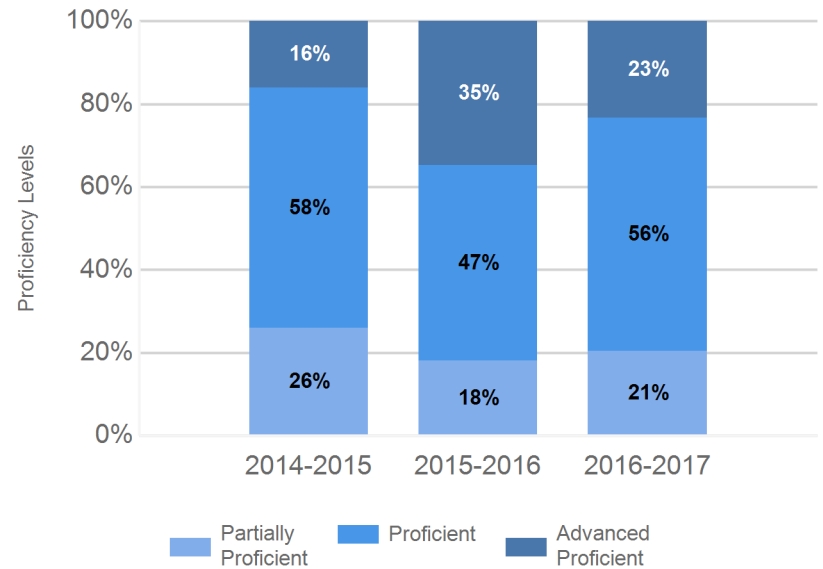

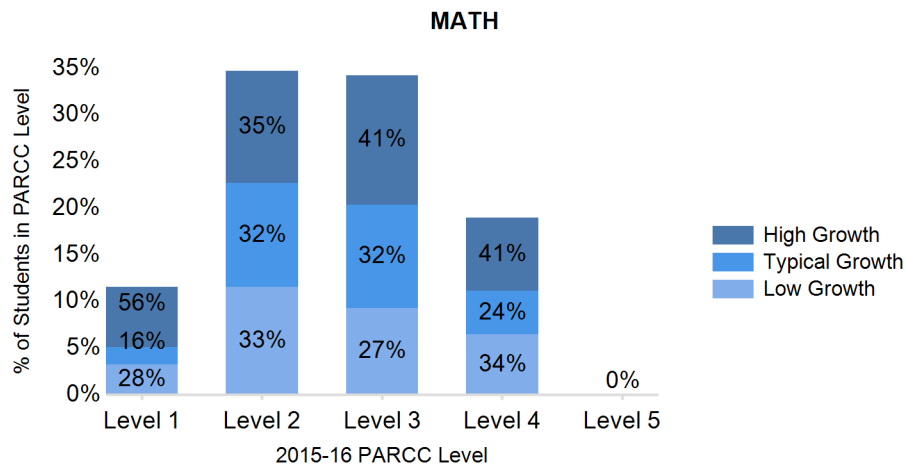
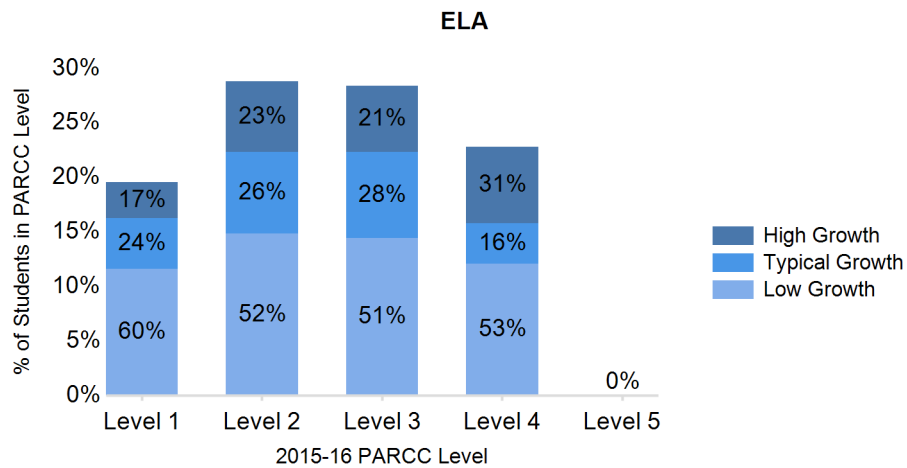

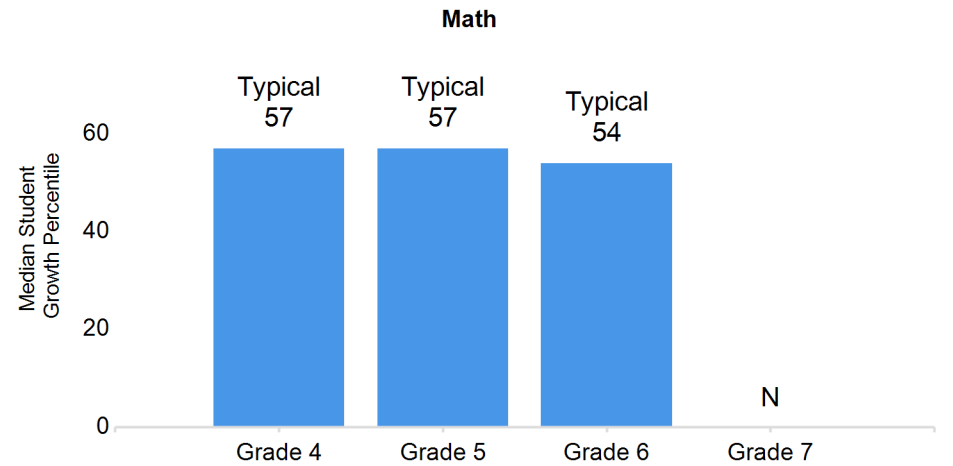
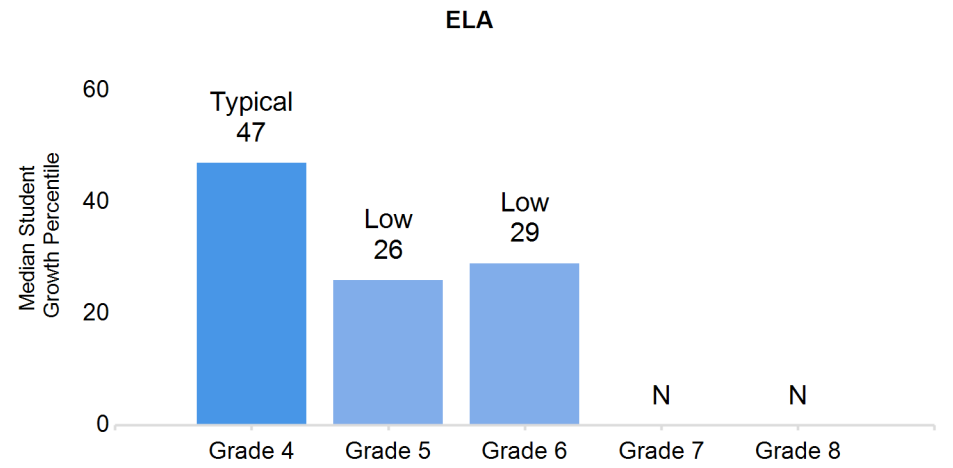
Student Growth by Performance Level

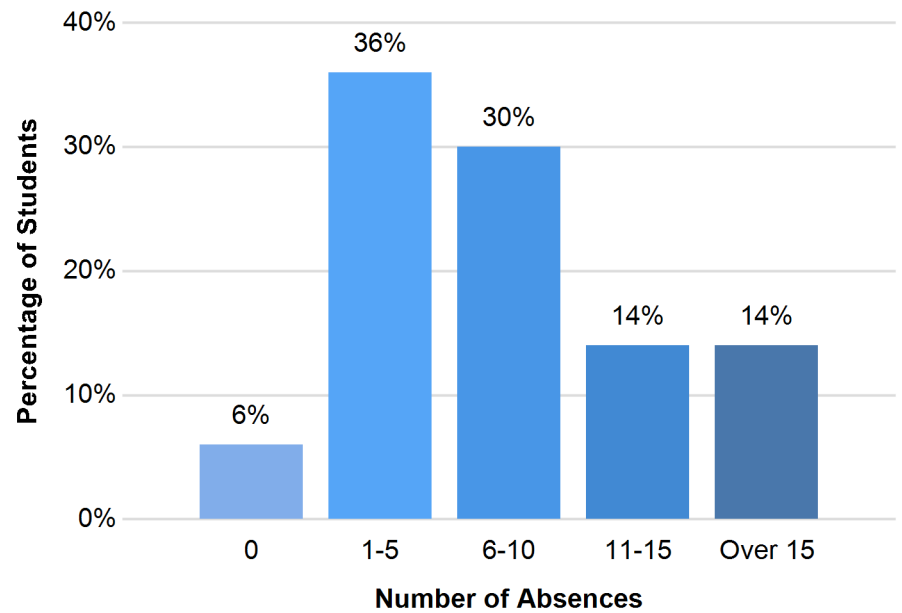

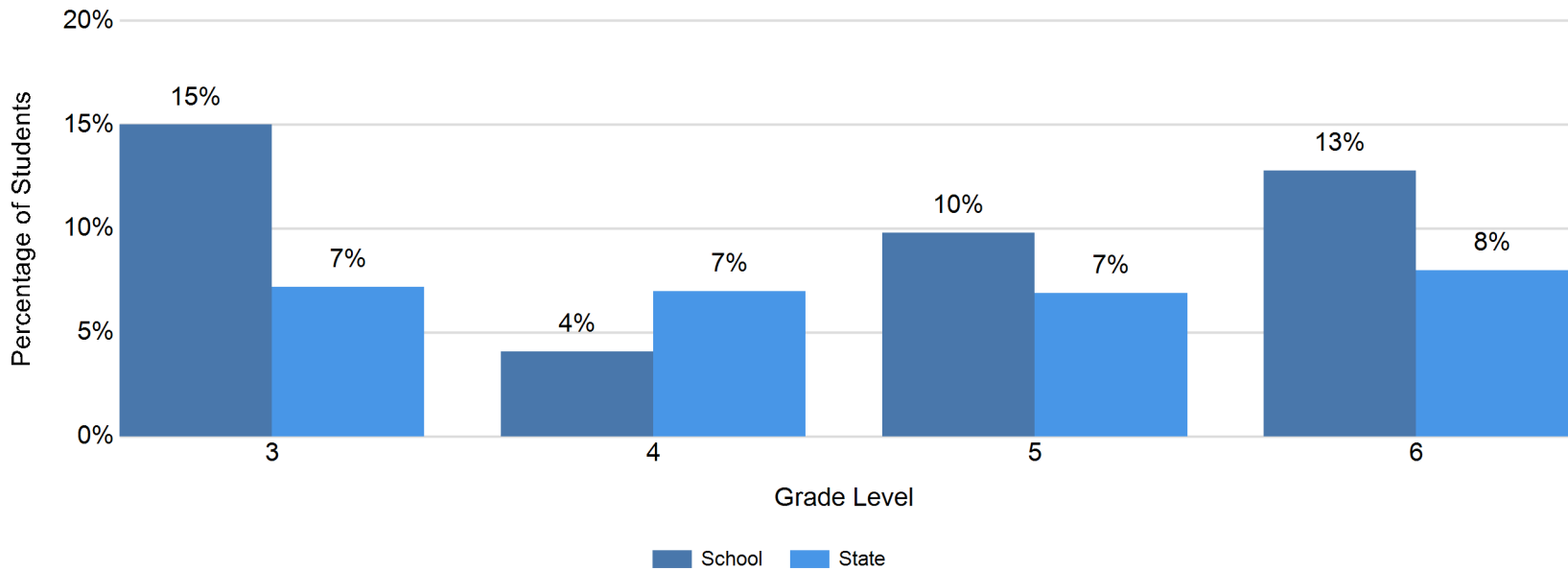

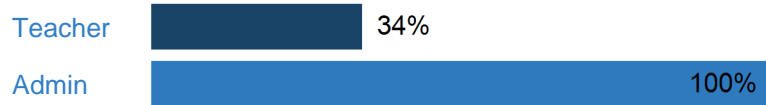

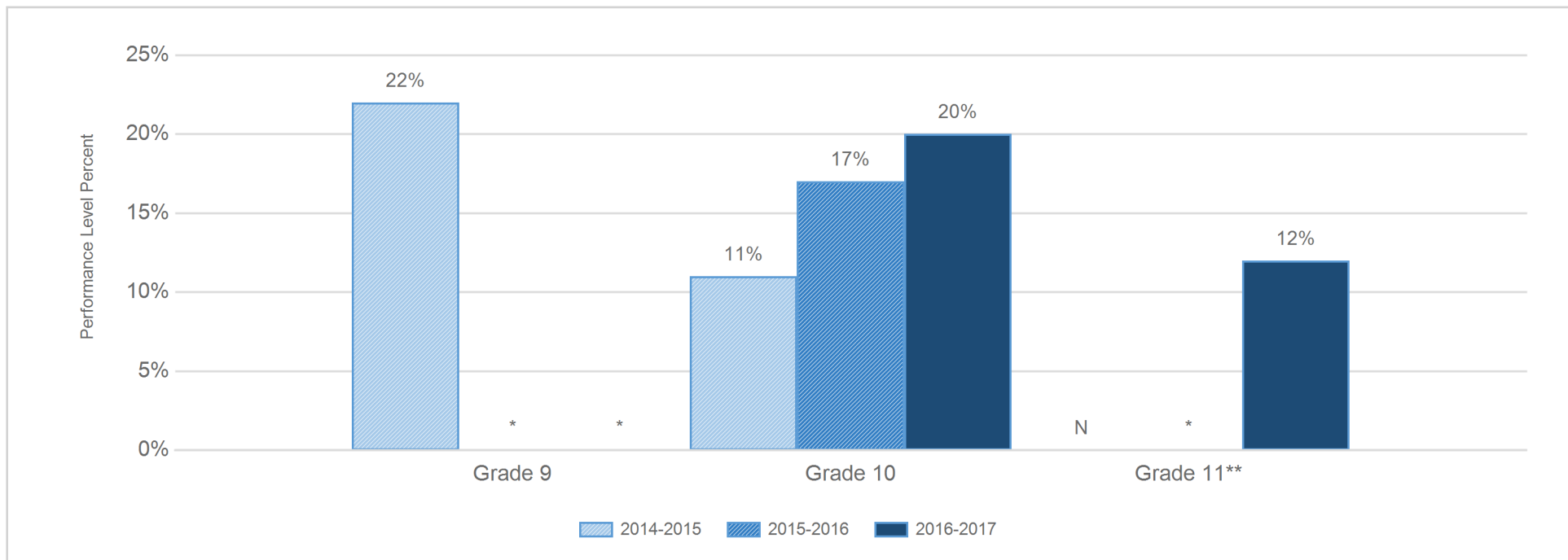

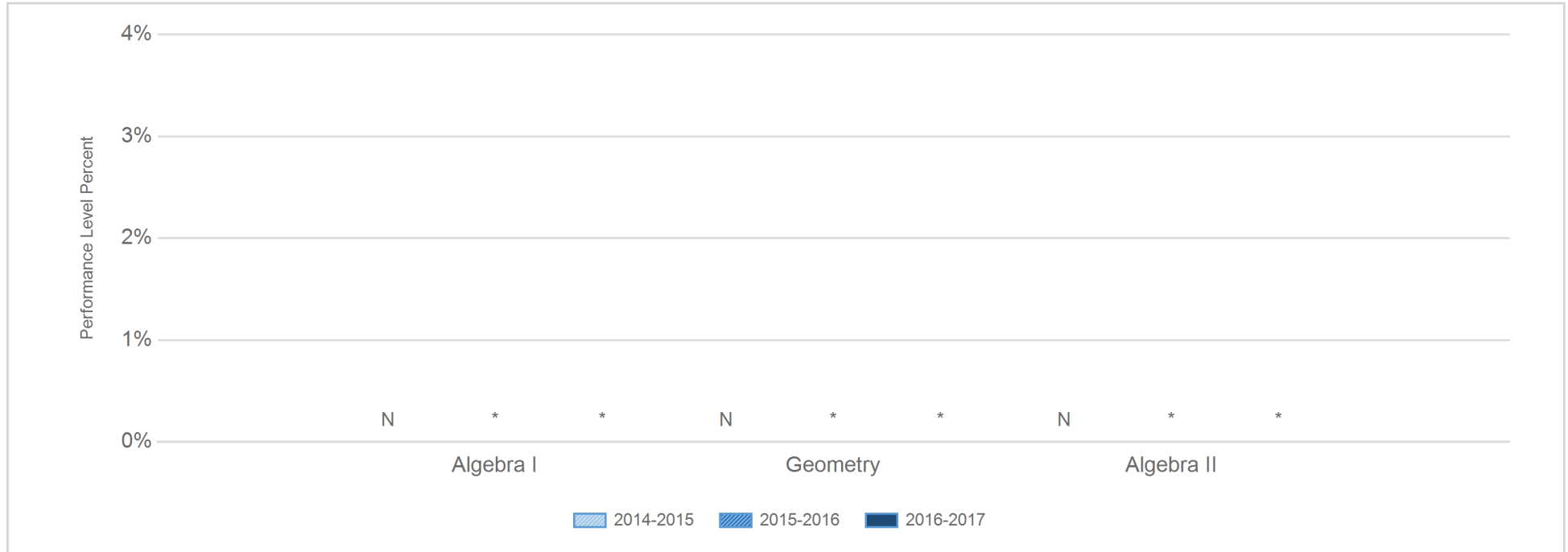

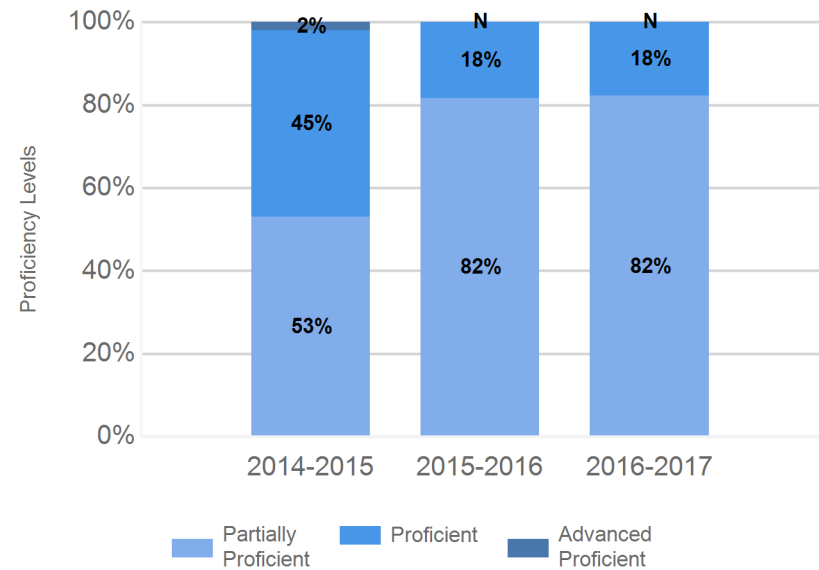

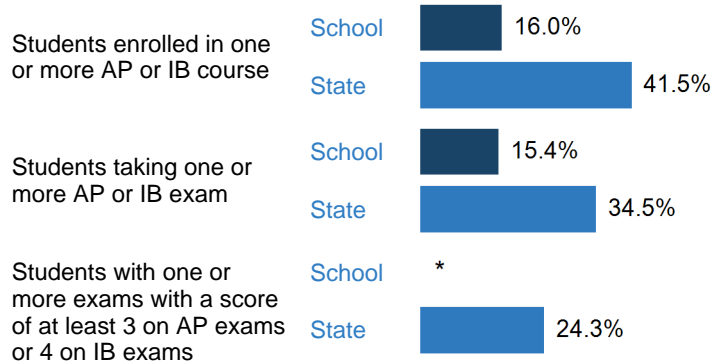

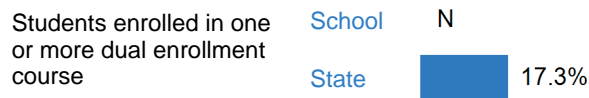

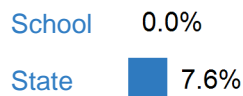

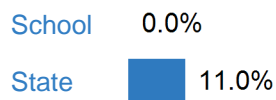
CTE Participants

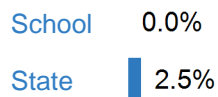

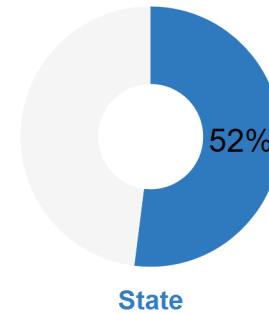

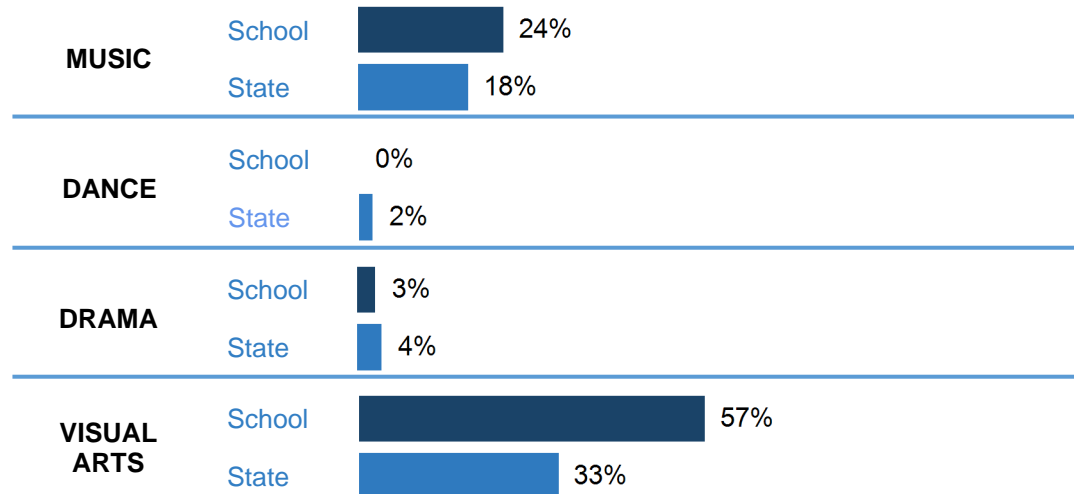

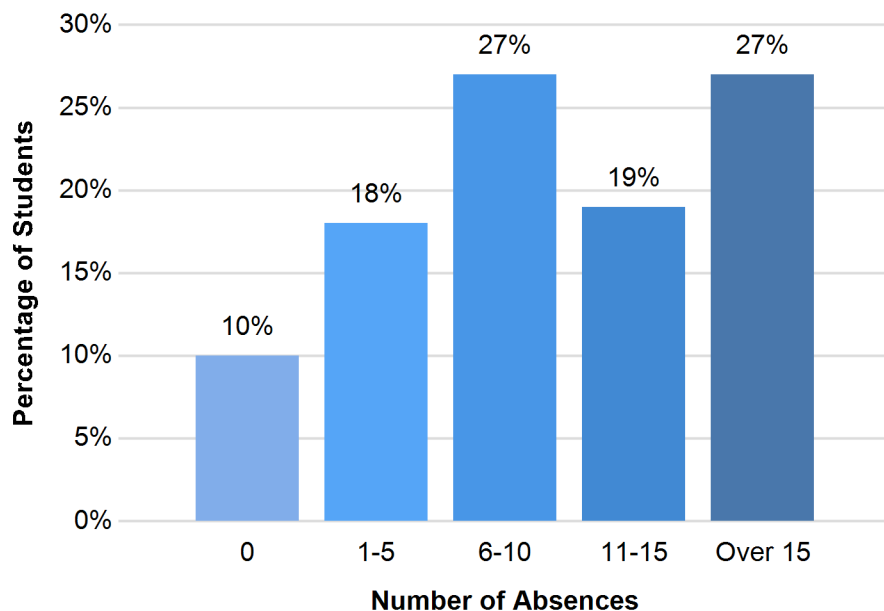

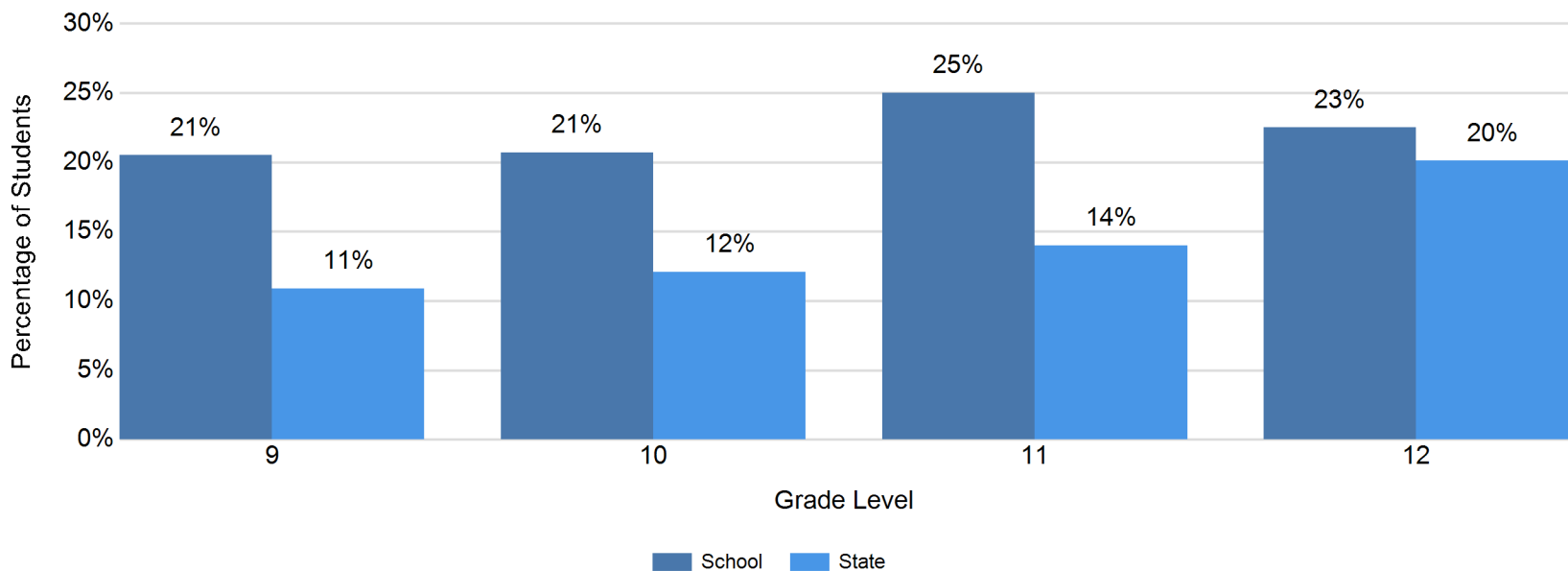

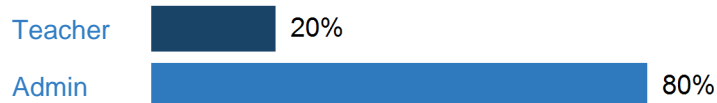

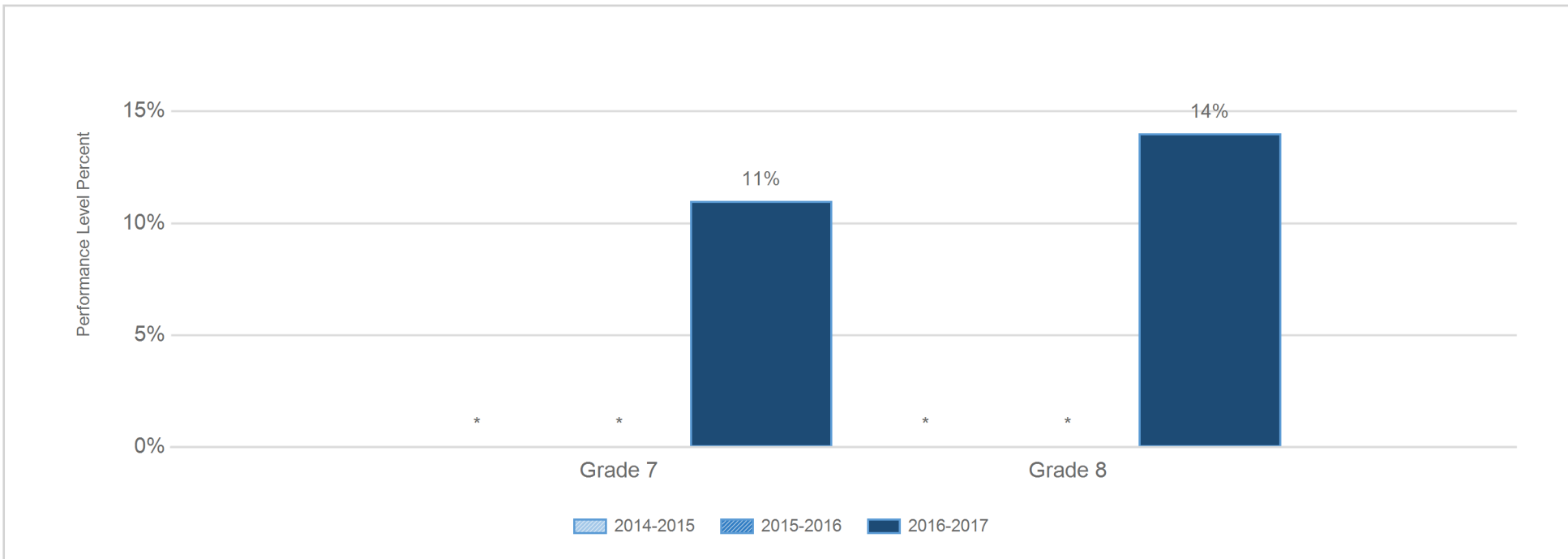

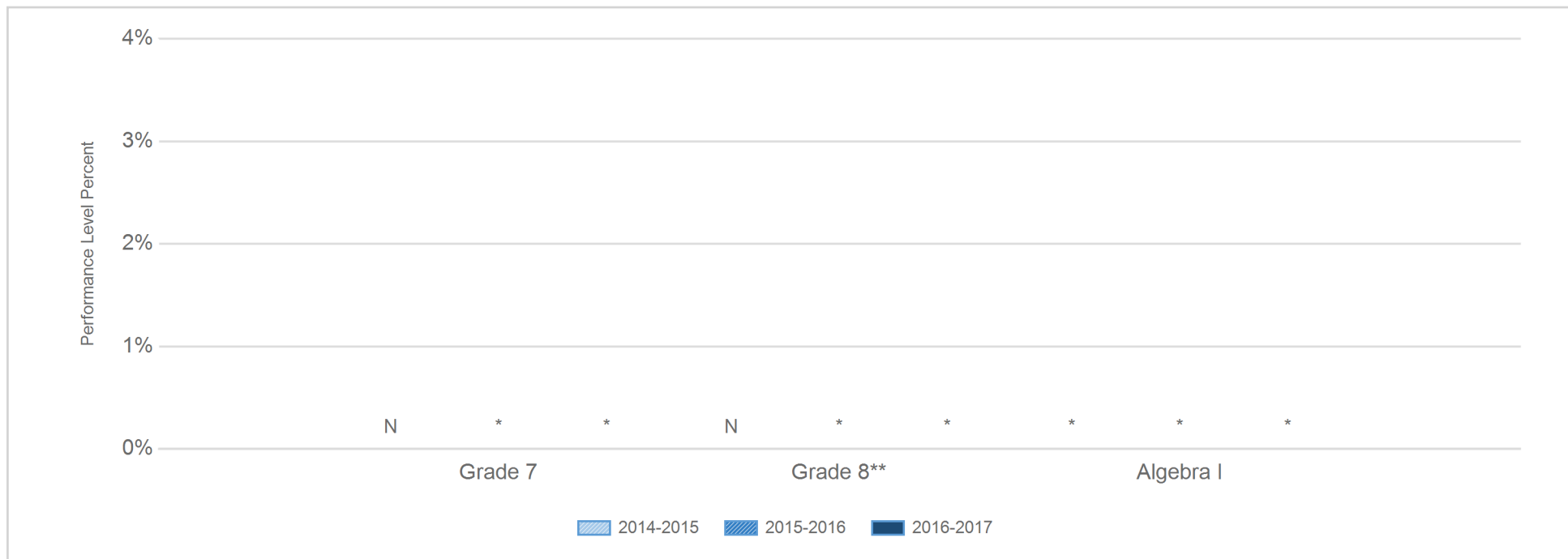

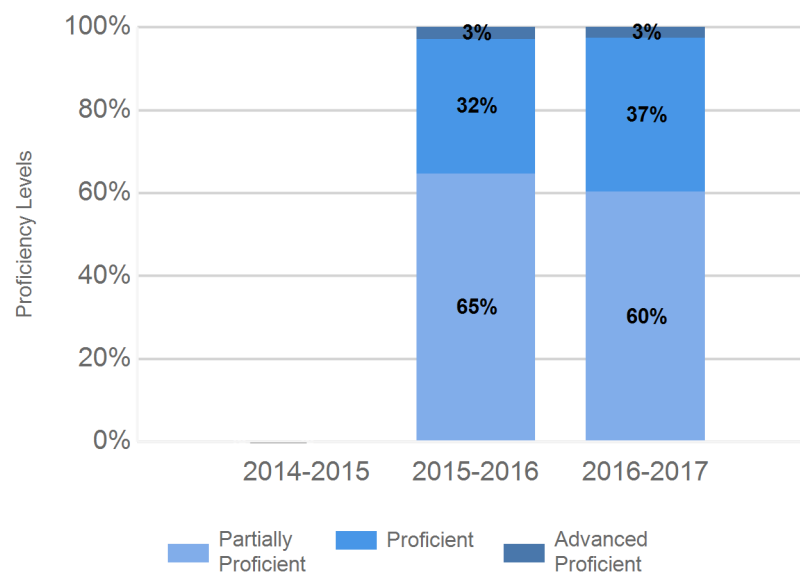

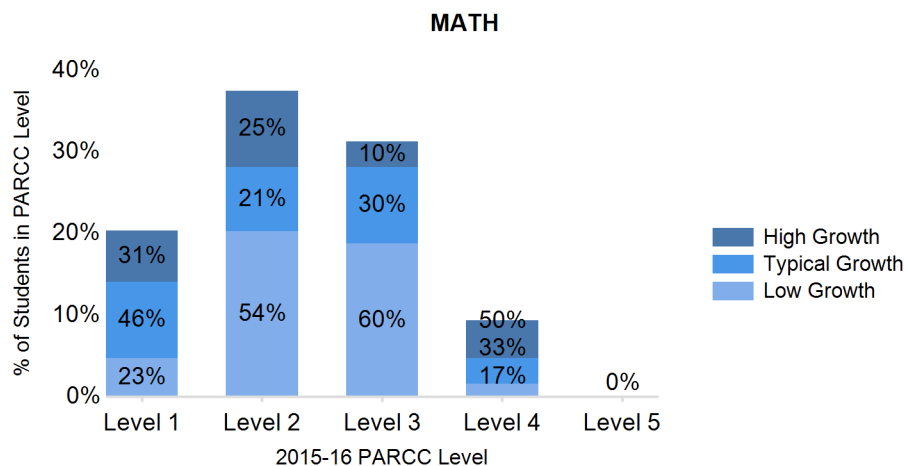
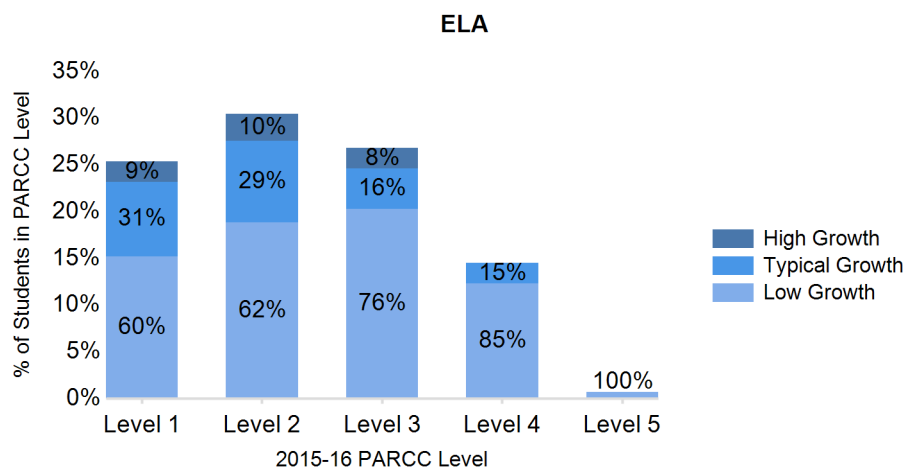

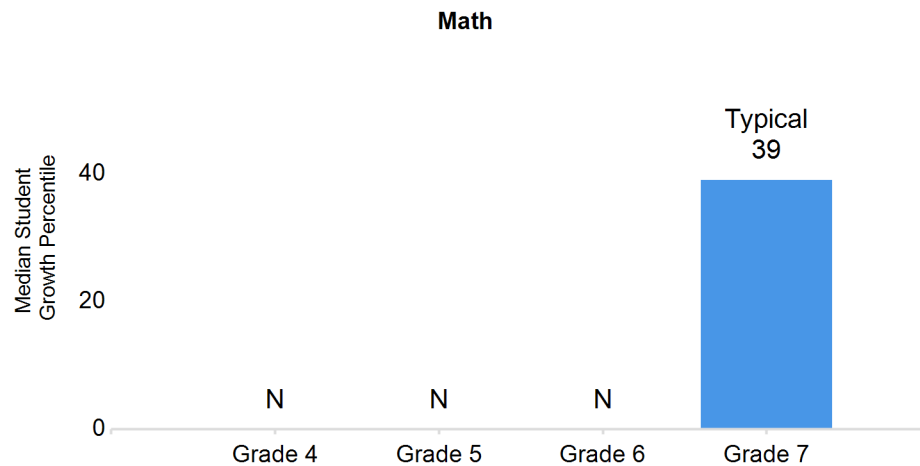
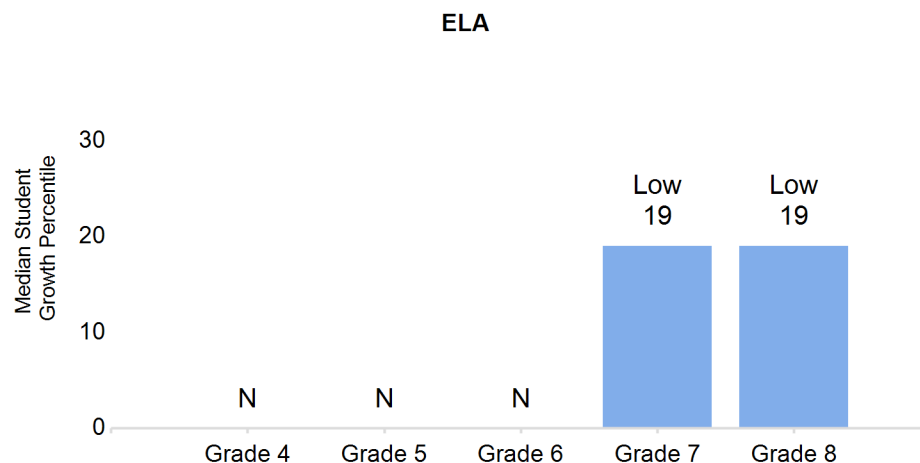

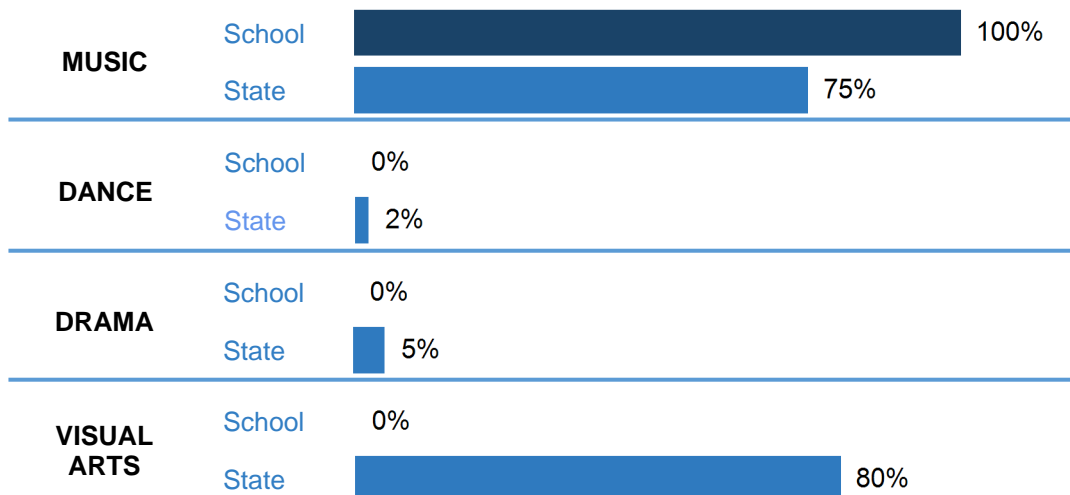

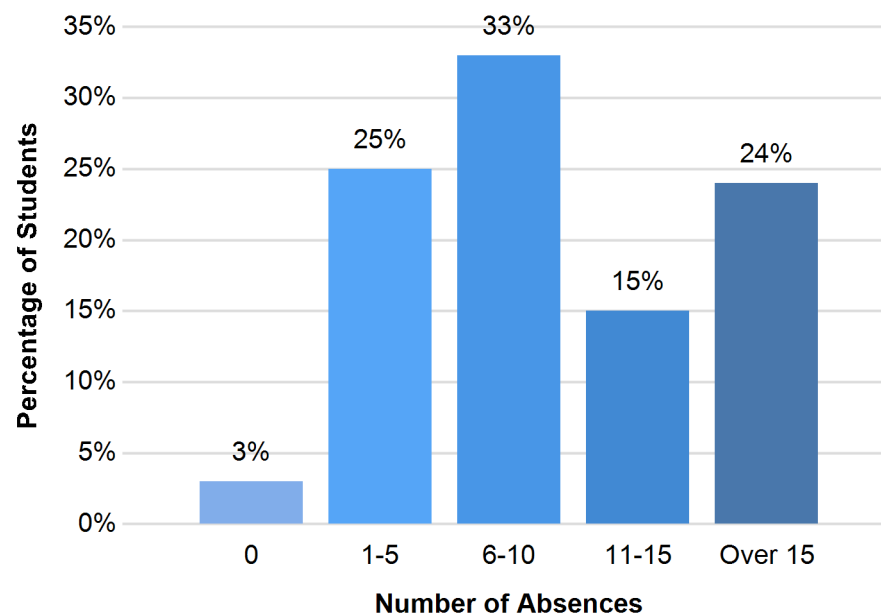

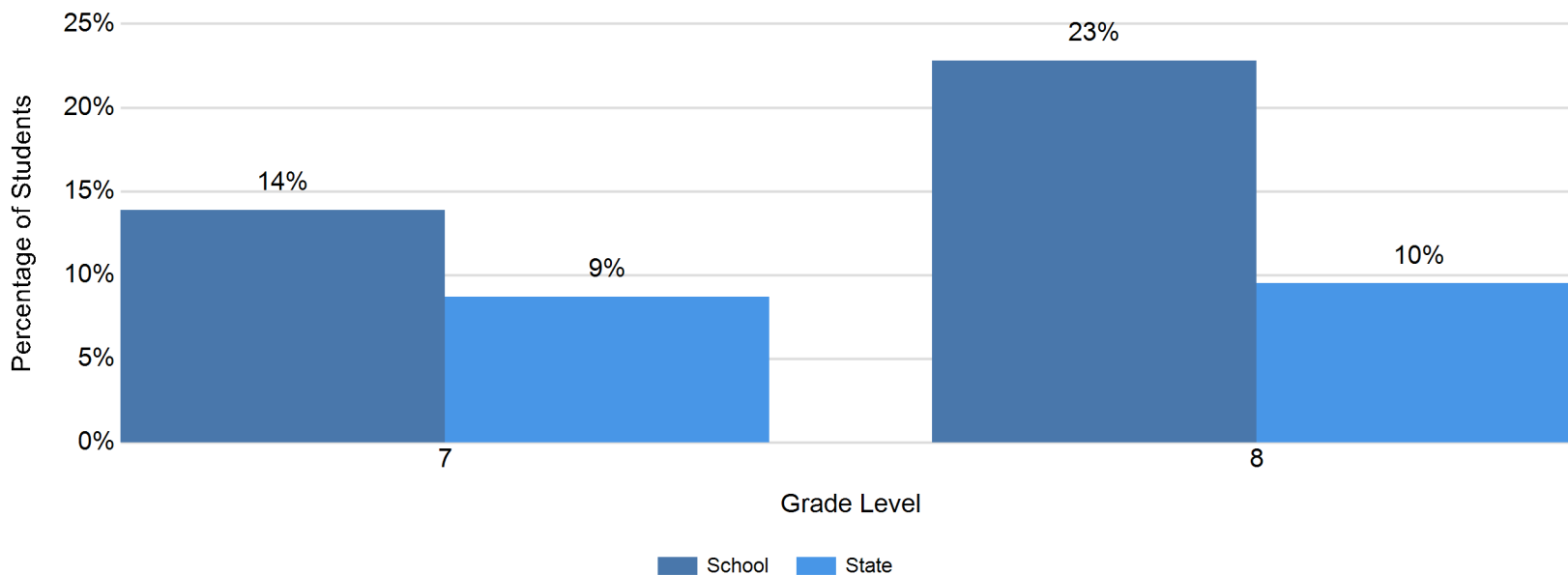

All of our classrooms are equipped with computers allowing students access to the various software packages available to them on our server as well as access to the World Wide Web. The building is equipped with four computer labs. Teachers and students have been trained in a variety of applications, and most recently Paulsboro has incorporated Compass Learning Odyssey, an online instructional learning path created specifically for each student based on his/her own learning needs
