Academic Achievement

A proficiency rate is calculated by summing the count of students who scored either proficient or advanced proficient on the assessment and dividing by the count of valid test scores.

College and Career Readiness

This school outperforms 89% of schools statewide as noted by its statewide percentile and 90% of schools educating students with similar demographic characteristics as noted in its peer school percentile in the performance area of College and Career Readiness. Additionally, this school is meeting 100% of its performance targets in the area of College and Career Readiness.



College and Career readiness measures the degree to which students are demonstrating behaviors that are indicative of future attendance and/or success in college and careers. 
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Enrollment by Grade

This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.




Total School Enrollment Trends




Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup



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




NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy - Grade Level - 03




NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 03



COLLEGE AND CAREER READINESS MONMOUTH

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Students in both elementary and middles schools begin to demonstrate college readiness behaviors long before they even enter high school. 


Chronic Absenteeism Trend











This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.






Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup








NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 03




NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 03








Chronic Absenteeism Trend





Enrollment by Grade












NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 07




NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 07






Chronic Absenteeism Trend



This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.




Total School Enrollment Trends




Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup








NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 03






NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 03
















Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup












Chronic Absenteeism Trend



This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.




Total School Enrollment Trends




Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup


















Chronic Absenteeism Trend



This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.




Total School Enrollment Trends




Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup

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









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




Chronic Absenteeism Trend
