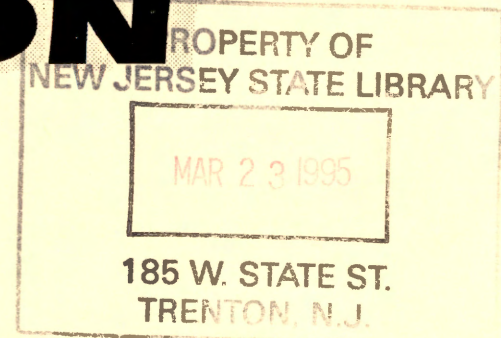

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INTRODUCTION

INTRODUCTION

The 1992-93 edition of Vital Education Statistics presents the status of education in New Jersey as demonstrated by local district and school organization, student enrollments, and post-graduation plans of high school graduates. Also included are data pertaining to certificated and non-certificated district personnel and identified nonpublic schools.

As in the previous edition, the data are reported within the following five distinct sections as a single volume.

Section I contains local district and school organization data;

Section II reports student enrollments and high school graduate data including post-graduation plans and graduation rates;

Section III contains certificated staff data, including assignment, degree, age, experience, salary, mean salary, and mobility;

Section IV reports non-certificated support staff data by position classification, sex, and racial origin; and

Section V contains school count, enrollment, and program data for identified nonpublic schools.

These data are compiled from the New Jersey State Department of Education's annual fall survey data collection of local districts and schools. This information is used to meet state and federal mandates for information pertaining to the current condition of education in New Jersey, as well as for the purposes of educational research and policy considerations.

HIGHLIGHTS OF VITAL EDUCATION STATISTICS 1992-93

1. An increase in the number of operating school districts from 593 in 1991-92 to 595 in 1992-93. The number on non-operating districts decreased from 27 in 1991-92 to 25 in 1992-93.
2. An increase in the number of public schools from 2,284 in 1991-92 to 2,292 in 1992-93.
3. The overall number of enrollments increased by 20,764 in 1992-93 as there were 11,124 more elementary and 9,640 more secondary students. These increases continue a trend as demonstrated below:

From a 1989-90 low of 1,076,005 to the present 1,130,560, total enrollments have increased by 54,555 or 5.1%.

4. Enrollments have increased from 1991-92 to 1992-93 for all racial/ethnic categories: White by 4,881 or 0.7%, Black by 4,861 or 2.4%, Hispanic by 7,305 or 5.4%, American Indian/Alaskan Native by 49 or 4.1%, and Asian/Pacific Islander by 3,668 or 7.1%. See "Selected Educational Statistics for School Years 1988-89 to 1992-93" for enrollments by racial/ethnic categories by school year.
5. As a percentage of the total enrollment, Black, Hispanic, and Asian or Pacific Islander student populations have increased slightly over last year. White student enrollments have declined. Enrollments for American Indian or Alaskan Native students remained the same.

6. While the number of public high school graduates has declined slightly from 67,003 in 1990 to 66,669 in 1991-92, as a percentage of the ninth grade class enrolled four years earlier the number of graduates has increased from 82.1% reported for 1990-91 to 84.1% for 1991-92. Graduates are reported for the preceding school year.
7. An increase in the number of graduates continuing their education as a percentage of all high school graduates from 76.5% in 1990-91 to 78.1% in 1991-92. Of those continuing their education, 92.8% of these students plan to attend a college or university.
8. A 4.7% decrease in full-time administrator/supervisors from 8,467 in 1991-92 to 8,069 in 1992-93.*
9. An increase in the reported number of full-time classroom teachers from 80,515 in 1991-92 to 81,517 in 1992-93.* The pupil/teacher (full-time) ratio increased slightly from 13.8:1 in 1991-92 to 13.9:1 in 1992-93.
10. A 19% increase in the number of full-time classroom teachers who entered the educational system from 5,789 in 1990-91 to 6,888 in 1991-92. The number of full-time classroom teachers who left the educational system increased by 14.5% from 1990-91 (4,459) to 1991-92 (5,105). Mobility occurring during a school year is reported on the department's annual fall survey in the subsequent school year.

The criteria for "entering" includes out-of-district transfers; placement from a college or university, home duties, military service, non-teaching occupation, or other; and return from a leave of absence without pay. The criteria for "leaving" includes out-of-district transfers; continuing education; enter military service or non-teaching employment; leave of absence without pay, resignation, retirement, death, or other; and not offered re-employment.

- * Factors other than individuals returning to or entering the educational system for the first time may have impacted these numbers. Other factors include greater precision with which staff time may be allocated in 1992-93 for those full-time staff members who are counted in more than one major assignment category due to reporting by Full-Time Equivalency (FTE). In prior years, full-time staff with assignments in more than one major assignment category were counted in their primary category.

TABLE 1: OPERATING AND NON-OPERATING NEW JERSEY PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICTS BY COUNTY AS OF OCTOBER 15, 1992.

Number of operating and non-operating school districts by county. A non-operating school district is a district that has been legally established with a board of education but does not operate any schools. Table includes county totals, percentage of total operating school districts by county, and statewide totals.

TABLE 2: UNIVERSE OF LOCAL AND COUNTY OPERATING EDUCATIONAL AGENCIES AS OF OCTOBER 15, 1992.

Number of operating educational agencies by county. Table includes Type I regular and vocational districts, Type II regular, regional, and consolidated districts, as well as educational services commissions, special services district, and statewide totals. In Type I school districts, the Board of Education members are appointed by the mayor and a Board of School Estimate establishes the annual school budget. In Type II districts, the members of the Board of Education are elected and the annual school budget is submitted for voter approval at a school district election. Consolidated districts are formed by the merger of two or more municipalities into a single district. Regional districts are formed when two or more school districts combine for a limited purpose, as in establishing a Grade K-12 or 9-12 district.

SECTION II STUDENT INFORMATION

This section contains information on student enrollments and high school graduates. These data are used to prepare enrollment projections and identify those schools with a high concentration of low income pupils. The data are also provided to the United States Department of Education's National Center for Education Statistics. The racial/ethnic categories appearing in Tables 9, 10, 12, and 13 are in accordance with prescribed federal reporting requirements.

Table includes the calculated percentage rate of high school graduates to the Grade 9 enrollment four years earlier by county for the 1989-90, 1990-91, and 1991-92 school years. The rate was calculated by dividing the total number of graduates for each county per school year by the total Grade 9 enrollment reported four years previously. The resulting percentage is the calculated graduation rate. Also included is the calculated statewide rate for each school year.

SECTION III: CERTIFICATED STAFF INFORMATION

This section contains information pertaining to the certificated staff employed full and part-time. For the purposes of this publication, certificated staff are classified into three categories that define the major work assignments in the educational profession. These categories are: administrators and supervisors; classroom teachers; and educational support services personnel. The following tables report the staff in these categories by location (system-wide or central office assignment, elementary or secondary), sex, race/ethnicity, age, experience, academic degree acquired, and mobility (entering and leaving).

New to the current edition is the reporting of certificated staff counts in Full-Time Equivalency (FTE). In order to comply with federal reporting requirements and resolve discrepancies as to identification of major work assignments and associated category classification the "Report of Certificated Status," distributed as part of the department's annual fall survey, was revised to include FTE for each reported assignment. For the purposes of this publication, certificated staff counts appearing in tables related solely to major assignments are based on the reported FTE (Tables 15-18 and 37). Certificated staff counts related to demographic information (e.g., sex, race/ethnicity, age, experience, academic degree acquired, mobility, etc.) are reported as a sum of each single individual occurrence (Tables 19-33, 36, 38, and 39). A detailed definition of FTE appears in the Glossary.

Please note that total staff counts based on FTE and those calculated as the sum of individual occurrences may differ.

GLOSSARY

GLOSSARY

ADMINISTRATOR/SUPERVISOR:

A staff member with valid certification who has been assigned the responsibility to manage or direct the activities of a district or a portion of these activities.

ASSIGNMENT:

The specific group of activities for which a staff member has been given responsibility.

CERTIFICATE:

The legal document giving authorization, from the New Jersey State Board of Examiners, to perform the services to which the person is assigned.

CLERICAL/SECRETARIAL STAFF:

Staff members in positions requiring skills and training for all clerical work including such activities as preparing, transcribing, systematizing, or filing written communications and reports; and operating such equipment as bookkeeping machines, typewriters, calculating machines, word processors, and personal computers. Tables include bookkeepers, messengers, office machine operators, clerk-typists, stenographers, secretaries, hearing reporters, statistical clerks, dispatchers, payroll clerks, and data entry operators.

COLLEGES OR UNIVERSITIES:

Tables include post-secondary institutions offering a two-year or four-year curriculum and empowered to confer a degree, as well as armed services academies and other post-secondary degree granting institutions.

CONSOLIDATED SCHOOL DISTRICT:

A legal entity established in accordance with New Jersey Statutes 18A, Chapter 8-25. Such districts are formed through the merger of two or more existing municipalities into a single district.

DEGREE:

A title conferred by an approved college or university as official recognition for a completed course of study.

EDUCATIONAL SERVICES COMMISSION:

A legal entity established in accordance with New Jersey Statutes Title 18A, Chapter 6. Such agencies are established in one or more counties for the purpose of carrying on programs of educational research and development and providing to public school districts such educational and administrative services as may be authorized pursuant to the rules of the State Board of Education.

EDUCATIONAL SUPPORT SERVICES PERSONNEL:

A staff member with valid certification who provides administrative, technical, and logistical support to achieve the objectives of a district's educational programs.

EMPLOYED, NOT CONTINUING EDUCATION:

Tables include individuals working full-time or those participating in an apprenticeship or on-the-job training program, as well as those in government service through enlistment in the armed services or other government sponsored program.

ENTERING:

The source from which a staff member new to the school or district was recruited.

ESSIA CHAPTER 1:

The federal Elementary/Secondary School Improvement Act chapter that provides federal funds to eligible schools for supplemental remedial programs which meet the special needs of students performing below minimum levels of proficiency.

EXPERIENCE:

A year of professional, educational employment (excluding current year) in a public school, college, or university.

FTE (FULL-TIME EQUIVALENCY):

FTE is the amount of time required to perform an assignment stated as a proportion of a full-time position. This proportion is usually represented by a decimal in tenths for each assignment.

FULL-TIME:

The period of time in each day required for full-time certificated staff employment shall be the number of hours prescribed by the local board of education, but shall not be less than four hours.

GRADUATION RATE:

The number of Grade 12 graduates represented as a percentage of the Grade 9 enrollment four years earlier.

HOME ECONOMICS:

A consumer and homemaking program of instructional and laboratory experiences taught by a home economics teacher and which (1) contributes to personality development; (2) teaches the child's role in school and home life; (3) develops appreciation of the family; and (4) enriches the child's skills in other areas such as foods and clothing.

INDUSTRIAL ARTS:

A program of instructional and laboratory experiences which provides basic education related to the industrial and technological aspects of life through experiences with tools, materials, and processes.

LABORERS, UNSKILLED:

Staff members in full-time positions performing manual labor and not classified in another activity assignment area.

LEAVING:

The relocation of a staff member from the site reported in the previous year.

NEW HIRES:

Refers to persons who were hired for the first time or after a break in service for full-time employment in the district. Personnel returning from official leaves of absence granted by the district are not counted as new hires.

NON-CERTIFICATED STAFF:

Staff members in positions for which a certificate issued by the New Jersey State Board of Examiners is not required for the performance of professional services in the school or district. Table includes persons engaged in administration, such as accountants and attorneys; in health services, such as doctors, dentists, and psychiatrists; in facilities planning and operations, such as architects and engineers.

NOT CONTINUING EDUCATION:

Tables include high school graduates, who are unemployed, engaged in additional secondary schooling, homemaking, deceased, or where status is unknown.

NON-OPERATING DISTRICT:

A district that has been established legally having a board of education, but does not operate any schools.

NONPUBLIC SCHOOL:

Table include agencies, also known as "private schools," that are established for the purposes of providing education to children in programs of study under college grade which do not derive support entirely or in part from public funds.

OTHER EDUCATION:

Tables include high school graduates attending other post-secondary institutions such as business or secretarial schools, cosmetology or barber schools, art schools, nursing schools, technical, trade, or vocational schools, industry sponsored schools, or other post-secondary institutions not granting a degree.

OTHER TYPE COLLEGE:

Includes armed services academies, as well as any post-secondary degree granting institution.

PART-TIME:

A staff member whose total current assignments constitute less than full-time service. A part-time staff member maybe employed full-time for a part of the school year, part-time for a part of the school year, or part-time for the entire school year.

POST-GRADUATE:

Students who, after graduating from high school (Grade 12), re-enroll in the same or another secondary school for additional high school courses.

PRE-KINDERGARTEN:

A group or class organized to provide educational experiences for children during the year or years preceding kindergarten and are part of the elementary school program under the direction of a qualified teacher.

PROGRAM OF STUDIES:

A combination of related courses and/or self-contained classes organized for the attainment of specific education objectives such as, a program of special education for handicapped pupils or program of occupational (vocational) education.

REGIONAL SCHOOL DISTRICT:

A legal entity established in accordance with New Jersey Statutes Title 18A, Chapter 13. Such districts are formed when two or more school districts combine for a limited purpose as in establishing a Grade K-12 or 9-12 district.

RACE/ETHNICITY:

The group which an individual appears to belong, identifies with, or is regarded as belonging to in the community. The four categories, mandated by federal reporting requirements, are: White, not Hispanic origin; Black, not of Hispanic origin; Hispanic; American Indian or Alaskan Native; and Asian or Pacific Islander.

SCHOOL DISTRICT:

A legal entity established in accordance with New Jersey Statutes Title 18A, Chapter 8. Each municipality is considered a separate local school district. A Type I school district is the legal classification of a local school district in accordance with New Jersey Statutes Title 18A, Chapter 9-2. Such districts are formed where the board of education members are appointed by the mayor of the municipality and a board of school estimate establishes the annual school budget. A Type II school district is the legal classification of a local school district in accordance with New Jersey Statutes Title 18A, Chapter 9-3. Such districts are formed when members of the board of education are elected and the annual school budget is submitted for voter approval in a school district election.

SCHOOL YEAR:

A calendar year which begins on July 1 and ends on June 30 of the following year.

SERVICE WORKERS:

Staff members in positions performing paraprofessional services in the areas of cafeteria operation, maintenance, security, transportation, etc. Tables include food service workers; custodial workers with the responsibility for cleanliness of buildings and operating such equipment as heating and ventilating systems; security workers with the responsibility for preserving the security of district property and keeping the buildings safe for occupancy; and transportation workers.

SKILLED CRAFTS:

Staff members in positions performing jobs which require special manual skills and a thorough and comprehensive knowledge of the processes involved in this work. Such skills may have been acquired through on-the-job training and experience, through apprenticeship, or other formal training programs. Tables include mechanics, carpenters, electricians, plumbers, heavy equipment operators, stationary engineers, skilled machinery operators, compositors, and typesetters.

SPECIAL EDUCATION:

Students on roll in self-contained special education classes. Special Education students who are mainstreamed are reported in their respective grade levels.

SPECIAL SERVICES SCHOOL DISTRICT:

A legal entity established in accordance with New Jersey Statutes Title 18A, Chapter 46-29. Such districts are established by a county board of chosen freeholders for the education and treatment of handicapped children.

TEACHER:

A staff member with valid certification who instructs students.

TEACHER AIDES:

Staff members in positions performing assigned activities which assist certificated staff members perform professional educational-teaching assignments. Tables include teacher aides, library aides, playground aides, guidance aides, etc.

TECHNICIANS:

Staff members in positions requiring a combination of knowledge and manual skill which has been obtained through approximately two years of post-high school education, such as is offered in many technical institutes and/or junior colleges, or through equivalent on-the-job training. Tables include computer programmers and operators, film inspectors, projectionists, and graphic artists, draftsmen, technicians (medical and dental) and similar occupations which cannot be properly classified in other activity area assignments.

UNEEMPLOYED:

Not employed at any paid work.

UNGRADED:

Students in a class which is not organized on the basis of grade and has no standard grade designation. (Students in self-contained special education classes are not reported in this category.)

VOCATIONAL EDUCATION:

Program offering education and training in such semi-skilled, skilled and/or technical occupations as agriculture, home economics, office occupations, distributive education, and technical education.

VOCATIONAL SCHOOL DISTRICT:

A legal entity established in accordance with New Jersey Statutes Title 18A, Chapter 54. Such districts may be established by the county board of chosen freeholders or referendum and are administered by a separate board of education.
